and I ended up getting very, very sick, hospitalized.

And to this day, my doctor still haven't come up with an explanation.

Now, here's the thing.

130

So I think we have not ruled out the possibility

133

that we have something active beneath the surface of this property.

We have some evidence, at least to support the idea

that there may be a magnetic field generating device

136

or devices or something located on or beneath this property

137

So until we have done all the non-invasive work,

139

I don't think we're ready to start digging.

140

That's it's more my mindset.

141

There's no data that's been on the table

142

that tells us digging is correlated to anything that causes events.

But a lot of the things bad happen more often when you dig.

Look, we're just trying to do the best that we can out here.

149

Eric, if we set out and we do all of these different tests

150

and use those to guide us as to a point that we could dig,

would you feel comfortable with that?

152

I think that's the approach that I'm advocating.

is we need some experts to come in here to do a full sweep of the ranch

for safety, measure radiological and RF and microwaves on the whole ranch.

Let's make sure that it's safe just to be here.

167

We're not getting slow cooked or something.

Yeah, we can do that.

You know, we've got people that can come to the ranch,

170

do a full sweep of radio frequency radiation tomorrow.

That sounds great to me.

What do you guys think?

173

Yeah, it sounds good.

Okay.

So how many people actually have access to the ranch?

179

Very few.

180

00:08:19,000 --> 00:08:20,000

No.

181

00:08:20,000 --> 00:08:26,000

We do our very best to try to keep the integrity of the science that's going on here.

182

00:08:26,000 --> 00:08:32,000

So actually today it's got the team out there doing the radiation sweep and the RF sweep.

183

Good.

184

00:08:33,000 --> 00:08:36,000

Following our discussion in the command center yesterday,

185

we invited two different companies up to the ranch.

186

00:08:38,000 --> 00:08:41,000

The first will look for dangerous levels of radiation,

187

00:08:41,000 --> 00:08:43,000

and the second will look for microwaves.

188

00:08:43,000 --> 00:08:47,000

Now, if everything checks out, then we'll be safe to conduct some more focused experiments

189

and find out where the strange electromagnetic energy on the ranch is coming from.

190

00:08:52,000 --> 00:08:55,000

We're going to continue to head across the ranch.

191

00:08:55,000 --> 00:08:57,000

You can see the old building.

192

00:08:57,000 --> 00:09:00,000

This is what we call homestead 2.

193

00:09:00,000 --> 00:09:10,000

There are specific places on the ranch where I've even personally witnessed some shadow figures.

194

I've heard voices on multiple occasions.

195

00:09:14,000 --> 00:09:18,000

I've had individuals with me that heard the voices too.

196

00:09:18,000 --> 00:09:23,000

The interesting thing is I have no idea whether it's an actual audible voice

197

00:09:23,000 --> 00:09:26,000

or something that's playing out in my head.

198

00:09:26,000 --> 00:09:30,000

It was as if someone was standing right in front of me talking to me,

199

00:09:30,000 --> 00:09:34,000

telling me to either stop what I was doing or to leave.

200

Now, is this all Indian reservation part of the ranch here or is this part of the other property?

201

Ute Tribe is just right up on top of this hill right here.

202

00:09:45,000 --> 00:09:50,000

The fascinating thing is there's a lot of Native Americans that to this day,

203

00:09:50,000 --> 00:09:54,000

they tell us that they look to the east, they won't even acknowledge that the ranch exists.

204

00:09:54,000 --> 00:09:56,000

That's strange.

205

00:09:56,000 --> 00:10:01,000

The Utes and the Navajos actually have quite a story past.

206

00:10:01,000 --> 00:10:05,000

They originally started off as allies and trading partners,

207

00:10:05,000 --> 00:10:10,000

and then as generations went on, relationships started to become strained.

208

00:10:10,000 --> 00:10:14,000

So much so that when the U.S. government sets soldiers out to the southwest

209

00:10:14,000 --> 00:10:18,000

to protect the white settlers from the Navajo tribe,

210

00:10:18,000 --> 00:10:22,000

the Ute tribe joined forces with the soldiers.

211

00:10:22,000 --> 00:10:29,000

And as retribution, the Navajos actually cursed this land with evil spirits known as skinwalkers,

212

00:10:29,000 --> 00:10:34,000

which are evil entities that can take many different forms and shapes.

213

00:10:35,000 --> 00:10:40,000

So where's the north border on the other side of the mesa? How far does it go?

