When they were investigating Skinwalker Ranch several years ago,

we used to have trouble getting guys like him

What is that it that's in control?

But after last week's visit by another former Bigelow employee,

BAS stands for Bigelow Aerospace Advanced Space Studies.

61

It was the organization to study UFO phenomena

62

This is also during the time of the federal contract, ASAP.

63

00:02:53,000 --> 00:02:57,000

ASAP stands for Advanced Aerospace Weapons Systems Application Program.

64

00:02:57,000 --> 00:03:01,000

I was one of the lead members out here that spent lots of time

65

00:03:01,000 --> 00:03:04,000

exploring, documenting data, and also safekeeping

66

00:03:04,000 --> 00:03:06,000

and protecting the property.

67

00:03:06,000 --> 00:03:08,000

I have a lot of experiences out here.

68

00:03:08,000 --> 00:03:10,000

You know, I lived and breathed this property for six years.

69

I would love to show you guys some of the things that I went through

70

and the important aspects of the property.

71

Well, I'm here to do that.

72

I think we throw you in the UTV right here,

73

and let's start across, because I want to hear everything that happened.

That sounds good. I appreciate it.

We have this 20-year gap where Mr. Bigelow owned the ranch,

76

for which we know very little.

I think somebody that spent six years here

78

and spent a lot of time during that six years is critical

79

and could be crucial to helping us solve some of the mysteries

80

that are here on the ranch.

81

Yeah, right here.

82

Let's park here, then.

83

I find it interesting that you stop us here.

84

This is by a place we call the Triangle.

85

It's been a place we've done a lot of experiments and research

86

and had a lot of interesting data, so I'm curious to tell me about

87

what you experienced here.

88

So, October of 2010, we had a pretty good routine

89

where one guy would do a normal run through the property

90

to get kind of eyes on what's going on.

That day, the other officer came back and he was like,

hey, I found some big prints on top of the mesa.

93

And I'm like, okay, let's go take a look at them.

We get to the top of here and we find these pretty good sized canine prints.

I have photos of those if you like to see them.

Yes, I'd love to see those.

Here, take a look at this. You can see here, look at those.

Look how deep those go down.

99

Look at that. Oh, my gosh.

100

That's about three feet between step.

101

And then we had a couple of labs with us.

103

You can see here in the top corner, the labs prints.

That thing's like four times the size of those.

That's a very big canine.

Seeing this picture, you can tell by both the size and the stride

107

that we're talking about a very large animal.

108

It makes me think about the legend of the skinwalker.

109

The legend of the skinwalker is that it's an entity that can shape shift.

110

Often, the lore is having it go from a wolf to a man.

111

And for whatever reason, this piece of ground was cursed with the skinwalker.

112

I was here, the other officer was right there and the dogs were kind of in between us.

113

00:05:26,000 --> 00:05:29,000

And the other officer says, Chris, stop, I hear something.

114

00:05:30,000 --> 00:05:35,000

And I'll never forget this, because it's been a replay in my mind forever since this day.

115

Out of that ditch, I hear a god-awful guttural howl growl.

116

And I was like frozen for a second.

117

So was the other officer and the dogs were all alerting.

118

The animal jumps out of the ravine, over the berm, and travels west.

119

This thing was probably the size of a donkey, black.

120

Instinctively, the dogs chased after it.

I run after the dogs.

122

We get around that corner there.

123

It's gone.

124

Wow.

125

I can understand why Chris was hesitant to share some of these stories.

126

If I had heard this on day one of the ranch, I would have dismissed Chris.

127

But after spending five years here on the ranch, I find myself believing his story.

128

Did you come back and look for tracks the next day?

129

00:06:23,000 --> 00:06:25,000

The next day, we came back.

130

We followed the ditch.

131

We really didn't find any tracks.

132

00:06:28,000 --> 00:06:30,000

But there was an area I found on this mason slope.

133

And it led to this open cavity.

134

It looked like a cave.

135

00:06:36,000 --> 00:06:37,000

So I jumped down into it.

136

I look around and it's a decent size open cavity.

137

But inside the cavern, I pulled out two old canine traps.

138

So anytime somebody says the word cave or cavern here, it catches our attention.

Absolutely. Let's go.

