One, this happened only a couple nights

after our telescope and rocket experiment

76

78

Two, those UAPs appeared just after Eric detected

Retired Army Colonel John Alexander.

148

Thanks for coming out.

We appreciate it.

150

Colonel Alexander was a key member of billionaire

152

00:06:23,160 --> 00:06:26,040

Robert Bigelow's team who studied phenomena on the ranch

153

00:06:26,100 --> 00:06:29,340

for two decades, starting back in 1996.

154

00:06:29,400 --> 00:06:30,240

Hey, guys.

155

00:06:30,300 --> 00:06:32,240

You remember Colonel Alexander?

156

00:06:32,300 --> 00:06:34,740

So given everything we've been experiencing recently

157

00:06:34,800 --> 00:06:38,080

at the Triangle, which now seems to be affecting the cattle

158

00:06:38,140 --> 00:06:40,980

as well, we were grateful that he agreed to come back

159

00:06:41,000 --> 00:06:43,440

and they could help our investigation.

160

00:06:43,500 --> 00:06:45,300

So is this the first time you've been back to the ranch

161

00:06:45,380 --> 00:06:46,340

since the Bigelow era?

162

00:06:46,400 --> 00:06:47,640

Well, a couple decades.

163

Wow.

164

00:06:48,520 --> 00:06:49,640

Looks a little different.

165

00:06:49,720 --> 00:06:51,080

The topography looks the same.

166

00:06:51,140 --> 00:06:55,880

The rest of it has kind of been updated quite a bit.

167

00:06:55,960 --> 00:06:58,220

I was a colonel in the Army.

168

00:06:58,280 --> 00:07:01,160

I was in special operations and finally

169

00:07:01,220 --> 00:07:03,960

as director of advanced system concept.

170

00:07:04,020 --> 00:07:07,900

Second career was Los Alamos National Laboratory.

171

00:07:07,900 --> 00:07:11,120

We did all the non-lethal weapons concepts.

172

00:07:11,200 --> 00:07:15,560

I had just left Los Alamos and in mid-95,

173

00:07:15,640 --> 00:07:18,200

Bob Bigelow decided to create NIDS,

174

00:07:18,260 --> 00:07:20,300

National Institute for Discovery Science.

175

00:07:20,360 --> 00:07:23,700

And I was the first NIDS employee.

176

00:07:23,780 --> 00:07:27,480

NIDS was formed for the purpose of looking at UFOs.

177

00:07:27,540 --> 00:07:31,180

Skinwalker presented that and so much more.

178

00:07:31,240 --> 00:07:35,680

We would like to see if you have some insight from your past

179

00:07:35,700 --> 00:07:39,800

here that might spur us into some other experiments

180

00:07:39,880 --> 00:07:41,140

that we might like to do.

181

00:07:41,200 --> 00:07:44,540

So during the time that you guys were here,

182

00:07:44,600 --> 00:07:50,980

can you think of a specific event that was the most disturbing

183

00:07:51,040 --> 00:07:54,480

or impactful, especially something like the cow?

184

I wouldn't know where to begin with that one.

185

When NIDS was created in mid-95,

186

00:08:01,940 --> 00:08:05,380

Terry Sherman was prepared to sell a ranch

187

00:08:05,380 --> 00:08:08,340

and so Bob Bigelow made it an offer.

188

00:08:08,400 --> 00:08:13,640

After he bought the ranch, he stayed on as the ranch manager.

189

00:08:13,720 --> 00:08:15,180

So it was calving season.

190

00:08:15,240 --> 00:08:19,280

Terry went out, found a newborn, tagged it and waited,

191

00:08:19,340 --> 00:08:22,380

drives across as perfectly open field,

192

00:08:22,440 --> 00:08:27,220

finds another newborn, tags it and weighs it, comes back,

193

00:08:27,280 --> 00:08:33,280

and mother's going berserk and cap one is dead.

194

00:08:34,080 --> 00:08:37,480

Not only is it dead, but there's about 40 pounds of stuff

195

00:08:37,540 --> 00:08:39,180

is missing.

196

00:08:39,240 --> 00:08:42,080

It's eviscerated, exsanguinated,

197

00:08:42,140 --> 00:08:44,280

ear had been sliced off.

