but there's no physical evidence and I'm going

to be working on since I live here now and

spent two or three months sitting in the library

oh that's a satellite you know you see them

whatever um I really enjoyed looking over

86

say it's there this that this that um how did you personally triangulate or find the

87

actual crash site I'd love to hear how that process went okay so it's it's well noted

as to where it is now it's it's documented fairly well however back when I started uh

89

it wasn't well documented as to its location so what I did was I um I watched um I watched

digs that were out there and I read the documents that were related to that and they didn't

in there uh some aerial photographs and uh so being a geologist and knowing how to look

at aerial images and such uh what I did was I call it back Engineering in fact this picture

that you're seeing right here uh which actually helps a lot that was one of the pictures that

I originally saw and I took that image and it took me a day or two to sort of triangulate

where it was out there and then I had it um once I zoomed in with Google Earth is a marvelous

piece of uh research material but I was able to zoom in on the site and find the exact

location and then the researchers like Don Schmidt verified it uh for me that I was actually

100

in the right place so um that that was the hard part it didn't take me long to find it

of course and I compared the 1946 images with the 1954. I couldn't get anything uh after

47 other than the 54. so the uh comparing the two images side by side uh led me to believe

that there was definitely some disturbances out there and it was worth taking a look and

sort of honed in on the specific area because of what was showing up in the pictures this

image right here is from 1954. it's the first aerial photo I could find of this area after

117

1947. there's something that I kind of honed in on in this picture pretty fast and you'll

118

notice this white area right here there are a series of steps can you see the little white

119

steps the little steps I refer to them as Dozer tracks it looks like the sharp edges

120

of where bulldozers have come in and sort of scrape the land the military was cleaning

the area up and they were very systematic
now if you come over here on the 1946 picture

122

that line is gone so this has been changed
between them the damage that was done to the

123

area happened after 46. now what happened
to the land between 1946 and 1954. I have

124

actually found metallic artifacts within this
area and along the edges of those Dozer tracks

small pieces of material those are those are
easy to do when you can compare and sort of

126

Flash the images back and forth same resolution
same same size pictures it's kind of like

127

they do to find planets up in the new planets
that's the way they used to do it you could

128

Flash the images very quickly and watch for
very subtle changes and movements on the film

and that's exactly what I did with this right
right and then the other interesting thing

you showed us was this state-of-the-art augmented

was stunned when I saw this thing I think

the sandbox is is absolutely amazing because

on top of it and uh draw in the sand and have

was I built uh the crash site in the sandbox

call it the the fur or the skid marks that

it left and that's it it's a fun tool I use
it in my classroom for uh basically uh topography

and geology related things and it gives the
students uh they they go crazy when they see

you know for me at least and you can see the

UFO um yeah you know the green Direction yeah the greens and the Browns are uh are of course

Higher Ground and then that light blue was is the lower lower terrain um so it makes

it really easy to sort of highlight and show people what's going on so what I used to teach

a school with here it's called an augmented reality sandbox and this is a nice digital

representation of the crash site and you can make it rain simply by holding your hand over

the top of it like this you can make it rain so you can actually get a picture of how the

water actually rolls off the land and where it accumulates which is what I use to help

locate some of the the artifacts so utilizing this can you explain the crash site to us

oh absolutely the odd it came in out out this way and it came in this direction and it made

what's referred to as a Furrow it's spread out kind of in a v-shape and then according

to the eyewitness accounts there was also a gouge Mark and it's kind of an interesting

thing because the metal artifacts that I have found seem to be centered right on the area

where the gouge Mark is how big was this crash site this area is probably maybe uh twice

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00:16:11,190 --> 00:16:18,610

the size of a football field but the debris was scattered for a distance of more than

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00:16:18,610 --> 00:16:26,830

half a mile so okay so you use this um you find what you believe is the site um you go

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00:16:26,830 --> 00:16:32,329

out there so that's where um I think a lot of people out there want to know what did

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00:16:32,329 --> 00:16:37,660

you go out there with what sort of instruments or tools did you use to start looking for

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00:16:37,660 --> 00:16:43,529

uh wreckage for debris that might have been left behind uh yeah give us an idea of what

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00:16:43,529 --> 00:16:49,820

was kind of year no Arsenal yeah my arsenal of tools of course it was the the the uh the

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00:16:49,820 --> 00:16:53,980

maps but I went out and in fact this is the location right here it's just just in the

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00:16:53,980 --> 00:17:02,170

background behind me um I went out with a Fisher gold bug metal detector uh it can find

it was an older one I still use it the thing is amazing was like the either I think it

was like the second gold bug that ever came out uh that thing is so uh powerful and so

sensitive that it can detect a BB size gold nugget down to about three inches and I used

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00:17:19,140 --> 00:17:24,670

it I used that exact same metal detector in Arizona and also here in Arizona to find uh

