Virtually unknown by all but the most dedicated ufologists,

a confirmed sighting in Mansfield, Ohio may be the most significant UFO encounter to date.

Why isn't Mansfield, Ohio in the pantheon of UFO hotspots?

Because the key witnesses wouldn't, or were instructed not to, talk publicly.

Until now.

It was October 1973.

18

A Cleveland, Ohio police detective asked his partner to meet him in an interrogation room.

19

The cop wanted to make a report about the strangest thing that had ever happened to him.

20

And he wanted it on tape.

21

Today is October the 19th, 1973.

And the time is approximately 2 p.m.

I have with me in my office at the present time, Detective John Healy.

Healy's going to describe in his own way of an incident that had occurred last night.

Okay, we left Port Columbus Airport at about 10.30 last night.

The tape you are listening to is an important historical document.

27

It is a permanent record of a UFO encounter that occurred on the night of October 18th, 1973,

as witnessed by Detective John Healy.

It had a steady red light on its nose.

30

It was cigar shaped.

31

And it had a green light shining down out of the abdomen.

32

When Detective Healy wasn't on the beat, he was an Army Reserve medic.

33

On the night in question, Healy and three other reservists were returning to Cleveland

34

via helicopter from their annual Army physical.

35

00:02:57,000 --> 00:03:02,000

Over the town of Mansfield, Ohio, all four men made contact with the UFO.

36

Detective Healy now speaks publicly about the incident for the first time in 20 years.

37

We were almost involved in a mid-air collision with an object that was coming out of the east heading west toward us.

38

I noticed a red light on our port's side going south.

39

00:03:22,000 --> 00:03:25,000

It was a big red light, but I didn't think anything of it.

40

00:03:25,000 --> 00:03:29,000

I thought it would be the port wing of another aircraft.

41

00:03:29,000 --> 00:03:35,000

We saw it kept coming at us, and it was a clear night, unlimited visibility.

42

00:03:35,000 --> 00:03:42,000

It didn't have any wings. It didn't have any windows, as you would see on a conventional aircraft.

43

Healy was not the only witness. All four crew members saw the UFO,

44

and the two pilots filed official military reports detailing their versions of the near-dently UFO encounter.

45

But Healy is the only one who, two decades later, is willing to speak out.

46

He described for sightings what all four crew members attested to when they signed this affidavit.

47

This was an object that moved at a very fast rate of speed.

48

It saw us probably before we saw it.

49

It just tracked us, because we had all our navigation lights on and running and blinking.

And then it started back toward us again. Maybe it had never seen a helicopter at night.

51

The UFO appeared to be threatening the helicopter, maneuvering toward it on a collision course.

52

The pilot was flying in the right seat. He had to take the controls, and he put the helicopter into a dive.

53

After narrowly avoiding a mid-air crash, the pilot took evasive action, diving at a rate of 2,000 feet per minute.

54

At 1,700 feet, the helicopter was suddenly paralyzed, even though the controls were still in a dive configuration.

55

The UFO cast an ominous greenish light over the helicopter.

56

This was just a humongous green light just shining down on us in a very definite cone shape.

57

You could look at the light and you could actually see the beam of the light.

58

The pilot tried to dive, but instead started to rise.

59

00:05:11,000 --> 00:05:16,000

It seemed that the UFO was pulling the helicopter toward it, overriding the aircraft's controls.

60

In regards to our aircraft climbing while it was in a dive configuration, I didn't feel us being pulled up as in an elevator or a roller coaster.

61

You don't feel a G-force of a dive or a climb. I didn't feel that.

It scanned us for that instant that it hesitated over us. It scanned us. Then it took off.

63

After the object went off to the west, the helicopter pilot noted that although he had been in a descent and his controls were in the configuration for a descent,

the helicopter had actually risen to 3,800 feet.

Jenny Zeidman was part of a research team from Kufos, the Center for UFO Studies, that investigated the Mansfield Encounter for more than three years.

66

The interviews, military reports and diagrams compiled by Kufos make Mansfield one of the most well-documented UFO encounters ever.

67

My analysis of this case showed that the object was under continual observation for five minutes, perhaps even more.

68

Despite the impeccable credentials of the four military men, the Center for UFO Studies searched for ground eyewitnesses that could corroborate the sighting, and they found them.

69

The DeLong family was driving on the outskirts of Mansfield when they saw a helicopter hovering in the wake of a UFO.

70

00:06:44,000 --> 00:06:47,000

The kids kept hollering. They wanted to stop. They wanted to stop.

71

She finally stopped the car, and I jumped out. I remember the whole top of the sky was lit up, a dull fluorescent green.

