I don't know what that is, but I'm going to go look on the spectrum analyzer and see if maybe there's something on it.

Maybe the sound has something to do with the crazy microwave signals we've been seeing.

37

Oh, it turns the computer on.

Alright, let's turn this thing on.

What is that?

I'm not sure what I'm seeing.

Wow.

There's a signal oscillating up and down between 20-something megatrons, 6-ish megahertz, all the way up to 2 gigahertz.

43

This is crazy. I'm getting a huge and constant level of radio waves across the entire frequency spectral band.

44

It's like turning on a radio and having every single station playing the exact same song at the exact same level.

Now, if I move it across, look at the signal. It's extremely sinusoidal and has a lot of structure.

I've never seen anything like it. It just keeps on going all the way across the spectrum.

Wow. That's just insane.

What's going on?

We called you guys here because we wanted to talk to you about what happened to me this morning.

And I hear off in the distance this weird whirr whirrr.

So I figured I'd go in and look on the spectrum analyzer.

54

I'm seeing all these signals from the microwave band all the way down past the handbands at 35 megahertz.

Now, to do that, it would be, I don't even know how we would do that. It's almost impossible.

Since I've been here with the team investigating Skinwalker Ranch, a lot of strange and bizarre things have been happening.

And it could be underground from the center of the earth coming up and then being focused to a point.

So in other words, what we're saying is that to us standing here,

96

this could look like an orb to us or it could look like a portal to us.

In 2016, I purchased Skinwalker Ranch from Robert Bigelow.

102

Prior to transfer of ownership, Bigelow cautioned me that we're dealing with forces that are very powerful,

103

that are not easily understood or characterized.

104

There are amazing stories claiming that one of the most interesting observations made by not only Bigelow's team,

105

but others is the presence of portals that have appeared in the area of the homesteads.

106

Literally mid-air.

107

00:08:13,000 --> 00:08:18,000

They've seen truly a window into what appeared to be another world.

108

Other skylines or other landscapes that they could see through those portals that are difficult to describe.

But a hypothesis isn't worth anything unless you can create an experiment to test that hypothesis.

So we understand the hypothesis.

I think we go and figure out if the energy source may be coming from inside the Earth that's here under the Skinwalker Ranch.

120

We should go and see if we can measure these weird signals down there.

121

We need to do ground-penetrating radar.

122

00:09:17,000 --> 00:09:20,000

We've got to do resistivity measurements out in the field.

Now there's an experiment we could do.

124

Yeah.

125

00:09:23,000 --> 00:09:25,000

It gives us a place to start looking.

126

So maybe that's it.

127

Maybe the tremendous energy source we would have to have to produce this portal effect is located deep underground.

128

That would validate what Eric suspected all along.

129

Alright, so I say we quit talking about it and then we get up and go start figuring out what we've got to do to do it.

139

we might be able to find out what it is before we start digging.

We haven't done experiments yet to look beneath the surface.

141

Okay.

So we've been doing some measurements with these signals that we've been picking up

143

and we've kind of triangulated a few hotspots.

144

And this is the starting line.

145

And anywhere there's a roadway, flat surface along, all the way from the gate on the east end to the fence on the west end,

146

just start mapping it out.

Then we'll go from there to the mesa and then maybe out into the field and around the homesteads.

148

Since there's so much varied area of skinwalker ranch to cover,

150

we decided to use two different methods to search below the surface.

151

One is GPR or Ground Penetrating Radar,

152

00:10:54,000 --> 00:11:00,000

which works by sending radio waves down into the earth that will bounce off any solid objects or

structures,

153

00:11:00,000 --> 00:11:04,000

and soil resistivity, which does pretty much the same thing,

154

00:11:04,000 --> 00:11:09,000

but it uses metal stakes and wires to send electrical currents down into the ground.

155

00:11:09,000 --> 00:11:12,000

So what we should do is kind of divide and conquer.

156

00:11:12,000 --> 00:11:18,000

I think half of us will work on the ground penetrating radar and the other half will do the resistivity measurements.

157

00:11:18,000 --> 00:11:20,000

Trucks right here is a good place to start.

158

00:11:20,000 --> 00:11:23,000

So just pull the equipment out and let's just get going.

159

00:11:23,000 --> 00:11:24,000

All right, sounds good.

160

00:11:24,000 --> 00:11:25,000

Let's get it out.

161

00:11:25,000 --> 00:11:33,000

Here on the ranch, we have seen a correlation between digging activities and some injuries to individuals.

162

00:11:33,000 --> 00:11:42,000

So I've taken the position that invasive activities like digging should be first justified by less invasive methods.

163

00:11:42,000 --> 00:11:43,000

Go on back.

164

00:11:43,000 --> 00:11:44,000

Oh, oh, oh.

165

00:11:44,000 --> 00:11:48,000

A good example of that is the GPR survey resistivity measurements.

166

00:11:48,000 --> 00:11:54,000

Those are the kinds of things that put exercises like digging or drilling on a more firm foundation,

167

00:11:54,000 --> 00:12:02,000

particularly in view of the fact that human safety and life is held in the balance.

168

00:12:02,000 --> 00:12:07,000

We've got everything loaded to do the resistivity measurements, so why don't we take it over there.

169

00:12:07,000 --> 00:12:09,000

You guys are going to continue with the GPR, right?

