The small rockets we launched last summer above the Triangle area

That's like a 120-millimeter rocket right there.

You hand us the devil, have to carry it.

I've been looking forward to that ever since.

A lot of times the drones fell.

114

The balloon got to that altitude and just kind of disappeared.

3-2-1, let it launch.

116

That is awesome.

117

If these rockets that we'll equip with measuring devices

118

and cameras can reach that point above the triangle area,

119

maybe we'll find out what happened to the balloon.

120

Why don't you guys walk us through what all you brought

121

so then Eric and I can start thinking,

122

well, what we're going to put in each one of these

as far as the science is concerned.

The motors that we brought are Gs through Ms.

Alan brought this one.

128

Wow.

That thing is awesome.

133

So what type of altitudes are you thinking we're going to get

134

138

There has to be well over a dozen rockets

139

that they've brought this year.

140

Some of them are massive.

141

00:05:18,000 --> 00:05:20,000

The fact that we have these big rockets

142

00:05:20,000 --> 00:05:22,000

that can hold all sorts of equipment

143

00:05:22,000 --> 00:05:24,000

and larger payloads of instruments

144

00:05:24,000 --> 00:05:26,000

and can reach that height

145

00:05:26,000 --> 00:05:29,000

is going to be really interesting to see what the data yields.

146

I'm excited all the way across the board for this day.

147

So we are really excited to have this happen,

148

154

we had a lot of unexplained strangeness take place

155

during the launch and after the launch.

156

And even after you go home over the next couple of days,

157

if you experience anything that's out of the ordinary

158

or strange, we want to know about it

159

because sometimes maybe the effects aren't immediate.

160

Yeah, if your phone acts crazy,

161

your car starts itself or the radio equipment

162

malfunctions unexplainably.

163

Any of that kind of stuff is data points for us.

164

All right, we want these guys to stay.

165

So let's not scare them off just yet.

Well, let's build some rockets is what I want to do.

167

I want to.

173

While we were building the rockets,

175

Tom Lewis and Candace Lindy met once again

176

with the family of the late UFO and UAP researcher,

177

00:06:56,000 --> 00:06:58,000

Junior Higgs.

178

00:06:58,000 --> 00:07:00,000

With everything we've seen and are now trying to verify,

179

00:07:00,000 --> 00:07:02,000

we reached out to them to see if anything in Junior

180

00:07:02,000 --> 00:07:04,000

is more than 60 years of record.

181

We're going to see if they're going to be able to get

182

00:07:07,000 --> 00:07:10,000

60 years of records could help us with this investigation.

183

We're happy to have you back.

184

Thanks for inviting us.

185

Junior Higgs is kind of a local legend.

186

Unfortunately, he passed away a few months ago,

187

00:07:19,000 --> 00:07:23,000

but he kept thousands of different documents of people

188

00:07:23,000 --> 00:07:27,000

who had seen sightings of UFOs and different creatures.

189

00:07:27,000 --> 00:07:32,000

Just recently, his son, Ward, found a lot more documents.

190

So we invited him to the ranch to go through these documents

191

00:07:35,000 --> 00:07:38,000

because this is going to help us, you know,

192

00:07:38,000 --> 00:07:40,000

put more pieces of this puzzle together.

193

Oh, yeah, we were so impressed with the notion of his record keeping.

194

I mean, knowing that he kept those records

195

and then your willingness to share some of the most really incredible.

Whenever there was a phenomena of UFO or unexplained flying objects,

he would want to interview people.

He had a form that he could fill out.

200

He'd have the date, the time, the place, the weather conditions,

how many witnesses, what was actually observed.

And then they'd even draw pictures of what they had seen.

203

And he kept a file on every incident of every observation.

Wow.

When I was growing up, I remember a lot of UFO reports.

206

I remember my dad going out to visit people and to interview people.

207

I remember him bringing home the paperwork

208

and talking about it with her family.

209

And I thought it was interesting, exciting, and it was pretty cool.

210

There's over 200 of them in here.

211

Well, for example, here's one.

212

This was, you can see they draw the image there.

213

Showing the image of the object down below there.

214

And here's one. You can see this one.

215

That one right there, you see?

216

Some of them were double convex and some were half convex.

217

Now, here's another one here. You see this one?

218

Wow.

219

00:09:10,000 --> 00:09:14,000

And that one was in 1965.

220

00:09:14,000 --> 00:09:19,000

Here's another one that shows the beam coming out.

221

00:09:19,000 --> 00:09:22,000

Some of them mentioned a red beam that would come out.

222

00:09:22,000 --> 00:09:24,000

It could actually see the end of the beam.

223

00:09:24,000 --> 00:09:26,000

It would slowly come out of the object, hit the ground,

224

00:09:26,000 --> 00:09:29,000

light it up for a little bit, then withdraw the beam.

225

00:09:29,000 --> 00:09:33,000

You can actually see the end of the beam coming up.

226

00:09:33,000 --> 00:09:38,000

There are really incredible images to see, to look at.

227

And what was fascinating to me, my dad, was when they would have a sighting

228

and then he would get another report and he could tell it was the very same object.

229

Oh, wow.

230

Two people didn't even know each other and they would both report it

231

and it would happen the same day, the same time, the same description.

232

Some of these stories completely correlated with each other,

233

00:09:59,000 --> 00:10:01,000

seeing these strange lights in the sky.

234

That lends a lot of, you know, validity and credibility to what these people had to say.

235

Well, here's one. This one happened in 1970.

236

The man and his boy were riding horses.

237

He said it was, they noticed this object about a mile from us.

238

It was a white halo of light.

239

Another person, driving by saw the same thing, so he's got a report of that one as well.

240

Wow.

241

These images are very similar to something that we've seen.

242

Oh, yeah.

243

These images are very similar to something that we've seen.

244

Exactly. Yeah, that looks just like what we saw last year.

245

Some of these drawings resonated with some of the things that we've seen on the ranch.

246

There's one instance where I saw something that I can't explain

247

00:11:16,000 --> 00:11:19,000

fly across the mesa right in front of our house.

248

You're seeing this weird ball of light flying across the sky.

249

Is that a UFO? Is that alien? I don't know.

250

00:11:31,000 --> 00:11:33,000

You know, it wasn't a helicopter.

251

00:11:33,000 --> 00:11:35,000

It wasn't a satellite. It wasn't an airplane.

252

00:11:35,000 --> 00:11:37,000

I can tell you what it wasn't.

253

But I can't tell you what it is.

254

We're so, so thankful and so excited to get this information

255

because it's going to help us paint a better picture of what's happening here.

You know, going through all these records, putting them in a database.

270

Well here's my thoughts on order of launch.

Gamma-ray detector.

Gamma-ray detector and it's also going to have the transmitting chirp

281

that we can pick up with the spectrum analyzer.

Yeah.

283

One thing we want to keep in mind is as interesting as it is to track these rockets

284

we should just keep our eyes on the sky in general

285

because we don't know what else might happen.

Yeah, so one thing to keep in mind is what happened last year.

While we're launching those rockets we had all these experiences

And remember that something could occur, a phenomena could occur

We're ready whenever you guys are. Load the rocket. Copy that.

869

and once and for all determine whether or not there's something happening with the magnetic field,

871

I want to do that with a helicopter above the ranch.

You know, Cameron is one of the greatest pilots that I've ever been around,

875
