The family town was rocked by the kidnapping of one of its own, three-year-old Sarah Skidmore.

She was kind of a bouncy little kid, always in the trouble and always jumping on, you know, always wanting hugs and kisses and jumping on you and mollying you.

And she was always fun.

172

The day that Sarah was kidnapped, everything changed. Everything was different.

173

It was just unimaginable.

On Tuesday, October 7th, 1986, Rhonda Skidmore received an urgent call from her five-year-old son, Robert's school.

I had to go to the school to help Robert.

And so I took some things into the school and I left my little kids in the car.

177

When I came back, the little boy in the car that had been babysitting, I said, a man took Sarah out of the car and he was serious.

And I looked around and she was nowhere.

179

For the first 48 hours, state police conducted an exhaustive search for Sarah and her kidnapper.

180

He was described by an eyewitness as a heavy-set bearded man wearing a baseball cap.

181

After Sarah disappeared, our other children were questioning, wondering where she was, asking if she was going to get some dinner.

What is Sarah having for dinner tonight? Is Sarah hungry? Where is Sarah going to sleep? She doesn't have her pajamas.

183

Robert went to the front door and just screamed, Sarah, Sarah, trying to call her home.

184

00:15:48,000 --> 00:15:54,000

And he did that until his voice was totally spent.

185

After two days, the authorities narrowed their search. There were indications that Sarah's kidnapper may have retreated into the harsh desert backcountry, where there was no water and no shelter from the elements.

This incident occurred in fall time, which in Arizona we see our greatest extremes, the extreme heat, the extreme cold.

187

Children lose heat and become dehydrated very quickly. And it can even progress to a point of unconsciousness, what we call heat stroke, and a large percent of those patients could die.

On day three, there was an unusually violent thunderstorm.

We actually had one news reporter say, how will you feel when they find her dead body?

190

The next morning dawned clear and calm. The skidmoors were praying for a miracle. Zane Bingham did not hear the prayers, but he answered them.

I was hunting quail, I hit one. Upon retrieving it, walking up to where it was laying, I picked it up, looked across the wash to the left, where the cover, the rest of the cover I had flown to.

And upon doing so, I saw her in the wash looking at me. The closer I got to her, I noticed that she had been out there apparently for a while because she had lots of scratches all over her legs, her arms and her legs.

And they said that the exposure should have put her in a coma because of her weakened condition she should not have been able to survive it.

Doctors pronounced Sarah's recovery a miracle. A few days later, Sarah herself offered a mysterious clue to her miraculous survival.

When Jessica was three years old, Sarah looked at her baby sister and suddenly realized that it was Jessica, not Heather, who had been her angel.

Sarah just was watching Jessica and she said, I feel like Jessica was the one that was in the desert when I needed the help.

I think it was me. I believe my sister, I was her angel.

The Skidmore's religious belief in pre-born spirits is gaining a lot of attention among paranormal researchers.

After her own encounter with what she believed was a pre-born spirit, Sarah Hines, educator, author and mother of nine, began compiling similar case studies in her book, Coming from the Light.

During her research, Hines contacted Paul Perry, a best-selling author and journalist who is an acknowledged expert in near-death experience.

Hines and Perry compared case studies and found an astonishing link.

Many survivors of the near-death experience report seeing not only their past, but also spirit beings waiting to be born.

28 years have passed since the crash at Shag Harbor. Time was not on our side, but state-of-the-art detection equipment unimaginable in 1967 would improve our chances.

There is 500 kilohertz digital side scan sonar for seabed profiling and target detection.

Roger survey one, commencing sequence over.

296

00:31:05,000 --> 00:31:17,000

A towed array GEM magnetometer for underwater metal detection and a GPS satellite tracking system to pinpoint potential targets.

297

00:31:17,000 --> 00:31:23,000

Our intention was to scan and search three main areas of the ocean floor in the waters off Shag Harbor.

298

00:31:23,000 --> 00:31:33,000

These areas corresponded to eyewitness recollections and coordinates taken from a document

reporting where the initial government searched of place in 1967.

299

Sonar buoy drops out of nearby Canadian forces base Greenwood and the magnetic anomaly detection grid at the nearby Shelburne base, which was the coordination center for submarine detection in the Atlantic, led the authorities to believe that perhaps the largely intact object was still moving under the water.

But where it came to rest remains a mystery.

301

Reports that wreckage was recovered from Shag Harbor on the night of the crash dictate that we begin our operation there.

Man at the base had told me that it was probably the most intense thing next to the Cuban missile crisis which left the base on alert for 34 days.

The sightings investigation heads out to sea after months of onshore planning.

The three targeted areas are scanned for potential pieces of wreckage called targets and each target is given a priority designation.

We were able to lay down an extensive grid pattern and pick up numerous target detections which we gave an assessment value for high strangeness.

Very simple system one, two or three.

The initial search shows no high priority targets in area one, the section of ocean shore closest to the Nova Scotia mainland.

Attention bridge, this is control. We have a strong target return.

Target detection is one thing going down and confirming what the target is is much harder to repeat.

The environment presents perhaps the main challenge in doing a thorough search. Extreme current conditions are almost constant.

As the divers close in on their bearing, they realize that the ocean currents are distorting sonar readings.

The team is disappointed, but Chris Stiles is undaunted.

326

He has eliminated three crash sites and can now move forward to another area where some government eyewitnesses have told him UFO debris may still be found.

I've spoken with several of the divers in the past and other support naval personnel that were involved in this.

And early on they told me the story of the Shelburne connection and it just keeps resurfacing, resurfacing.