72

I looked out, and the helicopter was just sitting there in midair with this object over.

73

And to be honest, it scared me. I was scared at that time, but it didn't sink in, and it was still really something a UFO.

The DeLongs were interviewed three years after the fact by Wara Nicholson, director of the Civil Commission on Aerial Phenomenon.

He grilled the family about what they had seen.

76

I was a little bit doubtful at first that maybe they had just read the story in the newspaper, but they knew things that hadn't been in the article.

77

From the multiple interviews we had with them, you could tell that they were scared.

78

This brought together two groups of witnesses. It established the exact location of the event.

79

We were able to compute the flight path of the helicopter.

80

00:07:52,000 --> 00:08:03,000

Legendary UFO researcher Dr. J. Allen Heineck compiled sketches of the event drawn by the flight crew and conducted in-depth interviews about every aspect of the encounter.

81

At the same time, the military was conducting their own investigation. They ruled the incident a near miss with an unidentified craft.

82

Their findings were inconclusive in large part because the radio transmissions between the helicopter and the tower had mysteriously disappeared.

Was the tape erased to cover up the encounter, or could the UFO have intentionally obliterated the transmission?

Coincidentally, many other onboard instruments continued malfunction weeks, even years after the incident.

The aircraft number was 15444. That was the aircraft we were in at. She was never any good after that.

86

She was the hangar queen after that. The radios would never work right. Navigation instruments, nothing.

87

The skeptics immediately came up with the idea that this was a meteor. Well, there's no way this could have been a meteor. It lasted for five minutes.

No meteor takes five minutes to cross the sky from horizon to horizon.

89

As far as I'm concerned, the case will not be concluded until we have identified this object.

90

But after 21 years, the trail is growing cold. The Mansfield UFO will never be investigated by our military the way Detective Healy once took for granted that it would be.

It's quite something. Anything further comes along. I'll just be interested in knowing.

Alfred Hitchcock was films undisputed master of suspense. He created some of Hollywood's most memorable moments of terror.

The shower scene in Psycho, the dis-teen staircase in Vertigo, and the ominous ravens who perched atop a quaint schoolhouse in The Birds.

98

Well, that schoolhouse wasn't a set. It was a real building in a real town, and the real family who lives there now believes that it's haunted.

99

People come here to see this building because that movie somehow affects them.

100

I don't know. Maybe it's the idea of nature finally getting back at human beings.

101

It was sheer terror, created by the sheer genius of Alfred Hitchcock.

102

He took a real schoolhouse in Bodega, California, and transformed it into a nightmare.

103

But according to The Birds' leading lady, Tippi Hedron, Hitchcock chose the old schoolhouse for a reason.

104

He would always choose places that were of interest and that would have a mystique about them.

105

I mean, you looked at it up on that hill, and it was really quite a... almost a bit foreboding.

106

But it was disturbingly populated, and there was nobody there.

107

Today, the movie crew and their make-believe world are long gone.

108

But some people believe that the inexplicable force that once drew Hitchcock here is still at work and stronger than ever.

Oh, there are bumps on the wall, voices in the hallway, sounds on the stairs.

Sometimes I hear a woman singing, or maybe it's a little girl. I don't know.

The sounds of childhood have been heard in the schoolhouse since it was built in 1873, and not much in Bodega has changed since then.

First thing we did, we'd get in lines out in front of the school and pledge allegiance to the flag.

113

It was called the Potter School, and for 85 years it educated the town's children, and the upstairs meeting room also served as the community's social center.

114

They used to hold plays upstairs, and they'd have dances and things like that, and then kind of dwindle down.

115

00:12:17,000 --> 00:12:23,000

But in 1962, the county declared the Potter School unsafe and closed it down.

116

00:12:23,000 --> 00:12:33,000

The children were moved to a new, more modern school, but strange phenomena around the building suggest some of the students didn't want to leave their alma mater.

117

I was alone and was working at the tie prider. There was a slow rap on the kitchen door upstairs, and I stopped typing,

118

00:12:50,000 --> 00:12:54,000

and then I saw the doorknob turn.

119

I heard kids playing in the schoolyard, and it didn't faze me at all because I'm a teacher and I'm so familiar with that sound.

120

And of course, I knew that there were no children here and hadn't been for a long time.

121

The Potter School has been lovingly restored by the Taylor family, and since 1970, three generations of tailors have called the old schoolhouse home, and everyone who has lived here has had their own ghostly encounter.

122

When I was 12, I was sat on scaffolding five tiers high and actually painted under the eaves of the building, and from the very beginning it was very spooky.

123

After we were here at night, we began to hear sounds and steps and things that were all friendly.

