OK.

Welcome to Skinwalker Ranch, man.

Thanks for coming out.

Aaron, welcome.

Well, we've had all kinds of strange things happening

42

that we need to investigate further.

We inherited so many different stories

45

about strange things happening out there.

Yeah.

The Mesa has always been a point of interest for us.

48

There are all sorts of rumors and stories

49

about things that happened while the Bigelow team was

50

00:02:08,100 --> 00:02:09,100

here on the property.

51

00:02:09,140 --> 00:02:11,140

I've even heard a story of people

52

00:02:11,160 --> 00:02:14,340

claiming to see the side of the Mesa open up and a spaceship

53

00:02:14,380 --> 00:02:16,240

flying in and it closing up again.

54

00:02:16,280 --> 00:02:18,640

Our story is about these openings

55

00:02:18,680 --> 00:02:21,620

that lead to some sort of an underground base or cavern.

56

00:02:21,640 --> 00:02:24,020

I think there's a lot more there to be discovered.

57

And we need to spend more time over there exploring.

58

Hearing those kinds of rumors makes

59

you wonder how anything of the sort

60

could be possible in a solid sandstone Mesa that covers

61

about three square miles.

62

But just last week, after Chris Bartell's visit,

63

we dropped smoke bombs into the crevices

64

00:02:42,440 --> 00:02:44,200

between the large boulders covering

65

00:02:44,240 --> 00:02:46,200

the supposed cave entrance.

66

00:02:46,240 --> 00:02:48,040

Now, aren't smoke, aren't smoke.

67

00:02:48,080 --> 00:02:51,140

And inexplicably, the smoke was being sucked down

68

00:02:51,180 --> 00:02:53,480

inside somewhere like they're really

69

00:02:53,480 --> 00:02:56,580

could be a huge cavern system of some kind.

70

Look, look, it's getting sucked in.

71

Yeah, the smoke's going down.

72

We're hoping that we can go drill through it

73

and see if we hit any voids or any type of, you know,

we really don't know what to expect.

Well, we'll just get the drill off the trailer

76

and then start walking it, so.

You let us know what we can do to help.

We'll do.

Aaron and his crew from Straight Shot Drilling,

82

00:03:26,480 --> 00:03:28,240

they're going to do some horizontal drilling

83

00:03:28,280 --> 00:03:30,240

into the side of the Mesa.

84

00:03:30,280 --> 00:03:32,540

The way that this horizontal drill works

85

00:03:32,580 --> 00:03:35,380

is they're actually going to go down under the road,

86

00:03:35,420 --> 00:03:39,120

under this canal, and then be able to maneuver up

87

00:03:39,160 --> 00:03:41,420

and hopefully puncture up into the Mesa

88

00:03:41,460 --> 00:03:42,960

and see if we find a void there.

89

00:03:43,000 --> 00:03:45,660

You want to just park up here a little bit?

90

00:03:45,700 --> 00:03:49,660

Given the ongoing anomalies witnessed at the Mesa,

91

00:03:49,700 --> 00:03:52,700

everything from smoke being sucked into the Mesa

92

00:03:52,720 --> 00:03:57,360

and disappearing into an unknown chamber or cavern system

93

00:03:57,400 --> 00:03:59,600

coupled with other anomalies.

94

Is that plugging into the USB here?

95

Yeah.

96

00:04:02,340 --> 00:04:04,140

Considering all the evidence that has been presented,

97

I've given my approval to proceed forward with caution.

98

We're using the RF Spectrum Analyzer,

99

which we've used pretty much all of these digs.

100

I'm data logging for gamma radiation,

101

as we've gotten when we do digs.

102

Yeah.

103

00:04:18,560 --> 00:04:21,120

Also, since we've got GPS anomalies showing up

104

00:04:21,140 --> 00:04:23,920

out here in the field, I'm doing real-time GPS tracking.

105

And so we're getting a data point every second on those guys

106

00:04:26,740 --> 00:04:27,980

and their data logging.

