Now we can look at it under a microscope

189

What the heck is all this stuff?

It's definitely hair.

208

Yeah, that's hair.

Yeah, right here.

210

Can you push the...

211

I can.

212

00:10:23,000 --> 00:10:25,000

Or can you translate the microscope, whichever?

213

Stop right there.

214

Oh, look at the bone fragment.

215

Well, it looks like gnaw marks, too.

216

Yeah.

217

It's either a tooth or a rib.

218

00:10:33,000 --> 00:10:34,000

This thing here?

219

00:10:34,000 --> 00:10:35,000

Yeah.

220

I don't know.

221

Hard to tell what kind of bone that is.

222

I mean, moving around some more.

223

Okay, if you see anything you want to dive into,

224

00:10:42,000 --> 00:10:44,000

this is as low a magnification as we can do.

225

Oh, really?

226

Yeah, we can actually go much, much further in,

227

00:10:47,000 --> 00:10:48,000

if you want.

228

Well, why don't we look at that black piece right there?

229

All right.

230

That right there, see what that is.

231

I wonder if that's like flesh or skin.

232

00:10:57,000 --> 00:10:59,000

That's what it looks like.

233

It looks like it's been in there a while, though, right?

234

Yeah, for a long time.

235

That's like a tomb, right?

236

And the air's dry.

237

00:11:07,000 --> 00:11:10,000

And so it could be desiccated and pretty much mummified.

238

I mean, that could have been there for years,

239

00:11:12,000 --> 00:11:13,000

and you wouldn't know it.

240

I mean, if it was recent, you would have smelled it.

241

Yeah.

242

Lots and lots of bone fragments.

243

The fact that it's fragmented is interesting,

244

because what would have had to play out in that cellar

245

00:11:28,000 --> 00:11:31,000

in order for these bones to be crushed up like this?

246

00:11:33,000 --> 00:11:34,000

What in the world?

247

00:11:34,000 --> 00:11:36,000

Probably a lot of crime scene.

248

00:11:37,000 --> 00:11:41,000

Somebody or something could have done this.

249

00:11:41,000 --> 00:11:43,000

It has to be a possibility.

250

Yeah, but that thing was sealed.

251

How would they get in this?

252

Well, that reddish stuff looks wet still.

253

Like if it's blood.

254

What does that look like to you, Eric?

255

Would it be reasonable to interpret this as animal,

256

00:11:58,000 --> 00:12:01,000

or could you interpret it as possibly being human?

257

You know what?

258

00:12:07,000 --> 00:12:08,000

I don't think so.

259

00:12:08,000 --> 00:12:11,000

They're way too small to be anything in a human.

260

What's really strange about these bone fragments

261

is that there's not enough of them to make a complete skeleton.

262

I mean, if some small animal was able to crawl in and die in there,

263

why are there only bone fragments?

264

00:12:23,000 --> 00:12:25,000

Why do they look like they've been burned?

265

00:12:25,000 --> 00:12:27,000

And none of this explains why Tom and Candice

266

00:12:27,000 --> 00:12:30,000

have been hearing strange knocking sounds at night.

267

00:12:30,000 --> 00:12:32,000

I say let's move forward, let's keep moving.

268

00:12:32,000 --> 00:12:33,000

Okay.

269

00:12:33,000 --> 00:12:36,000

Another mystery to figure out.

270

00:12:43,000 --> 00:12:45,000

Today's a pretty big day on the ranch.

271

00:12:45,000 --> 00:12:48,000

We have a couple trucks bringing some cattle on,

272

00:12:48,000 --> 00:12:50,000

probably around 40-head.

273

00:12:50,000 --> 00:12:54,000

Cattle play quite a role in the history of Skinwalker Ranch.

274

00:12:54,000 --> 00:12:57,000

And with tales of UFOs and paranormal,

275

00:12:57,000 --> 00:13:00,000

it does get a little bit spooky.

276

00:13:00,000 --> 00:13:03,000

It's a known fact that there have been numerous cattle mutilations

277

00:13:03,000 --> 00:13:05,000

on this property.

