Maybe we can come focus over here more.

192

Nothing but background.

210

At this point in time, there's no radiation.

211

212

there's nothing there at the moment.

213

If there really is some kind of massive object or structure

228

then I'm eager to start drilling so we can find it.

Can we be stirring up a hornet's nest here?

231

But why would we want to walk away now without any answers?

233

So I guess we're getting some new animals.

234

El Pacas, I think is what they are.

235

Is that the ones that spit on you?

236

I think if you make them mad, yeah, they'll spit on you.

237

Go ahead and open this.

238

We decided to see if our drilling operation,

239

00:09:55,000 --> 00:09:58,000

coupled with the introduction of an exotic type of animal,

240

00:09:58,000 --> 00:10:02,000

would help trigger some kind of strange or unusual phenomenon.

241

00:10:02,000 --> 00:10:06,000

So Tom and Candice arranged for the delivery of two El Pacas.

242

00:10:06,000 --> 00:10:07,000

That's probably good.

243

00:10:07,000 --> 00:10:10,000

That's a type of animal that, as far as any of us know,

244

00:10:10,000 --> 00:10:12,000

has never been on the ranch before.

245

00:10:12,000 --> 00:10:13,000

Hello, hello.

246

00:10:13,000 --> 00:10:14,000

Hey, Jim.

247

00:10:14,000 --> 00:10:15,000

Good to see you.

248

00:10:15,000 --> 00:10:16,000

You too.

249

00:10:16,000 --> 00:10:17,000

So excited.

250

00:10:17,000 --> 00:10:18,000

I can see you've already adopted them.

251

00:10:18,000 --> 00:10:19,000

Yes.

252

00:10:19,000 --> 00:10:23,000

The idea of bringing El Pacas on the ranch was just to introduce a different animal,

253

00:10:23,000 --> 00:10:25,000

something that's never been here,

254

00:10:25,000 --> 00:10:27,000

something a little bit more exotic than a cow.

255

00:10:27,000 --> 00:10:29,000

I'm ready to rock and roll.

256

00:10:29,000 --> 00:10:32,000

And we thought it would be interesting to just see how they react to the ranch

257

00:10:32,000 --> 00:10:34,000

and how the ranch reacts to them.

258

00:10:34,000 --> 00:10:37,000

We could put them in this corner pen for now.

259

00:10:38,000 --> 00:10:41,000

We're going to corral them to start with in a smaller space

260

00:10:41,000 --> 00:10:44,000

so they can get more comfortable to the bigger scope of things

261

00:10:44,000 --> 00:10:46,000

where we can maybe eventually let them out in the pasture.

262

Just watch out for their back legs,

263

00:10:48,000 --> 00:10:50,000

because they will kick sometimes if they're scared.

264

Candice, do it.

265

Hi.

267

Come here.

268

It's okay, buddy.

269

Well, look at them.

270

00:11:00,000 --> 00:11:01,000

Yeah.

271

Oh, it's so sweet.

272

Oh, it's so cute.

273

Come here.

280

because they have very good eyesight, very good hearing,

281

00:11:16,000 --> 00:11:20,000

and are always aware of what's going on around them.

282

Come on.

283

00:11:21,000 --> 00:11:24,000

Hopefully they'll react if they see something out of the ordinary.

284

00:11:24,000 --> 00:11:25,000

Welcome.

285

00:11:25,000 --> 00:11:27,000

This is where you're going to live.

286

00:11:27,000 --> 00:11:31,000

But the only thing is they're not known to be very vocal.

287

00:11:31,000 --> 00:11:33,000

So which one is Lionel?

288

00:11:33,000 --> 00:11:35,000

The chocolate brown, yeah.

289

00:11:35,000 --> 00:11:37,000

Jed is the lighter one.

290

00:11:37,000 --> 00:11:38,000

Yeah, he's the blonde.

291

00:11:38,000 --> 00:11:39,000

He's four.

292

00:11:39,000 --> 00:11:40,000

Okay.

293

00:11:40,000 --> 00:11:42,000

And then Lionel's 10.

294

I got my degree in anthropology,

295

00:11:44,000 --> 00:11:47,000

which is really the study of behavior.

296

So Tom and I, being part of this whole team,

297

we're hoping that it sheds light on things

298

00:11:52,000 --> 00:11:55,000

we hadn't ever really looked into before, researching-wise.

299

I seem to like it, okay?

300

They're doing it, yeah.

301

00:11:57,000 --> 00:12:00,000

And their ears are telling too, when they stand up.

302

I like the idea of introducing new types of animals to the property

303

in order to see if that will stimulate different types of interactions

304

00:12:09,000 --> 00:12:11,000

with the phenomena.