170

00:12:09,000 --> 00:12:10,000

Correct.

171

00:12:10,000 --> 00:12:11,000

All right.

172

00:12:11,000 --> 00:12:12,000

I gave him the flags.

173

00:12:12,000 --> 00:12:13,000

Mark the spots if you find anything weird.

174

00:12:13,000 --> 00:12:14,000

All right.

175

00:12:14,000 --> 00:12:15,000

Let's load up.

176

00:12:15,000 --> 00:12:16,000

Sounds good.

177

00:12:16,000 --> 00:12:17,000

I got a shotgun.

178

00:12:17,000 --> 00:12:26,000

So guys, what we'll be doing now is we're going to be pulling this.

179

00:12:26,000 --> 00:12:27,000

This is our GX-160.

180

00:12:27,000 --> 00:12:33,000

We're going to be pulling behind this ATV, and we'll figure out a suitable way to pull

181

00:12:33,000 --> 00:12:34,000

that.

182

00:12:34,000 --> 00:12:37,000

I think I've got an idea of how we can do it so it doesn't slide around.

183

00:12:37,000 --> 00:12:38,000

Okay.

184

00:12:38,000 --> 00:12:42,000

And then we'll use the dual frequency system to do the homestead work.

185

00:12:42,000 --> 00:12:43,000

Sounds great.

186

00:12:43,000 --> 00:12:44,000

All right.

187

00:12:44,000 --> 00:12:49,000

And what we're going to do is pull this latch up.

188

00:12:49,000 --> 00:12:53,000

And then what we'll do here is we've got two power buttons.

189

00:12:53,000 --> 00:12:59,000

We've got a power button on the monitor, and we have one down here on the antenna, and

190

00:12:59,000 --> 00:13:03,000

that will fire the system up.

191

00:13:03,000 --> 00:13:08,000

Oh my gosh.

192

00:13:08,000 --> 00:13:13,000

This was fully charged, so it's a mystery.

193

00:13:13,000 --> 00:13:14,600

So we can't start now?

194

00:13:14,600 --> 00:13:19,760

We actually can't start with this system, at least with the battery this low.

195

00:13:19,760 --> 00:13:21,600

Why would it be down in the red now?

196

00:13:21,600 --> 00:13:27,400

That's a good question, because the system has to be on in order for it to utilize those

197

00:13:27,400 --> 00:13:31,400

lithium-ion batteries.

198

00:13:31,400 --> 00:13:33,200

Why don't we check the other system?

199

00:13:33,200 --> 00:13:37,000

It was completely powered too, and let's just see what the batteries look like on that.

200

00:13:37,000 --> 00:13:38,500

Yeah, that's a good idea.

201

00:13:38,500 --> 00:13:43,900

It's not uncommon that we experience problems with battery-powered systems on this property.

202

00:13:43,900 --> 00:13:49,500

Everything from mobile devices, including our cell phones, our tablets, laptop computers,

203

00:13:49,500 --> 00:13:56,000

audio-video equipment have experienced some kind of an anomaly as a result of some influence

204

00:13:56,000 --> 00:13:57,500

that is prevalent on the ranch.

205

00:13:57,500 --> 00:14:00,500

Dude, I would tell you my phone battery just went...

206

00:14:00,500 --> 00:14:02,500

Your battery's dead on your phone?

207

00:14:02,500 --> 00:14:03,500

Yeah.

208

00:14:03,500 --> 00:14:05,000

Your battery's dead too, ain't it?

209

00:14:05,000 --> 00:14:06,500

It shut off.

210

00:14:06,500 --> 00:14:09,500

You think I'm just getting off the ranch, right?

211

00:14:09,500 --> 00:14:16,500

I completely charged these four batteries last evening, and now they're into the yellows

212

00:14:16,500 --> 00:14:18,500

section.

213

00:14:18,500 --> 00:14:20,000

When have you seen that before?

214

00:14:20,000 --> 00:14:24,500

I quite frankly have not seen that before.

215

00:14:24,500 --> 00:14:25,500

Hey, Bryant, come here.

216

00:14:25,500 --> 00:14:26,500

Check this out.

217

00:14:26,500 --> 00:14:28,000

So, Phil, would you like to explain what you're seeing?

218

00:14:28,000 --> 00:14:31,500

Right, we were getting some highly unusual battery level there.

219

00:14:31,500 --> 00:14:35,500

We should be seeing full power there, and we're seeing about 50%.

220

00:14:35,500 --> 00:14:39,000

Another so damn battery that's getting trashed.

221

00:14:39,000 --> 00:14:40,500

I guess we'll just keep an eye on it.

222

00:14:40,500 --> 00:14:43,500

I guess you go until it goes off.

223

00:14:43,500 --> 00:14:45,500

All right, yep.

224

00:14:45,500 --> 00:14:51,500

We've decided to proceed by dragging one of the instruments behind the UTV.

225

00:14:51,500 --> 00:14:57,500

So what I did is I ran a wire underneath here attached to the body to hold this tight.

226

00:14:57,500 --> 00:14:59,500

It looks very solid to me.

227

00:14:59,500 --> 00:15:00,500

All right?

228

00:15:00,500 --> 00:15:01,500

Hey, Eric.

229

00:15:01,500 --> 00:15:02,500

Yeah.

230

00:15:02,500 --> 00:15:03,500

My phone's freaking out.