198

00:08:44,340 --> 00:08:46,520

Hearing the strange details of this calf

199

00:08:46,580 --> 00:08:49,980

being mutilated in broad daylight reminds me again

200

00:08:50,040 --> 00:08:53,080

of the cow that died after we first stimulated UAPs

201

00:08:53,140 --> 00:08:57,340

to appear above the triangle two years ago.

202

00:08:57,420 --> 00:08:58,980

What in the world?

203

00:08:59,040 --> 00:09:01,640

Tom Winerton found the cow right after it died

204

00:09:01,640 --> 00:09:03,300

and alerted us to go investigate it.

205

00:09:03,380 --> 00:09:05,380

The meters just going crazy.

206

00:09:05,440 --> 00:09:08,380

Almost immediately, we began detecting high readings

207

00:09:08,440 --> 00:09:10,780

of RF radiation with our tri-fill meters.

208

00:09:10,840 --> 00:09:12,780

So we got out of there.

209

00:09:12,840 --> 00:09:16,040

What we'll do is go forward very slowly.

210

00:09:16,120 --> 00:09:18,580

But then, we reviewed the surveillance footage

211

00:09:18,640 --> 00:09:20,840

that captured the moment of the cow's death

212

00:09:20,920 --> 00:09:24,520

and saw UAP in the sky right above it since that day.

213

00:09:24,580 --> 00:09:26,020

We've wondered if we might have stopped

214

00:09:26,080 --> 00:09:27,680

a mutilation from happening.

215

00:09:27,740 --> 00:09:30,820

But it's also very curious that both the Bigelow team

216

and our team had cows die under very inexplicable

217

00:09:34,520 --> 00:09:37,520

circumstances right after we first began investigating

218

00:09:37,600 --> 00:09:39,820

phenomena on Skinwalker Ranch.

219

It made me wonder what other similarities

220

00:09:41,900 --> 00:09:43,600

we've both experienced.

221

00:09:43,660 --> 00:09:45,800

What's really interesting is a lot of times

222

00:09:45,860 --> 00:09:47,900

when we do have these anomalies,

223

00:09:47,960 --> 00:09:50,260

we are detecting a strange signal

224

00:09:50,320 --> 00:09:51,300

that we can't identify.

225

00:09:51,360 --> 00:09:54,300

At 1.6 something gigahertz.

226

00:09:54,360 --> 00:09:55,160

OK.

227

00:09:55,220 --> 00:09:58,300

And so I guess the question we would have

228

00:09:58,340 --> 00:10:02,200

is during the time that you guys were here,

229

00:10:02,280 --> 00:10:06,980

did you record or see things that looked like this signal

230

00:10:07,040 --> 00:10:09,000

at 1.6 gigahertz?

231

00:10:09,080 --> 00:10:12,700

As you know, I've dealt with the UFO phenomena quite a bit.

232

00:10:12,780 --> 00:10:16,640

And that is one of the perplexing aspects

233

00:10:16,700 --> 00:10:19,280

is things like these sort of signals.

234

00:10:19,340 --> 00:10:23,140

And these things occur in many, many areas.

235

00:10:23,200 --> 00:10:27,140

And why is it that we see things that shouldn't be there

236

00:10:27,180 --> 00:10:29,880

and don't see things that we should see?

237

00:10:29,940 --> 00:10:33,280

For instance, we would set up cameras and say, OK,

238

00:10:33,340 --> 00:10:35,280

we're going to, if it's happening here,

239

00:10:35,340 --> 00:10:37,420

we're going to watch in that location.

240

00:10:37,480 --> 00:10:39,140

But you get nothing.

241

00:10:39,220 --> 00:10:41,280

Things would happen off camera.

242

00:10:41,340 --> 00:10:43,080

Sometimes the most important data

243

00:10:43,140 --> 00:10:45,040

are the ones we can't collect.

244

00:10:45,120 --> 00:10:46,740

The fact that something is interfering,

245

00:10:46,820 --> 00:10:48,480

which is very often the case here.

246

00:10:48,540 --> 00:10:49,940

Right.

