Members of the Delaware Indian nation believe this stretch of Highway 55, near Deptford Township in New Jersey,

was built over an ancient Indian burial ground, prompting what has become known as the Curse of Highway 55.

To us, our ancestors are sacred.

31

And anything that is connected with our ancestors, the whole area to us is sacred.

And we do not defile it in any way. And we don't want anyone else to defile it.

Well, they just laughed at me.

So I raised my hands to the heavens, and I prayed to the Great Spirit, and I prayed to my ancestors.

I mean, then the winds came up and blew vehicles off the road with their workers in them.

Within three weeks, many more construction workers and their families seem to fall victim to the curse.

Chief Wyandaga doesn't agree. He believes the site is sacred and anyone who disturbs it is cursed.

I said if there was a village, then within a hundred yards in one direction or the other,

there would have to be a burial site because after all they didn't have horses,

70

they didn't have any other means of transportation, so they had to carry the body and bury it.

71

The soils are fairly acidic and organic remains do not last very long.

72

Two, three hundred years tops before they completely disintegrate into the soil.

So I said well even if there's no bones left, there still was a burial site.

at the end of a lifetime when the body dies, leaves that lifetime, leaves that body,

Does reincarnation exist? Under hypnosis, Betty's clients try to reach back in time

The technique is called regression therapy.

Subjects say their previous lives come to them like snapshots from the past.

The philosophy behind reincarnation is that the soul has chosen to get into a physical body in order to learn something.

We are choosing to incarnate in each lifetime because we have certain lessons to learn in each lifetime.

Regression therapists work with people who want to go back in time and explore the possibility that they've lived before.

The first step involves total relaxation of mind and body.

I was a crew member on the Titanic down in the engine room.

134

00:12:18,000 --> 00:12:24,000

The ship is in trouble and I don't want to die. I don't want to go down with this ship.

135

00:12:25,000 --> 00:12:31,000

I can remember screaming all around me and then all of a sudden things turning upside down

136

00:12:31,000 --> 00:12:39,000

and the most disturbing thing is timber creaking and stretching and cracking ways that it's not supposed to.

Up until then, I felt a sense of gravity and now it's all upside down and ropes.

I can feel a rope wrapped around here.

I'm being pulled under by these ropes. I'm being pulled down with the ship.

This is a really frightening thing.

I watched myself tied up in the ropes.

Go down, down, down and I can see the stern of the ship and it disappears into this black fog water.

The Titanic sank in 1912, 40 years before Darrell was supposedly reborn in his present life.

When you go to most religions in the world, you'll find that reincarnation is something that most people have been brought up with.

Until his death, Tony was everyone's favorite bartender at the Banta Inn near San Francisco.

166

Locals believe his spirit haunts the restaurant still. But Tony's not a frightening malicious ghost. His trademark is mischief.

167

00:15:49,000 --> 00:15:56,000

There was a fellow staring at me there. I went through the door of the kitchen and he was gone.

168

00:15:56,000 --> 00:16:02,000

I saw a figure in the mirror and I turned to look at the floor where that person should have been standing and there was nothing in there.

169

00:16:02,000 --> 00:16:06,000

All of a sudden, I felt this, like somebody took your finger up the back of my leg all the way up.

170

00:16:06,000 --> 00:16:07,000

And I turned around and there was nobody there.

171

00:16:07,000 --> 00:16:12,000

After that, the guy's beer right next to me tipped over, spun around three times.

172

All of a sudden, the CDs started flipping by themselves. He just flipped a couple times.

173

He played a little. He loved Patsy Klein. And it would come on all the time.

174

Ghosts tend to react to situations as if they were people living and breathing people.

175

One of the reasons is they don't know they're dead. They're in total denial.

176

We have a lot of physical things happening that seem to relate to Tony's behavior when he was alive.

177

One of the things that Tony was apparently fond of doing was playing with the money in the cash register and stacking the change so that it was a nice orderly sex in the changemen.

178

00:16:43,000 --> 00:16:50,000

And here, when you just toss money in a changemen, obviously close the door up and open it back and forth, it's not going to stack automatically.