231

00:15:03,500 --> 00:15:06,500

I just want you to see it.

232

00:15:06,500 --> 00:15:07,500

What is it doing?

233

00:15:07,500 --> 00:15:08,500

I don't know.

234

00:15:08,500 --> 00:15:11,500

It's just been doing this for the last, you know, couple of minutes.

235

00:15:11,500 --> 00:15:13,500

It just ran up here so you can see it.

236

00:15:13,500 --> 00:15:14,500

It was in my contacts.

237

00:15:14,500 --> 00:15:19,500

It tried calling a couple of people, and then it's been messing around in my camera the

238

00:15:19,500 --> 00:15:20,500

last couple of minutes.

239

00:15:20,500 --> 00:15:21,500

When did this start?

240

00:15:21,500 --> 00:15:25,500

About two, three minutes ago.

241

00:15:25,500 --> 00:15:29,500

It's as if someone was pushing the buttons and switching between applications and sending

242

00:15:29,500 --> 00:15:33,500

messages and making phone calls as fast as anyone can possibly do it.

243

00:15:33,500 --> 00:15:36,500

Dude, that is crazy.

244

00:15:36,500 --> 00:15:46,500

We're laughing at it, but I'm not sure that we should be.

245

00:15:46,500 --> 00:15:54,500

While Eric and Dragon are working with Phil Ovia to run GPR from the command center to

246

00:15:54,500 --> 00:15:58,500

the old homestead, Jim Tom and I are heading out with Zach Zyla to do a series of tests

247

00:15:58,500 --> 00:16:03,500

and test the system and find out if it's working or not.

248

00:16:03,500 --> 00:16:11,500

And I'm going to do a test test with Zyla to do a soil resistivity survey.

249

00:16:11,500 --> 00:16:16,500

So, Zach, we're interested in this field out here.

250

00:16:16,500 --> 00:16:20,500

There's rumors and stories and myths and all sorts of things.

251

00:16:20,500 --> 00:16:26,500

There might be underground facilities or bases or other stuff inside this field out here.

252

00:16:26,500 --> 00:16:27,500

Yep.

253

00:16:27,500 --> 00:16:30,500

We're going to go up and start laying out the lines.

254

00:16:30,500 --> 00:16:31,500

All right.

255

00:16:31,500 --> 00:16:32,500

All right, so what goes first?

256

00:16:32,500 --> 00:16:35,500

So, every six feet, we're going to place one of these into the ground.

257

00:16:35,500 --> 00:16:36,500

All right.

258

00:16:36,500 --> 00:16:39,500

And then you're going to start and you don't want to pound it in about three-quarters of

259

00:16:39,500 --> 00:16:41,500

the way, so we get good contact into the ground.

260

All right.

261

00:16:42,500 --> 00:16:46,500

Next, you're going to take one of these connector cables and connect it to the base.

262

All right.

263

00:16:47,500 --> 00:16:49,500

And then we're going to keep moving along all the way to the end.

264

So, let me get started.

All right.

I guess we just wait.

282

Am I holding a speed that you like there?

283

Yeah, you're good.

284

Okay.

285

It's going to get a little bumpy here.

286

Yeah, I think it goes without saying.

287

Just be careful going through the dips.

288

Yep.

That thing works like a champ.

Oh, I'm anxious to get up by the homestead.

292

Well, we're just about to get close.

I don't know.

295

Could be.

I don't know what that is.

297

I mean, we certainly see a difference than this garbage we've been seeing the whole way.

298

Right?

299

That is unusual.

300

Yeah, it is.

301

So, as we're dragging the device behind us, Phil noticed that there was a structure.

302

Could have been something mundane.

303

Could have something to do with the utilities on the property.

304

00:18:15,500 --> 00:18:18,500

So, for Phil's benefit, you see that roof over there?

305

00:18:18,500 --> 00:18:19,500

Yes.

306

00:18:19,500 --> 00:18:24,500

Right in this grove of trees up on the left, we call it homestead number two.

307

00:18:24,500 --> 00:18:25,500

Okay, got it.

308

00:18:25,500 --> 00:18:27,500

Got it.

309

00:18:27,500 --> 00:18:29,500

Now, look at this right here.

310

00:18:29,500 --> 00:18:30,500

Okay.

311

Whoa, I see that.

312

I see that.

313

How do you interpret that, that feature?

314

Well, it looks like a dome feature.

315

Then we see another interesting anomaly in the homestead two-way.

316

And we don't know what the origin of those structures really is.

317

Look.

Oh, wow.

319

00:18:50,500 --> 00:18:51,500

What does this?

320

I cannot tell you what's causing that.

321

00:18:53,500 --> 00:18:57,500

I mean, it could be something buried, you know, metal.

322

00:18:57,500 --> 00:18:58,500

Really?

323

00:18:58,500 --> 00:18:59,500

Yes.

324

00:19:07,500 --> 00:19:10,500

Let's talk about the other side of the road.

325

00:19:11,500 --> 00:19:14,500

Let's halt the vehicle.

326

00:19:14,500 --> 00:19:15,500

Another dome look at the thing?

327

00:19:15,500 --> 00:19:16,500

Another dome.

328

00:19:16,500 --> 00:19:17,500

All right.

329

00:19:17,500 --> 00:19:24,500

I'm looking laterally in the data, and it's been fairly consistent through this whole area.