I found it interesting that this DJ, he said they were picking up some kind of weird signal.

145

Yeah, that's the part that got my attention.

146

You know, normally when you think about a radio station, you think of them broadcasting,

147

00:07:12,000 --> 00:07:14,000

but not receiving anything.

148

So I'm surprised that they're vigilant to any incoming signals.

149

Well, I can't wait to hear what they say.

150

Ranch caretakers Tom Lewis and Candace Lindy let me and Eric know that a local radio station nearby

151

reached out to them about a really strange frequency interference that's been jamming their system.

152

00:07:33,000 --> 00:07:38,000

And it sounds just like what we experienced last week on Skinwalker Ranch.

153

Hey, hey, hey, hey, hey, hey, right here.

154

00:07:40,000 --> 00:07:43,000

We've got that 1.6 thing.

155

00:07:43,000 --> 00:07:48,000

During a lot of the experiments we've done to stimulate different phenomena, including UAPs,

156

00:07:48,000 --> 00:07:55,000

Eric has detected a huge radio frequency energy spike of 1.6 gigahertz on the spectrum analyzer.

157

00:07:55,000 --> 00:08:00,000

And last week we detected it after launching a rocket out by Homestead 2.

158

00:08:00,000 --> 00:08:03,000

Well, it's coming back. Oh, there it is, there it is, there it is.

159

00:08:03,000 --> 00:08:06,000

But this time, a mysterious sound came through with it.

160

00:08:06,000 --> 00:08:08,000

Want to try and listen to it?

161

Yeah.

162

00:08:09,000 --> 00:08:18,000

I swear that sounds like a communication signal.

163

So here we are.

164

So when we heard that a potentially similar signal was occurring at a radio station 10 miles away in Roosevelt,

165

we definitely wanted to meet with the station manager and DJ, Jen Rook.

166

Hi.

167

00:08:34,000 --> 00:08:35,000

Hey, I'm Travis.

168

00:08:35,000 --> 00:08:36,000

Hi, I'm Jen.

169

00:08:36,000 --> 00:08:37,000

Nice to meet you, Jen.

170

00:08:37,000 --> 00:08:38,000

You too.

171

00:08:38,000 --> 00:08:44,000

We wanted to see if it could be related to the strange communication signal we've detected on Skinwalker Ranch.

172

00:08:44,000 --> 00:08:49,000

So we hear you've been having some weird signals or interference with your radio station?

173

00:08:49,000 --> 00:08:55,000

Some interference for sure and just some other weird anomalies that happen.

174

00:08:55,000 --> 00:08:59,000

I'm talking about interferences. Is it keeping you from being able to operate at certain times?

175

00:08:59,000 --> 00:09:02,000

My live stream online, it keeps it from operating.

176

00:09:02,000 --> 00:09:03,000

Really?

177

00:09:03,000 --> 00:09:05,000

Like the online stream was just absolute fuzz.

178

00:09:05,000 --> 00:09:10,000

It was just cutting out everything. It was just such an interruption.

179

00:09:10,000 --> 00:09:12,000

You couldn't hear the radio station online.

180

00:09:12,000 --> 00:09:13,000

Wow.

181

00:09:14,000 --> 00:09:21,000

So if I was listening to your station and I hear some kind of a problem,

182

00:09:21,000 --> 00:09:26,000

I would expect to hear what? Static, strange tones, signals that don't belong in your signal stream.

183

00:09:26,000 --> 00:09:28,000

What would I hear?

184

00:09:28,000 --> 00:09:32,000

I mean, you could probably hear any of that.

185

00:09:32,000 --> 00:09:39,000

You know, we've heard some weird stuff and we see weird signals at the ranch that we can't figure out where they're coming from.

186

00:09:39,000 --> 00:09:45,000

And we found this one that seems to be repeating around here all the time. It's near 1.6 gigahertz.

187

00:09:45,000 --> 00:09:47,000

Travis, can you bring that up and play it?

188

00:09:47,000 --> 00:09:50,000

I believe it's this one right here.

189

00:09:50,000 --> 00:10:02,000

You know, I've heard something similar to this along with all of the fuzz that I get that I know is interference.

190

00:10:02,000 --> 00:10:03,000

Really?