278

00:13:05,000 --> 00:13:10,000

You know, daylight cattle mutilations going back to the 1930s.

279

00:13:10,000 --> 00:13:16,000

We're talking very surgically precise dissections of these cattle.

280

They were drained of their blood,

281

00:13:18,000 --> 00:13:22,000

and there was no blood to be found underneath them.

282

Shortly after Mr. Bigelow purchased the property,

283

they installed observation towers and baitpins.

284

They are quite ominous looking.

There are three that span the entire property.

286

These towers and the enclosures around them,

287

for the purpose of using livestock as biosensors.

289

With UFO activity over the property

290

coupled with constant cattle mutilations,

291

they felt there would be an environment that would exist

292

293

Each cow we bring on is another biosensor

308

Animals seem to have that sixth sense to them,

310

and when we observe an anomaly here on the ranch,

311

we can monitor their behavior patterns

312

before and after that occurred.

313

Okay, so back up a little bit.

that works with a number of large companies.

337

So this summer, we're going to have Tom and Candice

338

helping monitor the behavior of the cows,

339

00:15:40,000 --> 00:15:41,000

which is going to be nice.

340

They're here on the ranch,

341

00:15:43,000 --> 00:15:45,000

and they're going to be able to keep much closer track

342

00:15:45,000 --> 00:15:47,000

on exactly what these cattle are doing.

343

Get them out.

344

Yeah, you know what?

345

They walked away, and minutes later, they returned.

Cattle were nowhere to be found.

362

After a search, they found them inside a trailer,

363

penned up, standing perfectly still, non-responsive, catatonic.

Okay, so we're good to go ahead and let them roll.

Let them go.

Come on, sis.

Come on, girl.

Come on.

Come on.

371

If the history of this property is any guide,

372

I'm very interested to see how these cattle will behave on this ranch.

373

And more importantly, how this ranch will behave with these cattle here.

374

Okay.

Good job.

376

Come on, William.

I think we're all good.

379

We just need rockets.

380

It's going to be interesting.

It'll be awesome.

Last week, after we determined that some kind of intense RF radiation

383

is coming from about a mile above the ranch.

384

All right, you guys ready?

385

Yep.

386

Good to go.

The team and I devised an experiment where we sent up a weather balloon

388

outfitted with a tri-field meter and a GPS tracker

389

00:17:58,000 --> 00:18:00,000

to try and identify the source.

390

00:18:00,000 --> 00:18:02,000

Oh, that is perfect.

391

I say we pack up and go back and try and track it on the internet.

392

But suddenly, just when it reached the target area,

393

the balloons stopped transmitting data.

394

The whole thing just seemed to disappear.

395

Did you bring us our rockets?

396

So now we're going to try and repeat the experiment,

398

Guys, what you all to meet?

400

401

So she's a rocket builder extraordinaire, so I got her to help us out.

Caitlyn is one of the interns who works with me at the University of Alabama in Huntsville.

405

She's been studying aerospace engineering and rocketry,

406

00:18:38,000 --> 00:18:42,000

so I thought she'd be helpful working with us on this experiment.

407

00:18:42,000 --> 00:18:45,000

So I'm really fascinated to see what you guys are using

408

00:18:45,000 --> 00:18:47,000

and how we're fitting this stuff inside.

409

00:18:47,000 --> 00:18:48,000

That's going to be cool.

410

00:18:48,000 --> 00:18:50,000

Yeah, so I'm thinking we're going to have an SDR in one,

411

00:18:50,000 --> 00:18:54,000

maybe the Spectrum Analyzer, maybe a gamma ray detector.

412

00:18:54,000 --> 00:18:55,000

That sound good to y'all?

413

00:18:55,000 --> 00:18:56,000

I love rockets.

414

00:18:56,000 --> 00:18:57,000

Yeah, let's do it.

415

00:18:57,000 --> 00:19:00,000

All right, well, let's unload this stuff and get it over there.

416

Just grab something and here we'll bucket-brigade it.

