Los Angeles was rocked by the worst earthquake ever recorded in the area.

Late, we anxiously returned to Scalgan's rural New Hampshire retreat to find out if

165

the monster quake had altered his bleak outlook for the future.

The Ring of Fire is the predominant pattern or the predominant region of the globe that

Scalgar's vision may seem alarmist to many, but the sobering truth is that reports of

Paul Devereux believes it's not history or superstition that creates a sacred site.

225

That's something in the rock, some kind of magnetic energy or radiation that changes

226

people physically and emotionally.

Is there something about the actual site memory, if you like, the actual place memory of a

monument that can affect us in subtle ways that we're not directly conscious of?

But how can a scientist prove that energy from these sites affects the subconscious?

Devereux believes the latter and is testing his theory by having volunteers spend the

Amazing.

So coming clear.

We're not interpreting their dream for them, but what we are doing is looking at a site

in granite, aswan granite.

And it just makes us wonder a little if that was a factor to help create an environment

256

where altered states could develop visionary states.

Because on the Dragon Project, we have had a few examples of spontaneous occurrences

Near Santa Fe, New Mexico, one place stands as a testament to the power of prayer.

For nearly 200 years, people have come to El Sanjuario de Chimayo to pray,

often leaving behind the crutches and wheelchairs they no longer need.

Dr. Larry Dossy studies the accounts of healing by prayer that continue to this day.

The question for us in science is, can we go beyond people's stories

433

and make anything scientific out of the personal account?

That's the great challenge.

Dr. Dossy has written a best-selling book that chronicles the positive effects of prayer,

a subject considered entirely anecdotal and unsubstantiated until just a few years ago.

I discovered, however, back in the mid-80s that there were some studies coming out

438

showing that if you take prayer into the clinic or the hospital or the laboratory

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00:31:39,220 --> 00:31:42,220

and test it pretty much like you would in new medication,

440

00:31:42,220 --> 00:31:45,220

you can actually show that prayer does something.

Religious affiliation and religious belief are not factors in these experiments.

In the 1980s, medical researchers in Oregon devised an experiment

443

to test the power of prayer under controlled laboratory conditions.

444

In a double-blind study, test tubes were filled with equal amounts of yeast and sealed.

445

Half of the tubes were prayed over by volunteers, half were not.

446

00:32:10,220 --> 00:32:16,220

Researchers were amazed that there was a significant difference in the tubes that had been prayed over.

447

You can do this with extreme accuracy,

448

00:32:19,220 --> 00:32:23,220

and the differences in the growth rates are quite profound,

449

00:32:23,220 --> 00:32:26,220

favoring those that get prayed for.

It frequently is the case in the history of medicine that we have known that something works

451

before we know how it works.

452

Penicillin was an example.

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00:32:35,220 --> 00:32:39,220

When penicillin was discovered, no one had a clue about actually how it worked,

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00:32:39,220 --> 00:32:43,220

we honored the data, we did the studies and we could show that it did something.

455

00:32:43,220 --> 00:32:45,220

We're at the same point with prayer.

456

00:32:45,220 --> 00:32:50,220

We haven't the foggiest idea scientifically how it could work,

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00:32:50,220 --> 00:32:53,220

but we have taken it into the laboratory, we have done the precise studies,

458

00:32:53,220 --> 00:32:56,220

we have shown that it works.

459

00:32:56,220 --> 00:33:00,220

Bolstered by the remarkable results found in the yeast experiment,

San Francisco General Hospital launched its own power of prayer study.

Volunteers were asked to pray for patients they did not know.

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00:33:09,220 --> 00:33:13,220

393 patients were prayed for over a 10 month period.

463

We had the prayers do so only outside of the hospital, they never came inside the hospital,

464

00:33:19,220 --> 00:33:21,220

and the patients never saw them,

465

00:33:21,220 --> 00:33:28,220

and we didn't produce any standard prayer or prayer format.

466

00:33:28,220 --> 00:33:32,220

After analyzing the data, the results were impressive.

467

00:33:32,220 --> 00:33:37,220

The patients who received extra prayer from our groups outside of the hospital

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00:33:37,220 --> 00:33:47,220

required less diuretic therapy, less antibiotics, and had less cardiac arrest.

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00:33:47,220 --> 00:33:54,220

In Riverside, California, Taylor Hall's family didn't know about the results of the San Francisco General study.

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00:33:54,220 --> 00:33:56,220

They prayed because they felt they had to.

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00:33:56,220 --> 00:33:59,220

Their little boy was dying.

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00:34:00,220 --> 00:34:03,220

His entire pelvis was crushed under the tires.

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00:34:03,220 --> 00:34:08,220

I had grave doubts about being able to put his intestinal tract back together.

The damage was so extensive in the pelvic area.

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00:34:12,220 --> 00:34:18,220

He had huge open wounds, again very susceptible to infection.

There was a very good possibility that the infection that might have gotten in there

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00:34:23,220 --> 00:34:26,220

would be the thing that would end up killing him.

The next thing we were told was that if he made it through that,

that there would be a possibility that one, he might not be able to have children.

He might have to have a colostomy the rest of his life.

His ability to walk might be impeded substantially.

He thought he was going to die.

I think that scared the nurses a little bit because they said when patients think that they're going to die,

then it's pretty serious.

But the family never lost their faith and dedication to prayer.

That mysterious force that now has mainstream medicine rethinking its power to heal.

The fact that prayer can work says that the consciousness, the human psyche, the mind,

The mind has some aspect, some quality, which can reach out through space and time

In the end, prayer may have been the difference for Taylor Hall.

We were both at the hospital.

Steve and I, I think, I know I did, prayed on the way to the hospital.

And the family prayed as a family.

It just seemed we were all on the same level, doing the same thing for the same purpose.

And we all wanted the same thing and that was for Taylor to recover.

And I'm fully convinced that that was every bit as important a part as what the doctors did.

Yeah, I think it was a miracle.

I think if somebody else had got run over and nobody prayed and he could have died.

It was my opinion that prayer helped 100%.

A lot of the stuff that we were able to do as doctors was relatively simple,