191

00:10:03,000 --> 00:10:11,000

Yeah, there's something not right and I've had people look at it and try to fix it, but it's a signal that is not supposed to be there.

192

00:10:11,000 --> 00:10:12,000

Wow.

193

00:10:12,000 --> 00:10:22,000

After we verified that Jen believed that the 1.6 gigahertz communication signal from the ranch was very similar to the one that's been coming through the radio station,

194

00:10:22,000 --> 00:10:29,000

it made both Eric and I think that maybe we could use it to try to communicate back to whoever sent it in the first place.

195

00:10:29,000 --> 00:10:39,000

We couldn't by any chance talk you into maybe broadcasting this strange signal that we've picked up and see if we'll detect something with our instruments when you do.

196

00:10:39,000 --> 00:10:41,000

Are we poking a bear here?

197

00:10:41,000 --> 00:10:46,000

Well, the expression that I use is one of my grandmother taught me and it's poking a hornet's nest.

198

00:10:46,000 --> 00:10:49,000

Okay, let's do it. Let's see if any hornets fly out.

199

00:10:49,000 --> 00:10:50,000

All right, let's do it.

200

00:10:54,000 --> 00:11:00,000

So we have some equipment outside in the car and if you'll give us a few minutes, we'll run out, we'll get it set up and run into.

201

Okay, yeah, let's do it.

202

00:11:01,000 --> 00:11:03,000

So we'll go set up the equipment, I'll be right back and tell you when we're ready.

203

All right, sounds good.

Thank you.

205

After Jen Rook, the station manager at Jack FM told us that the 1.6 gigahertz communication signal that we've detected on Skinwalker Ranch

206

00:11:14,000 --> 00:11:18,000

sounded similar to what's been interfering with her station's broadcast.

207

00:11:18,000 --> 00:11:21,000

We convinced her to let us run an experiment.

208

00:11:21,000 --> 00:11:25,000

I'm going to go ahead and start the Jeep and tune into the radio station.

209

00:11:25,000 --> 00:11:26,000

Perfect.

210

00:11:26,000 --> 00:11:30,000

The idea was to play the 1.6 gigahertz signal over her airwaves.

211

00:11:30,000 --> 00:11:32,000

All right, I got the radio station up.

212

00:11:32,000 --> 00:11:42,000

While Eric and I set up an antenna with our spectrum analyzer in the parking lot, so we could monitor the broadcast for anything strange that might happen in response.

213

All right, I think that's good right there.

214

00:11:44,000 --> 00:11:45,000

All right.

215

00:11:46,000 --> 00:11:51,000

I'm interested in watching the RF spectrum through our spectrum analyzer.

216

I've got really high hopes that we're going to see something unusual.

217

00:11:54,000 --> 00:11:56,000

I'm going to tell her we're ready.

218

00:11:56,000 --> 00:11:57,000

All right.

219

Hey, Jen.

220

00:11:58,000 --> 00:12:03,000

Yeah, we've got our equipment set up in the parking lot, so whenever you're okay to broadcast the signal, we're watching.

221

All right.

222

00:12:04,000 --> 00:12:05,000

All right.

223

00:12:05,000 --> 00:12:06,000

Ready.

224

00:12:06,000 --> 00:12:07,000

All right.

225

00:12:07,000 --> 00:12:08,000

Cool, thanks.

226

00:12:09,000 --> 00:12:12,000

All right, Eric, she's about to broadcast it.

227

00:12:12,000 --> 00:12:13,000

All right.

228

00:12:13,000 --> 00:12:14,000

Hey there, everybody.

229

00:12:14,000 --> 00:12:16,000

Just a little interruption in the music right now.

230

00:12:16,000 --> 00:12:19,000

We're doing a few tests here at the studios.

231

00:12:19,000 --> 00:12:20,000

And you know what?

232

00:12:20,000 --> 00:12:22,000

I'm going to play something here.

233

00:12:22,000 --> 00:12:27,000

And if you've heard this, you can always give me a call here at the studios and let me know.

234

This is just a test, everybody.

235

There it is.

236

Wow, it really changed her waveform big time.

237

Look at how the waveform is reacting to it though.

238

You see that?

What's right here?