417

Another one for you to take there.

418

Why don't you go ahead and lay out the motors?

419

Jim said he's going to want to use my phone for something.

420

Hey, guys, all the cows just happened to come and look.

421

Is that the craziest thing?

422

They wanted to see the rocket launch, too.

423

Explain to me how you've got this set up.

424

So we have Spectrum Analyzers which read electromagnetic energy

425

00:19:28,000 --> 00:19:30,000

and reports it back in what we call a spectrum.

426

00:19:30,000 --> 00:19:33,000

And the way it works is that you hook up a phone to it,

427

00:19:33,000 --> 00:19:36,000

you run a special app, you put it in the nose code

428

00:19:36,000 --> 00:19:39,000

and pray that it comes back and you take that reading.

429

Cool.

430

00:19:40,000 --> 00:19:44,000

The data on the Spectrum Analyzer will be recorded directly into a cell phone.

431

00:19:44,000 --> 00:19:49,000

And if our earlier date is correct, it'll show that the higher the rocket travels,

432

00:19:49,000 --> 00:19:52,000

the more intense the RF radiation levels will become.

433

00:19:52,000 --> 00:19:54,000

Right there.

434

00:19:54,000 --> 00:19:55,000

You ready to go?

435

00:19:55,000 --> 00:19:56,000

We're ready to go.

436

00:19:56,000 --> 00:19:57,000

Let's do it.

437

00:19:58,000 --> 00:20:01,000

Look at that windsocks if it's changed, any.

438

00:20:01,000 --> 00:20:03,000

It's coming from the south.

439

00:20:03,000 --> 00:20:05,000

We'll give us a little more angle.

440

00:20:05,000 --> 00:20:08,000

When I first came here to Skinwalker Ranch,

441

00:20:08,000 --> 00:20:11,000

I found that some of the members of the team had been so spooked

442

00:20:11,000 --> 00:20:13,000

by all the strange things going on here,

443

00:20:13,000 --> 00:20:16,000

they were really reluctant to do any experiments

444

00:20:16,000 --> 00:20:18,000

that might trigger some kind of negative energy.

445

00:20:18,000 --> 00:20:21,000

I have to say, no digging.

446

00:20:21,000 --> 00:20:23,000

My grandmother used to always say,

447

00:20:23,000 --> 00:20:26,000

a hornet's nest isn't interesting until you poke it with stick.

448

00:20:26,000 --> 00:20:29,000

Okay, well, what kind of hornets were you dealing with?

449

00:20:29,000 --> 00:20:31,000

All right, we're hot here.

450

00:20:31,000 --> 00:20:34,000

But now, given all the information we've been gathering lately,

451

00:20:34,000 --> 00:20:36,000

they're not only willing to poke the hornet's nest,

452

00:20:36,000 --> 00:20:38,000

they're eager to do it.

453

00:20:38,000 --> 00:20:40,000

So we are ready to launch.

454

00:20:40,000 --> 00:20:42,000

Inserting the safety key.

455

00:20:43,000 --> 00:20:44,000

It's good.

456

00:20:44,000 --> 00:20:49,000

So let's do a launch in three, two, one, ignition.

457

00:20:52,000 --> 00:20:53,000

Oh, yeah.

458

00:20:53,000 --> 00:20:54,000

Oh, it smokes.

459

00:20:55,000 --> 00:20:56,000

There it goes.

460

00:20:56,000 --> 00:20:57,000

There we go.

461

00:20:59,000 --> 00:21:00,000

Uh-oh.

462

00:21:00,000 --> 00:21:01,000

Uh-oh.

463

00:21:01,000 --> 00:21:02,000

Watch your head.

464

00:21:02,000 --> 00:21:03,000

Watch your noggin.

465

This rocket hasn't gone as high as it was supposed to,

466

00:21:07,000 --> 00:21:10,000

and so it didn't reach a point where the shoot could pop.

467

00:21:10,000 --> 00:21:12,000

That's what you call a missile.

468

00:21:12,000 --> 00:21:13,000

I'll go get it.

