When the Portuguese first settled here, they enslaved the native population, a crime for which legend tells us the spirits will forever take revenge.

Some say the spirits were vengeful on this day in 1974. In a high rise built in the heart of the Valley of the Spirits, a devastating fire took nearly 200 lives.

Right next door to the site of Sao Paulo's worst fire disaster, city hall was used as a temporary mort.

And some believe the vengeful spirits may have followed because strange things are now happening there.

That magnetic field anomalies could be responsible for the haunting activity and they conduct interviews to explore the psychic abilities of the eyewitnesses.

There is a possibility of two people at the same time having a hallucination. So sometimes seeing a ghost is nothing more than a psychic image that shows itself in the shape of a ghost.

I believe that all this phenomena that people relate may have psychic explanations.

Sightings was invited to observe the techniques used by the institute's academic researchers during one of many overnight investigations they hope to conduct here.

Tonight we collected some data. We made some interviews and we used some instruments to see the level of magnetic fields here in the building and about radiation and things like that.

We used equipment that is being used by engineers and physicists that help us with our analysis. The gear can tell us if anything is being misinterpreted.

As scientists, institute team members are concentrating on phenomena that can be quantified and analyzed. But those Brazilians with their roots still firmly entrenched in ancient beliefs warn that there is no way to measure the wrath of their ancestors.

So far, Sao Paulo's paranormal team has ruled out the first two possibilities on their list of five. The haunting activity is not a hoax, they insist, and everyone they interviewed showed no signs of mental or physical impairment.

In Pasadena, California, at Jet Propulsion Laboratory, the next great interplanetary observer is being readied for its October 1997 launch.

Spacecraft Cassini is a joint effort between NASA and the European Space Agency. Its goal? To reach the rings of Saturn and explore its many intriguing moons.

Many researchers have their eye on this one. Titan is Saturn's largest moon, half the size of Earth. It has a dense atmosphere denser than Earth's.

115

And for this reason, scientists like Planetary Society's Tom McDonough speculate that there could be life on Titan.

116

00:17:42,000 --> 00:17:52,000

Titan is one of the most fascinating moons in the solar system because it's similar in a lot of ways to what Earth was like when we first got started as a planet and when life first got formed.

117

Titan's surface is hidden beneath a thick smoggy cloud, believed to be similar to the haze over Los Angeles or Mexico City.

In order to see through this cosmic veil to the moon below, Cassini is equipped with an unmanned probe called the Huggins probe.

It will descend through the cloud, land on the surface of Titan and snap the first pictures of this unexplored moon.

It's really important to send a probe to a place like Titan because it's so far away that we cannot see it very well with our telescopes.

If we want to see what's really down on the surface, are there oceans and things like that, then you have to send a probe that penetrates through the atmosphere and lands on the surface.

NASA wants the public involved on this project. On their website, you can watch Cassini's progress. Every four minutes, live video images from the construction site at JPL are downloaded for you to see.

And NASA is also creating a CD-ROM to be carried aboard Cassini with one million signatures from planet Earth.

You can send your signature to Cassini Program JPL. Names will be included on a first-come basis until the CD-ROM is filled.

In Siberia, Russia, two scientists from Kagoshima University in southern Japan have taken the first step toward recreating a creature that has been extinct for nearly 10,000 years.

Recently, the researchers on Earth this baby woolly mammoth and now hope to extract DNA from the sperm of the Stone Age carcass and use it to fertilize an elephant egg.

The result, they hope, will be a modern mammoth.

What we're able to do in space is at a standstill. And yet our genetic technology, this really seems to be the next big frontier.

Paleontologist Dr. Charles Pellegrino of Brookhaven National Laboratory is familiar with genetic manipulation like that proposed by the Japanese team.

Pellegrino's own work formed the basis for the book and the movie Jurassic Park.

The genetic distance between a woolly mammoth and an elephant is probably about the genetic distance between a horse and a donkey, probably somewhere in the range of less than 1%.