He feels there is simply too much information about the mysterious UFO crash of October 4, 1967 to abandon his search for the truth.

We see lights moving through the sky that we talked to be an airplane at first.

And there was four in segments, one would come on, then two, and three, and four.

There was reddish-orange in color and they seemed to be on about a 45 degree incline and the lights seemed to be going in the downward motion.

This thing headed down, crashed on the water, and at that time all the lights went off and one other light came on a few minutes later,

and that's the light that was there when I arrived on the scene.

Royal Canadian Mounted Police Officer Ron Pond not only saw the Shag Harbor UFO, he also interviewed eyewitnesses at the scene.

There were witnesses coming from a variety of directions and in different locations, so there was no way that there was a conspiracy or any kind of an attempt to mislead anybody.

347

It was definitely something that came down in the water.

In addition to credible eyewitnesses, Chris Stiles has uncovered a trail of documentation,

349

leading him to conclude that the U.S. and Canadian governments knew about and monitored the Shag Harbor UFO.

The more we find, the more there is, you know, I mean, sources of even the paper trail-ness have hardly dried up.

And there was this exclusive interview with a member of the Canadian military who had been debriefed as part of a Shag Harbor naval recovery operation.

I was told that it had hit the water, crash landed in trouble, and had actually moved under water.

And I think that that was one of the more interesting points that I found of the whole story, because this thing was not only aerodynamic, it was hydro.

Dynamic also has had the capacity to travel in two mediums.

According to this source, the UFO continued traveling underwater and finally came to rest several miles from the impact site.

Near where the UFO had moved, there was a high-top secret listening post for submarine detection.

357

This claim of a second location of an unidentified flying object resting on the bottom, somewhere off government point in the water,

358

is very interesting because this location was the spot where Canadian forces stationed Shelburne was located.

359

It is quite possible that there is something laying down there, somewhere between the crash site, the site that had moved.

360

It's hard to move that amount of physical energy around and not leave some sort of a trace.

361

Because sightings initial scientific search of Shag Harbor failed to turn up any debris, Stiles is now exploring the possibility that the crash site was 25 miles to the north, near Shelburne.

It was here that a second Navy dive reportedly took place on the night of the crash.

When I spoke to the divers and support personnel early on, they told me that at the Shelburne and into the operation where they sat over this craft for a week,

I can only imagine that he would assign some people to ensure that those people do keep quiet.

Although he has uncovered a mountain of documentation confirming civilian sightings of the Shag Harbor UFO, Stiles has found almost nothing on paper to confirm military operations in Shelburne or government point.

For example, off government point there's an area called the Knot Island which has a manned lighthouse.

Attempts with the Coast Guard to get these seem to indicate that these records were lost.

It is Stiles' belief that considerable work remains to be done in the Shag Harbor UFO investigation.

The elimination of three potential impact sites during the first sighting's salvage operation is only the first step to what may be a very long road.

It's been more than 20 years since he first introduced his groundbreaking Gaia hypothesis.

391

Today inventor scientist James Lovelock and his wife Sandy live and work on a 35 acre estate in the Cornish Highlands which he's preserving as a wildlife habitat.

392

How did you come up with the Gaia theory?

393

00:42:00,000 --> 00:42:08,000

Well I was very fortunate in 1961. I got a letter from the director of space flight operations of NASA.

394

They wanted to use my gadgets, these sensitive devices, for analyzing the lunar soil to see if it would be safe for astronauts to go there.

395

00:42:16,000 --> 00:42:22,000

But it wasn't long before I became interested in the next big step which was to go to Mars.

And the question, how do you find, is there's life there?

397

Lovelock determined that Mars was almost certainly lifeless because its atmospheric composition was static in contrast to Earth's composite parts which are highly volatile.

So I then thought, well if it's an atmosphere like that, highly unstable, something must be keeping it constant because it couldn't stay constant on its own.

399

And that set me thinking about a regulating system at the Earth's surface which presumably was life itself.

And then this idea of Gaia was born in my mind.

401

Since then Lovelock's Gaia theory has been embraced and embellished on by scientists, environmentalists and new age philosophers who believe Gaia is a sentient being with a capacity for

intelligence, emotion, even vengeance.

402

I don't really now regard the Earth as a living organism. I think in the early days of Gaia we used the term the Earth is alive metaphorically.

403

What we meant was that the Earth has properties like those of a living organism.

404

It's able to regulate its temperature and it's able to regulate its chemistry and that was all we meant by it.

405

What do you think of the theories that are now coming out? People call it Gaia's revenge, that the Earth is fighting back with diseases like AIDS and Ebola and getting rid of the human parasite.

406

Oh I don't like it one bit. Gaia is in no way sentient. Not at all. There's no possibility of fighting back. There's only consequences.

407

While he does not regard the Earth as an angry, vengeful planet, the father of the Gaia theory is deeply concerned by humankind's apparent disregard for the delicate balance between our planet and her life-sustaining atmosphere.

What is the greatest danger to us right now?

409

00:44:15,000 --> 00:44:30,000

If you're talking about human dangers, we're now talking in terms of hundreds of years, not billions or billions of years, there's a distinct possibility that a large chunk of ice which is supported above the water by a ridge in Antarctica

410

00:44:30,000 --> 00:44:45,000

It's called the West Antarctica Gai-Shin, may slip off into the ocean. It did so 120,000 years ago during another inter-placing and if we go on warming the Earth, adding CO2 and things, it may well slip off again.

411

When it does, it's estimated there will be a maximum rise of sea level of about 15 feet, but even if only a part of it drops, there's only a rise of 5 feet of sea level. This would be enough to take out many of the major cities around the world.