469

00:21:13,000 --> 00:21:14,000

All right.

470

00:21:14,000 --> 00:21:15,000

Radio's on.

471

00:21:15,000 --> 00:21:17,000

It's going to land in the canal.

472

00:21:20,000 --> 00:21:22,000

You got eyes on it, Tom?

473

00:21:22,000 --> 00:21:24,000

It's over here, Waze.

474

00:21:25,000 --> 00:21:28,000

Hey, Dragon, come on, you can not fight it yet.

475

00:21:28,000 --> 00:21:29,000

There she is.

476

00:21:31,000 --> 00:21:33,000

Yep, we're almost to it.

477

00:21:36,000 --> 00:21:37,000

That's destroyed.

478

00:21:38,000 --> 00:21:43,000

Hey, Travis, we're certainly not taking this rocket up again.

479

00:21:43,000 --> 00:21:44,000

Aw, man.

480

00:21:44,000 --> 00:21:47,000

Our first test was a complete bust.

481

00:21:47,000 --> 00:21:48,000

Oh, this thing is host.

482

00:21:48,000 --> 00:21:50,000

The Spectrum Analyzer's all banged up

483

00:21:50,000 --> 00:21:52,000

and the on-off switch is missing.

484

00:21:52,000 --> 00:21:53,000

It's had it.

485

00:21:53,000 --> 00:21:54,000

Did it be record, though?

486

00:21:54,000 --> 00:21:55,000

I want to see it.

487

00:21:55,000 --> 00:21:56,000

It'd be great if we got some data.

488

00:21:56,000 --> 00:21:59,000

I sure hope the Spectrum Analyzer got enough data to the phone

489

00:21:59,000 --> 00:22:00,000

before it hit the ground,

490

00:22:00,000 --> 00:22:02,000

and maybe we can get some data off of it.

491

00:22:02,000 --> 00:22:05,000

Let's get the next rocket going, and we'll launch it.

492

00:22:05,000 --> 00:22:07,000

Hey, rockets failed.

493

00:22:07,000 --> 00:22:08,000

That's why we have more of them,

494

00:22:08,000 --> 00:22:10,000

so we just have to do another test.

495

00:22:10,000 --> 00:22:11,000

That's how it works.

496

00:22:12,000 --> 00:22:13,000

Eric, you're up.

497

00:22:13,000 --> 00:22:15,000

We're going to do your instrument next.

498

00:22:15,000 --> 00:22:17,000

This is a gamma ray detector,

499

00:22:17,000 --> 00:22:19,000

and we've outfitted it to be as light as it can be

500

00:22:19,000 --> 00:22:21,000

and as small as it can be.

501

00:22:21,000 --> 00:22:22,000

For our second launch,

502

00:22:22,000 --> 00:22:24,000

we decided to go forward with Eric's idea to test

503

00:22:24,000 --> 00:22:26,000

not only for RF radiation,

504

00:22:26,000 --> 00:22:28,000

but also for gamma rays.

505

00:22:28,000 --> 00:22:32,000

After RF, there's infrared, visible, ultraviolet,

506

00:22:32,000 --> 00:22:34,000

and finally, gamma rays.

507

00:22:34,000 --> 00:22:36,000

Now, gamma radiation is very dangerous to humans,

508

00:22:36,000 --> 00:22:38,000

so if the test comes back positive,

509

00:22:38,000 --> 00:22:40,000

it can mean we're all in real danger

510

00:22:40,000 --> 00:22:43,000

just being out here on Skinwalker Range.

511

00:22:43,000 --> 00:22:46,000

So if we have gamma rays detected during flight,

512

00:22:46,000 --> 00:22:48,000

it'll show up in a sound recording.

513

00:22:48,000 --> 00:22:50,000

So what would it sound like?

514

00:22:50,000 --> 00:22:53,000

Oh, it sounds just like a gager counter.

515

00:22:53,000 --> 00:22:54,000

Exactly.

