So this shows, from an aerial view, the ranch.

115

Our 512 acres lies in the center of the Uinta Basin.

116

The Uinta Basin, is that like one of the Indian tribes

117

or something?

The Uinta Basin?

119

00:04:40,540 --> 00:04:41,400

Yes.

120

00:04:41,440 --> 00:04:43,340

And it is named after the Ute tribe.

121

OK.

00:04:44,700 --> 00:04:49,740

And the entire property is surrounded by Ute tribal properties.

123

Well, so one question I have is, why is it called Skinwalker Ranch?

124

What is the lower of it, right?

125

00:04:55,720 --> 00:04:56,880

Well, it's a phenomenon.

126

That's what it is.

127

00:04:57,860 --> 00:04:59,320

It goes back hundreds of years.

128

Native Americans talk of shape-shifting demonic entities

129

00:05:03,860 --> 00:05:07,160

called Skinwalkers, they take on the form

130

00:05:07,200 --> 00:05:10,600

of a large, werewolf-like creature.

131

00:05:10,640 --> 00:05:13,600

And also a number of other shapes.

132

00:05:13,620 --> 00:05:17,360

Well, the Native American people, for generations,

133

00:05:17,400 --> 00:05:20,760

referred to this property as being in the path of the Skinwalker.

134

And they called the mesa that runs the expanse of this property

135

00:05:24,400 --> 00:05:25,900

Skinwalker Ranch.

136

00:05:25,940 --> 00:05:30,140

So that's the namesake of the property.

137

I see.

138

00:05:30,780 --> 00:05:31,440

I see.

139

As early as 1911, newspaper reports

140

profiled strange noises in the basin.

141

And the homesteaders started seeing unexplained phenomena.

142

And by 1979, there were a lot of UFO sightings in the basin

143

being documented.

144

People had really acute medical episodes.

145

Everything from incidents of nausea, perception

146

00:06:01,260 --> 00:06:06,200

altering experiences, vertigo, temporary paralysis.

147

And then the Sherman family in 1992 acquired the property

148

and were witness to some of the most disturbing events

149

on record.

Cattle mutilations.

151

These were daylight cattle mutilations.

152

We're talking very surgically precise dissections

153

of these cattle.

154

00:06:28,620 --> 00:06:30,420

They were drained of their blood.

155

And there was no blood to be found underneath them.

156

As much as 25% of the herd at that time were lost.

157

In 1996, the reports of the Sherman family

159

led billionaire Robert Bigelow to acquire the property

160

and to commence an unprecedented scientific study.

161

Bigelow came in with his team, National Institute of Discovery

162

00:07:00,180 --> 00:07:02,340

Science, or NIDS.

163

00:07:02,380 --> 00:07:05,420

That transitioned to Bigelow Aerospace Advanced Space

164

00:07:05,440 --> 00:07:08,680

Studies, which was funded by the US government,

165

00:07:08,700 --> 00:07:11,680

and kept highly confidential.

166

00:07:11,700 --> 00:07:13,440

It was a very aggressive effort.

167

00:07:13,480 --> 00:07:15,640

And as part of that, it was staffed at one time

168

00:07:15,680 --> 00:07:18,440

by dozens of professionals.

169

00:07:18,480 --> 00:07:21,020

Many of those professionals to this day

170

00:07:21,040 --> 00:07:25,480

refused to ever set foot on this ranch ever again

171

00:07:25,520 --> 00:07:27,080

for the rest of their lives.

172

00:07:27,120 --> 00:07:27,460

Really?

173

00:07:27,480 --> 00:07:28,120

Literally.

174

00:07:28,160 --> 00:07:29,160

That's right.

175

00:07:29,180 --> 00:07:29,660

Wow.

176

00:07:33,060 --> 00:07:35,360

That brings us to present day.

177

00:07:35,400 --> 00:07:38,360

In 2016, I purchased Skinwalker Ranch

178

00:07:38,380 --> 00:07:42,220

and assembled our team to carry this investigation forward

179

00:07:42,260 --> 00:07:43,620

into the next level.

180

00:07:43,660 --> 00:07:44,460

And what is that?

181

00:07:44,480 --> 00:07:48,460

We started deploying technology devised by Eric Bart,

182

00:07:48,500 --> 00:07:52,660

our principal investigator, related to monitoring and recording

183

00:07:52,700 --> 00:07:54,160

the events happening on the ranch.