330

Except we've seen features at several different depths.

331

But you say it could just be a geological feature?

332

00:19:31,500 --> 00:19:34,500

It could be, but it doesn't look like it to me.

333

It looks anomalous.

334

00:19:36,500 --> 00:19:39,500

We'll see if we can duplicate that on the way back.

335

Okay.

336

It'd be interesting to have a look at all of these.

337

Okay.

338

Yeah, everyone looks at these.

339

You want to re-shoot it all the way back.

340

Right.

Just to verify what we see.

342

Okay.

You know, I was really excited just to get any data at all.

344

You know, when we're talking about the possibility of metal structure, of course it's very exciting.

345

But we need to go back in the other direction to verify that we're not just seeing some artifact,

346

but that what we're seeing is real.

347

So right here is one of the domes we measured.

348

Oh, yeah.

349

It's not quite as evident as it was, but you can sure see it.

350

And we had another one of those up here.

351

00:20:19,500 --> 00:20:20,500

That's right.

352

00:20:20,500 --> 00:20:24,500

Yeah, there it comes.

353

00:20:24,500 --> 00:20:25,500

There it is.

354

00:20:25,500 --> 00:20:26,500

There it is.

355

00:20:26,500 --> 00:20:27,500

We're doing good there.

356

00:20:27,500 --> 00:20:29,500

That's exactly what we saw before.

357

00:20:29,500 --> 00:20:30,500

Okay.

358

00:20:30,500 --> 00:20:31,500

Very distinct.

359

00:20:31,500 --> 00:20:37,500

It's exciting when you have anomalous data and you go back and take it a second time and you get the same thing.

360

And that's exactly what we've seen.

361

We're seeing very interesting multi-layer structures at depths of anywhere from 8 feet below the surface to 24, 25 feet below the surface.

362

All right.

363

00:20:53,500 --> 00:20:58,500

Stop right here, Eric.

364

00:20:58,500 --> 00:20:59,500

Interesting.

365

00:20:59,500 --> 00:21:01,500

Oh, wow.

366

00:21:01,500 --> 00:21:04,500

I can see a couple of parallel features right here.

367

00:21:04,500 --> 00:21:06,500

We saw this in both directions.

368

00:21:06,500 --> 00:21:13,500

I mean, you may be seeing the top and the base of a possible tunnel, and it opens up as you move this direction.

369

00:21:13,500 --> 00:21:17,500

So we're looking at something quite large in here.

370

00:21:17,500 --> 00:21:18,500

Oh, wow.

371

00:21:18,500 --> 00:21:24,500

I hate to point it out, but, you know, this is exactly where we were when we had the difficulty with the drone survey.

372

00:21:24,500 --> 00:21:25,500

So let's get going.

373

00:21:25,500 --> 00:21:26,500

Yeah.

374

00:21:26,500 --> 00:21:34,500

We did try drone thermography measurements, but we're not successful due to some mysterious electromagnetic interference.

375

00:21:34,500 --> 00:21:36,500

No connection.

376

00:21:36,500 --> 00:21:42,500

We are in one of the most interesting and notorious regions of the ranch.

377

00:21:42,500 --> 00:21:44,500

This is Homestead 2.

378

00:21:44,500 --> 00:21:46,500

I'm wondering if this is coincidence.

379

00:21:46,500 --> 00:21:47,500

Clear as mud, Eric.

380

00:21:47,500 --> 00:21:49,500

That's what this place is.

381

00:21:50,500 --> 00:21:55,500

Here we go.

382

00:21:55,500 --> 00:21:59,500

So this is the raw data plotted over, you know, a 2D grid.

383

00:21:59,500 --> 00:22:03,500

So blues are going to be more conductive and reds are going to be more resistive.

384

00:22:03,500 --> 00:22:05,500

More resistive might mean a hole.

385

00:22:05,500 --> 00:22:06,500

Yep.

386

00:22:06,500 --> 00:22:08,500

So that could be a cave.

387

00:22:08,500 --> 00:22:10,500

Potentially.

388

00:22:10,500 --> 00:22:15,500

We really need to post-process it and run it through an inversion so that we can really say what's going on.

389

00:22:15,500 --> 00:22:16,500

I want you to do the post-processing.

390

00:22:16,500 --> 00:22:17,500

They want to know more about it.

391

00:22:17,500 --> 00:22:18,500

Yep.

392

00:22:18,500 --> 00:22:20,500

Hey, Tom, you copy?

393

00:22:22,500 --> 00:22:23,500

Yeah, go ahead.

394

00:22:23,500 --> 00:22:27,500

Hey, we're getting some really interesting readings out here at Homestead 2.

395

00:22:27,500 --> 00:22:33,500

I'm just going to ask you to just drop whatever you're doing and bring some of Phil's extra gear out here so we can take a closer look at it.

396

00:22:33,500 --> 00:22:34,500

Okay.

397

00:22:34,500 --> 00:22:35,500

I'll grab the guys.

398

00:22:35,500 --> 00:22:37,500

We'll grab the equipment and head that way.

399

00:22:37,500 --> 00:22:38,500

Copy.

400

00:22:38,500 --> 00:22:40,500

Okay, just leave this and we'll just head over?

401

00:22:40,500 --> 00:22:41,500

Yeah, I'll pack this in.