179

00:16:50,000 --> 00:16:54,000

And yet they've been opening the drawer for a few years and the change seems to be stacking by itself.

180

00:16:54,000 --> 00:17:00,000

You can throw it in and turn around the next second and it's all stacked in there, all nice and neat.

181

00:17:00,000 --> 00:17:05,000

In the search for proof, investigators test Tony's favorite table with a magnetometer.

182

00:17:05,000 --> 00:17:08,000

They're looking for abnormal levels of electromagnetism.

183

00:17:08,000 --> 00:17:09,000

Oh my God, it's going off the scale.

184

00:17:09,000 --> 00:17:14,000

No, no, right as I was coming over here, it went off the scale, went up to about 100.

Unlike other hauntings Lloyd Auerbach has investigated, the people here aren't frightened.

186

One of the bartenders told me that she had pretty much gotten a couple of guys who were very drunk out of here and come back in and she didn't lock the door behind her, which she thought as an afterthought.

187

It turned out to have locked itself.

And according to eyewitnesses, Tony is not the only ghost that haunts the band again.

189

From what I have been told, Margaret was an old regular in the 50s and 60s.

190

00:17:42,000 --> 00:17:49,000

She passed away, she died of a heart attack in the building and that she absolutely loved the band.

191

00:17:49,000 --> 00:17:53,000

At Bann Ann, she lived down here and that she didn't want to leave either.

192

00:17:53,000 --> 00:18:00,000

Margaret plays, she likes levitation, she likes throwing objects.

193

00:18:00,000 --> 00:18:05,000

Well, then came in order to hamburger and bartenders asked him something about how he wanted it done.

194

00:18:05,000 --> 00:18:14,000

And that moment from across the room where there was no one sitting, an ashtray picked up off the table, flew across the room, passed the guy's head and dropped down in front of the bartender.

195

Even Lloyd has experienced what seems to be Margaret's temper.

196

The chandelier started moving by itself and there was no way for that to have happened if the other one wasn't always already moving, unless somebody rigged it.

And that's the first thing we did check.

In another haunting case at the Moss Beach Distillery in California, a deluge of eyewitness reports warranted more sophisticated diagnostic tools.

Now what we're installing are three different types of motion detectors, an infrared detector, a microwave detector and an ultrasonic detector.

In addition to the detection devices, our back has assembled a team of psychics who will attempt to make contact with the spirits here.

You may have a lot of person witnesses, but no camera witnesses to objectify the actual phenomenon that's going on.

Photographic evidence doesn't exist and there are no good photographs because we're dealing with a purely mental phenomenon where the ghost is somehow transmitting an image into your brain and bypassing the eyes altogether.

203

Apparently it was built as a residence to begin with.

204

00:19:15,000 --> 00:19:23,000

There was a garage downstairs and then it became a booming restaurant and a bordello, we think.

205

00:19:23,000 --> 00:19:32,000

There was a piano player here and every evening a beautiful woman wearing blue would come to listen to him play and apparently they were having an affair.

206

00:19:32,000 --> 00:19:37,000

The only problem was that she was married and her husband was very jealous.

207

00:19:37,000 --> 00:19:51,000

And one night they were all here at the same time and a fight broke out and they ended up on the beach and a stabbing took place and apparently the blue lady, the lady in blue, was killed and then she came back here to haunt the place.

208

The blue lady is quite comfortable with us and we're comfortable with her.

209

00:19:58,000 --> 00:20:02,000

We'll protect her I think as much as we can.

210

I suppose a lot of pranks. I guess one that I can remember is the funniest is at a waitress in the kitchen towards the end of the evening got smacked in the rear end with a spatula and there was nobody in the kitchen.

211

We recently installed a heating and air conditioning system and I spent the better part of one day programming these thermostats so that they would go on precisely the time predesignated and so forth.

212

The next day I came into the restaurant and every single setting and the thermostat had been changed and it would take at least 30 minutes for somebody to do that if you knew how to do it and if you knew how to unlock it.

213