214

00:10:40,000 --> 00:10:42,000

Just to the back cliff over there.

215

00:10:42,000 --> 00:10:43,000

Oh, really?

216

00:10:43,000 --> 00:10:44,000

Yeah, just short of it.

217

00:10:44,000 --> 00:10:47,000

It looks different from the...

218

00:10:47,000 --> 00:10:49,000

Hey, Thomas, do you copy?

219

00:10:51,000 --> 00:10:53,000

Yeah, Bryant, go ahead.

220

00:10:53,000 --> 00:10:56,000

We're up at the sinkhole doing this radiation sweep.

221

00:10:56,000 --> 00:10:58,000

You guys should get it just straight over here.

222

00:10:58,000 --> 00:11:00,000

We found some crazy stuff you're gonna want to see.

223

00:11:05,000 --> 00:11:12,000

While Tom Winerton and I are taking a tour of the ranch, we get this emergency call,

224

00:11:12,000 --> 00:11:18,000

and it's from the team that's up on the mesa scanning for harmful levels of radiation and microwaves.

225

00:11:18,000 --> 00:11:21,000

All right, we will head straight over there. You'll see us soon.

226

00:11:21,000 --> 00:11:26,000

My first thought was whether or not the guys were getting the kinds of crazy readings we measured yesterday

227

00:11:26,000 --> 00:11:28,000

when we were up on the mesa.

228

00:11:29,000 --> 00:11:33,000

I mean, that's the significant amount of energy right there.

229

00:11:33,000 --> 00:11:37,000

We found electromagnetic radiation that could be harmful to humans.

230

00:11:37,000 --> 00:11:38,000

Oh!

231

00:11:38,000 --> 00:11:41,000

And it's shifted now. Now it's going from that direction.

232

00:11:41,000 --> 00:11:43,000

And it's all radiation.

233

00:11:43,000 --> 00:11:44,000

Yes.

234

00:11:48,000 --> 00:11:50,000

I see them standing over there.

235

00:11:51,000 --> 00:11:53,000

We gotta walk from here on out.

236

00:11:58,000 --> 00:12:00,000

Hey, guys.

237

00:12:10,000 --> 00:12:11,000

Hey, guys.

238

00:12:11,000 --> 00:12:14,000

The sinkhole is right over here, obviously, Thomas knows.

239

00:12:14,000 --> 00:12:18,000

These guys picked up stuff I thought you guys would be interested in seeing yourselves.

240

00:12:19,000 --> 00:12:20,000

Wow.

241

00:12:20,000 --> 00:12:21,000

Look at that.

242

00:12:22,000 --> 00:12:24,000

Oh, there's Jim down in there.

243

00:12:24,000 --> 00:12:26,000

How far does it go?

244

00:12:26,000 --> 00:12:28,000

It goes down quite a ways.

245

00:12:29,000 --> 00:12:32,000

We get up there and there's a hole in the ground.

246

00:12:32,000 --> 00:12:34,000

It's kind of like a little cave.

247

00:12:34,000 --> 00:12:37,000

And it's big enough for three or four people to get down in.

248

00:12:37,000 --> 00:12:41,000

This one is interesting just because air flows out of it and things like that.

249

00:12:41,000 --> 00:12:42,000

Yeah, you can feel it.

250

00:12:43,000 --> 00:12:46,000

We've had a few people that climbed down in that hole

251

00:12:46,000 --> 00:12:50,000

and experienced some pretty extreme vertigo and nauseousness.

252

00:12:50,000 --> 00:12:57,000

The sinkhole is a spot that I found one day when I was hiking up above Homestead 2.

253

00:12:57,000 --> 00:13:00,000

And the thing that made it remarkable the first time I found it was

254

00:13:00,000 --> 00:13:03,000

there is a cavity that continues down.

255

00:13:03,000 --> 00:13:06,000

We've been trying to figure out how far down there it goes.

256

00:13:06,000 --> 00:13:11,000

And it was just blasting cold air, just like an air conditioner.

257

00:13:11,000 --> 00:13:16,000

Myself as well as several other individuals that I was there to witness

258

00:13:16,000 --> 00:13:19,000

have had experiences when we climbed down inside that hole.

259

00:13:19,000 --> 00:13:22,000

You know, I kind of shrugged it off as heat stroke at the time,

260

00:13:22,000 --> 00:13:25,000

but then other individuals that we've taken up there since then

261

00:13:25,000 --> 00:13:27,000

have experienced the same thing.

