July 31st, Aralinas, Argentina's Flight 674 is cleared to land at Bariloche Airport.

It's a quiet night, just two planes on radar, Flight 674 and a distant military jet,

but then suddenly a third craft appears, a UFO so disturbing that it has changed

the course of this pilot's life as he tells sightings in his first interview outside Argentina.

Our worries began when we saw the light.

31

We consulted with the tower and they said they didn't know of any other craft in the area.

The tower questioned whether Polanco might be seen in the military aircraft,

but Polanco insisted that there was a third craft bearing down on his jet.

We asked the tower again and they said they could see our lights,

that there was no craft near ours, and they confirmed that there was the military craft in its position.

We were approaching the airport at Bariloche.

37

Argentine Air Force Commandant Rubens Apusak was the other identified pilot in the air that night.

At 38 miles outside of the airport, I set my radio to the same frequency as the control tower.

39

We could hear the communication between the control tower and the pilot of an Aerolines Arientines aircraft,

who was asking the controller if there was any other flight in this area.

41

The controller answered that there was no other craft around.

The first impression was shock from the people inside the plane.

The lights of the object were well defined.

44

There was an orange light on top of it, green lights on the side, and the solid part of the object was dark.

Horrified passengers stared out the window and watched as the UFO flew dangerously close to the port wing.

46

I was looking through the window and I saw blue lights and orange lights passing very quickly, very close to the plane.

We heard the AA pilot saying that there was something flying parallel to them.

48

The controller said it couldn't be. They couldn't see anything.

49

The control tower then called us to ask if we didn't see anything.

We were 6,000 feet above the AA flight and paying attention to its communication.

We told the controller that we couldn't see anything.

52

Just after that, we heard the AA pilot say that the lights at the airport had gone out.

53

There was a general power cut throughout the city, which made us use the emergency services at the airport.

54

I told the control tower that we couldn't generate electricity anymore and that they should tell the plane to start an escape maneuver

55

because we couldn't keep even the emergency lights on properly.

The blackout forced Polanco to abort his landing.

57

He was ordered to circle until power could be restored.

As the streets were enveloped in darkness, the brightest source of light in the city was the UFO.

That night we had a big blackout. My husband and I went out to buy cigarettes.

When we went out, we saw that it was all dark. There wasn't anyone outside, not even cars on the streets.

Maria and Silvario Cabral were among the hundreds of Beralogia residents who reported seeing the UFO.

I was driving the car when my husband said with panic that there was something standing still above us.

I was pretty amazed to stare at something that wasn't normal.

The light was really powerful. When we decided to get out of the car, the light suddenly disappeared going east.

That means it went toward the airport. It went so quickly that it was impossible to follow with our eyes.

We were about to enter the airspace when we again heard the Arolinas Argentinas pilot asking for confirmation of the existence of another aircraft in the area.

The control tower denied it again. The controller said that the only aircraft close to him was mine.

69

Then we saw a small light 5,000 feet below our aircraft.

70

It was an amber and clear light blinking, which went by us at a speed of about 600 or 800 miles per hour.

71

This light flew horizontally, then suddenly it turned vertically and suddenly it was up above us.

72

We raised our eyes up to the window to see the light going up higher.

73

The control tower didn't confirm it, but the military confirmed that he could see the light as he saw our plane from a different position.

74

The lights at the runways on the airport were gone. We started our escape maneuver and I noticed that the crew started getting nervous.

People were very nervous. They didn't know what was happening, so everyone chatted inside and talked.

They were asking, wondering what was happening that we couldn't land.

77

We said we were making an escape maneuver because there was no electricity at the airport.

78

While we went up, the object to our right went up, forward toward the lake and went up at a 90 degree angle at incredible speed and waited for our turn at the lake.

Nobimos, all of a sudden, we saw nothing else. So we started looking toward our horizon and we saw the light just in front of us, standing still about 29 miles from us.

Polanco thought the UFO was moving away, but suddenly, there it was again, directly in front of it.

When we turned over the lake toward the airport, we saw the UFO again, waiting for us in our trajectory.

Once we finished our turn toward the airport, the UFO disappeared below us.

As soon as the UFO disappeared, the lights came back on.

I would like to know what it was. Since the light was flying in a very strange way, it didn't fly like a normal plane.