184

00:07:54,200 --> 00:07:56,400

That makes sense.

185

00:07:56,440 --> 00:07:59,140

One of the first things that we captured,

186

00:07:59,180 --> 00:08:06,940

a 500-foot section of the mesa became totally illuminated.

187

00:08:06,960 --> 00:08:08,060

That's wild.

188

00:08:08,100 --> 00:08:12,900

We have seen several instances of compact light pillars,

189

00:08:12,940 --> 00:08:16,300

these columns of light that have appeared above the mesa.

190

00:08:16,340 --> 00:08:17,740

I'm looking at this picture, and I

191

00:08:17,780 --> 00:08:22,540

believe I'm seeing scatter off of the lower cloud cover, which

192

00:08:22,580 --> 00:08:24,880

implies that it's going upward.

193

00:08:24,920 --> 00:08:27,320

And there's no used car lot on the other side,

194

00:08:27,360 --> 00:08:30,020

where they're having a spotlight shining up.

195

00:08:30,060 --> 00:08:30,660

Nope.

196

00:08:30,680 --> 00:08:31,620

That's interesting.

197

00:08:31,660 --> 00:08:34,660

There is also a bright, luminous object that came into view

198

00:08:34,700 --> 00:08:36,060

in the Western sky.

199

00:08:36,180 --> 00:08:38,380

And disappeared behind the mesa.

200

00:08:38,420 --> 00:08:40,180

And it traveled at a speed that was not

201

00:08:40,220 --> 00:08:42,220

consistent with typical aircraft.

202

00:08:42,260 --> 00:08:46,260

Plus, at that time, there was no historical flight data

203

00:08:46,300 --> 00:08:50,060

showing commercial or private air traffic.

204

That's intriguing.

205

Indeed.

206

I really am curious as to why exactly am I here?

207

208

I think you, as an experimentalist,

210

you would bring to the table a lot more stringent protocols

211

212

OK.

213

We want your perspective.

214

We've noticed that when we bring new people onto the ranch,

215

00:09:11,780 --> 00:09:14,740

the ranch behaves differently than it normally does.

216

00:09:14,780 --> 00:09:16,140

It's just a place, right?

217

00:09:16,180 --> 00:09:21,520

I mean, and you guys think that it's going to behave when I

218

00:09:21,560 --> 00:09:22,820

show up there, right?

219

00:09:22,860 --> 00:09:24,560

Where there's smoke, there's fire.

220

00:09:24,580 --> 00:09:26,620

And there's things that go on on that ranch

221

00:09:26,660 --> 00:09:29,260

that I cannot get my head around.

222

00:09:29,300 --> 00:09:31,300

That ranch can push back.

223

00:09:31,340 --> 00:09:34,500

We'd like to fly you out to the property tomorrow.

224

00:09:34,620 --> 00:09:36,860

My brother will be escorting you so you

225

00:09:36,900 --> 00:09:38,460

can see the ranch firsthand.

226

00:09:38,500 --> 00:09:40,100

I'm not sure what we're going to find,

227

00:09:40,120 --> 00:09:42,060

but I can't wait to see what we're going to find.

228

00:09:42,100 --> 00:09:42,560

Great.

229

00:09:42,600 --> 00:09:51,100

So Travis, tell me honestly, do you think I'm crazy?

230

00:09:51,140 --> 00:09:55,940

Well, I think some of the stories are crazy.

231

But just because the stories sound crazy

232

00:09:58,620 --> 00:10:00,980

doesn't mean that there's not something to it.

233

So no, I don't think you're crazy, Brandon.

260

No one proceed on our way.

261

You do the best you can to minimize any danger or risk.

You make sure the maintenance is right.

286

But even then, there's still some things

287

288

And so for every flight I go on, I always say a little prayer.

289

And so we've got the weather data.

432

This is the transponders for the airplanes.

450

Right. So this is air traffic over the ranch right now.

452

that receives the signals being emitted by aircraft,

The purpose of the avionics receiver

455

is to help us discern between things of known origin,

592

Okay.

And they measure three fields, magnetic field,

596

static electric field,

597

00:25:02,220 --> 00:25:05,220

and then it measures radio frequency and microwaves,

598

00:25:05,260 --> 00:25:09,140

which is electromagnetic dynamic field.

599

00:25:09,180 --> 00:25:10,980

Whoa, whoa, it's going up.