240

00:12:57,000 --> 00:13:07,000

When an FM radio station broadcasts music or anything over the airways, the frequency always has a constant and uniform pattern.

241

00:13:07,000 --> 00:13:11,000

You shouldn't see any deviation in it no matter what the sound is.

242

00:13:11,000 --> 00:13:20,000

But as soon as Jen started broadcasting the sound from our 1.6 gigahertz signal, the station's frequency began showing strange, sporadic spikes.

243

Now, that shouldn't be possible.

244

00:13:22,000 --> 00:13:28,000

So it really made us wonder if our experiment might stimulate something strange out here in the basin community.

245

And if so, would it be anything like the phenomena we've seen on Skinwalker Ranch?

246

This has just been a test, everybody.

247

00:13:37,000 --> 00:13:38,000

Thanks for listening.

I'll put you back to the music now.

249

I'm Jen Rook.

All right.

Thank you for that.

Yeah, we were watching the spectrum all around your signal.

260

And when you were broadcasting, the waveform actually changed.

261

Normally, it has a certain shape.

262

00:14:09,000 --> 00:14:14,000

And when you started that signal, it changed to something completely different.

263

It was really odd.

264

Now, the interesting question is, if there's any kind of response, what form will it take and how

will we find out about it?

265

Yeah, if anybody calls you and says, hey, what was that weird thing, or I had a headache when that was going on, you know, or whatever.

Especially if someone happens to see a UFO or a UAP or something strange in the sky, anything at all, please let us know.

You may be able to provide some information that's very helpful to our research going on.

And what the best method of getting into the Mesa would be.

Well, about a quarter of the way down from the top, there's an opening where that little clay slough off is.

405

We had a former guard from Bigelow's era that told us about this large opening.

406

He'd climbed down in.

407

There were some traps and stuff, but it appeared like it had collapsed in.

And the whole time we've been here, we've heard reports of these large tunnels that people can walk clear, clear back in.

And it does appear like there could have been a large opening that went back and it caved in.

415

I'd like to take a closer look, see if maybe we can see some signs of any drilling activity.

416

Usually if you have a slough, then you're going to have material that's built up somewhere, you know, and I'm not seeing anywhere where softer material or mud or anything.

422

I don't know what that purpose would be.

424

I can't see the rock having a value as landscaping rocks.

425

I believe at some point there was some blasting done and perhaps that was done to hide something.

426

Jake suggested that we go to the base of the rock.

427

At some point there was some blasting done and perhaps that was done to hide something.

428

Jake suggests that blasting has occurred in this area that perhaps the face of this mace has been collapsed in.

429

And if so, it makes me wonder why did they collapse it in?

430

Was it for safety to keep people out of these tunnels or mines or whatever they were or were they trying to hide something?

431

We got to talk to Eric and Travis about all this and see what they think.

He was following some very, very large tracks.

The stride of his animals, like three feet.

443

That's a big animal.

444

00:23:57,000 --> 00:24:02,000

He used the term canine, but those tracks look like a very large wolf.

445

And as he came down, he found this cavern.

446

00:24:05,000 --> 00:24:12,000

It was pretty large and there were large traps that had been set down inside of this.

447

The interesting thing was is that when you look down in it,

448

you can tell that the rocks have collapsed down.

449

Wait, wait, so you've actually seen it?

450

Yes, and I have a solid GPS coordinate for the actual opening.

451

So if you provide the coordinates, I can actually bring it up on the screen.

452

Ever since I joined the team two years ago,

453

00:24:31,000 --> 00:24:36,000

I wanted to investigate the stories about caves and supposed underground caverns.

454

00:24:36,000 --> 00:24:38,000

But we just couldn't find any.

455

00:24:38,000 --> 00:24:40,000

I said we pull this up on the screen and look at it.

456

00:24:40,000 --> 00:24:41,000

Yeah, let's do that.

457

00:24:41,000 --> 00:24:45,000

So when Thomas said that former Bigelow team member Chris Bartell

458

00:24:45,000 --> 00:24:49,000

showed them where one was possibly covered over,

459

00:24:49,000 --> 00:24:51,000

I couldn't wait to learn more.

460

00:24:51,000 --> 00:24:54,000

It's about three-quarters of the way up the mesa.