So you would only have to go in and basically re-edit less than 1% of the genetic code of an elephant that is already walking around today.

133

Many scientists question the feasibility of this process, but if indeed it is possible, a larger question needs to be addressed. Why should we resurrect such a creature?

It's almost like asking why do we want to go to the moon? Why do we want to go to the bottom of the ocean?

To me, bringing back a woolly mammoth or bringing back a dinosaur, it's the ultimate paleontological tool.

It's the closest you can have to building a time machine and going back into time and studying these creatures face to face, nose to nose.

Although Pellegrino believes that such a genetic feat would be invaluable, he worries about the new mammoth's impact outside the scientific community.

There are probably industrial types around the world right now who are looking at this and saying, gee, if we can bring back extinct life forms, then we don't have to worry so much about endangering species.

So let's cut down more of the Amazon rainforest or it might incite people to get a bit cocky about creating the conditions that lead to extinction in the first place.

Being 19, this was really just the beginning of life and getting a formalized education, higher education,

But until you sit in the seat, you don't realize how quickly they went and how much you didn't really appreciate each and every moment.

We searched through the campus area.

173

Unlike other psychic detectives, Kathlyn Ray wants to know every detail of the case.

And we'll go to the spot where she was last seen by a witness.

Sometime after 2 a.m. on Saturday, May 25th, 1996, Kristen left a fraternity party with a girlfriend and a male student who offered to walk the two young women home.

Kristen's friend says that around 2.30, she left Kristen at this corner on campus with the same man who reassured her that he would see Kristen to her dorm safely.

178

Kristen never made it to her dorm and has not been seen nor heard from since.

179

00:25:22,000 --> 00:25:29,000

She's certainly missing under suspicious circumstances and possibly there has been foul play involved in her disappearance.

180

According to the male student, she turned up to go up to her dorm.

181

00:25:33,000 --> 00:25:39,000

She's back up there and he continued over here, which is his dorm.

182

We believe that that's not the case.

It was not until one month later on June 25th that the Cal Poly Campus police turned the Kristen smart case over to the San Luis Obispo County Sheriff's Office.

That is except for the one student that accompanied her back to the dorm.

But still no sign of Kristen, no physical evidence that a crime has been committed.

That's where Kathleen Ray comes in. All of her psychic energy is directed toward finding Kristen smart.

Those who dared approach the Sphinx were presented with a riddle, and those who could not solve it were destroyed.

Like its mythological counterpart, the Great Stone Sphinx in Egypt poses an ancient riddle for humankind, who built it and why.

And now, there is a new challenge in the riddle of the Sphinx.

Not only is the how and why of the Sphinx being called into question, but also the when.

242

Could this great monument predate Egypt, predate in fact all known civilizations?

Edgar Cayce thought so.

244

He was an American mystic, one of the most accurate of all modern psychics.

245

Known as the Sleeping Prophet, Cayce's revelations while in a trance-like state fill hundreds of volumes and are housed at his foundation in Virginia Beach.

246

During a series of readings in the 1930s, Cayce prophesied at length about the monuments on the Giza Plateau, revealing what he believed to be the origin of the Sphinx.

247

It was like he was in the deep unconscious mind, and he was accessing the universal consciousness that contained all wisdom.

248

And when they asked him specifically about ancient Egypt, he said that this place was built in the year 10,500 BC, and that these dates would be supported somewhere around 1998.

249

Mainstream archaeologists date the Sphinx and the Great Pyramid at Giza to 2500 BC, when they were built to honor the pharaohs of the Fourth Dynasty.

Cayce's date of 10,500 BC is dismissed by mainstream science, but a few researchers are coming forward, as Cayce predicted, to support his unorthodox view.

251

John Anthony West is a self-described rogue Egyptologist. He believes that the pattern of erosion on the Sphinx rules out the mainstream date of 2500 BC.

257

Help us understand the mirror image of the monument to Giza and the sky at certain points in time, because that's key to understanding the entire concept you're putting forward.