600

00:25:11,020 --> 00:25:13,940

Hold on, let me step out of here.

601

There are always radio waves and microwaves

602

00:25:16,380 --> 00:25:17,380

bouncing around everywhere.

603

We use that for Wi-Fi, for your cell phone communications,

604

everything.

605

The biggest thing that piqued my interest

606

was the amount of energy in these microwaves we're measuring

607

That's significant.

And the direction continued to change.

610

It's coming from that direction.

What is doing that?

Look at that.

Sounds like it might be getting louder as we get higher.

614

Skinwalker Ranch is in the middle of nowhere,

and I couldn't see a cell phone tower as far as I could see.

617

I barely was getting a signal on my phone.

618

00:25:55,300 --> 00:25:58,260

And there were no Wi-Fi routers.

619

00:25:58,300 --> 00:26:00,260

Whew, man, that was a nice walk.

620

00:26:00,300 --> 00:26:03,260

Hey, hand me that meter.

621

00:26:03,300 --> 00:26:05,260

What you're saying, Eric?

622

00:26:05,300 --> 00:26:07,260

So we're at four and a half.

623

00:26:07,300 --> 00:26:08,260

Which way?

624

00:26:08,300 --> 00:26:10,260

This way.

625

00:26:10,300 --> 00:26:12,260

Yeah, this was pegging out.

626

00:26:12,300 --> 00:26:14,260

It's kind of along the region.

627

00:26:14,260 --> 00:26:17,220

Yeah, I mean, it's a real strong signal.

628

00:26:17,260 --> 00:26:19,220

What's it saying?

629

00:26:19,260 --> 00:26:23,220

Dude, it's in the milliwatts per meter squared.

630

00:26:23,260 --> 00:26:26,220

I mean, that's a significant amount of energy right there.

631

00:26:26,260 --> 00:26:28,220

We went to the top of the mason.

632

00:26:28,260 --> 00:26:31,220

What we found was even more.

633

00:26:31,260 --> 00:26:34,220

The electromagnetic radiation shouldn't be there.

634

00:26:34,260 --> 00:26:36,220

It's a real strong signal.

635

00:26:36,260 --> 00:26:39,220

And at dangerous levels, that could be harmful to humans.

636

00:26:39,260 --> 00:26:40,220

Oh!

637

00:26:40,260 --> 00:26:41,220

And it's shifted now.

638

00:26:41,260 --> 00:26:43,220

Now it's going to be a big wave.

639

00:26:43,220 --> 00:26:45,180

And it's all radiation.

640

00:26:45,220 --> 00:26:47,180

Yeah, it's all our air.

641

00:26:47,220 --> 00:26:48,180

Wow.

642

00:26:48,220 --> 00:26:51,180

The level of microwaves there that we detected

643

00:26:51,220 --> 00:26:56,180

were much stronger than what you get from your cell phone

644

00:26:56,220 --> 00:26:58,180

or your Wi-Fi routers.

645

00:26:58,220 --> 00:26:59,180

Random slides?

646

00:26:59,220 --> 00:27:02,180

And microwaves like that just don't exist in nature.

647

00:27:02,220 --> 00:27:06,180

So where was this microwave radiation coming from?

648

00:27:06,220 --> 00:27:08,180

Because I've never seen that.

649

00:27:08,220 --> 00:27:09,180

I don't know.

650

00:27:09,220 --> 00:27:10,180

We've been here what?

651

00:27:10,220 --> 00:27:11,180

An hour or two?

652

00:27:11,180 --> 00:27:12,140

We've been here what?

653

00:27:12,180 --> 00:27:14,140

An hour and already found something

654

00:27:14,180 --> 00:27:16,140

that I don't have any idea what's going on.

655

00:27:16,180 --> 00:27:18,140

I don't understand it.

656

00:27:24,180 --> 00:27:27,140

Well, I have no idea what we just saw,

657

00:27:27,180 --> 00:27:29,140

but we did see something.

658

00:27:29,180 --> 00:27:32,140

Yeah, not bad for your first few hours on the ranch, huh?

659

00:27:32,180 --> 00:27:33,140

Yeah, it wasn't bad.

660

00:27:33,180 --> 00:27:37,140

It wasn't a monster or an alien or a UFO,

661

00:27:37,180 --> 00:27:39,140

but it was still something weird.

662

00:27:39,180 --> 00:27:40,140

At least it was something.