If there are answers, Polanco says he must find them because he believes there is something out

Some dogs can track the scent of a missing child or a wanted man.

And there is growing evidence that some dogs can save lives in yet another way. They can sniff out cancer.

They are sensing something that I can't see, and that's another clue.

Dermatologist Dr. Arman Cognata heard a report about a search dog that had sniffed out a body at the bottom of a lake.

The doctor who treats many patients with skin cancer wondered if a dog can pick up a scent through water, could they sniff out disease specifically cancer inside the human body?

Then a strange coincidence. In a British medical journal, this article about a dog credited with finding a belignant growth on its owner's leg.

Dr. Cognata brought the article and his hunches to Duane Pickle.

Duane, watch. Listen. Watch. Wait.

I said, I can train a dog to find anything that's different than a surrounding environment, and if indeed cancer is, then yes, we can train dogs to find it.

Duane has worked with dogs for 30 years, ate in the military and the rest in law enforcement.

115

00:11:32,000 --> 00:11:40,000

He initiated the Canine Unit of the Tallahassee Police Department, training and patrolling with dogs for drugs, bombs and to detect smuggling.

116

Duane Pickle knows dogs.

117

00:11:42,000 --> 00:11:49,000

The dogs' sensitivity to smell is 220 million times better than ours. They can see 10 times better than we can. They can hear 1,000 times better than we can.

118

The combination of three is why we use dogs. They're just phenomenal things that they can do.

119

And the best example of this phenomenal ability, says Duane, is his partner George, the pure-bred schnauzer and one of the most highly decorated dogs in the country.

I wanted a bomb dog that was more agile, more coordinated, and that's why I brought George home.

121

He has so much experience and so much indoctrination that throwing something new at him doesn't faze him. He enjoys doing that.

The first hurdle was to determine if cancer did, in fact, have a smell.

123

Dr. Cognetic gave Duane cancer cells taken from biopsies of patients with malignant melanoma.

124

Duane placed the cells in an airtight test tube and hid it from George.

125

00:12:32,000 --> 00:12:37,000

Finding cancer is the exact same thing as training a dog to find drugs or training a dog to find bombs.

126

He's already knows that when I give him a scent, he has to go and find it.

127

00:12:40,000 --> 00:12:43,000

Good. Okay. Very good.

128

00:12:43,000 --> 00:12:51,000

To determine if George was smelling the scent on the tube or the cancer inside, Duane built a scent box.

129

00:12:51,000 --> 00:13:00,000

He filled the holes with tubes and other medical supplies. Only one airtight compartment held the cancer cells. And George found it.

130

00:13:00,000 --> 00:13:02,000

Very good.

131

00:13:02,000 --> 00:13:18,000

Then we went to the Tallahassee Memorial Regional Medical Center and asked if they could sponsor the program and help us get approval for doing so through the American Medical Association and the Academy of Dermatology and the Ethics Committee,

and actually jump a lot of the hoops that had to be done in order to do this.

133

Nurse Kim Edwards had a very personal reason for volunteering for the next phase of testing.

My dad had melanoma as well as my grandmother had a basal cell cancer that removed a large portion of her left upper arm.

I have been having moles removed for the past six or seven years, probably a total of 20 moles that were questionable.

So Duane came up with a way to put band-aids to see if we could train the dog with a cancer cell

hidden in a band-aid.

Could you then put it on a patient and would the dog then be able to do a process and figure out where it was?

When we first did the first test and I came out and laid down, I wasn't really skeptical but I didn't know.

139

I was trying to come with an open mind and as George was walking around and came up on the first cell and hit it, it was like, oh gosh, he can do it.

140

This is potentially something that can save my life one day.

141

Good. Okay.

142

00:14:11,000 --> 00:14:15,000

That day did come for one of Duane's fellow officers.

143

Edward Messer was one of the participants in Duane's final testing phase.

144

00:14:19,000 --> 00:14:28,000

This time there were no cancer cells in the adhesive bandages, just bandages placed over suspicious moles and growths of medical center volunteers.

145

Edward had a growth on his back that had been biopsied, but the results were inconclusive.

146

00:14:34,000 --> 00:14:38,000

Would a schnauzer know when a pathologist did not?

