the knowledge that would eventually lead him to the Russian space program.

I grew up a slight man. My health was never good.

I was even kicked out of the Russian military because I was too frail.

This one here is proof that he was discharged from the army for health reasons.

After I was discharged from the military, I worked for a newspaper as a reporter.

I started reading letters about the M-Triangle zone.

He found documents in the archives that one of the KGB agents started to write reports to his superiors

There were many UFO sightings, sudden insanity, and dangerous levels of radiation.

Wild feelings came over me, strange photos were taken, and many in the group fell ill.

For me, the M-Triangle story is good.

The M-Triangle changed my life. I am no longer slight. Now I am a cosmonaut.

The M-Triangle is an area considered to be a hotbed of UFO activity.

It is located in a remote area 600 miles east of Moscow in the Ural Mountains.

Eyewitnesses have reported strange craft, mysterious light phenomena, and encounters of the third kind with translucent beings.

There are even journals and books devoted to the ongoing sightings in the M-Triangle.

When Muhartov first wrote about it, I was skeptical.

79

It was too obvious that everyone who lived in the area saw all this extraterrestrial activity.

Many suggest that the area is high in mercury deposits, and this is causing hallucinations.

But could it be to the extent that people are seeing signs and letters in the sky? There must be something there.

Before our own sightings investigation at the M-Triangle, we stopped at the Commonwealth Euphological Center,

a government agency on the outskirts of Moscow dedicated to UFO research.

Each day we process 15 to 20 UFO reports at our offices, including those from the M-Triangle.

We know of the dangers of this zone, and that science has not been able to establish the truth about UFOs in the zone.

But that doesn't rule out the health hazards.

My advice to you is to get in and get out of that dangerous zone. It's just not safe.

Working in Russia was made more difficult by the lack of provisions we found available.

This is a typical grocery store in Russia during business hours,

90

a grim reminder of the upheaval still going on in the New Republics.

There may be a free market now, but red cabbage is still too expensive for most shoppers.

92

The harsh conditions bear silent witness to the character of the Russian people who endure this hardship on a daily basis.

93

After a two-and-a-half-hour jet flight into the Ural Mountains, the research team flew an additional 90 minutes by helicopter.

We agreed to comply with the government's request that we remain in the M-Triangle for 24 hours only.

The government warned us of dangers there. People who'd reportedly gone mad,

96

lost their eyesight, or disappeared completely.

We first landed in a small village just outside the M-Triangle to see if we could find eyewitnesses

98

to the bizarre phenomena in the region. What we found was a village out of the 1890s

99

with people who told stories right out of Star Wars.

I was walking my grandmother home when we both saw a red flash coming from that zone.

Mysterious things that fly in the sky here are common. I don't even listen anymore to such old news.

I've seen the saucers numerous times. To say that they are nonsense is nonsense. We know what we see.

We found no one who had been adversely affected by the reported paranormal activity.

We then proceeded on the final leg of our journey into the M-Triangle,

I've written a book about the zone because there have been so many strange experiences here

109

by believers and skeptics alike.

In our tent, one group saw translucent fireballs that chased them into the woods and burned them seriously.

111

Only 17 meters from here a glowing object stunned a research group, one of them in later committed suicide.

112

We often see groups of UFOs fly past this field. Sometimes they disappear, sometimes they land and leave radiation.

113

The UFOs cited here have yet to be fully explained.

114

The strange light phenomena, however, are thought to be the result of geomagnetic anomalies evident in the area

115

known to scientists as lightning balls.

116

We've used very sensitive equipment that measures and reacts to electricity in a battery from as far as 100 meters.

117

But the same piece of measuring equipment wouldn't react to those energetic balls that we've observed.

118

Therefore, we conclude that the energy is not of an electromagnetic nature.

The light phenomena are best seen at night. Our investigative team brought special night vision cameras,

120

and after several hours they photographed what can only be described as startling.

George, should we see a satellite? What do you think that was?

No, satellites cannot do this light.

What was it?

I don't know. It cannot do the trajectories like this in the sky like this, like this.

The strange streak of light never reappeared. A frame by frame analysis offers more detail,

but gives little insight into its origin. It may have been a shooting star or a satellite.

However, there is little debate among the Russian UFO community that something beyond rational explanation is occurring in this remote region.

Most of the people we talked with in Russia believe UFOs are operating in the M Triangle.

However, off the record, a few scientists offered another possibility.

133

They suggest that eyewitnesses in the M Triangle may have actually seen something that wasn't really there

135

because they were unwitting participants in a top secret military experiment.

Coming up, our ghost investigators uncover an apparition haunting Whitechapel London.

It was just something I couldn't explain, but it was frightening.

Was she a victim of Jack the Ripper?

The Ten Bells has been a favorite meeting place in London's Whitechapel district since 1754, and for the past 100 years, it has also been a favorite haunt for ghostly apparitions, spotted by owners and customers alike.

It was just something I couldn't explain, but it was frightening.

147

00:13:46,500 --> 00:13:48,500

Haunting is a form of communication.

148

00:13:48,500 --> 00:14:01,500

We first brought our investigation into the pub's dank cellar, where many people have experienced haunting phenomena and apparitions. Siding's asked renowned psychic investigator Marion Dapier-Jeans to record her impressions at the Ten Bells.

149

There's quite, if you like, a bit of a tragic sort of place, but spirit are definitely in here.

150

00:14:09,500 --> 00:14:16,500

This is the door that we can hear banging during the night, and you can only get a funny feeling of presence.

151

And I know that spirit have showed himself to landlords who've been here.

152

On a number of occasions we heard footsteps. We come upstairs here and we find nothing.

