These are only two of the thousands of shipwrecks and plane crashes

122

The most dangerous zone is known as the Marsberg Vortex in Lake Ontario,

124

but disappearances routinely occur throughout a larger area known as the Great Lakes Triangle.

Marine insurance records show that more than 15,000 shipwrecks, plane crashes,

128

With Marsberg, what you get is exactly the same type of things.

130

You're getting down and around the Bermuda Triangle, disappearing people, disappearing ships and that.

We have found that there is at least one major link between all these crashes and disappearances.

The ever-present magnetic fields which wrap the Earth appear to act differently in the Great Lakes Triangle.

This state-of-the-art vessel had two independent radar systems thought to be infallible, but they weren't,

and route to Cleveland, Ohio, disaster struck.

November 10, 1975, 5 p.m.

145

00:11:48,000 --> 00:11:52,000

The Edmund Fitzgerald is fully loaded with iron ore and leaves port.

146

00:11:52,000 --> 00:11:57,000

By 6 p.m. the ship is unexpectedly caught in the grips of a severe winter storm.

147

00:11:57,000 --> 00:12:06,000

Just after 7 p.m., the Edmund Fitzgerald, a highly sophisticated modern freighter, has disappeared, with all hands feared lost.

148

00:12:06,000 --> 00:12:13,000

The weather was harsh, but the Edmund Fitzgerald was designed with stand storms like this.

149

00:12:13,000 --> 00:12:18,000

The beginning of the end occurred when not one, but both radar systems failed.

150

00:12:18,000 --> 00:12:23,000

With low visibility and no working navigational system, the ship was doomed.

151

00:12:23,000 --> 00:12:34,000

I do know that they had lost their radar, and they were, depending on the Anderson, which was a ship nearby in the storm, the Anderson was doing their seeing for them.

152

00:12:34,000 --> 00:12:41,000

It was trying to get the fix on the Fitzgerald with radar and then radio to the Fitz and tell them where they were.

153

00:12:41,000 --> 00:12:46,000

One minute they had a blip on the radar, and the next minute the blip was gone.

154

00:12:46,000 --> 00:12:54,000

They were in communication with the Fitzgerald at 10 minutes after 7, and 20 minutes after 7, they had no sight of it at all.

155

And given that 10-minute span and the fact that no distress call was ever sent by the Fitzgerald, that ship going down must have happened no more than a minute.

156

It just dove and went down, and that was the end of it.

157

So, I said you had him visually hand down the radar, and you lost him in both respects.

The approach was over Lake Michigan. The last altitude that they were cleared to, in which he was supposed to have leveled off

and maintained that altitude until cleared lower was 6,000 feet.

169

But Flight 389 did not level off at 6,000 feet.

170

00:14:34,000 --> 00:14:43,000

The aircraft stuck the water in a descending attitude. It spread over about 1.6 miles and it sank in about 250 feet of water.

171

We know there was no mid-air collision. We know there was no structural failure. We know the engines were operating properly.

172

Everything appeared to be normal up until the aircraft disappeared.

173

Unpredictable magnetic energies that ripple through the entire 100,000-square-mile area of the Great Lakes may explain what happened.

The purpose of a soul exchange is always to have a being come into a body that is more highly evolved

203

and is coming in for the purpose of helping the earth evolve.

For a precious few, the supposed soul exchange triggers miraculous new and unexplainable talents.

205

Charlotte King's experience has been remarkable.

In December of 1976, I overdosed on a combination of Valium and Brandy.

207

208

but I was in a real bad state for quite a few hours.

And I heard the word that the doctor had admitted me and that I would have to stay there.

210

And I was in kind of a drug sleep, a very drug sleep.

211

And a few hours later, I all of a sudden became real full of energy, just a burst of energy.

Charlotte believes she left the hospital literally a new person,

213