147

00:14:38,000 --> 00:14:43,000

When I was laying there on the table and the dog was moving around, I said, what the heck am I doing here?

148

00:14:43,000 --> 00:14:47,000

This is silly.

149

00:14:47,000 --> 00:14:59,000

And of course you never know, you know, and that's something that you...

150

And the dog would go all the way around and when he hit the spot that he smelled that was the cancers, he put his paw on it and then sat down.

151

And after he did that, I said, well, maybe this Duane might have something there after all.

152

When the dog indicated on it and it proved to be melanoma, then that to me was amazing because now we've done something that's never been done before and that feels good.

How many lives he saved?

154

His record in the cancer thing is 99.7% out of 451 surgeries.

After the initial study, Duane began contacting other Tallahassee doctors, including Dr. Clifton Bailey, who specializes in diseases of the lung, asthma, emphysema and lung cancer.

I thought for a few minutes and I said, I'm sure, I'm sure that a dog can identify tumors of the lung that connect to the outside.

159

And if you think about it, it's really logical because if something looks different, it's probably made up differently.

And if it's made up differently, it's got a different smell.

161

Duane built a new scent box to hold adenine test tubes, one of which contained a filter that a lung cancer patient had breathed into.

162

Good boy, alright.

163

00:16:26,000 --> 00:16:30,000

It takes a real professional to do this because someone's life is at risk.

164

00:16:30,000 --> 00:16:34,000

This is a trained dog that's doing it on command.

165

So it takes a great deal of work, energy and effort.

166

It takes about 1200 hours of training dog to do this.

167

It may not be high tech, but the program is very high skill.

168

Duane's challenge now is to teach his training methods to more dogs and more dog trainers.

169

Very good.

170

Good girls.

171

I've lost several friends through cancer.

172

I've watched the agony that families and patients go through.

173

00:17:00,000 --> 00:17:07,000

And if there's any way that a canine and I could help in that, that's what I would like to see

done.

174

The project is not without its detractors.

175

00:17:10,000 --> 00:17:17,000

Many healthcare professionals see the dogs as impractical and less cost effective than mechanical detection devices.

176

00:17:17,000 --> 00:17:24,000

But Dr. Bailey believes that by studying how the dogs find the cancer may lead to new medical breakthroughs.

177

The first question is what is the dog smelling?

178

00:17:27,000 --> 00:17:34,000

Is the dog smelling an individual molecule, an individual chemical?

179

00:17:34,000 --> 00:17:39,000

Is the dog smelling a fixed recipe of volatile chemicals?

180

00:17:39,000 --> 00:17:47,000

To go further we need a more sophisticated scientific approach and we don't have it.

181

This is just another incident where dogs are really a part of our family.

182

It can save our lives because they have capabilities we don't have.

183

The doctors use as many tools and stuff as they can and to me this was possibly just another tool to be used.

184

Yeah, it's a dog, but it doesn't matter what the tool is.

185

It sounds a little strange to some people, but if you know dogs, if you work with them, then it doesn't matter.

186

You're talking about your life.

187

As promising as his initial study has been, Dwayne Pickle may not be able to take his research much further.

188

Dwayne's a dog trainer, not a medical researcher.

He needs guidance and funding to keep his cancer alert dog program alive.

190

But so far he has yet to find a mainstream scientific institution willing to help him continue his research.

I started the website mostly out of curiosity to find out what was common throughout the world regarding ghosts.

Bolin's website has been up and running for just over a year and already has received more than 14,000 first-person reports of haunting activity.

I tried to get a survey going then and research to try to find out how common this was.

But the logistics prevented that and what made it available was the internet.

202

And that's why I started the Ghost Links website so that I could reach out to the whole world.

203

Through his research, Bolin has discovered that there are four major ghost categories.

204

There are shadows, two-dimensional figures of the human form.

205

There are spheres of light or electricity.

There are also clouds, amorphous or figural.

And there is the classic three-dimensional ghost, usually translucent and monochromatic.

Bolin has also found that sighting spiked in June, July and September.

209

My research has been very, very worthwhile.

210

I plan on using the research, writing a book, incorporating a lot of these true stories,

plus the information about the different types of ghosts that these beings are real.

They're not some life videotape or life worths that's left over.