153

And this whole totally, completely disted, whole atmosphere here is very disturbing, if you like.

About five months ago, I was here managing the bar. After about eight or nine days here, I went down to the cellar.

When I got down to the bottom of the stairs, I went over to the right.

156

Very briefly, I got a glimpse of a woman in sort of old-style clothes.

157

I think she comes to what is known as the old grounds where she might have been, where she might have existed.

158

It gave me just as much of fright, you know, really frightened, I've got to be honest.

159

I would say she's from about 1856, 1860, whatever is around that era I'm in.

160

She's been spotted downstairs on numerous occasions by previous managers.

161

I still feel that there was a murder committed, but again, you know, I'm not quite sure who did the murder or why the murder was taking shape or place.

162

This place was used to be frequently used by the ladies of the night going back to Jack the Ripper's time.

163

A young lady five foot too tall, she said, lives.

164

It's been proved that Elizabeth Stride did drink here.

165

00:15:47,500 --> 00:15:52,500

Marion had provided an important clue to the identity of at least one apparition, the name lives.

166

00:15:52,500 --> 00:15:58,500

And indeed, Elizabeth Stride, a prostitute, was a frequent customer here in the late 1800s.

167

On September 30th, 1888, Stride, known as Long Liz, was the third victim of Jack the Ripper.

168

Could it be her restless spirit that haunts the ten bells today?

169

Our psychic investigator believes so, but we also called in scientific investigator Tony Cornell for his opinion.

170

I mean, people in poltergeist cases and hauntings, they see things and hear things.

171

00:16:22,500 --> 00:16:27,500

It's okay for them. It's real to them, but for us, for it to be real to us, we want it on film.

172

We set out to try to film the haunting phenomena, but our camera operator was stymied.

173

As we came into this little room we are in now, the recording fault in the viewfinder was going berserk, is the best way to describe it.

174

And so we've now come in here again to play it back and just started up.

175

And yes, it's still showing strangely in the viewfinder.

176

Psychic investigator Nella Jones has worked with Scotland Yard on a number of cases.

177

We asked her to walk through Whitechapel to see if she felt a psychic connection between the hauntings and Jack the Ripper.

178

00:17:05,500 --> 00:17:10,500

We also brought in Don Rumbolo, Ripper historian and the owner of one of the alleged murder weapons.

179

00:17:11,500 --> 00:17:16,500

I'm pleased to have possession of it, but I don't know about Proud. I mean, it's such a macabre weapon.

180

00:17:16,500 --> 00:17:20,500

This is definitely the place. I would stake my reputation on that.

181

00:17:21,500 --> 00:17:28,500

It has a thumb grip on the blade for cutting upwards. This is how you can tell that it's different from other knives of the period.

182

00:17:29,500 --> 00:17:39,500

Well, if Nella felt something here, there's a very good reason for it, because this is where the body of the first of Jack the Ripper's victims was found on the night of the 31st of August, 1888.

183

00:17:39,500 --> 00:17:46,500

Claiming no knowledge of where the murders had occurred, Nella led us to this site but would not work with Rumbolo's knife.

184

00:17:47,500 --> 00:17:56,500

Take it back please. I don't want to know. I don't know about that. If they could feel what I feel when I touch that, they wouldn't even want to look at it.

185

00:17:57,500 --> 00:18:02,500

Documents, letters at the time, contemporary memoirs. This is evidence.

186

00:18:03,500 --> 00:18:07,500

Using a psychic is not proof.

187

00:18:08,500 --> 00:18:10,500

What's new in this case is really what's old.

188

00:18:11,500 --> 00:18:16,500

It was author and historian Paul Bay, who was finally able to shed some new light on this dark subject.

189

31st of September, 1888 was the night of the double event when Jack the Ripper killed two women within an hour. The first of those murders took place along this street.

190

00:18:25,500 --> 00:18:28,500

In fact, a street not far from the Ten Bells pub.

191

00:18:28,500 --> 00:18:33,500

It's an interesting case because it's the one instance where we probably have a witness to Jack the Ripper in action.

192

00:18:34,500 --> 00:18:42,500

A man named Israel Schwartz was walking down the road. In front of him was another man and ahead of both of them standing in the entrance to a yard was a woman.

193

00:18:43,500 --> 00:18:49,500

And as the second man approached, he attacked and assaulted the woman and threw her to the ground.

194

00:18:50,500 --> 00:19:01,500

Israel Schwartz probably saw Jack the Ripper committing his crime, murdering Elizabeth Stride, who was found dead in the alleyway about 15 minutes later.

195

00:19:02,500 --> 00:19:07,500

Because there was a witness, the murder of Elizabeth Stride was key to Scotland Yards investigation.

196

00:19:08,500 --> 00:19:12,500

The most important piece of information that's come to light in the last couple of years is what we call the Swanson Marginalia.

197

These notes were written by a man called Swanson who had overall responsibility for the investigation of the crimes.

198

And in those penciled notes, he names Jack the Ripper.

199

He says that the Ripper was a man called Kosminski.

200

00:19:26,500 --> 00:19:33,500

If the police at the time were right, and if we've understood the information that we've got correctly, Aaron Kosminski was Jack the Ripper.

201

Our ghost investigation at the Ten Bells, near the site of Elizabeth Stride's murder, poses intriguing new questions about the identity of Jack the Ripper.

202

Foremost, he's the ghost of Long Liz trying to communicate some important clues.

203

Is she trying to add her voice to those who believe Eric Kosminski is the bloody murderer known as Jack the Ripper?

And if police believed Kosminski was the Ripper, why wasn't he arrested?

Now, because Aaron Kosminski had never been tried, had never been convicted, they were not able to release that information to the public.