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00:17:24,670 --> 00:17:31,190

thousands of dollars worth of gold nuggets uh so I'm very good at using it and so I took

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00:17:31,190 --> 00:17:37,070

that out there and I started sweeping all of the runoff areas um in fact you can see

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00:17:37,070 --> 00:17:42,070

one of the runoff areas directly behind me in this image so I started sweeping the area

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00:17:42,070 --> 00:17:47,900

with uh with a metal detector and I got news for you I was out there for a good solid six

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00:17:47,900 --> 00:17:53,440

or eight hours swinging that metal detector
and didn't find a thing until the end of the

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00:17:53,440 --> 00:17:59,350

day and then I got this beep in my headset
because I'm wearing a headset at the time

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00:17:59,350 --> 00:18:05,520

and got pretty excited I was in an ant hill
so I uh I I dug down about an inch into the

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00:18:05,520 --> 00:18:10,549

ant hill and here was this tiny little piece
of metal and the scary part about it is I

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00:18:10,549 --> 00:18:16,640

when I held the piece in my hand I'm going
oh my gosh is this a piece of an alien spacecraft

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00:18:16,640 --> 00:18:21,970

it was so lightweight it blew it out of my
hand and then I had to go and spend another

three four minutes trying to find where it
had hit the ground um that that's a true story

um so um that was the first fine but it was
not easy like I said it took a God uh six

and I didn't find anything during that time

so my arm was about ready to break off and
uh it was uh getting towards the sun was going

down I didn't I'm very persistent very tenacious
when it comes to looking for things because

I I knew something was there and then I found
that piece um and that's what started I named

it a H1 stands for ant hill one and uh that's
what started all of this the whole thing because

it's when I found the buttons um um was following

a long time ago uh but I found the buttons

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00:19:17,960 --> 00:19:24,270

that's that's them right there and uh in these
pictures so the military buttons uh were found

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00:19:24,270 --> 00:19:28,730

and there was three of them spaced a couple
of feet apart uh they have been identified

as uh basically military fatigue buttons dating
somewhere between like the late 40s early

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00:19:36,430 --> 00:19:41,049

50s so I know they were out there this stuff
was buried three four inches deep in hard

pack clay uh so they were old really really
old um and these are cool I think this is

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00:19:48,170 --> 00:19:52,820

probably one of the coolest things that that
I found which is you know if you want to think

we weren't out there because these buttons

of them out there so they were on their hands

think they had an orgy out there ripping the

buttons off but yeah they were there's definitely
military buttons so they were found out there

196

right well and the big thing about this too
is I I was I was stunned when you showed me

197

these buttons and you were able to you know
get them analyzed that they do date back to

198

when the actual crash happened I think a lot
of people's question is well they they got

199

00:20:34,750 --> 00:20:39,059

everything they recovered everything and these
things you know they they would have they

200

00:20:39,059 --> 00:20:43,630

would have found everything out there and
cleared it but I mean come on for anyone to

201

00:20:43,630 --> 00:20:50,190

believe that they got every single tiny piece
that was out there um it makes perfect sense

202

especially when you said these these Military
Officers sent out there to clean up the debris

203

site uh were on their hands and knees it's
very possible so a button or two popped off

204

and they'd never noticed um the other big
thing is you said that they were found you

205

00:21:07,210 --> 00:21:11,679

know below the surface and this would make
perfect sense since so much time has passed

206

right deep you know what I don't know whether
anyone has ever seen I and I'm sure lots of

207

00:21:17,131 --> 00:21:22,809

people have seen pictures of aircraft uh crash
sites uh the debris is scattered everywhere

208

uh and it makes a uh it makes it makes a mess
and the the pieces yeah some of the pieces

209

are really big but some of the pieces are
so tiny uh that they're gonna get buried and

210

00:21:33,970 --> 00:21:39,220

you have to understand that back in July of
1947 that was it was raining it was storming

211

00:21:39,220 --> 00:21:46,490

um stuff could have been washed down animal
Burrows uh carried down uh carried down slope

212

00:21:46,490 --> 00:21:53,590

washed into the little gullies covered up
by Gophers um all kinds of things can happen

213

and so the idea of the military finding every
scrap I think is is kind of bogus uh they

214

00:22:01,179 --> 00:22:09,330

could not have found every scrap um so I've
been to other types of like super secret sensitive

215

well not really secret but uh things that
were military origin one of them was the um

216

00:22:15,580 --> 00:22:21,929

outside of Albuquerque there was a broken

this one to me is interesting it's it looks

like it's almost curled back it's bent when

422

that they they usually end up being small pieces with Jagged edges or the edges might

barium is very heavy but barium is also a byproduct of nuclear testing and uh the interesting

thing is uh several of the samples had a relatively High barium content and the cool