461

And it looks like there potentially could have been a much larger cavern

462

00:24:59,000 --> 00:25:02,000

that the whole thing has just kind of sunk in and collapsed.

463

00:25:02,000 --> 00:25:06,000

Is this close to where we're starting to see some of the GPS anomalies

464

00:25:06,000 --> 00:25:09,000

where they vanished into the mesa?

465

00:25:09,000 --> 00:25:12,000

Now that is a great question.

466

00:25:12,000 --> 00:25:14,000

Actually, it's the opposite.

467

00:25:14,000 --> 00:25:21,000

In some of our exercises, we've seen things seem to emerge from about that part of the mesa.

468

00:25:21,000 --> 00:25:23,000

Really?

469

00:25:25,000 --> 00:25:26,000

Back at your way!

470

00:25:26,000 --> 00:25:30,000

Earlier this summer, we conducted two different aerial experiments

471

00:25:30,000 --> 00:25:33,000

over the Triangle area using GPS sensors.

472

00:25:33,000 --> 00:25:34,000

I'm getting something, yeah.

473

00:25:34,000 --> 00:25:38,000

Trying to pinpoint the location where we keep detecting high-energy spikes

474

00:25:38,000 --> 00:25:40,000

about a mile above the ranch.

475

00:25:40,000 --> 00:25:45,000

These blue cubes represent the position of the GPS payloads.

476

00:25:45,000 --> 00:25:48,000

It looks like you smashed into the mesa.

477

00:25:48,000 --> 00:25:51,000

We popped out on this side right there.

478

00:25:51,000 --> 00:25:56,000

But in both cases, the GPS data we collected inexplicably showed

479

00:25:56,000 --> 00:25:59,000

that our aircraft flew down below the mesa.

480

00:25:59,000 --> 00:26:00,000

Look at that.

481

00:26:00,000 --> 00:26:03,000

That's about that location right there.

482

00:26:03,000 --> 00:26:07,000

And now, it looks like the exit point corresponds with this spot

483

00:26:07,000 --> 00:26:11,000

where Chris Bartell says a cave entrance used to exist.

484

00:26:11,000 --> 00:26:17,000

I don't know yet, but maybe that's where our answers about the Triangle area are hidden.

485

00:26:17,000 --> 00:26:22,000

After seeing this, we brought Jake out here and had him look at it.

486

00:26:22,000 --> 00:26:28,000

He had a feeling that it looked like there had been some demolition work there.

487

00:26:28,000 --> 00:26:33,000

Did Bigelow's team discover something that we have yet to discover?

488

00:26:33,000 --> 00:26:37,000

If there really is a cave there and it was covered up,

489

00:26:37,000 --> 00:26:40,000

that had to be done during Bigelow's ownership of the ranch

490

00:26:40,000 --> 00:26:42,000

since he's the one that Brandon bought it from.

491

00:26:42,000 --> 00:26:47,000

So given that Bigelow was funded in part by the federal government for his research,

492

00:26:47,000 --> 00:26:50,000

what could they have found that needed to be kept hidden?

493

00:26:50,000 --> 00:26:55,000

It'd be good to get Pete Kelsey to fly over it with the infrared camera

494

00:26:55,000 --> 00:27:00,000

and see if there's any temperature differences that might suggest there's an airflow or a pocket or something.

495

00:27:00,000 --> 00:27:02,000

Absolutely.

496

00:27:02,000 --> 00:27:04,000

I've been really impressed by his work in the past

497

00:27:04,000 --> 00:27:07,000

and to be able to have him bring out even more equipment

498

00:27:07,000 --> 00:27:10,000

that's more technologically advanced would be awesome.

499

00:27:10,000 --> 00:27:11,000

Sounds like we've got a plan.

500

00:27:11,000 --> 00:27:15,000

The more detail we can get about this part of the property, the better.

501

You're right, too.

502

00:27:16,000 --> 00:27:17,000

Okay, sounds good.

503

Right in here somewhere?

504

Right up on the edge up there.

505

To help us figure out if this really is a covered entrance to something in the Mesa,

506

technologist Pete Kelsey has brought out a drone with a thermal imaging camera

507

00:27:39,000 --> 00:27:44,000

that'll be able to identify any signs of voids or caverns below the rubble.