107

00:04:28,020 --> 00:04:29,920

There really isn't any place that we can go

108

00:04:29,960 --> 00:04:33,020

and not be exposed to some level of background radiation.

109

00:04:33,060 --> 00:04:36,300

But when we get gamma ray spikes during our experiments,

110

that's when we become concerned.

111

So before we start disturbing the Earth,

112

we want to make sure that we have all the monitoring

113

equipment in place to detect anything

114

that we might stir up inside the Mesa itself.

115

So we'll dig an exit pit right here for the mud,

116

00:04:51,540 --> 00:04:54,100

and then we'll set up behind that pit and drill in.

117

And our bit has a beacon in it.

118

And we have the equipment to locate that beacon

119

all the way up to where you guys want to go.

120

You said you could reach 500 feet.

121

00:05:05,280 --> 00:05:06,820

Is how much rod you've got with it?

122

00:05:06,860 --> 00:05:08,220

I have 500 foot of rod right now.

123

00:05:08,260 --> 00:05:09,120

Wow.

124

00:05:09,160 --> 00:05:09,780

This is awesome.

125

00:05:09,820 --> 00:05:10,880

Yeah.

126

00:05:10,920 --> 00:05:12,320

Well, I think that we get to work,

127

00:05:12,360 --> 00:05:13,620

get you guys drilling.

128

00:05:13,660 --> 00:05:14,960

All right.

129

00:05:15,000 --> 00:05:17,160

Ever since I've gotten here on the ranch,

130

00:05:17,280 --> 00:05:21,280

we've been really curious what lies underneath the Mesa.

131

00:05:21,320 --> 00:05:23,160

So before the guys start drilling,

132

00:05:23,180 --> 00:05:26,160

they're going to dig this pit on the south side of the road.

133

00:05:26,200 --> 00:05:28,660

This pit will allow them to catch all of the drill mud

134

00:05:28,700 --> 00:05:31,540

and the spoils that are coming out of the hole as they drill.

135

00:05:34,040 --> 00:05:35,740

Yeah, man.

136

00:05:35,780 --> 00:05:38,740

I think that it may tell us something pretty interesting

137

00:05:38,780 --> 00:05:40,640

about what's going on here in the Mesa.

138

00:05:40,640 --> 00:05:43,640

I say we get the drill set up and get going on this.

139

00:05:43,680 --> 00:05:44,600

All right.

140

00:05:46,640 --> 00:05:49,640

The rig that we're using is a directional bore machine.

141

00:05:49,680 --> 00:05:52,640

It has 30,000 pounds of push and pull,

142

00:05:52,680 --> 00:05:57,480

and you can guide the drill bit wherever you want it to go.

143

00:05:57,520 --> 00:05:59,720

It could go left, or it could go right,

144

00:05:59,760 --> 00:06:03,220

or I can steer it, come up, or I can steer it to go down.

145

00:06:03,260 --> 00:06:04,520

There it is, that one, right?

146

00:06:04,560 --> 00:06:05,220

Yeah.

147

00:06:05,260 --> 00:06:06,600

So we're that little pit.

148

00:06:06,620 --> 00:06:07,760

We're going to go down.

149

00:06:07,800 --> 00:06:09,060

We're going to go down.

150

00:06:09,060 --> 00:06:11,480

Yeah, so where that little play out cropping is?

151

00:06:11,520 --> 00:06:13,480

If we came in at the edge of those rocks

152

00:06:13,520 --> 00:06:15,520

or just a little bit under them, that's, I mean,

153

00:06:15,560 --> 00:06:17,520

that's right where that opening is at.

154

00:06:17,560 --> 00:06:18,560

That makes sense?

155

00:06:18,600 --> 00:06:19,360

Yeah.

156

00:06:19,400 --> 00:06:20,560

OK.

157

00:06:20,600 --> 00:06:22,900

The drill bore requires hundreds of gallons of water

158

00:06:22,940 --> 00:06:26,140

to keep it lubricated as it penetrates into the sandstone

159

00:06:26,160 --> 00:06:28,140

rock that the Mesa's made from.