402

00:22:41,500 --> 00:22:43,500

You guys can, we can head over now.

403

00:22:44,500 --> 00:22:45,500

I don't know, man.

404

00:22:45,500 --> 00:22:47,500

It's an interesting area.

405

00:22:47,500 --> 00:22:49,500

It's too much of a coincidence all the time.

406

00:22:49,500 --> 00:22:50,500

Mm-hmm.

407

00:22:51,500 --> 00:22:52,500

They're there.

408

00:22:52,500 --> 00:22:53,500

That was quick.

409

00:22:54,500 --> 00:22:56,500

See what they got.

410

What's up, fellas?

411

Hey.

412

00:23:00,500 --> 00:23:05,500

You said if you come across anything interesting or intriguing, we should call you.

413

So that's what we did.

414

Yeah, find something?

415

We found some dome features anywhere from 8 to 25 feet that are almost parallel with this structure over here.

416

When you say dome, are you talking a formation or an opening?

417

00:23:19,500 --> 00:23:25,500

Yes, like a, like a, it almost looked as though there was the top of the, of a tunnel and the base of a tunnel.

418

00:23:25,500 --> 00:23:26,500

Oh, a tunnel?

419

00:23:26,500 --> 00:23:27,500

Yes.

420

00:23:27,500 --> 00:23:31,500

And it's interesting that it's parallel to this structure right here as well.

421

00:23:31,500 --> 00:23:32,500

That's why we called you guys.

422

00:23:32,500 --> 00:23:36,500

We want you over here and to check this area out and see if we can see any correlation.

423

00:23:36,500 --> 00:23:39,500

Is it a pair of jagged or is it pair of smooth?

424

00:23:39,500 --> 00:23:40,500

It's smooth.

425

00:23:40,500 --> 00:23:46,500

So we're seeing almost a domo type feature and then it pinches into almost a point.

426

00:23:47,500 --> 00:23:50,500

It looks more like a hollow opening than anything.

427

00:23:50,500 --> 00:23:58,500

What I would suggest is to scan this area with the wide range and see if we see any correlation between this, between this area and that area.

428

Yeah.

429

00:23:59,500 --> 00:24:01,500

Let's get the equipment out and just do it, right?

430

00:24:01,500 --> 00:24:03,500

Grab the, grab the, got it?

431

00:24:03,500 --> 00:24:07,500

For a very long time, there's been a lot of strange things going on at Homestead 2.

432

00:24:07,500 --> 00:24:20,500

And what I want to do is dig around the place because I believe there's a possibility that there's something unknown under the ground that seems to be seeping up or causing different, causing different phenomena to happen.

433

00:24:20,500 --> 00:24:21,500

So let's turn it on.

434

00:24:21,500 --> 00:24:25,500

But there's been a lot of pushback on digging on the property.

435

00:24:25,500 --> 00:24:35,500

So of course with GPR, that gives us an idea of what might be under there without really disturbing the ground and bringing up anything that might be toxic underneath.

436

00:24:35,500 --> 00:24:36,500

Okay.

437

00:24:36,500 --> 00:24:37,500

So we're ready.

438

00:24:37,500 --> 00:24:41,500

Hey Phil, sorry to interrupt you, but I mean, I know we want to get up on the Mesa and do that.

439

00:24:41,500 --> 00:24:46,500

I mean, we're getting late in the day and I want to make sure that we utilize all the time we have with you gentlemen.

440

00:24:46,500 --> 00:24:51,500

Can we split up teams here like Zach go with one of us and you go with one group?

441

00:24:51,500 --> 00:24:52,500

Absolutely.

442

00:24:52,500 --> 00:24:53,500

Yeah, Phil, why don't you go up to the Mesa?

443

00:24:53,500 --> 00:24:54,500

Sounds good.

444

00:24:54,500 --> 00:24:55,500

You guys okay with that?

445

00:24:55,500 --> 00:24:57,500

Yeah, I'm good with that because I want to see what you guys have already seen here.

446

00:24:57,500 --> 00:24:58,500

That makes sense.

447

00:24:58,500 --> 00:25:00,500

Let's take it and get going.

448

00:25:00,500 --> 00:25:06,500

Now that the wide range system has been recharged, Jim, Zach and I are going to run GPR scans at Homestead 2.

449

That's where a lot of very weird phenomena have been reported.

450

00:25:11,500 --> 00:25:16,500

And while we're doing that, the rest of the guys are going to run some scans up on top of the Mesa.

451

00:25:16,500 --> 00:25:18,500

Eric loves this Mesa.

452

00:25:18,500 --> 00:25:19,500

I do, I guess.

453

00:25:19,500 --> 00:25:21,500

Once I get to the top.

454

00:25:21,500 --> 00:25:31,500

Well, so guys, what I think is if you can get right there, kind of hug the tree line and go do south toward that dead tree.

455

00:25:31,500 --> 00:25:34,500

I think we can go through over here.

456

00:25:34,500 --> 00:25:39,500

To hug this bush right here is the best you can.

457

00:25:39,500 --> 00:25:46,500

Ground penetrating radar device we're using, it was more mobile so we started pushing it through the woods and around the homestead.

458

00:25:46,500 --> 00:25:49,500

We just kind of use the house as a guide for the line.

459

00:25:49,500 --> 00:25:53,500

And that allows us to do a much deeper investigation.