124

00:13:43,000 --> 00:13:52,000

The clearest thing that I've heard here is right up here in the room over by the stairs over there

on Saturday night, usually.

125

I hear partying noises going on. Nobody's here.

126

00:13:58,000 --> 00:14:06,000

All of a sudden, I hear a latest voice saying, hey, it's Sunday morning.

127

00:14:06,000 --> 00:14:14,000

The party slows down, takes a look, goes right back, and I don't see anybody.

128

00:14:14,000 --> 00:14:23,000

I did see an apparition a few years ago, a little girl, and she actually spoke to me. She said, hi!

129

And the whole room echoed with the sound of her voice.

130

00:14:27,000 --> 00:14:39,000

Despite eerie reminders that they may not be alone, Leah, her husband Rick, and baby Taylor, do not feel threatened by the otherworldly sounds and images that surround their daily lives.

131

In fact, sightings first heard about the activity here after sightseers at the home were spooked by an unsettling encounter.

132

When we received a phone call from a family of three in Washington, they had apparently been vacationing in the area.

133

Their teenage daughter came over to take some photos of the house, and as she was taking the photos, she stated that she saw a young lady standing at the top of these stairs.

134

She told the young girl to move, and the young girl came down the stairs and walked right toward her, and at that point she apparently just evaporated.

135

Suspecting a case of what's known as residue haunting, the Office of Scientific Investigation and Research has teamed with sightings to document the activity here.

136

My name is Christopher Chacon, and I am the case manager.

137

00:15:27,000 --> 00:15:33,000

For this investigation, the OSIR unveiled its newest monitoring technology.

138

The robot has and is equipped with telemetry so that it can utilize video night vision, thermo vision, and transmit back what it's seen back to our mobile laboratory.

139

The robot was programmed to roam paranormal hotspots inside. Super sensitive microphones were monitored from our control center outside.

140

00:15:53,000 --> 00:15:58,000

The baseline readings taken earlier were continually updated and checked for anomalies.

141

We also were able to document a variety of anomalous cold spots also along the wall, which was west of the main living room.

142

Much of the investigation centered here, in the upstairs room that was once Bodega's community center.

143

The room where the family has felt the strongest spiritual presence.

144

00:16:18,000 --> 00:16:30,000

I was sleeping in a bed that was right here in the South Cove, and I heard the front door open and close, and I heard footsteps coming up the stairs.

145

And I looked at my dog and the hair on her back was up, and there was a child's rocker right about here and also a plastic beach ball, small plastic beach ball.

146

And the child's rocker began to rock back and forth, and then the beach ball began to roll.

147

And the night of our investigation, the same kind of unexplained movement Leia described was caught on tape by our team.

Wait a minute, that thing is, that thing should stop by now, that's on.

149

The swinging lamp seemed to be an eerie sign that some unknown force was at work.

150

And the next morning, there was another stranger sign, a message written on the outside of a window that had been painted shut years ago.

After people live here for a while and they leave, what it creates is an impression in the environment, and it's sort of like a loop, a videotape loop, playing back over and over again.

I think it's the residual energy of some kind, how that energy is maintained.

I don't, I don't, I am a physicist, but I'm a physics, doesn't have any explanation for that.

154

In search for that explanation, sightings and the OSIR continue to work with people in supposedly

haunted houses in an ongoing investigation of residue haunting.

155

Despite the ghostly activity, the family that owns the supposedly haunted house in Bodega Bay is not moving.

156

00:17:57,000 --> 00:18:04,000

They told sightings that a little paranormal phenomena is a small price to pay for life in paradise.

157

Next, they're in search of hope and enlightenment, and some believe this book has the answers.

158

It's a book about sensing another way of life.

159

Self-styled prophets have been predicting the end of time since the beginning of time.

That calf has changed a lot of people's lives.

You see them walking with disbelief on their face, so when they walk out, they got all together a different attitude.

The same search for hope that draws thousands of people to the white buffalo

But while en route, something strange happened. Cosmonaut Afanasyev saw an unidentified object turn toward his craft and begin tailing it through space.

368

It followed us during half of our orbit. We observed it on the light side and when we entered the shadow side, it disappeared completely.

Spaceflight itself broadens your horizons to the point which you kind of open up to possibilities.

Dr. Story Musgrave is a veteran of five American shuttle missions, who has seen and photographed several unidentified flying objects in space.

Dr. Musgrave does not believe they are craft from another planet.

380

On two of my missions, and I still don't have an answer, I have seen a snake out there, six, seven, eight feet long.

It is rubbery because it has internal waves in it, and it follows you for a rather long period of time.