160

00:06:28,180 --> 00:06:30,940

So it's going to be an extra messy job for the team

161

00:06:30,980 --> 00:06:34,340

to look for clues as the water and spoil shoot back out

162

00:06:34,380 --> 00:06:36,440

into the pit they dug by the rig.

163

00:06:36,440 --> 00:06:38,700

But hopefully, by the end of the day,

164

00:06:38,740 --> 00:06:42,500

they'll confirm if there's a big void and even obtain

165

00:06:42,540 --> 00:06:44,740

evidence of an object or structure that

166

00:06:44,780 --> 00:06:46,140

could be hidden inside there.

167

00:06:50,180 --> 00:06:52,720

You're all good to go, huh?

168

00:06:52,760 --> 00:06:54,220

OK.

169

00:06:54,260 --> 00:06:58,260

Inside the head of that drill is a beacon.

170

00:06:58,300 --> 00:07:00,560

And the beacon is the brains of it.

171

00:07:00,600 --> 00:07:03,660

We can follow it with the locator,

172

00:07:03,660 --> 00:07:08,220

and it will tell me where I'm at, how deep I am,

173

00:07:08,260 --> 00:07:13,860

what my pitch is, and what direction I'm going in.

174

00:07:13,900 --> 00:07:18,300

So do you have to walk along and track wherever that's going

175

00:07:18,340 --> 00:07:19,840

so you'd have to hoof it up there?

176

00:07:19,880 --> 00:07:21,000

I'll be doing some hiking.

177

00:07:26,240 --> 00:07:27,840

Is it pretty soft drilling?

178

00:07:27,880 --> 00:07:28,720

No.

179

00:07:28,740 --> 00:07:29,680

Really?

180

00:07:29,720 --> 00:07:30,880

It's not in the rock.

181

00:07:30,940 --> 00:07:34,100

It feels like a really tight, sticky play.

182

00:07:34,140 --> 00:07:35,640

Have you hit the mesa yet?

183

00:07:35,680 --> 00:07:36,740

No.

184

00:07:36,780 --> 00:07:37,940

Still weighs this way?

185

00:07:37,980 --> 00:07:40,240

Yeah.

186

00:07:40,280 --> 00:07:41,020

Cool.

187

00:07:44,380 --> 00:07:46,620

Yeah, he's up against something hard.

188

00:07:46,660 --> 00:07:50,320

OK, well, I think we should go up your snake camera.

189

00:07:50,360 --> 00:07:51,420

We're going to go for a hike.

190

00:07:51,460 --> 00:07:52,920

I'm going to shed a couple layers here.

191

00:07:52,960 --> 00:07:55,460

This drilling process takes a lot of time.

192

00:07:55,500 --> 00:07:58,000

So in the meantime, Thomas and I

193

00:07:58,040 --> 00:08:00,640

have decided to hike up the mesa to where we had previously

194

00:08:00,660 --> 00:08:03,300

dropped these smoke canisters down.

195

00:08:03,340 --> 00:08:05,400

I don't know what the path of least resistance is.

196

00:08:05,440 --> 00:08:07,400

You've been up there the most, so I'll follow you.

197

00:08:07,440 --> 00:08:10,240

No, there is no path of least resistance.

198

00:08:10,280 --> 00:08:13,080

We want to see if we can run a snake camera down

199

00:08:13,120 --> 00:08:15,940

and see if we can figure out how deep this thing goes

200

00:08:15,980 --> 00:08:17,620

or if we see anything strange.

201

00:08:17,640 --> 00:08:19,020

The hole's right here.

202

00:08:19,060 --> 00:08:19,720

OK.

203

00:08:22,360 --> 00:08:29,060

This one actually has the ability to pan, tilt, and zoom.

204

00:08:29,180 --> 00:08:31,480

So if we get it down in there, we can actually,

205

00:08:31,520 --> 00:08:35,620

with this real remote right here, we can move it around.

206

00:08:35,660 --> 00:08:38,260

And maybe the camera will reveal some clues to us.