516

00:22:54,000 --> 00:22:56,000

But we'll be able to get the waveform

517

00:22:56,000 --> 00:22:58,000

so we can analyze it and see if we can find out what...

518

00:22:58,000 --> 00:23:00,000

If it changes with altitude or whatever, right?

519

00:23:00,000 --> 00:23:02,000

I'm really interested in comparing

520

00:23:02,000 --> 00:23:04,000

the readings that we get down here at ground level

521

00:23:04,000 --> 00:23:06,000

with those that we get at altitude

522

00:23:06,000 --> 00:23:08,000

to see if, in fact, we are getting gamma rays.

523

00:23:08,000 --> 00:23:10,000

If they're coming from altitude,

524

00:23:10,000 --> 00:23:12,000

the amount should increase the higher we get.

525

00:23:12,000 --> 00:23:14,000

But if they're coming from the ground...

526

00:23:14,000 --> 00:23:16,000

If they come from the ground, it'll decrease.

527

00:23:16,000 --> 00:23:17,000

This will tell us something, right?

528

00:23:17,000 --> 00:23:18,000

Sure.

529

00:23:18,000 --> 00:23:19,000

Let's go.

530

00:23:19,000 --> 00:23:20,000

All right.

531

00:23:20,000 --> 00:23:22,000

Yeah, this is a very fragile setup,

532

00:23:22,000 --> 00:23:24,000

so we need to really protect it.

533

00:23:24,000 --> 00:23:25,000

That's awesome.

534

00:23:25,000 --> 00:23:28,000

We are about ready to go launch another one, folks.

535

00:23:32,000 --> 00:23:33,000

Look at the cows.

536

00:23:38,000 --> 00:23:40,000

That is the strangest thing.

537

00:23:42,000 --> 00:23:44,000

Just before we started to fire the rockets,

538

00:23:44,000 --> 00:23:46,000

the cows were acting very strangely.

539

00:23:46,000 --> 00:23:48,000

They were running across the field,

540

00:23:48,000 --> 00:23:50,000

grouping together, fighting.

541

00:23:50,000 --> 00:23:51,000

That's crazy.

542

00:23:51,000 --> 00:23:53,000

Here, they've crammed themselves

543

00:23:53,000 --> 00:23:55,000

into the northeast corner of the ranch.

544

00:23:55,000 --> 00:23:58,000

They couldn't possibly get any closer to one another.

545

00:23:58,000 --> 00:24:02,000

And they're behaving as if they've been agitating by something.

546

00:24:03,000 --> 00:24:05,000

Never seen that before.

547

00:24:06,000 --> 00:24:07,000

Look, look, look, look.

548

00:24:07,000 --> 00:24:08,000

What is that?

549

00:24:08,000 --> 00:24:09,000

We got something. Hold on.

550

00:24:12,000 --> 00:24:14,000

It's a plane, I think.

551

00:24:20,000 --> 00:24:21,000

It's gone.

552

00:24:21,000 --> 00:24:23,000

No, that wasn't a plane.

553

00:24:23,000 --> 00:24:25,000

We'd still seen if it was a plane.

554

00:24:25,000 --> 00:24:26,000

What the hell was that?

555

Is that not crazy?

556

I don't know what that was, but it wasn't an airplane,

557

and it wasn't something that would be easily explained away.

The guys want to stand around and keep looking

566

00:24:54,000 --> 00:24:56,000

for these UFOs popping up in the sky,

567

00:24:56,000 --> 00:24:58,000

but I'm telling them, look, if it's happening now,

568

00:24:58,000 --> 00:25:00,000

we need to get the instruments in the sky

569

00:25:00,000 --> 00:25:02,000

so we can really measure what's going on.

570

00:25:02,000 --> 00:25:04,000

All right, well, let's launch it. See what happens.

571

00:25:04,000 --> 00:25:07,000

Three, two, one, ignition.

572

00:25:12,000 --> 00:25:13,000

Oh, yeah.

573

00:25:18,000 --> 00:25:19,000

Uh-oh.

574

00:25:19,000 --> 00:25:23,000

One, two, three, four, five.