663

00:27:40,140 --> 00:27:44,100

I certainly didn't expect to see anything the first day I got here,

664

00:27:44,140 --> 00:27:46,100

much less the first hour,

665

00:27:46,140 --> 00:27:49,100

but when we walked up on the Skinwalker Ridge,

666

00:27:49,140 --> 00:27:54,100

we saw microwave radiation at levels that were close to dangerous.

667

00:27:54,140 --> 00:27:55,100

Hey, guys, welcome back.

668

00:27:55,140 --> 00:27:57,100

And I wasn't expecting that.

669

00:27:57,140 --> 00:27:58,100

I can't explain it,

670

00:27:58,140 --> 00:28:01,100

but we're going to get to the bottom of it.

671

00:28:01,140 --> 00:28:05,100

There was some sort of source of electromagnetic radiation

672

00:28:05,140 --> 00:28:06,100

hitting the bottom of the mountain,

673

00:28:06,140 --> 00:28:08,100

and as we moved up the mountain,

674

00:28:08,100 --> 00:28:10,060

it seemed to get a little worse.

675

00:28:10,100 --> 00:28:11,060

And it was random, though,

676

00:28:11,100 --> 00:28:13,060

because we'd point the meter in one direction

677

00:28:13,100 --> 00:28:15,060

and it'd peg out, then it'd stop.

678

00:28:15,100 --> 00:28:17,060

Then we'd point it in another direction

679

00:28:17,100 --> 00:28:18,060

and it'd peg out again.

680

00:28:18,100 --> 00:28:20,060

I held my cell phone up to it.

681

00:28:20,100 --> 00:28:21,060

It wasn't the cell phone.

682

00:28:21,100 --> 00:28:24,060

Yeah, electronics didn't seem to be the source of it, which is...

683

00:28:24,100 --> 00:28:26,060

Well, there was two of them reacting the same way,

684

00:28:26,100 --> 00:28:28,060

so it wasn't a bad meter or anything like that.

685

00:28:28,100 --> 00:28:30,060

Well, but at one time,

686

00:28:30,100 --> 00:28:32,060

Eric was holding his point in completely opposite direction

687

00:28:32,100 --> 00:28:34,060

and both of them were begging out.

688

00:28:34,100 --> 00:28:35,060

It was just strange.

689

00:28:35,100 --> 00:28:37,060

Well, and that sort of thing doesn't just happen on the mesa

690

00:28:37,060 --> 00:28:39,020

or in the bowl like that.

691

00:28:39,060 --> 00:28:42,020

We'll come across times where we'll be carrying that equipment

692

00:28:42,060 --> 00:28:45,020

and all of a sudden it'll peg out for no reason.

693

00:28:45,060 --> 00:28:46,020

Yep.

694

00:28:46,060 --> 00:28:49,020

That's why we need to be measuring this stuff

695

00:28:49,060 --> 00:28:51,020

over a long period of time, right?

696

00:28:51,060 --> 00:28:52,020

Right.

697

00:28:52,060 --> 00:28:53,020

Exactly.

698

00:28:53,060 --> 00:28:54,020

Right.

699

00:28:54,060 --> 00:28:55,020

Exactly.

700

00:28:55,060 --> 00:28:57,020

So I'd like to get about 50 of those tri-field meters

701

00:28:57,060 --> 00:29:00,020

and put them in known locations around the ranch,

702

00:29:00,060 --> 00:29:02,020

like up on the hill where we just measured the crazy stuff,

703

00:29:02,060 --> 00:29:03,020

whatever that was,

704

00:29:03,060 --> 00:29:06,020

and have it real time right there being recorded.

705

00:29:06,060 --> 00:29:07,020

Yeah.

706

00:29:07,060 --> 00:29:09,020

Because if something like that's happening,

707

00:29:09,060 --> 00:29:10,020

like we just saw,

708

00:29:10,060 --> 00:29:12,020

I want to capture it in date and time

709

00:29:12,060 --> 00:29:14,020

because that way we might figure out where it's coming from,

710

00:29:14,060 --> 00:29:16,020

what it's doing, what's happening to it.

711

00:29:16,060 --> 00:29:17,020

Yeah.

712

00:29:17,060 --> 00:29:20,020

Beyond that, I would like to have a complete sweep

713

00:29:20,060 --> 00:29:23,020

of a radiation spectrum over the entire ranch.