207

00:08:38,300 --> 00:08:41,600

Maybe we'll see an opening or a void as we channel this snake

208

00:08:41,640 --> 00:08:43,700

cam deep into the hill.

209

00:08:43,740 --> 00:08:45,240

I think we're live.

210

00:08:45,260 --> 00:08:46,540

I'm going to hit record.

211

00:08:46,580 --> 00:08:47,240

All right.

212

00:08:55,480 --> 00:08:56,480

Still going down?

213

00:08:56,520 --> 00:08:57,480

You're still going.

214

00:08:58,480 --> 00:09:00,940

I have not seen any sign of smoke bombs.

215

00:09:00,980 --> 00:09:02,140

Neither have I.

216

00:09:02,180 --> 00:09:04,480

I thought for sure we'd see those.

217

00:09:04,520 --> 00:09:07,680

Now we're down 21 feet.

218

00:09:07,720 --> 00:09:09,280

I mean, that's pretty far now.

219

00:09:11,760 --> 00:09:13,160

What the hell is that?

220

00:09:22,960 --> 00:09:25,500

What is that?

221

00:09:25,620 --> 00:09:29,120

It looks like metal right there on the top.

222

00:09:29,160 --> 00:09:31,500

It definitely looks like it's reflecting something

223

00:09:31,520 --> 00:09:33,160

off of there.

224

00:09:33,200 --> 00:09:36,500

Those smoke canisters we dropped down there were basically

225

00:09:36,540 --> 00:09:38,000

just paper and cardboard.

226

00:09:38,040 --> 00:09:39,700

There's nothing reflective about them.

227

00:09:39,740 --> 00:09:41,740

What is that?

228

00:09:41,780 --> 00:09:43,340

It looks metallic.

229

00:09:43,380 --> 00:09:45,440

It really does look metallic.

230

00:09:45,480 --> 00:09:48,180

This object is sitting about 23 and 1 half feet

231

00:09:48,220 --> 00:09:50,580

below the entrance of this hole.

232

00:09:50,620 --> 00:09:53,120

And we're trying to get the camera in position

233

00:09:53,160 --> 00:09:54,080

to see what it is.

234

00:09:54,100 --> 00:09:55,700

And I can't tell what it is.

235

00:09:55,740 --> 00:09:59,940

I'd definitely like to find a way of getting it out of there.

236

00:09:59,980 --> 00:10:04,580

It looks like it could go more if we can actually manipulate it.

237

00:10:04,620 --> 00:10:07,780

It looks like it's almost on a ledge.

238

00:10:07,820 --> 00:10:09,980

It appears to be pretty large.

239

00:10:10,020 --> 00:10:13,160

Let me see if I can somehow manipulate this camera.

240

00:10:13,200 --> 00:10:14,800

Gosh, I wish we could get something down there

241

00:10:14,820 --> 00:10:17,560

and retrieve that.

242

00:10:17,600 --> 00:10:19,300

There's your canister.

243

00:10:19,340 --> 00:10:22,700

It got wedged, and there's still even more opening.

244

00:10:23,320 --> 00:10:25,120

There's the base of the smoke bomb, right?

245

00:10:25,160 --> 00:10:27,700

So we know that that other thing is not the smoke canister,

246

00:10:27,720 --> 00:10:31,960

because that other thing didn't look anything like that.

247

00:10:32,000 --> 00:10:35,800

Well, you know, Chris Bartel talked about a significant opening.

248

00:10:35,840 --> 00:10:37,600

This is definitely significant.

249

00:10:37,640 --> 00:10:40,940

I mean, we are 26-ish feet.

250

00:10:40,980 --> 00:10:43,540

There's all kinds of rumors that have been floating around

251

00:10:43,580 --> 00:10:46,280

this ranch since the day that I stepped foot on it,

252

00:10:46,320 --> 00:10:48,720

whether it be the Mesa opening up

253

00:10:48,760 --> 00:10:52,320

and some type of aerial craft flying into the hill

254

00:10:52,320 --> 00:10:56,680

or secret underground bases under the Mesa.

255

00:10:56,720 --> 00:10:59,280

I really was surprised with what we found.