262

00:13:28,000 --> 00:13:33,000

Jeff is with Semper and he's measuring radio wave frequencies and things like that.

263

00:13:33,000 --> 00:13:37,000

Travis and Kase here with Qualtech, they're doing a full radiation sweep.

264

00:13:37,000 --> 00:13:38,000

All right.

265

00:13:38,000 --> 00:13:42,000

We're also, while we're in there, looking for VOCs and other chemicals.

266

00:13:42,000 --> 00:13:43,000

Such as?

267

00:13:43,000 --> 00:13:44,000

Yes.

268

00:13:44,000 --> 00:13:46,000

Such as nerve agents or toxic chemicals.

269

00:13:46,000 --> 00:13:47,000

Okay.

270

00:13:47,000 --> 00:13:51,000

And we actually got a really high hit on our VOC levels.

271

00:13:51,000 --> 00:13:56,000

About 3,600 parts per billion, which is a really high abnormality.

272

00:13:56,000 --> 00:13:58,000

Dangerous level or just high?

273

00:13:58,000 --> 00:13:59,000

Dangerous levels, certainly.

274

00:13:59,000 --> 00:14:01,000

That was a real quick hit.

275

00:14:01,000 --> 00:14:04,000

It was almost as if there was a ventilation that plumed.

276

00:14:04,000 --> 00:14:06,000

We got a reading off of that and then...

277

00:14:06,000 --> 00:14:07,000

It disappeared.

278

00:14:07,000 --> 00:14:08,000

It disappeared.

279

00:14:08,000 --> 00:14:09,000

Really?

280

00:14:09,000 --> 00:14:10,000

Yep.

281

00:14:10,000 --> 00:14:11,000

That's intriguing.

282

00:14:11,000 --> 00:14:16,000

There are all sorts of volatile organic compounds like formaldehyde, benzene.

283

00:14:16,000 --> 00:14:19,000

But this synco is pretty far away from anything man-made,

284

00:14:19,000 --> 00:14:22,000

so their presence here is really strange.

285

00:14:23,000 --> 00:14:25,000

The VOC level, I thought that was significant.

286

All right, we got normal level here.

You guys got all the measurements that y'all plan to take up here, right?

We've seen some stuff that we expected to see,

some stuff that we didn't expect to see.

Our concerns seems to be around these underground emissions.

375

That's where we're seeing the most of these phenomenonons.

I want to tell you, we're still going to be looking for more holes to crawl into

Correct.

In some of the confined spaces,

This is going to primarily work from a rheological perspective.

If you're getting above the normal background radiation exposure,

we want to know.

397

It's looking for stuff that you are immediately, your body is in.

398

So, anything that's really in the window of harmful to humans

399

or impactful to humans, our instrumentation sets will see.

400

Okay, guys, so we'll hand these out to you guys.

Travis, there's yours.

I mean, you know, the sinkhole sits is right up above Homestead 2,

423

which has been the reported site of a lot of this paranormal activity

424

that Bigelow team reported.

Oh.

426

00:20:45,000 --> 00:20:49,000

In 2016, I purchased Skinwalker Ranch from Robert Bigelow.

427

Robert Bigelow is best known as the billionaire entrepreneur,

428

00:20:53,000 --> 00:20:56,000

real estate developer, and now aerospace entrepreneur.

429

00:20:56,000 --> 00:21:03,000

Mr. Bigelow also had an interest in everything from UFOs to the paranormal.

430

00:21:03,000 --> 00:21:08,000

In the early 90s, Robert Bigelow bought Skinwalker Ranch.

431

00:21:09,000 --> 00:21:14,000

His team conducted a very aggressive scientific investigation.

432

00:21:14,000 --> 00:21:19,000

The Bigelow team ended up having all sorts of strange things happen.

433

00:21:19,000 --> 00:21:24,000

They started seeing everything from electromagnetic anomalies

434

00:21:24,000 --> 00:21:28,000

centered around the old homesteads, cattle mutilations.

435

00:21:28,000 --> 00:21:35,000

It involves the full gamut of unexplained phenomena that we continue to monitor.

436

00:21:35,000 --> 00:21:40,000

Most of what Mr. Bigelow and his team studied and reported on the ranch

437

00:21:40,000 --> 00:21:46,000

remains either classified or confidential and is locked away.