258

There is only one time where the image of the sky locks with the image on the ground, and this occurs and only occurs in 10,500 BC.

259

00:34:40,000 --> 00:34:51,000

Baval and Hancock have discovered that the Egyptian sky in 10,500 BC bears an uncanny resemblance to the layout of the monuments on the Giza plateau.

260

10,500 BC, this is when the Sphinx is gazing directly at his own image, the constellation of Leo.

261

00:35:01,000 --> 00:35:15,000

And if we are to turn 90 degrees and face due south, we would see the three stars of Orion's bent in a pattern that mimics exactly the pattern of the pyramid on the ground.

262

So we have here a perfect conjunction taking place only in 10,500 BC.

263

00:35:24,000 --> 00:35:38,000

But history books teach us that in 10,500 BC our human ancestors were still in a primitive state, incapable of the advanced astronomical and engineering skills necessary to build great monuments.

264

We're suggesting that the entire foundation on which our notion of human history rests is faulty.

265

One thing is for sure, there was an enormous horrendous cataclysm at the end of the last ice age and this brings us to that date of 10,500 BC that we focus on in the monuments.

The new findings of West, Boval and Hancock support Casey's 60 year old predictions to the letter.

269

Even more startling is another one of Casey's early prophecies, that the record of a lost civilization would be found in a hidden chamber under the left paw of the Sphinx.

270

00:36:41,000 --> 00:36:46,000

In May of 1993 just such a chamber was found. It has yet to be opened.

271

00:36:46,000 --> 00:36:54,000

In good case he said that the lost records of Atlantis would be found in a chamber between the paws of the Sphinx.

272

00:36:54,000 --> 00:37:02,000

Our seismograph detected a chamber between the paws of the Sphinx. What's in that chamber? Absolutely we don't know.

273

00:37:02,000 --> 00:37:08,000

But certainly our findings seem to corroborate certain of his key prophecies.

274

The prophesied that that Hall of Records would be found again and would be opened between 1996 and 1998.

But a time capsule that was not intended to be found by barbarians, that was hidden away very carefully to be found as the ancient texts say by the fully worthy.

Somebody or something is killing these animals.

291

And the shock to me was seeing these animals lie there and they looked like they were just sleeping.

292

But yet, their tongues were gone, the sexual organs were gone, the blood was gone.

293

Gail Stalen is a New Mexico-based livestock mutilation investigator.

294

00:39:36,000 --> 00:39:41,000

She has worked on over 50 cases, including eight in 1996 alone.

295

00:39:41,000 --> 00:39:47,000

She is now concentrating her efforts in the Taos area where the most recent mutilations have taken place.

296

00:39:47,000 --> 00:39:56,000

The authorities right now, I do not believe are handling mutilations in a proper way or, let's say, a more professional way.

297

What I hope to change is to impose a forensic protocol on the cattle mutilations.

298

I would like to see an organized response from the government to address this issue, to investigate cattle mutilations as a crime scene.

299

John Paternoster made the cattle mutilations a central issue in his recent bid for district attorney of Taos.

300

00:40:22,000 --> 00:40:30,000

It's a growing mystery. It's a significant economic impact on the ranchers and they deserve a response.

301

Carlos Trujillo is a cattle rancher in Penausco, a remote town south of Taos.

302

00:40:37,000 --> 00:40:41,000

Just before our arrival, Trujillo had found his prize bull dead.

303

Organs, including the heart, had been removed with an eerie surgical precision.

304

00:40:45,000 --> 00:40:52,000

Trujillo told local field investigator Michael Appie that he was dissatisfied with the county inspector's findings.

305

00:40:52,000 --> 00:40:55,000

This was not the work of a coyote.

306

00:40:55,000 --> 00:41:00,000

I talked to the inspector personally and he said that he was some kind of a predator or a coyote.

307

00:41:00,000 --> 00:41:07,000

Well, if I'm coyote, I have knives like that. I mean, we're in a heap of trouble. We're in a heap of trouble.