460

00:25:53,500 --> 00:25:55,500

That's probably far enough.

461

00:25:55,500 --> 00:25:56,500

Yeah.

462

00:25:56,500 --> 00:25:57,500

Do you see anything on that run?

463

00:25:57,500 --> 00:25:59,500

Let me check.

464

00:25:59,500 --> 00:26:01,500

Oh, holy, look at this.

465

00:26:01,500 --> 00:26:02,500

Oh, wow.

466

00:26:02,500 --> 00:26:05,500

This is big.

467

00:26:05,500 --> 00:26:07,500

Oh, wow.

468

00:26:07,500 --> 00:26:09,500

That's crazy.

469

00:26:13,500 --> 00:26:15,500

Do you see anything on that run?

470

00:26:15,500 --> 00:26:16,500

Let me check.

471

00:26:16,500 --> 00:26:18,500

Oh, holy, look at this.

472

00:26:18,500 --> 00:26:19,500

Oh, wow.

473

00:26:19,500 --> 00:26:30,500

While conducting a ground penetrating radar test here at homestead 2, Jim, Zach, and I have just found more evidence of some kind of large object or structure buried several feet underground.

474

00:26:30,500 --> 00:26:32,500

So this is big anomaly here.

475

00:26:32,500 --> 00:26:33,500

Oh, wow.

476

00:26:33,500 --> 00:26:36,500

That's maybe five feet, four feet.

477

00:26:36,500 --> 00:26:37,500

So this is the structure.

478

00:26:37,500 --> 00:26:42,500

We look there and there, it's like an entrance or a pipe or something going up.

479

00:26:42,500 --> 00:26:47,500

It's on the same line as the well.

480

00:26:47,500 --> 00:26:48,500

And they used to say it's really a well.

481

00:26:48,500 --> 00:26:51,500

Heck, it could be a tunnel entrance for all we know.

482

00:26:51,500 --> 00:26:53,500

I'd like to know what's in this thing.

483

00:26:53,500 --> 00:26:54,500

Don't lift it up.

484

00:26:54,500 --> 00:26:55,500

Why not?

485

00:26:55,500 --> 00:27:00,500

Because the incident that happened with Brandon Fugel was right here.

486

00:27:00,500 --> 00:27:02,500

There was this guy that came in with him.

487

00:27:02,500 --> 00:27:08,500

He lifted this up and that's when he went catatonic.

488

00:27:08,500 --> 00:27:12,500

Several years ago, we were escorting some visitors on the site.

489

00:27:12,500 --> 00:27:21,500

And when we entered the old homestead area, we all piled out of the UTV to circle around the front of one of the old homesteads.

490

00:27:21,500 --> 00:27:27,500

And I looked around and found that one of the visitors was absent.

491

00:27:27,500 --> 00:27:37,500

As I circled around the back into the homestead, I saw this person fully upright with his eyes closed.

492

00:27:37,500 --> 00:27:44,500

And as I yelled his name to somehow get his attention and see what was happening, his eyes fluttered open.

493

00:27:44,500 --> 00:27:46,500

He says, well, that was strange.

494

00:27:46,500 --> 00:27:48,500

I said, what do you mean?

495

00:27:48,500 --> 00:27:52,500

He says, I was paralyzed and then went to sleep.

496

00:27:52,500 --> 00:27:55,500

How long have I been out?

497

00:27:55,500 --> 00:27:58,500

And I said, well, it's probably been about 10 minutes.

498

00:27:58,500 --> 00:28:01,500

He was shocked.

499

00:28:08,500 --> 00:28:10,500

And he did what now, Jim?

500

00:28:10,500 --> 00:28:12,500

He lifted it up.

501

00:28:12,500 --> 00:28:18,500

But I think before you open that up or do anything like that, I would definitely...

502

00:28:18,500 --> 00:28:19,500

Or maybe not.

503

00:28:19,500 --> 00:28:21,500

What the crap is that?

504

00:28:24,500 --> 00:28:26,500

It's filled with something.

505

00:28:26,500 --> 00:28:30,500

All right, well, look, if you want to look down in there, it's just filled with crappy water.

506

00:28:30,500 --> 00:28:31,500

I mean, muddy water or whatever.

507

00:28:31,500 --> 00:28:33,500

Maybe it's a septic tank.

508

00:28:33,500 --> 00:28:35,500

Seriously polluted.

509

00:28:35,500 --> 00:28:37,500

Well, it looks pretty bad.

510

00:28:47,500 --> 00:28:49,500

It stinks, though.

511

00:28:49,500 --> 00:28:51,500

So there's something in there.

512

00:28:55,500 --> 00:29:01,500

You know, I don't know if I want to say it or not, but I feel like, I don't know,

513

00:29:01,500 --> 00:29:04,500

I've got a little bit of a headache or something happening.

514

00:29:04,500 --> 00:29:08,500

So why don't we get out here, maybe the smell, maybe some mildew or mold or something here?

515

00:29:08,500 --> 00:29:12,500

So let's get back out to the road where there's more airflow.

516

00:29:14,500 --> 00:29:18,500

I started getting this headache and this nausea feeling.

517

00:29:18,500 --> 00:29:23,500

I wasn't sure what it was, but I realized, you know, I've got this dosimeter in my pocket.