438

You guys got everything?

439

00:21:52,000 --> 00:21:53,000

Yeah.

440

00:21:53,000 --> 00:21:54,000

All right.

441

If we don't, it's a long way back.

442

Later that day, after we got the all clear that the ranch was safe to explore,

443

Dragon, I guess I'll ride with you.

Dragon, Jim, Sigala, Tom, Winnerton and I decided to do a good old fashioned steak out near the Mesa.

445

From what I've observed, the Mesa is pretty much ground zero for most of the strange activity that's been happening on the ranch.

446

and glowing effects that people have reported seeing over the years.

This is perfect.

We see the Mesa, the moon's going to be giving us some back lighting.

451

Let's start grabbing stuff out and putting it up.

452

Let's start hooking up the experiments.

453

I want the telescope up, get the sound system set up.

454

We have a lot of diagnostic equipment.

455

We can measure radio and microwaves.

456

We can measure magnetic field.

457

We can measure infrared.

458

00:22:51,000 --> 00:22:56,000

We've got a lot of different things that we're going to use tonight and see what we can find out.

459

We'll move here watching aliens, predator, what?

460

We're going to hook the cameras up to it so we can look at it on the big screen.

461

Cool.

462

So the 512 acres of the ranch are under 24 hour video surveillance by dozens of security and surveillance cameras.

463

And Eric keeps track of these around the clock and is able to view them from the command center.

464

Hey Eric, are you there?

465

00:23:21,000 --> 00:23:22,000

Copy, yeah.

466

Okay, so you can see us then?

467

I can see everything you're doing.

468

00:23:27,000 --> 00:23:32,000

Eric Bard makes sure that pretty much every inch of this ranch is covered by a camera somewhere.

469

Although he can pretty much see everything we're doing tonight from the command center,

470

00:23:36,000 --> 00:23:41,000

he won't be able to get the kind of close up images and information we can get.

471

00:23:41,000 --> 00:23:44,000

And he certainly wouldn't be able to investigate it as quickly as we can.

472

00:23:47,000 --> 00:23:50,000

Let's bring the lights down now.

473

00:23:50,000 --> 00:23:53,000

And let's start looking at the mesa in the infrared.

474

That is so cool.

475

00:23:56,000 --> 00:23:58,000

That is really cool.

476

00:23:58,000 --> 00:24:02,000

As humans, we're only able to see light in a relatively narrow spectrum.

477

00:24:02,000 --> 00:24:07,000

But by using an infrared camera, we're going to be able to see things that are further out on that spectrum

478

00:24:07,000 --> 00:24:11,000

that we otherwise might not be able to see with our naked eyes.

479

00:24:12,000 --> 00:24:13,000

That's amazing.

480

00:24:13,000 --> 00:24:14,000

Isn't that awesome?

481

00:24:14,000 --> 00:24:15,000

That's a good view right there.

482

00:24:15,000 --> 00:24:17,000

Yeah, that's a really good view.

483

00:24:18,000 --> 00:24:19,000

Hey Jim's got the laser.

484

00:24:19,000 --> 00:24:20,000

There we are.

485

00:24:20,000 --> 00:24:22,000

So I'm going to go walk out here with the laser?

486

00:24:22,000 --> 00:24:23,000

Yep.

487

00:24:24,000 --> 00:24:25,000

You ready?

488

00:24:25,000 --> 00:24:26,000

Yep.

489

00:24:27,000 --> 00:24:35,000

We brought a very large green laser that allows us to light up a beam all the way up to the mesa.

490

00:24:35,000 --> 00:24:38,000

You can put the laser spot right there, then I'll look right at the spot.

491

00:24:38,000 --> 00:24:39,000

Come on here, I won't hurt anybody.

492

00:24:39,000 --> 00:24:45,000

That way we can focus our infrared cameras on that spot so we know exactly where we are.

493

00:24:45,000 --> 00:24:47,000

Perfect. Right there.

494

00:24:47,000 --> 00:24:48,000

There it is.

495

00:24:48,000 --> 00:24:49,000

There it is.

496

00:24:49,000 --> 00:24:50,000

There's two.

497

00:24:51,000 --> 00:24:52,000

Look.

498

00:24:52,000 --> 00:24:53,000

Do that again.

499

How is it doing that?

500

When we shine the laser on the mesa and saw it and the image of the camera, we also noticed there was a smaller image just above it.