508

00:27:44,000 --> 00:27:46,000

This looks great.

509

00:27:46,000 --> 00:27:47,000

Thank you, sir.

510

00:27:47,000 --> 00:27:48,000

Uh-huh.

511

00:27:48,000 --> 00:27:52,000

The guys have asked me to look for caves here on the properties.

512

00:27:52,000 --> 00:27:54,000

The thermal camera could be a really good fit there

513

00:27:54,000 --> 00:28:01,000

because typically caves, tunnels, the air inside is much cooler than the air outside.

514

00:28:01,000 --> 00:28:05,000

If it shows cold air, that could mean that there's a network.

515

00:28:05,000 --> 00:28:09,000

All right, I got all green lights here ready when you are.

516

00:28:09,000 --> 00:28:12,000

Where's the hole, Thomas?

517

00:28:12,000 --> 00:28:16,000

It's basically right up there.

518

00:28:16,000 --> 00:28:18,000

You can only see it from the top down.

519

00:28:18,000 --> 00:28:20,000

You can't see it looking up.

520

00:28:20,000 --> 00:28:26,000

So I'm going to just go up there so that you have an easy point of reference as you're trying to locate where this opening is at.

521

I think it'll be a lot easier if I'm up there standing close to it.

522

00:28:28,000 --> 00:28:29,000

Okay.

523

00:28:29,000 --> 00:28:31,000

So, okay, I'm going to get started.

524

Be careful.

525

Yep.

526

In my years on the ranch, there's been rampant rumors about underground tunnels, underground bases.

527

And really, with the technology that we're deploying now,

528

00:28:45,000 --> 00:28:50,000

the hopes is to either find it or finally put it to bed once and for all.

529

00:28:50,000 --> 00:28:52,000

Right here.

530

Is there?

531

00:28:53,000 --> 00:28:54,000

Yep.

532

00:28:54,000 --> 00:28:56,000

Spinning up.

533

So you're flying the thermal camera first.

534

Yeah, so the fancy term is this is a radiometric thermal camera,

535

00:29:08,000 --> 00:29:13,000

which means it will give me the temperature, but it also can do just video.

536

Very cool.

537

Heading for Thomas.

538

There he is.

539

I will zoom in on him a bit.

So the hole must be that thing right in front of him.

541

Is that hole really the coldest thing within the field of view?

542

Yes.

But it's black.

544

That's 64 degrees.

546

Whereas on the rock surfaces you are at.

547

Yeah, on the sun, just went to 102.

548

40 degree difference.

549

I'm going to go ahead and take one of those smoke bombs up there.

550

And that means digging or drilling to find out what it is.

west of the triangle that's causing it to look like,

745

00:37:34,000 --> 00:37:37,000

and then out of the Mesa on top, somehow or other.

746

That's kind of the same location that we've had an eyewitness

747

00:37:40,000 --> 00:37:43,000

suggest that there was a cave there in the past.

748

Really?

749

00:37:44,000 --> 00:37:45,000

Wow.

750

00:37:45,000 --> 00:37:49,000

Chris Bartell, one of the former guards for Mr. Bigelow,

751

00:37:49,000 --> 00:37:51,000

he came out here and visited with us,

752

00:37:51,000 --> 00:37:54,000

and he showed us this cavern.

753

00:37:54,000 --> 00:37:57,000

Thomas and I had one of his associates come out

754

00:37:57,000 --> 00:37:59,000

who's done a lot of blasting and drilling.

755

00:37:59,000 --> 00:38:02,000

Well, he just looked at it, and he said it does have the appearance

756

00:38:02,000 --> 00:38:06,000

that it could have been blasted and collapsed.

757

00:38:06,000 --> 00:38:08,000

Chris Bartell's showing us this cavern

758

00:38:08,000 --> 00:38:10,000

led us to explore further in that area

759

00:38:10,000 --> 00:38:13,000

to see if we could find other clues or maybe other entrances.

760

00:38:13,000 --> 00:38:16,000

And we actually did find some other holes,

761

00:38:16,000 --> 00:38:19,000

which we dropped smoke bombs down into.

762

The smoke started to come up out of the hole,

763

and then it was as if somebody turned on a vacuum,

764

and the smoke sucked down into the hole,

765

and we never saw another trace of it.

