So as you can see, this area here has a lot of activity.

157

We're going to help her with some of the equipment that she uses and actually try and find Bigfoot ourselves.

This is a digital predator collar and this is something that we're going to be using.

It's programmed with 32 digital quality sounds.

160

I need you to go to a butcher shop and pick up some beef liver.

You heard they like to eat the liver first.

172

Autumn told us that to bait the Sasquatch, we should put out raw meat.

174

So I'm thinking, all right, this is a carnivore that eats meat.

So I left the guys and went to see Dr. Jeff Melendrum, the foremost expert in scientific Bigfoot evidence.

I'm looking forward to using some of the forensic techniques I employ in my work as a crime scene technician in helping to solve this Bigfoot mystery.

Here's my lab where the cast collection is kept.

187

There's well over 150, there are 200 casts here assembled.

188

There'll be under some circumstances a footprint cast can actually pick up the fine skin-ridge detail of the foot.

189

And one of the ways that we can help to visualize this in the vein of crime scene investigation is to create a thin latex peel of the surface.

190

00:13:23,320 --> 00:13:33,320

Well, humans and primates have friction-rich skin on our hands and feet, which means that we have lines going in patterns on our fingertips and on our hands.

191

00:13:33,320 --> 00:13:40,320

What we're looking for is sort of a rough, really well-defined dermal ridge of the feet because they walk around barefoot.

192

00:13:40,320 --> 00:13:43,320

There's actually evidence of healed scars.

193

00:13:43,320 --> 00:13:50,320

And you can actually see it has some of the characteristics of human fingerprints, bifurcations, short ridges, ending ridges.

194

00:13:50,320 --> 00:13:51,320

That's right.

195

00:13:51,320 --> 00:14:00,320

For someone to mimic a footprint, I don't think that they would really take the time out to learn about dermal-rich patterns of primates and insert them into the footprint.

196

I like the fact that the scientific evidence behind the footprint cast with Dr. Meldrum is really scientifically based.

197

So my two members and I have viewed the Patterson-Gimlin film, the famous film from 1967.

I'm wondering if you have an opinion, what makes that video so real and do you have any direct physical evidence from that case?

Well, I do. Right here, in fact, these are examples of footprints from that film side.

We can watch this film and see the foot of whatever this is, go through the precise motions that would be necessary to leave these types of footprints.

In other words, these are not just some simple artifice, some prosthetic foot.

I've left some of my doubt behind. My mind is now open. I'm going to take a better look at seeing if we can find some actual evidence.

Hey, Rob. I'm Luke. So, Luke, tell us. We heard you saw Bigfoot.

We saw something step into the center of the road. When it stepped into our headlights, it kind of turned towards me to where I could tell that it had two legs, broad shoulders.

If you were a bigfoot, where would you walk?

I would probably walk along the water

363

because I mean, every animal needs water, right?

364

These are snapshot sniper game cameras.

365

00:23:16,160 --> 00:23:19,880

They use a 4.1 Sony megapixel digital camera.

366

00:23:19,880 --> 00:23:21,640

This is a nice, flat area here.

367

00:23:21,640 --> 00:23:25,800

So what I'd like to do is kind of clear this out,

368

dig it up a little bit.

369

And then I want you to just kind of sprinkle a little bit

video at night.

414

00:24:57,660 --> 00:24:59,980

One of the orders of business was to hang the meat

415

00:24:59,980 --> 00:25:03,540

that we had bought at the butcher shop to attract Bigfoot.

416

00:25:03,540 --> 00:25:05,380

We want to tie a rope from one tree to the other

417

00:25:05,380 --> 00:25:06,740

and we'll string it up.

418

00:25:06,740 --> 00:25:09,300

We all agreed we'd like to get it far enough away from camp

419

00:25:09,300 --> 00:25:10,700

that if a bear happened to show up,

420

00:25:10,700 --> 00:25:14,380

that we wouldn't have a bear in our camp.

421

Oh, shi-crap.

424

The tree was really big around.

429

It was not that easy to climb.

430

Crap.

Whoa.

433

I got it.

434

I guess he misunderstood what Autumn told him.

435

465

That's all right.

Autumn's attempts to call it and get a response

499

very clearly echoed from the hillsides.

500

00:28:07,580 --> 00:28:12,180

And this thing's voice did not echo from the hillside.

501

I'm not sure what that was.

502

It wasn't a barking.

503

It's been happening for about the last five minutes.

510

But we just got to make sure we got audio roll

511

in the whole time.

512

I think we got that recorded.

513

I think Autumn thought it was a big foot noise.

514

00:28:38,020 --> 00:28:41,220

We discussed it and she didn't say, oh, yeah, that's definitely

515

it.

516

00:28:41,720 --> 00:28:42,660

That's a Sasquatch.

517

00:28:42,660 --> 00:28:44,980

She just said it's the kind of sound

518

00:28:44,980 --> 00:28:46,820

that I'm used to hearing.

519

This is from E2V Technologies.

520

00:28:48,620 --> 00:28:50,700

It's an August thermal imaging camera.

521

00:28:50,700 --> 00:28:53,020

And it allows us to pick up the heat signature

522

00:28:53,020 --> 00:28:56,180

of any warm-bodied creature.

523

00:28:56,180 --> 00:28:57,220

You don't see anything?

524

00:28:57,220 --> 00:28:58,100

I don't see anything.

525

00:28:58,100 --> 00:28:59,220

OK.

526

Let's keep the thermal camera handy.

527

We didn't see anything.

528

00:29:03,620 --> 00:29:04,740

We haven't heard anything else.

529

So we're going to go back in the tents

530

and just listen for a little while

531

00:29:07,220 --> 00:29:09,500

until we can go to sleep or get woken up

532

It's good.

The light is on.

775

Bill, we're going to have you use your vocal cords.

I got to say that I'm just not believing in Bigfoot.

Regarding the sum total of everything that we've done,

831

just because you can fake evidence doesn't mean that all the evidence we've looked at

832

has been faked.

It's a very big assumption.

834

There are thousands, as I understand it, of these casts that have been collected.

835

If you're going to assume every one of them is a hoax,

that's a pretty big assumption as well.

I'm coming away from this thinking that,