247

00:10:50,020 --> 00:10:51,220

So the other thing I wanted to ask you

248

00:10:51,280 --> 00:10:54,340

is we've heard about opening portals.

249

00:10:54,420 --> 00:10:56,540

What can you tell us about those?

250

00:10:56,540 --> 00:10:58,780

The closest to what you're asking

251

00:10:58,840 --> 00:11:02,940

is the incident out at the second homestead, you know,

252

00:11:03,020 --> 00:11:07,440

something moving through the Russian olives out there,

253

00:11:07,520 --> 00:11:08,340

through the trees.

254

00:11:08,420 --> 00:11:11,780

We were aware it was kind of a slight distortion.

255

00:11:11,840 --> 00:11:12,940

You didn't see a thing.

256

00:11:13,020 --> 00:11:16,080

It was more distortion than moving.

257

00:11:16,140 --> 00:11:17,740

After their investigation ended,

258

00:11:17,820 --> 00:11:21,140

the NINDS team put forth the idea that a portal connected

259

00:11:21,220 --> 00:11:23,580

to another dimension causes the phenomena

260

00:11:23,640 --> 00:11:25,140

that happened on the ranch.

261

00:11:25,140 --> 00:11:26,940

I don't know if that could really explain what's

262

00:11:27,020 --> 00:11:28,420

happened during our experiments,

263

00:11:28,480 --> 00:11:32,820

but we've seen some crazy stuff at Homestead 2 as well.

264

00:11:32,880 --> 00:11:35,240

Last year, we used thermal imaging at night

265

00:11:35,320 --> 00:11:38,420

to capture a circular temperature vortex

266

00:11:38,480 --> 00:11:43,080

that was at least 20 degrees colder than any of its surroundings.

267

00:11:43,140 --> 00:11:44,980

And when we reviewed our footage,

268

00:11:45,040 --> 00:11:47,140

we saw something moving erratically

269

00:11:47,220 --> 00:11:49,140

in front of the homestead.

270

00:11:49,220 --> 00:11:51,980

Now, I'm still not ready to say a portal or a wormhole

271

00:11:52,040 --> 00:11:54,080

exists on Skinwalker Ranch,

272

00:11:54,080 --> 00:11:57,420

but it is amazing that other researchers and scientists

273

00:11:57,480 --> 00:11:58,920

believe that it could.

274

00:11:58,980 --> 00:12:00,520

So what I'm taking from this is that there

275

00:12:00,580 --> 00:12:02,860

is a long history of unusual phenomena

276

00:12:02,920 --> 00:12:06,860

without an identifiable source in this basin.

277

00:12:06,920 --> 00:12:11,320

And I'm learning that there were no answers produced

278

00:12:11,380 --> 00:12:14,720

as a result of the previous research here.

279

00:12:14,780 --> 00:12:16,180

That's kind of surprising.

280

00:12:16,260 --> 00:12:17,180

Right.

281

00:12:17,260 --> 00:12:19,020

Because that burden that we're bearing today

282

00:12:19,080 --> 00:12:22,620

is that our own conclusions don't make sense to us yet.

283

00:12:22,620 --> 00:12:23,720

It's been a frustration.

284

00:12:23,800 --> 00:12:25,260

It almost become a joke.

285

00:12:25,320 --> 00:12:27,920

Yes, but I think you're operating under the illusion

286

00:12:28,000 --> 00:12:29,720

that you're in control.

287

00:12:29,800 --> 00:12:31,720

You're not in control.

288

00:12:31,800 --> 00:12:33,420

There's an it that's in control.

289

00:12:40,420 --> 00:12:44,960

Whatever it was seemed to know how we would respond

290

00:12:45,020 --> 00:12:49,220

before the event even occurred.

291

00:12:49,220 --> 00:12:53,220

It was not responding in a way that we would anticipate.

292

00:12:53,300 --> 00:12:55,760

And every time you try to anticipate,

293

00:12:55,820 --> 00:12:59,060

it would just morph to something a little bit different.

294

00:12:59,120 --> 00:13:00,820

Like I say, you like that?

295

00:13:00,900 --> 00:13:02,660

Try this.