766

Wow. That was really strange.

767

It really suggests that there is some sort of opening network

769

The fact that the smoke experiment

771

showed that there's some void, there's something

772

00:38:48,000 --> 00:38:52,000

that is pulling that material into the Mesa,

773

00:38:52,000 --> 00:38:54,000

I mean, that's a key clue.

774

00:38:54,000 --> 00:38:56,000

Yeah, it is the most bizarre thing.

775

00:38:56,000 --> 00:38:59,000

There's an airflow somewhere going into something,

776

00:38:59,000 --> 00:39:02,000

a void somewhere or whatever, it says it never came out lower.

777

00:39:02,000 --> 00:39:06,000

That suggests there's an opening underneath the Mesa out there.

778

00:39:06,000 --> 00:39:07,000

Yeah.

779

00:39:07,000 --> 00:39:10,000

As we've discussed before, this is an area

780

00:39:10,000 --> 00:39:14,000

attended by GPS receivers behaving anomalously

781

00:39:14,000 --> 00:39:16,000

in that part of the ranch.

782

00:39:16,000 --> 00:39:18,000

What's doing it? What's interfering with them?

783

00:39:18,000 --> 00:39:21,000

And what may have been covered up in the past?

784

00:39:21,000 --> 00:39:24,000

What were they hiding in that Mesa?

785

00:39:24,000 --> 00:39:26,000

That's the big question, right?

786

00:39:26,000 --> 00:39:29,000

What were they hiding, and why would they deliberately

787

00:39:29,000 --> 00:39:31,000

cover up their tracks?

788

00:39:31,000 --> 00:39:34,000

I think Thomas has found the ideal solution.

789

What would you propose?

790

00:39:35,000 --> 00:39:40,000

Well, I have a good friend that is a driller.

791

00:39:40,000 --> 00:39:42,000

Now, he's a horizontal driller.

792

00:39:42,000 --> 00:39:45,000

This drill is special in the fact that it's directional,

793

00:39:45,000 --> 00:39:47,000

and it allows them to steer the bit around.

794

00:39:47,000 --> 00:39:50,000

And so we could set it up at the base of the Mesa

795

00:39:50,000 --> 00:39:54,000

and drill horizontally into the Mesa,

796

00:39:54,000 --> 00:39:57,000

and we can steer it around, and so it would allow us to explore

797

00:39:57,000 --> 00:40:01,000

and see if we might be able to punch into one of these voids.

798

00:40:01,000 --> 00:40:04,000

That is a perfect match for our problem set, Thomas.

799

I'm very curious to find out what may be hidden

800

00:40:08,000 --> 00:40:10,000

in that chamber or at least in that area.

801

You have my approval to proceed, but proceed with care.

802

I want to minimize the amount of disruption over in that area,

803

00:40:17,000 --> 00:40:21,000

and I want to make sure that safety is paramount.

You got it, Brandon. Let's go.

805

You can't really take this ranch as a serious scientific investigation

806

if you don't take in mind all of the lore and mythology that comes with it.

We've heard so many stories about what's underneath this Mesa.

808

00:40:39,000 --> 00:40:42,000

We've heard myths of caves that have portals in them,

809

00:40:42,000 --> 00:40:44,000

even a military base.

810

00:40:44,000 --> 00:40:49,000

Any information we could get that tells us there's some type of void

811

00:40:49,000 --> 00:40:53,000

or even a structure, that would be amazing information.

812

00:40:54,000 --> 00:40:58,000

I believe as we move forward, the Mesa holds secrets

813

00:40:58,000 --> 00:41:00,000

that have yet to be revealed.

814

We have to always be aware that any time we begin digging or disturbing the Earth,

815

00:41:06,000 --> 00:41:12,000

we stand to experience harm, and there's risk involved.

816

However, I can tell you we are onto something.

817

This is the time to put our foot on the gas and to charge forward,

818

This thing is broadcasting.

827

This thing shouldn't be broadcasting anything.

Hey.

829

00:41:54,000 --> 00:41:55,000

Are you okay?

830

00:41:55,000 --> 00:41:56,000

No.

831

00:41:56,000 --> 00:41:57,000

I'm sorry.