256

00:10:59,320 --> 00:11:02,320

I've never seen anything like it anywhere on the ranch.

257

00:11:02,360 --> 00:11:04,460

Is this hard evidence that there is truly

258

00:11:04,500 --> 00:11:07,160

something going on inside this Mesa?

259

00:11:07,200 --> 00:11:10,160

I'm really anxious to see what we find out.

260

00:11:10,200 --> 00:11:12,500

Well, I'll tell you what, that's as far as we're going.

261

00:11:12,540 --> 00:11:15,240

Okay, well, I think we've got what we need here.

262

00:11:15,280 --> 00:11:17,480

I'm going to just power this thing off.

263

00:11:17,500 --> 00:11:19,040

I'm shocked we got down so far, actually.

264

00:11:19,080 --> 00:11:20,540

I honestly...

265

00:11:20,560 --> 00:11:23,500

It's becoming obvious to me that there's many, many different

266

00:11:23,540 --> 00:11:26,540

channels and chambers down this hole.

267

00:11:26,580 --> 00:11:29,440

Some of them appear to be very, very large.

268

00:11:29,480 --> 00:11:32,980

There's definitely a lot of empty space inside this Mesa.

269

00:11:33,020 --> 00:11:35,920

That was really surprising.

270

00:11:35,960 --> 00:11:37,480

I want to get in there more than ever now

271

00:11:37,520 --> 00:11:39,820

and discover where is this metal coming from?

272

00:11:43,620 --> 00:11:44,860

Hey, Eric.

273

00:11:44,900 --> 00:11:46,020

Hey, Tom.

274

00:11:46,060 --> 00:11:48,160

I'm really interested in what you guys found up there.

275

00:11:48,280 --> 00:11:51,280

I feel like we got about a third of the way down the Mesa.

276

00:11:51,320 --> 00:11:53,820

When we got down in that 20, 24-foot range,

277

00:11:53,860 --> 00:11:57,760

we saw something that looks completely out of place.

278

00:11:57,800 --> 00:11:59,900

The first thought, maybe, it might have been the outside

279

00:11:59,940 --> 00:12:01,400

of one of those smoke canisters.

280

00:12:01,440 --> 00:12:02,340

Yeah.

281

00:12:02,360 --> 00:12:03,400

But this was not.

282

00:12:03,440 --> 00:12:06,600

The object appeared to be reflecting light back,

283

00:12:06,640 --> 00:12:08,100

like it was metallic.

284

00:12:08,140 --> 00:12:12,240

It was like ridges and lines of a metallic looking

285

00:12:12,280 --> 00:12:16,080

or reflective type stuff, not packaging of some sort

286

00:12:16,120 --> 00:12:18,080

that would be reflecting light.

287

00:12:18,100 --> 00:12:21,400

What is this material made up, and what is it doing

288

00:12:21,440 --> 00:12:25,640

in the depths of a Mesa in eastern Utah?

289

00:12:25,680 --> 00:12:26,780

Hey, guys.

290

00:12:26,820 --> 00:12:28,580

We're going to be here drilling for a while.

291

00:12:28,620 --> 00:12:31,080

Let's go call Travis and tell him what we found.

292

00:12:31,120 --> 00:12:32,480

Yeah, I agree.

293

00:12:32,520 --> 00:12:33,480

Let's do it.

294

00:12:39,060 --> 00:12:40,020

Hey, fellas.

295

00:12:40,060 --> 00:12:41,420

Hey, Travis.

296

00:12:41,460 --> 00:12:42,260

Hey there.

297

00:12:42,300 --> 00:12:43,400

How you guys doing?

298

00:12:43,420 --> 00:12:45,860

It's been a busy time out here.

299

00:12:45,900 --> 00:12:46,960

Yeah.

300

00:12:47,020 --> 00:12:50,080

While the drill rig was going on onto the side of a Mesa,

301

00:12:50,120 --> 00:12:55,060

Thomas and I decided to go back up to that hole at the top,

302

I have Travis viewed up here, the video conference with us.

809