575

00:25:23,000 --> 00:25:25,000

Good shoot!

576

00:25:25,000 --> 00:25:26,000

Yes!

577

00:25:31,000 --> 00:25:35,000

Man, we may have real data while we saw a UFO.

578

00:25:35,000 --> 00:25:38,000

This is our hero Rocky right here.

579

Awesome.

580

All the time I've spent on this ranch,

581

00:25:42,000 --> 00:25:44,000

I've never really seen anything,

582

00:25:44,000 --> 00:25:49,000

but right now, I actually saw

583

00:25:49,000 --> 00:25:52,000

what I would consider a UFO.

584

00:25:52,000 --> 00:25:55,000

Let's try it on the other side of the bush, I think.

585

00:25:55,000 --> 00:25:56,000

Right there.

586

00:25:56,000 --> 00:25:58,000

Oh, Tom found it!

587

00:25:58,000 --> 00:26:01,000

For years, I've heard hundreds of stories

588

00:26:01,000 --> 00:26:03,000

about UFO sightings at Skinwalker Ranch,

589

00:26:03,000 --> 00:26:06,000

but I have to admit, I thought they were all just products

590

00:26:06,000 --> 00:26:08,000

of someone's overactive imagination.

591

00:26:08,000 --> 00:26:11,000

I never thought I'd actually see one in person.

592

00:26:11,000 --> 00:26:12,000

We saw them.

593

00:26:12,000 --> 00:26:13,000

You thought.

594

That was incredible.

595

Did you see it?

596

I did.

597

What are you making out of it?

598

You want an airplane or we would have still been seeing it.

599

Well, there was no contrial.

600

No sound.

601

I'm hopeful that we can evaluate it frame by frame

602

There's absolutely no cloud cover to block anything.

You got the igniter.

Is anybody feeling a queasiness or anything like that?

691

Are you feeling queasy?

692

Almost like motion sick a little bit.

What does that thing say?

You haven't really traveled that much or climbed that much.

This camera is in the east field basically to the southwest.

735

What we see before launch can be compared to what we see during the flight, and then

773

again to what we see on the ground.

774

So I would ask you, what do you see?

775

It looks very concentrated right here.

776

At the apogee, this thing was screaming.

777

Holy cow.

778

00:33:19,000 --> 00:33:24,000

What it means is there was an immense amount of energy for some reason that was suddenly

779

on and then suddenly off.

780

00:33:26,000 --> 00:33:32,000

And then when we got up to about a thousand feet, we measured an increase in the electromagnetic

781

00:33:32,000 --> 00:33:34,000

radiation that was there.

782

We measured an increase in the gamma rays that were there.

783

00:33:37,000 --> 00:33:43,000

But I want to point out that this is at altitude, at a thousand feet up in the air, which says

784

that as you increase altitude, you get much more energy than we have down here.

785

00:33:49,000 --> 00:33:50,000

Yep.

786

00:33:50,000 --> 00:33:55,000

Just to be clear, normally, on anywhere else in the world, if you increase an altitude,

787

00:33:55,000 --> 00:33:57,000

you should see a decrease.

788

00:33:57,000 --> 00:33:58,000

That's right.

789

00:33:58,000 --> 00:34:01,000

So that does suggest there are more gammas at altitude.

790

00:34:01,000 --> 00:34:02,000

Right.

791

00:34:02,000 --> 00:34:05,000

It implies something about the location of the source.

792

00:34:05,000 --> 00:34:10,000

We got closer to a gamma ray source as we flew into the sky.

793

00:34:10,000 --> 00:34:11,000

Yeah.

794

00:34:11,000 --> 00:34:15,000

So there is a concentration of energy above the range.

795

00:34:15,000 --> 00:34:19,000

And I want to just point out that a lot of these readings took place when we started to see the

796

00:34:19,000 --> 00:34:22,000

strange objects in the sky.

797

00:34:22,000 --> 00:34:24,000

Wow.

798

00:34:24,000 --> 00:34:28,000

At a high enough concentration, gamma radiation can be deadly.