518

00:29:23,500 --> 00:29:27,500

All right, well, maybe we should check our dose meters or whatever.

519

00:29:27,500 --> 00:29:29,500

Yeah.

520

00:29:29,500 --> 00:29:34,500

Holy, mine's beeping.

521

00:29:34,500 --> 00:29:36,500

Your max dose rate is about 120?

522

00:29:36,500 --> 00:29:37,500

Yes, 120 something.

523

00:29:37,500 --> 00:29:38,500

That's pretty high.

524

00:29:38,500 --> 00:29:39,500

That's pretty high.

525

00:29:39,500 --> 00:29:41,500

This is really scary.

526

00:29:41,500 --> 00:29:49,500

My dosimeter device, which measures exposure to ionizing radiation, is showing that I just got hit with 120 mRads per second.

527

00:29:49,500 --> 00:29:57,500

That's like getting 20,000 full-body X-ray scans in an airport, which is five times more than the legal limit allows in a year.

528

00:29:57,500 --> 00:29:59,500

So I just accumulated a semi-dangerous dose.

529

00:29:59,500 --> 00:30:05,500

So we're reading the exact same amount of rate, but this thing accumulated more.

530

00:30:05,500 --> 00:30:09,500

Well, and I was wondering if we stood over that hole when we opened it up.

531

00:30:09,500 --> 00:30:12,500

We were just exposed to ionizing radiation.

532

00:30:12,500 --> 00:30:13,500

Wow.

533

00:30:13,500 --> 00:30:19,500

Now, I gotta tell you that it's not a lethal dose, but it's an accumulated dose that you're not gonna see out in the middle of nowhere.

534

00:30:19,500 --> 00:30:20,500

Guaranteed.

535

00:30:20,500 --> 00:30:25,500

And well, and it's enough that they're saying, hey, it's dangerous to get out of that place and don't stay in that place.

536

00:30:25,500 --> 00:30:27,500

So we need to stop the GPR.

537

00:30:27,500 --> 00:30:29,500

Well, let's load the stuff up.

538

00:30:29,500 --> 00:30:30,500

All right.

539

00:30:30,500 --> 00:30:31,500

Cool.

540

00:30:33,500 --> 00:30:35,500

What happened at Homestead 2 really shook me up.

541

00:30:35,500 --> 00:30:41,500

And then the next day, I noticed weird red marks on my hand and my head.

542

00:30:41,500 --> 00:30:46,500

I went to my doctor to get checked out, and he confirmed they were radiation burns.

543

00:30:46,500 --> 00:30:54,500

I'm okay now, but I'm really anxious to get to the final results of our GPR scans to find out if

it's something in the ground that caused this.

544

00:30:55,500 --> 00:30:56,500

Okay.

545

00:31:02,500 --> 00:31:08,500

Okay, we're here to discuss the processing of the GPR data that we collected out in the field.

546

00:31:08,500 --> 00:31:14,500

I took a look at all the data, and I'm really gonna concentrate in and around Homestead 2.

547

00:31:14,500 --> 00:31:17,500

So that's what we're gonna be looking at on screen today.

548

Now, what creates the hyperbolas are objects.

A lot of things can cause those.

559

Boulders can cause those types of features.

560

Tunneling can cause that type of feature.

561

Gosh, it goes all the way as far down as 25, 30 feet.

562

Right.

563

Well, it's clearly an anomaly.

564

Yes.

I'll tell you what it looks like to me.

Here's the top point.

There's another one kind of down here lower.

So now it's laid on the table and we'll draw it with a connect the dots.

We have a thousand foot long oval shaped object that appears to be buried underground at homestead two.

597

So the question obviously is, are they related?

I always get painted as the guy that's the anti-digging guy.

And look, I'm interested to know what's there too.

But at the end of the day, that was one of Brandon's big mandates to me.

611

Looking at that interesting shape we found, the knee-jerk reaction is we need to dig and find out what's going on.

612

It could be amazing or whatever.

613

My first reaction is, wait a minute.

614

00:34:41,500 --> 00:34:46,500

We have radiation in the area and we don't know what this is.

615

00:34:46,500 --> 00:34:50,500

And you pile that on top of the hole, don't dig, lure around this place.

616

00:34:50,500 --> 00:34:54,500

I mean, Thomas had a major injury that almost took his life.

617

00:34:54,500 --> 00:34:57,500

Travis was exposed to radiation.

618

00:34:57,500 --> 00:35:03,500

The last thing I'm going to do is just say, hey, yeah, let's head out there and start digging up the road and see what's down there.

619

00:35:04,500 --> 00:35:13,500

I'm extremely sensitive to what's going on right now between what happened to you the other night when we were camping again, what Travis experienced.

620

There certainly, I don't see the data the same way you do.

621

00:35:16,500 --> 00:35:19,500

I'd like to see what your opinion is.

622

00:35:19,500 --> 00:35:21,500

You're the professionalist.

623

Right, I think from what I see here.

624

00:35:23,500 --> 00:35:25,500

I don't have an opinion, Jim, is that what this is?

625

00:35:25,500 --> 00:35:32,500

I think from what I see here, I would absolutely see this as being an anomalous area, is what I would say.

626

Just me, when you say anomalous, different than the rest of the area.

627

00:35:36,500 --> 00:35:41,500

Different than the rest of the area that we didn't see for nine-tenths of the road that we went down.