296

00:13:02,720 --> 00:13:05,500

I'm really interested in how you arrived at that impression,

297

00:13:05,560 --> 00:13:07,820

that overall assessment of what was going on here,

298

00:13:07,900 --> 00:13:11,220

from having experiments not go as your plan

299

00:13:11,300 --> 00:13:13,620

to there being an it.

300

00:13:13,700 --> 00:13:16,020

When a physical event had occurred,

301

00:13:16,100 --> 00:13:17,900

something would happen.

302

00:13:17,940 --> 00:13:20,180

Theoretically, can somebody happen?

303

00:13:20,240 --> 00:13:22,300

Yes, but when you look at it practically,

304

00:13:22,380 --> 00:13:25,300

it just makes no sense at all.

305

00:13:25,380 --> 00:13:29,100

It was when it decided to present us with something

306

00:13:29,180 --> 00:13:32,580

that the events occurred.

307

00:13:32,640 --> 00:13:35,180

Do you know, did they ever feel like they got a response

Thomas rented an industrial-sized bulldozer

488

00:20:47,040 --> 00:20:49,180

so we could dig in that exact same area

489

00:20:49,240 --> 00:20:51,640

to see what might happen.

490

00:20:51,720 --> 00:20:53,980

Oh, here he comes.

491

00:20:54,040 --> 00:20:55,080

What's up, Thomas?

492

00:20:55,140 --> 00:20:56,920

How was your sports car ride over here?

493

00:20:56,980 --> 00:20:57,880

Rough.

494

00:20:57,960 --> 00:21:00,060

Yeah, I bet it was.

495

So I'm thinking we just go down what, four or five feet?

496

Right now, we're at normal background.

517

12.

518

12 micro.

519

00:21:44,440 --> 00:21:45,380

Yep.

520

00:21:45,440 --> 00:21:46,980

As a precaution for this experiment,

521

Eric had the Spectrum Analyzer scanning the area

522

00:21:49,660 --> 00:21:52,420

for the 1.6 gigahertz RF signal.

523

And we both also had Geiger counter devices

524

to look out for harmful spikes and gamma radiators.

525

And we also had a radio radiation.

526

When we dug last year in the South Field near where the cow

527

died, we detected gamma rays three times the normal level.

528

All right, I think we got it covered.

529

Thomas, you ready to dig?

530

Yeah, I'm ready to dig.

531

Rolling this D8 dozer across, this

532

00:22:20,920 --> 00:22:22,860

is definitely the largest bulldozer that has ever

533

00:22:22,920 --> 00:22:24,200

been on Skatewalker Ranch.

534

It's unusual.

535

00:22:29,920 --> 00:22:32,400

After seeing some of the data that we've received after digging

536

00:22:32,460 --> 00:22:34,900

other holes on the ranch, it'll be interesting to see what

537

00:22:34,960 --> 00:22:35,460

happens.

538

00:22:39,000 --> 00:22:41,000

That looks like that might be a little harder to dig.

539

It does.

540

Hey, dragon, Eric, y'all see anything?

541

So guys, I didn't shut it off.

550

It could be very dangerous for anyone in that location.

These are very inexplicable spikes

as if something artificial could be generating them.

You've got to get those people out of here.

Eric just picked up a gamma ray source that was 3,400 micro

604

renigin per hour.

That's a significant dose.

606

That's enough dose rate that it could be dangerous.

607

In terms of gamma rays, that's almost

608

00:25:24,520 --> 00:25:26,900

300 times what would be normal and safe.

609

Guys, come on.

610

We had to immediately evacuate the area

611

and go see if we get to the bottom of what's going on.

612

between Homestead 2 and Homestead 3.

signal was coming from the same direction in the sky

that the rocket had just flown through.

The question was, what the hell was it?

767

Let me go up and down with it.

768

Whoa, whoa, whoa, stop.

Suddenly two signals were out when you did that.

770

So we've got three peaks.

771

So if it were a deep sky object, in 15 minutes,

It's crazy to think about, but we need to try and figure out

what in the heck it could be and why we're receiving it.

836

837

You know what it looks like when you've got a, you know,

839

moth or some kind of insect or piece of debris

840

flowing across your field of view.

841

But I've got something here that doesn't fit in.

842

Really?