799

00:34:28,000 --> 00:34:30,000

But where is it coming from?

800

00:34:30,000 --> 00:34:34,000

And could it be connected in some way to this UFO we just saw?

801

00:34:34,000 --> 00:34:37,000

I don't realize what we are looking at here.

802

00:34:37,000 --> 00:34:42,000

Not only do we see the event with our eyes, we catch it on video.

803

00:34:42,000 --> 00:34:45,000

The cows apparently felt something.

804

00:34:45,000 --> 00:34:46,000

Yes.

805

00:34:46,000 --> 00:34:47,000

Because they moved.

806

00:34:47,000 --> 00:34:52,000

And we have scientific instruments corroborating that there is an anomaly in energy at the

807

00:34:52,000 --> 00:34:53,000

same time.

808

00:34:53,000 --> 00:34:56,000

I don't believe in the UFOs, period.

809

00:34:56,000 --> 00:35:01,000

But we were all there, and our eyes saw this.

810

00:35:01,000 --> 00:35:04,000

We all saw this with the other instruments.

811

00:35:04,000 --> 00:35:10,000

Every little men in black thing you come up with to explain it away is vanishing.

812

00:35:10,000 --> 00:35:13,000

I mean, this is like a breakthrough, guys.

813

00:35:13,000 --> 00:35:16,000

That is very important data right there.

814

00:35:16,000 --> 00:35:20,000

I know that every time we get exceptional footage like this, Brandon wants to see it immediately.

815

I'm sending it off now.

816

00:35:21,000 --> 00:35:22,000

Yeah, do that.

817

00:35:22,000 --> 00:35:24,000

And then let's give him a shout.

818

See what he has to say.

819

Hey, Mr. Fugel.

820

00:35:33,000 --> 00:35:34,000

How are things going?

821

Eric just sent you some files, Brandon.

822

You should see if you can get them and open them up.

823

00:35:39,000 --> 00:35:40,000

All right.

824

Watch in the upper right hand corner of the video closely.

825

Wow.

826

00:35:48,000 --> 00:35:51,000

What is that silver object?

827

This is the second of the unidentified object sightings that we saw today.

828

So did you see this?

829

00:35:58,000 --> 00:36:02,000

All five of us, without a doubt, saw the same thing.

830

00:36:02,000 --> 00:36:05,000

We also measured simultaneous anomalies.

831

00:36:05,000 --> 00:36:07,000

We measured gamma rays.

832

00:36:07,000 --> 00:36:10,000

We measured anomalies in the RF and microwave spectrum.

833

00:36:10,000 --> 00:36:11,000

Cows.

834

00:36:11,000 --> 00:36:12,000

Oh, and all the cows.

835

00:36:12,000 --> 00:36:13,000

That's right.

836

00:36:13,000 --> 00:36:17,000

Ran from one side of the field and got as far east as they could get.

837

00:36:17,000 --> 00:36:20,000

Is there any way this could be a satellite?

838

00:36:20,000 --> 00:36:24,000

No, it's not following orbital motion at all.

839

00:36:24,000 --> 00:36:31,000

It makes me wonder whether it is responding or reacting to some of the tests that you're conducting on the ground,

840

00:36:31,000 --> 00:36:35,000

and that is somehow stimulating the appearance.

841

00:36:35,000 --> 00:36:40,000

Well, the fact of the matter that all five of us, looking out and we see this object,

842

00:36:40,000 --> 00:36:45,000

it appeared to move a little bit and then get either larger or just more vibrant.

843

00:36:45,000 --> 00:36:51,000

And it stayed there for a moment and then basically dissipated and disappeared into nothing.

844

Shortly thereafter, I started to get nauseous almost like I was motion sick.

845

You know, I don't know if I was maybe affected by some of the energy that was in the area that we picked up on the other instruments.

And the fact we have all of you as witnesses, we've captured this on camera is nothing short of historic.

851

The fact that the entire team saw this and have camera surveillance footage, this changes our investigation at Skinwalker Ranch.