714

00:29:23,060 --> 00:29:25,020

And that reminds me when they were doing the nuclear test

715

00:29:25,060 --> 00:29:26,020

down in Nevada.

716

00:29:26,060 --> 00:29:28,020

Are you talking about the atomic bomb testing?

717

00:29:28,060 --> 00:29:29,020

Yes.

718

00:29:29,060 --> 00:29:31,020

When they were doing that down in Nevada,

719

00:29:31,060 --> 00:29:34,020

the unibasin was actually a hotspot for the downwind.

720

00:29:34,060 --> 00:29:35,020

Oh, really?

721

00:29:35,060 --> 00:29:37,020

Some of the highest concentrations measured

722

00:29:37,060 --> 00:29:39,020

in the United States, I understand right.

723

00:29:39,060 --> 00:29:41,020

We're just 30 miles north of here.

724

00:29:41,060 --> 00:29:43,020

Well, we should look into that as well.

725

00:29:43,060 --> 00:29:45,020

We know what the decay products are

726

00:29:45,060 --> 00:29:47,020

from those particular tests,

727

00:29:47,060 --> 00:29:49,020

and that's all documented really well.

728

00:29:49,060 --> 00:29:51,020

We should look in to see how that may have affected the ranch.

729

00:29:51,060 --> 00:29:52,020

That's a great idea.

730

00:29:52,060 --> 00:29:53,020

Yup.

731

00:29:55,060 --> 00:29:57,020

Back during the Manhattan Project,

732

00:29:57,060 --> 00:30:02,020

as long ago as 1945 and on through the early 50s,

733

00:30:02,060 --> 00:30:07,020

a few hundred miles away at the Nevada test site,

734

00:30:07,060 --> 00:30:10,020

there was a above-ground nuclear test,

735

00:30:10,060 --> 00:30:13,020

meaning atomic bombs were set off.

736

00:30:13,060 --> 00:30:15,020

Nuclear fallout was thrown up into the sky.

737

00:30:15,060 --> 00:30:17,020

This is radioactive dirt,

738

00:30:17,060 --> 00:30:21,020

dust particles that then fly around with the air currents,

739

00:30:21,060 --> 00:30:24,020

and a lot of those winds brought this radiation

740

00:30:24,060 --> 00:30:28,020

over the UN-Tibasin where Skinwalker Ranch is.

741

00:30:28,060 --> 00:30:31,020

So back in the 50s, it's highly likely

742

00:30:31,060 --> 00:30:35,020

that radioactive fallout fell on this ranch,

743

00:30:35,020 --> 00:30:38,980

and some of it should still be there today.

744

00:30:39,020 --> 00:30:43,980

It's possible that exposure to radioactive fallout

745

00:30:44,020 --> 00:30:45,980

could cause people to have strange symptoms,

746

00:30:46,020 --> 00:30:47,980

maybe even hallucinations,

747

00:30:48,020 --> 00:30:49,980

and see things, hear things,

748

00:30:50,020 --> 00:30:52,980

and maybe even do things that would seem abnormal.

749

00:30:53,020 --> 00:30:55,980

There might be uranium or something in the dirt here.

750

00:30:56,020 --> 00:30:56,980

Right.

751

00:30:57,020 --> 00:30:58,980

So we need to have a complete radiation sweep

752

00:30:59,020 --> 00:30:59,980

so it would have a map.

753

00:31:00,020 --> 00:31:00,980

Sure.

754

00:31:01,020 --> 00:31:01,980

That's right.

755

00:31:02,020 --> 00:31:02,980

So we need to look for radon gas,

756

00:31:02,980 --> 00:31:04,940

because that's a byproduct of uranium decay.

757

00:31:04,980 --> 00:31:08,940

We should look for gammas and betas and alpha particles even.

758

00:31:08,980 --> 00:31:11,940

So we need to look for radioactive trace

759

00:31:11,980 --> 00:31:12,940

or something in the ground,

760

00:31:12,980 --> 00:31:14,940

and so we should see what happens

761

00:31:14,980 --> 00:31:17,940

when we do something like digging a hole.

762

00:31:17,980 --> 00:31:21,940

And we create a precisely controlled experiment

763

00:31:21,980 --> 00:31:23,940

where we're digging to this depth

764

00:31:23,980 --> 00:31:25,940

and to this size and this volume

765

00:31:25,980 --> 00:31:28,940

and every five feet you do a gamma test.