501

That is so weird.

What the heck is that?

You know what it is, it's reflecting off of the surface.

The actual laser spot that's coming back and hitting the camera is the little one.

506

I do.

You interested in going up on the mesa while these guys sit back and monitor it?

510

Well let's go get Eric and let's head up there.

512

You ready man?

The rocks in the soil of the Skinwalker Ridge Mesa have an extremely high amount of some kind of crystalline material.

519

So I'm wondering if there's a reflection happening up on the mesa that's causing the laser beam to split into two points of light instead of one.

520

00:26:25,000 --> 00:26:28,000

There are these little white discs everywhere.

521

00:26:28,000 --> 00:26:30,000

I don't know what it is.

522

00:26:30,000 --> 00:26:33,000

You're getting pretty close to that laser.

523

00:26:33,000 --> 00:26:35,000

You'll have to start making a descent.

524

00:26:45,000 --> 00:26:48,000

I'm going to turn and set right here.

525

00:26:48,000 --> 00:26:51,000

Alright, and now I'm going to kill this light.

526

There we go.

Alright.

Does the laser seem like it lost intensity?

529

The laser's lost power.

And it went out just now.

I'll go back up there and see what's going on.

I just replaced the batteries in this laser.

543

There's no way that it's the batteries that are causing it to malfunction.

544

I tried everything to get it to come back on again,

545

but it's just one of those million things that happens at Skinwalker Ranch.

Buttons pushed in and everything.

It's dead.

548

Hey Travis?

549

The laser is dead.

I think it's crazy that as soon as we got here, the laser went out.

552

Hardly the first time something like that's happened here.

So, you know what we should do is we should scan across the mesa and see if we see something else with the camera.

So we're out here on the mesa investigating the strange lights and the glowing effects that other people have been reporting over the years.

We can only see them with the infrared camera.

Right now, something's happening.

What are we doing with this?

636

What we're attempting to do is measure electromagnetic energy or frequencies.

637

And what this board allows us to do is to isolate to one single direction or one plane.

638

We need to find out if the glowing effect we can see on the infrared monitor is connected to any kind of RF or radio frequency radiation.

639

This experiment will help us determine the direction of the radiation that we're detecting now and maybe help us find the direction of the source.

640

Alright, so I would say we hold it up about waist high.

641

Right about that's good.

642

00:33:02,000 --> 00:33:04,000

Now, Jim, there you go.

643

Alright.

644

00:33:06,000 --> 00:33:07,000

Sweep.

645

There you go, good.

646

00:33:08,000 --> 00:33:10,000

And keep sweep in search of dropping off.

Alright.

The tri-field meters are little RF radios for the little antenna.

649

Just like your FM and AM radio in your car or at home or wherever.

650

It's a tuner.

651

00:33:20,000 --> 00:33:21,000

Yup, it's dropping off.

652

00:33:21,000 --> 00:33:23,000

Alright, so it's not coming from that direction.

653

00:33:23,000 --> 00:33:24,000

So let's go the other way.

654

00:33:24,000 --> 00:33:25,000

Rotate the other way now.

655

00:33:25,000 --> 00:33:29,000

And this thing is set to listen to all the channels it wants and just measure the signal.

656

It's coming from right at where we saw that flash.

657

00:33:34,000 --> 00:33:36,000

Keep coming around.

658

00:33:37,000 --> 00:33:39,000

Alright, that's dropped off again.

659

The interesting thing is when we pointed the RF meter in a certain direction with the reflector behind it, it maxed out.

660

That tells us kind of the direction the big fields are coming from.

661

I mean, it's coming from that direction where we saw that beam.

662

00:33:55,000 --> 00:33:57,000

That's pretty significant right there.

Plus, at least concerning, we're measuring nearly 10 milliwatts per meter squared.

664

The microwave spikes that we're reading are getting on the level of standing by the microwave a few feet with the door open, but it's still working.

And that's dangerous levels.

666

667

What was that beam?

There is something here on this ranch that's broadcasting microwaves and they at times reach powers that's like a microwave oven.

669

And it's not Wi-Fi, it's not normal.

670

It's not cell phones, it's something different.

671

00:34:33,000 --> 00:34:36,000

All of this is real unusual.

672

To me, it's amazing.

673

Tom, you alright?

674

My head is killing me.

675

Is it?

Yeah, right here.

In that spot.

678

In exactly the spot, my head is hurting bad.