305

And it's something that will hopefully bring new insight.

306

They're pretty comfortable.

307

activity that happens here.

352

Now, because I'm a scientist, you

354

Skinwalker Ranch really derived its name from a curse.

404

The Skinwalker curse has its roots

in a feud between the Yute tribe and the Navajo tribe.

406

00:16:25,580 --> 00:16:29,020

At a time when the Yutes were really aligned with the United

407

00:16:29,120 --> 00:16:32,420

States government and had sold many of their peers

408

00:16:32,520 --> 00:16:34,420

into slavery.

409

00:16:34,520 --> 00:16:37,300

So the Navajo cursed this property.

410

00:16:38,220 --> 00:16:41,800

A skinwalker is essentially a witch

411

00:16:41,900 --> 00:16:45,300

that has chosen to put on the skin, essentially,

412

00:16:45,400 --> 00:16:50,840

or the form of what can only be described as a giant wolf.

413

00:16:50,940 --> 00:16:53,440

A skinwalker is something that exhibits

414

00:16:53,540 --> 00:16:57,040

superhuman agility and strength.

415

Placing the skinwalker curse on this property

416

00:17:00,180 --> 00:17:02,880

made it a very real place to avoid.

417

We've heard all these stories that if you dig on this ranch,

418

bad things might happen to the people that do the digging.

419

So there's a space down here that we've

420

got instruments that say there might be something

421

underground, but the only way to know is to drill.

422

don't want to do something that's dangerous.

ground-penetrating radar surveys near Homestead 2.

492

00:20:33,320 --> 00:20:35,320

That's perfect.

493

00:20:35,320 --> 00:20:36,320

Pew.

494

00:20:36,320 --> 00:20:38,320

We're told that some kind of misfortune

495

00:20:38,320 --> 00:20:40,320

often accompanies digging.

496

00:20:40,320 --> 00:20:42,320

We don't assume that there's a danger,

497

00:20:42,320 --> 00:20:45,320

but we also don't assume that there isn't.

498

00:20:46,320 --> 00:20:48,320

In my opinion, we're ready to dig.

499

00:20:48,320 --> 00:20:49,320

We have the right personnel.

500

00:20:49,320 --> 00:20:51,320

We hire the right consultants.

501

00:20:51,320 --> 00:20:52,320

We're well protected.

502

00:20:52,320 --> 00:20:55,320

We're ready to get out of there if anything bad happens.

503

00:20:55,320 --> 00:20:56,320

So we're ready to go.

504

00:20:56,320 --> 00:20:58,320

That's a pretty big drill.

505

00:20:58,320 --> 00:21:00,320

Yeah, this is on Brandon's mandate.

506

00:21:00,320 --> 00:21:02,320

It certainly wasn't mine.

507

00:21:02,320 --> 00:21:04,320

It's gonna be all right, Dragon.

508

00:21:06,320 --> 00:21:09,320

I still have some reservations about digging

509

00:21:09,320 --> 00:21:11,320

or drilling on the property.

510

00:21:11,320 --> 00:21:15,320

A lot of the activity associated with digging on the ranch

511

00:21:15,320 --> 00:21:18,320

isn't necessarily what you're gonna pull out of the ground.

512

00:21:18,320 --> 00:21:19,320

How we doing?

513

00:21:19,320 --> 00:21:22,320

But what may happen when you do disturb the earth?

514

00:21:22,320 --> 00:21:24,320

You guys are ready to do some work, huh?

515

Yeah.

516

I guess we'll have you come on in then.

517

Ground-penetrating radar said there's something under the road

518

00:21:31,320 --> 00:21:33,320

that's anomalous, and the only way to get down there

519

00:21:33,320 --> 00:21:35,320

and look at it is to dig a hole.

520

00:21:35,320 --> 00:21:37,320

So that's what we're going to do.

521

Hey, guys.

522

00:21:38,320 --> 00:21:39,320

I'm Thomas.

523

00:21:39,320 --> 00:21:40,320

Okay.

524

I'm the ranch superintendent here.

525

00:21:41,320 --> 00:21:42,320

It's Jeremy.

526

00:21:42,320 --> 00:21:43,320

Jeremy.

527

So what we found, guys, is we did ground-penetrating radar

528

00:21:45,320 --> 00:21:47,320

along the roadway here,

529

00:21:47,320 --> 00:21:49,320

and so there's something along this stretch

530

00:21:49,320 --> 00:21:51,320

from about where we are on past that homestead,

531

00:21:51,320 --> 00:21:53,320

probably 50 feet or so.