766

00:31:28,980 --> 00:31:29,940

Right.

767

00:31:29,980 --> 00:31:31,940

We could be looking at the electromagnetic spectrum

768

00:31:31,940 --> 00:31:34,900

while we're doing it in case there is some kind of strange

769

00:31:34,940 --> 00:31:36,900

microwave phenomena that's occurring.

770

00:31:36,940 --> 00:31:41,900

Look, scientists by nature want to explain everything.

771

00:31:41,940 --> 00:31:43,900

Well, see, here's the problem is

772

00:31:43,940 --> 00:31:46,900

those of us that don't think in a scientific mind all the time,

773

00:31:46,940 --> 00:31:48,900

you talk about a feeling or, you know,

774

00:31:48,940 --> 00:31:51,900

something to heebie-jeebies, whatever you want to call it,

775

00:31:51,940 --> 00:31:53,900

you know, slay people terms.

776

00:31:53,940 --> 00:31:54,900

I mean, I'm not a scientist,

777

00:31:54,940 --> 00:31:56,900

but I've spent a ton of time here.

778

00:31:56,940 --> 00:31:59,900

I know for a fact, crap goes down

779

00:31:59,940 --> 00:32:01,900

when people start disturbing me.

780

00:32:01,940 --> 00:32:05,900

When they start digging, that's the trigger.

781

00:32:05,940 --> 00:32:08,900

You know, if you're going to be a part of this,

782

00:32:08,940 --> 00:32:12,900

I have to unequivocally say no digging.

783

00:32:22,940 --> 00:32:26,900

You guys talk about every time somebody digs out here

784

00:32:26,940 --> 00:32:28,900

on the ranch, we're like asking about where to

785

00:32:28,940 --> 00:32:29,900

and where not to dig.

786

00:32:29,900 --> 00:32:33,860

It seems to me like that's a big blink in sign saying

787

00:32:33,900 --> 00:32:36,860

if you want to create the phenomena to manifest itself,

788

00:32:36,900 --> 00:32:37,860

you go and dig somewhere.

789

00:32:37,900 --> 00:32:40,860

I'm not the type that wants to go looking for trouble.

790

00:32:40,900 --> 00:32:42,860

There's enough going on around this place

791

00:32:42,900 --> 00:32:45,860

where I'm not looking to stir up trouble.

792

00:32:45,900 --> 00:32:46,860

I mean, I hear you.

793

00:32:46,900 --> 00:32:47,860

Right.

794

00:32:47,900 --> 00:32:52,860

The history of the place has said that when you dig,

795

00:32:52,900 --> 00:32:54,860

bad stuff happens.

796

00:32:54,900 --> 00:32:58,860

I heard about not digging as soon as I came onto the property.

797

00:32:58,860 --> 00:33:01,820

It goes back to previous owners of the property.

798

00:33:01,860 --> 00:33:05,820

They said that when you dig, you're disturbed the earth.

799

00:33:05,860 --> 00:33:10,820

That is what seemed to trigger whatever phenomenon is here

800

00:33:10,860 --> 00:33:12,820

and caused harm.

801

00:33:12,860 --> 00:33:16,820

And that's not what I'm looking to do here.

802

00:33:16,860 --> 00:33:17,820

Well, how about you, Eric?

803

00:33:17,860 --> 00:33:20,820

Well, do you want to go out and start digging holes?

804

00:33:20,860 --> 00:33:22,820

You're the eyes and ears of the place.

805

00:33:22,860 --> 00:33:25,820

I'm doing my very best not to be superstitious about this.

806

00:33:25,820 --> 00:33:31,780

I am intensely curious about what might be below this ranch.

807

00:33:31,820 --> 00:33:35,780

But I do not consider my own curiosity

808

00:33:35,820 --> 00:33:37,780

and entitlement to knowledge.

809

00:33:37,820 --> 00:33:40,780

There are some contexts in which perhaps even I

810

00:33:40,820 --> 00:33:43,780

shouldn't know about what's going on on the ranch,

811

00:33:43,820 --> 00:33:46,780

but until I'm advised to that end,

812

00:33:46,820 --> 00:33:50,780

I'm proceeding as if this is an observational experimental undertaking.

813

00:33:50,820 --> 00:33:52,780

Well, I think that's what it has to be.