628

Well, I think we take this to Brandon and tell him the whole story, Dragon, and say,

629

If it, we better take it, because apparently because I'm not a PhD, I don't have a f\*\*\*ing opinion at the table.

Look, I care about you guys.

634

that all this stuff has started happening, and I'm sorry, going back to your analogy,

I don't want to poke a hornet's nest that has radioactive hornets going flying out.

636

Well, we've been stung once by it, right?

637

Yeah, I know.

To that point, if we're going down two feet and we're testing, and two feet and we're testing,

639

if that is the case, those levels are going to be going up, and we can stop.

640

We'll see it every time.

641

And if Brandon looks at the data and says, OK, I will sign off on this, you're good with it then, Brian.

642

He's my boss.

But I'm just trying to get a read for where you are personally.

644

If he signs off on it, are you comfortable with it?

Because you're ultimately responsible for it.

Like I said, I just answered him.

Right in front of Homestead 2, there is an anomaly underground that ranges from about 12 or 13 feet all the way down to 35 feet.

666

And it's kind of, I would say, maybe football shape about a thousand foot long.

Wow.

668

00:38:11,500 --> 00:38:19,500

If I were going to say that there's any place on the ranch where X marks the spot, it's right there in the middle of the road right in front of Homestead 2.

669

Okay, this is something that I did not expect.

670

00:38:22,500 --> 00:38:25,500

That leads into the not so good news.

671

00:38:25,500 --> 00:38:34,500

Travis and Dr. Segala were exposed to a dose of toxic radiation.

672

What?

673

00:38:35,500 --> 00:38:36,500

Yeah.

674

00:38:36,500 --> 00:38:40,500

Well, I mean, I'm okay, and I've had my doctors talk to me about it and everything.

675

There's nothing to worry about.

676

00:38:42,500 --> 00:38:45,500

Yeah, I don't know if you guys can hear yourselves right now.

677

00:38:45,500 --> 00:38:52,500

I just told me that the ground penetrating radar study located a football shaped object.

678

00:38:52,500 --> 00:38:58,500

In tandem with that, we have Travis out there getting hit with some type of radiation.

679

00:38:58,500 --> 00:39:01,500

It sounds serious, it's all to me.

680

00:39:01,500 --> 00:39:04,500

Look, this is your property.

681

00:39:04,500 --> 00:39:08,500

And you know, I'm going to defer to you because you're the boss.

682

00:39:08,500 --> 00:39:11,500

So what, how do you feel about it?

683

00:39:12,500 --> 00:39:22,500

There is no way that we proceed with any major activity on that ranch without making sure that we properly assess the risks associated with it.

684

00:39:22,500 --> 00:39:26,500

Yeah, I think we don't have to dig in a major excavation way.

685

00:39:26,500 --> 00:39:29,500

What we do is take like auger core samples.

686

00:39:29,500 --> 00:39:38,500

And so, you know, something that's a few inches in diameter, we drill down until we get to that first layer of what the boundary of this thing is.

687

00:39:38,500 --> 00:39:39,500

Yeah.

688

00:39:39,500 --> 00:39:48,500

And we'll do safety measurements every couple of feet to make sure it's not pulling back a toxic chemical or something radioactive.

689

00:39:48,500 --> 00:39:49,500

I appreciate that.

690

00:39:49,500 --> 00:39:52,500

I think that's the case.

691

00:39:52,500 --> 00:39:59,500

I would, you know, with great caution, move swiftly to find out what we're dealing with here.

692

00:39:59,500 --> 00:40:08,500

And I'm sorry, Dragon, but I feel like I'm going to put you in the awkward position of making sure that proper precautions and measures are taken to protect those that are going to be taken.

693

00:40:08,500 --> 00:40:14,500

Let's make sure that we avoid at all costs any further harm.

694

00:40:14,500 --> 00:40:15,500

I agree with that.

695

00:40:15,500 --> 00:40:20,500

I don't think we have any choice but to move urgently and find out what is down there.

696

This could change the whole trajectory of this investigation.

697

Or it could halt it in its tracks, Brandon.

698

00:40:27,500 --> 00:40:36,500

Well, let's proceed forward cautiously, but expeditiously to see what really lies beneath and keep me posted.

Ground penetrating radar said there's something here under the road that's anomalous,

708

and the only way to get down there and look at it is to dig a hole.

So that's exactly what we're going to do.

710

Let's get to it.

711

00:41:36,500 --> 00:41:38,500

GPR has given us an X-Marked spot.

712

00:41:38,500 --> 00:41:40,500

They're hitting something hard.

713

00:41:40,500 --> 00:41:41,500

Man, they're on something.

714

00:41:41,500 --> 00:41:44,500

There is an unnatural structure beneath this property.

715

00:41:44,500 --> 00:41:45,500

That whole thing shakes.

716

00:41:45,500 --> 00:41:46,500

Look at that. What is that?

717

00:41:46,500 --> 00:41:47,500

Why is that rocket like that?

718

00:41:47,500 --> 00:41:48,500

Oh!

719

00:41:48,500 --> 00:41:49,500

There we go.

720

00:41:49,500 --> 00:41:53,500

I'm hoping that bringing an exotic animal on the ranch would stimulate whatever is mutilated.

721

He's cattle.

The alpacas have been torn apart.

What is that?