308

00:41:08,000 --> 00:41:12,000

Like many local ranchers, Trujillo doesn't know where to turn next.

309

00:41:13,000 --> 00:41:15,000

It hurts. It hurts in the pocket.

310

00:41:16,000 --> 00:41:20,000

The ranchers are frustrated. There's no question about that.

311

00:41:20,000 --> 00:41:27,000

About the lack of any kind of a response, a uniform, a significant response from government.

312

00:41:27,000 --> 00:41:34,000

As part of this investigation, sightings travel to Albuquerque to try and get some answers from John Wortman,

313

00:41:34,000 --> 00:41:40,000

the director of the New Mexico Livestock Board, the state agency charged with investigating cattle mutilations.

314

00:41:41,000 --> 00:41:45,000

I can't say that we've actually determined a specific cause of death in any of those.

315

00:41:45,000 --> 00:41:55,000

Some, we've got a higher probability that maybe they died of natural causes or struck by lightning or were killed by a predator or whatever.

316

00:41:55,000 --> 00:41:59,000

Yes, there are some of those that have been reported that we just have no explanation.

317

00:41:59,000 --> 00:42:03,000

But that's not to say that there was some deep, dark mystery about why they died.

318

00:42:03,000 --> 00:42:06,000

We just don't have a reason for why they were killed.

319

00:42:06,000 --> 00:42:14,000

We haven't been as careful with crime scenes in some of these mutilations as you would like to have if you're going to try to find evidence.

320

00:42:14,000 --> 00:42:16,000

And in some of these cases, there's very little evidence there.

321

00:42:16,000 --> 00:42:22,000

And when you walk in there and start rolling these animals around trying to figure out why they

died, you destroy whatever evidence is there.

322

00:42:22,000 --> 00:42:29,000

In those cases that remain unresolved, the Livestock Board believes that a conventional explanation will be found.

323

00:42:30,000 --> 00:42:38,000

We think that there are individuals out there that are mutilating for whatever reasons, either ritual activities or vengeance or just pure vandalism.

324

00:42:38,000 --> 00:42:47,000

The assertion by the New Mexico Livestock Board that there's cult activity behind these cattle mutilations or malicious vandalism,

325

00:42:47,000 --> 00:42:54,000

I have to say is based from my knowledge, I'm insufficient or completely absent evidence.

326

00:42:54,000 --> 00:42:59,000

It seems to me that everybody's got a lot of theories, but nobody's got a lot of hard evidence.

327

00:42:59,000 --> 00:43:03,000

One prevailing theory connects the mutilations to UFOs.

328

00:43:03,000 --> 00:43:11,000

Well, as an official here in response to the aliens are taking our cattle hypothesis, I understand there are people out there that firmly believe that.

329

00:43:11,000 --> 00:43:14,000

And I guess I can't prove that that's not true.

330

00:43:14,000 --> 00:43:17,000

We have no evidence that would point that direction.

331

00:43:17,000 --> 00:43:23,000

And at this point we're not pursuing that as a possibility of the problem.

332

00:43:23,000 --> 00:43:28,000

Eventually better forensic procedures may help officials cope with mutilations mystery.

333

00:43:28,000 --> 00:43:33,000

But for now it's an economic burden for the ranchers and a mystery to the community at large.

334

00:43:33,000 --> 00:43:34,000

We don't know.

335

00:43:34,000 --> 00:43:42,000

And until we do know from hard evidence obtained at the scene in a forensically responsible way, we're just guessing.

336

00:43:43,000 --> 00:43:47,000

Gail Stalen isn't waiting for the wheels of government to turn in her favor.

337

00:43:47,000 --> 00:43:52,000

She takes this issue personally and continues to fight the ranchers.

338

00:43:52,000 --> 00:44:01,000

I'm going to continue investigating these mutilations because I truly believe that eventually we will find the answers.

339

In November of 1996, John Paternoster was elected district attorney for Taos in the surrounding county.

340