532

00:21:53,320 --> 00:21:56,320

We've had some, I don't call them issues,

533

00:21:56,320 --> 00:21:58,320

but some events where there might have been

534

00:21:58,320 --> 00:22:00,320

some radioactive decay particles.

535

00:22:00,320 --> 00:22:02,320

There might have been some toxic chemicals.

536

00:22:02,320 --> 00:22:05,320

So we'd like to go small distances, like a few feet,

537

00:22:05,320 --> 00:22:08,320

measure it with equipment that Casey brought,

538

00:22:08,320 --> 00:22:11,320

and then once clear, do the next few feet

539

00:22:11,320 --> 00:22:13,320

and make sure that we're not getting anybody

540

00:22:13,320 --> 00:22:15,320

in any situation we don't want to be in, right?

541

00:22:15,320 --> 00:22:16,320

Sure.

542

00:22:16,320 --> 00:22:18,320

The first hole we're going to drill today

543

00:22:18,320 --> 00:22:20,320

will be at the far end of homestead 2.

544

00:22:20,320 --> 00:22:23,320

Now, Jeremy LeBeau has been instructed to go easy

545

00:22:23,320 --> 00:22:26,320

in case we hit something really dangerous.

546

00:22:26,320 --> 00:22:28,320

We're drilling today with hollow stem augers.

547

00:22:28,320 --> 00:22:30,320

They're hollow in the middle.

548

00:22:30,320 --> 00:22:32,320

That allows us to go down through the middle with our sampler.

549

00:22:32,320 --> 00:22:35,320

We'd bring up the sample, look inside of it,

550

00:22:35,320 --> 00:22:38,320

and you could do whatever readings you need to do at that point.

551

00:22:38,320 --> 00:22:41,320

And that would be before we drill down and really disturb it.

552

Yeah, I like that.

553

Well, let's get him located where we want to plunge

554

00:22:44,320 --> 00:22:45,320

that first hole.

555

00:22:45,320 --> 00:22:47,320

And let's get you situated to measure

556

00:22:47,320 --> 00:22:48,320

whatever they pull up from that, right?

557

00:22:48,320 --> 00:22:49,320

Correct.

558

You want it right there?

559

00:22:56,320 --> 00:22:58,320

Yep, right in the middle of the road, right there.

560

Unusual things happen out at homestead 2.

561

It's undeniable.

562

There's talk about things being buried here.

563

There are rumors that there is some kind of alien activity

564

00:23:13,320 --> 00:23:15,320

beneath this property.

565

00:23:15,320 --> 00:23:17,320

And here we are at that very spot,

566

00:23:17,320 --> 00:23:20,320

ready to start exploring what's beneath the ground.

567

00:23:20,320 --> 00:23:23,320

But we really don't know what we're going to find.

568

So, guys, before you drill, I'm going to remove myself.

569

00:23:30,320 --> 00:23:32,320

Keep it posted on how you're doing.

570

All right.

571

OK.

572

My rational mind says there's no problem digging on the ranch.

573

My experience makes me very superstitious.

574

00:23:44,320 --> 00:23:47,320

I didn't believe in the paranormal when I came out on this ranch.

575

00:23:47,320 --> 00:23:53,320

It wasn't until my injury that I really bought into the whole notion of digging.

576

00:23:53,320 --> 00:23:57,320

We can check for radiation or gases that come out.

577

00:23:57,320 --> 00:24:02,320

But show me the scientific meter that can pick up bad spirits or bad energies.

578

00:24:02,320 --> 00:24:05,320

And until we have that, we can't say that we can monitor

579

00:24:05,320 --> 00:24:08,320

for every bad thing that could possibly be coming out of the earth.

580

00:24:10,320 --> 00:24:11,320

Here we go.

581

So is this the core sample now?

582

00:24:21,320 --> 00:24:22,320

Yep.

583

00:24:22,320 --> 00:24:24,320

He's getting the sample.

584

Oh, so you're getting dirt before you even drill.

585

00:24:26,320 --> 00:24:27,320

That's right.

The drilling just facilities to get to the depth of sand.

587

There are a couple of reasons why we don't just bring

excavation equipment out and just dig the whole ranch up.

Number one, we're not sure what's down there.

And so it's safer to do core samples first.

When we pull the core sample up and we look at it,

the first thing we're doing is having Casey check it for radioactive material.

There's no radiation or anything in there, Casey?

Nothing.

So we can keep moving.

596

I have no preconceived ideas of what it is we're going to hit.

597

Disturbed earth, stuff like that.

These strange objects that we're seeing is a source of the radiation

607

that caused the injury to Thomas, caused the injury to Travis.

So if we do find something that shows dangerous radiation levels,

609

00:25:40,320 --> 00:25:42,320

that's the end of this investigation.

Anything?