814

00:33:52,820 --> 00:33:54,780

My grandmother used to always say,

815

00:33:54,780 --> 00:33:57,740

a hornet's nest isn't interesting until you poke it with a stick.

816

00:33:57,780 --> 00:34:00,740

Okay, well, what kind of hornets were you dealing with?

817

00:34:00,780 --> 00:34:02,740

Well, hornets that sting,

818

00:34:02,780 --> 00:34:04,740

and so you use a really long stick

819

00:34:04,780 --> 00:34:06,740

and then you drop a stick and run really fast.

820

00:34:06,780 --> 00:34:09,740

Who's going to do the digging then?

821

00:34:09,780 --> 00:34:10,740

Well, that's a good question.

822

00:34:10,780 --> 00:34:11,740

I don't know the answer to that.

823

00:34:11,780 --> 00:34:15,740

Maybe we get volunteers that don't mind the risk.

824

00:34:15,780 --> 00:34:17,740

It's impossible to explain the risk.

825

00:34:17,780 --> 00:34:19,740

There's one person that knows the risk

826

00:34:19,780 --> 00:34:23,740

and he's sitting right there, right?

827

00:34:23,740 --> 00:34:26,700

Having been a person that's done a lot of digging on this ranch,

828

00:34:26,740 --> 00:34:28,700

the more serious of digging I do,

829

00:34:28,740 --> 00:34:31,700

the more serious of consequences that follow.

830

00:34:35,740 --> 00:34:38,700

I didn't believe in the paranormal when I came out on this ranch

831

00:34:38,740 --> 00:34:41,700

and I paid a pretty hefty price.

832

00:34:41,740 --> 00:34:43,700

When they told me not to dig,

833

00:34:43,740 --> 00:34:45,700

I just thought it was ridiculous.

834

00:34:45,740 --> 00:34:50,700

And so one day I decided to do some digging

835

00:34:50,740 --> 00:34:52,700

and then three days after,

836

00:34:52,700 --> 00:34:56,660

I noticed that I had a goose egg on the back of my head.

837

00:34:56,700 --> 00:35:00,660

By the time I let my wife finally take me to the emergency room,

838

00:35:00,700 --> 00:35:04,660

the goose egg had actually spread through my entire head.

839

00:35:04,700 --> 00:35:07,660

My scalp separated from my skull.

840

00:35:07,700 --> 00:35:09,660

The pain is so excruciating,

841

00:35:09,700 --> 00:35:13,660

I've never felt anything like it before in my life.

842

00:35:13,700 --> 00:35:16,660

The doctors had no idea what caused it.

843

00:35:16,700 --> 00:35:18,660

They didn't know how to fix it.

844

00:35:18,700 --> 00:35:20,660

Basically they were telling me what happened to me

845

00:35:20,660 --> 00:35:22,620

was medically impossible

846

00:35:22,660 --> 00:35:24,620

and it caused me a severe injury

847

00:35:24,660 --> 00:35:28,620

that to this day I'm still having some repercussions with.

848

00:35:28,660 --> 00:35:30,620

I know that I was warned,

849

00:35:30,660 --> 00:35:32,620

hey, don't do digging.

850

00:35:32,660 --> 00:35:34,620

I didn't have this preconceived idea in my mind

851

00:35:34,660 --> 00:35:36,620

that if I dug, something bad was gonna happen

852

00:35:36,660 --> 00:35:39,620

because I didn't believe it.

853

00:35:40,660 --> 00:35:44,620

Enough things have happened to myself, to the equipment.

854

00:35:44,660 --> 00:35:47,620

It is a possibility that they are correlated.

855

00:35:47,660 --> 00:35:49,620

This is real stuff.

856

00:35:49,620 --> 00:35:51,580

This is nothing to take for granted.

857

00:35:51,620 --> 00:35:53,580

You're talking about health and well-being.

858

00:35:53,620 --> 00:35:55,580

This is no nonsense.

859

00:35:57,620 --> 00:35:58,580

I get it.

860

00:35:58,620 --> 00:36:00,580

These guys are nervous.

861

00:36:00,620 --> 00:36:02,580

They've dug, they've seen things happen.

862

00:36:02,620 --> 00:36:04,580

Tom's injury was real serious.

863

00:36:04,620 --> 00:36:07,580

It scares them a little bit and they want to be careful.

864

00:36:07,620 --> 00:36:08,580

And I get that.