Yeah.

It happened just last night after our experiment.

845

So what camera are we looking at specifically?

847

This is out at the carriage house.

848

That's the thing across the road from Homestead 2, right?

849

So looking back toward Homestead 2 is that one?

850

OK, so across the canal.

851

00:35:04,480 --> 00:35:05,380

Yeah.

852

00:35:09,160 --> 00:35:12,660

What on earth is that?

853

00:35:12,720 --> 00:35:14,660

The hell is that?

854

00:35:14,720 --> 00:35:16,360

OK, so let's play this through.

855

And I really want your thoughts on what this might be.

856

I'm going to go ahead and get the camera.

857

I really want your thoughts on what this might be.

858

Know what's behind the tree, so it's far enough away.

Right.

Play that again.

You can see the other particles around.

863

Well, it's leaving a trail.

864

Go back, Eric.

865

Go back to the route.

866

00:35:37,740 --> 00:35:38,740

Sure.

867

Yeah, point out the trail.

868

Is that camera lag?

869

It could be.

870

Stop right there.

Uh-huh.

You can even see the trail behind it,

873

and then let it watch you go.

It leaves a trail behind it as it goes.

875

All right, stop.

876

You see it?

Sure.

You see the path there?

What's the frame rate of this camera?

880

These are set, I believe, to 24.

Well, that's not moving much faster than that,

883

00:36:03,200 --> 00:36:07,400

so it shouldn't be causing frame delay.

884

There's a black line through the center of this thing.

885

00:36:11,020 --> 00:36:12,680

Interesting.

886

00:36:12,740 --> 00:36:15,120

If you look, there's a line going right through the center of it,

887

00:36:15,180 --> 00:36:17,220

and it's like this.

888

00:36:17,280 --> 00:36:19,080

So let it play and see if that continues.

889

OK.

Yeah.

891

Yeah, it stays through it.

892

Let it keep going.

OK.

894

So it's not a bug inside the field of view

895

00:36:31,720 --> 00:36:34,660

because it goes behind this tree, right?

896

00:36:34,720 --> 00:36:36,420

Well, let's not look at the bugs, Travis.

897

00:36:36,500 --> 00:36:37,860

You can see the bugs zooming by.

898

00:36:37,920 --> 00:36:39,060

Yeah.

899

00:36:39,120 --> 00:36:40,160

This thing looks like a balloon floating around.

900

00:36:40,220 --> 00:36:43,140

Yeah, and then it goes behind the tree over here.

901

00:36:45,840 --> 00:36:49,300

Yeah, but the movement is very organic, I would say.

902

00:36:49,320 --> 00:36:50,300

It's irregular.

903

00:36:50,360 --> 00:36:52,120

It's not just smoothly moving through the center.

904

00:36:52,200 --> 00:36:53,360

Well, the interesting thing is you

905

00:36:53,420 --> 00:36:56,200

look at the grass and the trees,

906

00:36:56,260 --> 00:36:58,200

I don't see really any wind.

907

00:36:58,260 --> 00:36:59,400

Good point.

908

00:36:59,460 --> 00:37:01,900

And so you see it, it drifts over to the right

909

00:37:01,980 --> 00:37:03,640

with no wind going that direction,

910

00:37:03,700 --> 00:37:05,840

and then it drifts and just slowly, like I said,

911

00:37:05,900 --> 00:37:09,280

it almost looks like a balloon is floating around.

912

00:37:09,340 --> 00:37:12,080

That's not being affected by the same forces that

913

00:37:12,140 --> 00:37:13,880

are carrying the rest of it.

914

00:37:13,940 --> 00:37:16,420

It's not a balloon because a balloon would have been more

915

00:37:16,480 --> 00:37:18,780

stochastically, ergodically moving.

916

00:37:18,800 --> 00:37:23,800

And that looks like it's moving within 10.

917

It comes along.

918

00:37:25,200 --> 00:37:26,680

The side doesn't want to be here,

919

and it decides to go off this way.

920

This is unique.

You know, I don't think I've seen anything.

922

so that tells us it's at least 30 feet away.

925

So it's about the size of a volleyball.

926

Think of this way.

927

In one night, one span there,

928