865

00:36:08,620 --> 00:36:10,580

I don't want anybody to get hurt.

866

00:36:10,620 --> 00:36:14,580

But I'm not sure what caused the injury.

867

00:36:14,620 --> 00:36:16,580

And I think we're only gonna find that out

868

00:36:16,620 --> 00:36:19,580

by doing a lot more experimentation.

869

00:36:19,620 --> 00:36:22,580

We are interacting with this somehow or other.

870

00:36:22,620 --> 00:36:24,580

And so we need to calibrate

871

00:36:24,620 --> 00:36:26,580

what we're doing to the experiment.

872

00:36:26,620 --> 00:36:28,580

Look, if we're gonna dig, we're gonna test this.

873

00:36:28,620 --> 00:36:31,580

Let's just do it in a way that we're keeping the possibility

874

00:36:31,620 --> 00:36:34,580

it may be dangerous and let's put some safety nets up

875

00:36:34,620 --> 00:36:37,580

just in case.

876

00:36:37,620 --> 00:36:39,580

Jim, what do you think about it?

877

00:36:39,620 --> 00:36:42,580

I think we should dig because I want to learn more

878

00:36:42,620 --> 00:36:44,580

about what it means to dig.

879

00:36:44,620 --> 00:36:45,580

I don't see an anomaly happen.

880

00:36:45,620 --> 00:36:47,580

It is a warning.

881

00:36:47,580 --> 00:36:50,540

I see it as an invitation.

882

00:36:50,580 --> 00:36:53,540

Look, it's not my piece of property.

883

00:36:53,580 --> 00:36:55,540

You've been brought here obviously for a purpose.

884

00:36:55,580 --> 00:37:00,540

If the owner of the property says I want this to happen,

885

00:37:00,580 --> 00:37:02,540

then I'm on board.

886

00:37:02,580 --> 00:37:06,540

We ought to see if we can get branded on the line

887

00:37:06,580 --> 00:37:08,540

and talk to him about some of the stuff

888

00:37:08,580 --> 00:37:09,540

that we've talked about.

889

00:37:09,580 --> 00:37:11,540

Eric, do you think we can get him on video chat

890

00:37:11,580 --> 00:37:13,540

or something like that and see if we can get him an update?

891

00:37:13,580 --> 00:37:14,540

Shall I bring him up now?

892

00:37:14,580 --> 00:37:15,540

All right.

893

00:37:17,580 --> 00:37:20,540

All right.

894

00:37:28,580 --> 00:37:29,540

Hey, Brandon.

895

00:37:29,580 --> 00:37:30,540

Greetings, team.

896

00:37:30,580 --> 00:37:31,540

How are you?

897

00:37:31,580 --> 00:37:32,540

I'm great.

898

00:37:32,580 --> 00:37:33,540

How are you?

899

00:37:33,580 --> 00:37:34,540

Good to see you.

900

00:37:34,580 --> 00:37:35,540

I'm glad that you've passed me in

901

00:37:35,580 --> 00:37:38,540

and I'm wondering how the investigation is progressing.

902

00:37:38,580 --> 00:37:42,540

Well, it's been an eventful day as the ranch usually does.

903

00:37:42,580 --> 00:37:43,540

When we bring new people on,

904

00:37:43,580 --> 00:37:46,540

it seems to liven up a little bit

905

00:37:46,540 --> 00:37:50,500

and we caught some pretty interesting things today.

906

00:37:50,540 --> 00:37:52,500

Yeah, Brandon, when we were up on the mace,

907

00:37:52,540 --> 00:37:54,500

the tri-field meters were measuring

908

00:37:54,540 --> 00:37:58,500

really strong transient microwave fields

909

00:37:58,540 --> 00:38:01,500

and the power that we were picking up

910

00:38:01,540 --> 00:38:04,500

was on the verge of being dangerous levels.

911

00:38:04,540 --> 00:38:08,500

So I'd like to get some more precise measurements made.

912

00:38:08,540 --> 00:38:10,500

Yeah, that's disturbing

913

00:38:10,540 --> 00:38:12,500

and that is also consistent

914

00:38:12,540 --> 00:38:15,500

with what we've experienced in the past.

915

00:38:15,500 --> 00:38:18,460

So what are the three items going forward

916

00:38:18,500 --> 00:38:21,460

as we launch into this phase of the investigation?

917

00:38:21,500 --> 00:38:23,460
