Oh, my God.

183

00:07:32,000 --> 00:07:34,000

They're always having cuts in them.

184

00:07:34,000 --> 00:07:36,000

Well, the cows were always

185

00:07:36,000 --> 00:07:38,000

opened up like that.

186

00:07:38,000 --> 00:07:40,000

And they always had a mark on the rib cage.

187

00:07:40,000 --> 00:07:42,000

Triangle.

188

00:07:42,000 --> 00:07:44,000

8x8.

189

00:07:44,000 --> 00:07:46,000

It looked like that old model paint.

190

00:07:46,000 --> 00:07:48,000

Real viscous and thick.

191

00:07:48,000 --> 00:07:50,000

Wasn't applied with the brush or anything.

192

00:07:50,000 --> 00:07:52,000

It looked like it was poured.

193

00:07:52,000 --> 00:07:54,000

And every buffalo, bull buffalo,

194

00:07:54,000 --> 00:07:56,000

had that triangle on its forehead.

195

00:07:56,000 --> 00:07:58,000

Every one of them.

196

00:07:58,000 --> 00:08:00,000

Maybe the seventh year into that,

197

00:08:00,000 --> 00:08:02,000

we had some professors show up from Michigan.

198

They took necropsy samples,

199

00:08:04,000 --> 00:08:06,000

paint samples.

200

00:08:06,000 --> 00:08:08,000

I call it paint.

201

Came back, they couldn't identify it.

No petroleum, no oil, no dyes.

203

205

On the floors,

212

this six foot long hump, this high

213

burlap bag.

214

What is that?

215

00:08:42,000 --> 00:08:44,000

Oh my...

216

00:08:44,000 --> 00:08:46,000

Is that a body?

217

Brother, we just stepped through the gates of hell.

I took a closer look at that head

225

and that hog had the same turn.

No, no, no, no, no, no.

227

Same color.

228

00:09:16,000 --> 00:09:18,000

Same fluid.

229

00:09:18,000 --> 00:09:20,000

30 years.

230

00:09:20,000 --> 00:09:22,000

Since I've seen that,

231

00:09:22,000 --> 00:09:24,000

it's like those sons of bitches

232

00:09:24,000 --> 00:09:26,000

followed me down here.

233

00:09:26,000 --> 00:09:28,000

What Jeff found in that barn

234

00:09:28,000 --> 00:09:30,000

was the same triangle

235

00:09:30,000 --> 00:09:32,000

on that hog's head

236

00:09:32,000 --> 00:09:34,000

that he saw all those years ago

237

00:09:34,000 --> 00:09:36,000

and all those other buffalo.

238

00:09:36,000 --> 00:09:38,000

And when you start thinking about all that

239

that weighed on him for 30 years,

240

00:09:40,000 --> 00:09:42,000

I don't know how the man ever slept.

241

I guess my question to you now

242

is where we go from here.

243

Well, that weed field,

244

00:09:48,000 --> 00:09:50,000

all the shit that's happened out there.

245

Boys, I don't think we got any business

246

00:09:52,000 --> 00:09:54,000

being in there tonight.

247

00:09:54,000 --> 00:09:56,000

Killing field.

248

00:09:56,000 --> 00:09:58,000

Killing field. Mutilated deer.

249

00:10:00,000 --> 00:10:02,000

What in the heck is this?

250

00:10:02,000 --> 00:10:04,000

Found your damn horse.

251

00:10:04,000 --> 00:10:06,000

The field we're handling got dragged?

252

00:10:06,000 --> 00:10:08,000

Yeah.

253

00:10:08,000 --> 00:10:10,000

How the fuck did you?

254

00:10:10,000 --> 00:10:12,000

I got, he cut and bailed that field.

255

00:10:14,000 --> 00:10:16,000

Put it in a stackyard about two miles from here.

256

00:10:16,000 --> 00:10:18,000

That son of a bitch burnt to the ground.

257

00:10:20,000 --> 00:10:22,000

What's the hang on the shit with me?

258

00:10:22,000 --> 00:10:24,000

The whole stackyard.

259

00:10:24,000 --> 00:10:26,000

Burnt to a christian.

260

00:10:26,000 --> 00:10:28,000

The field was massive.

261

00:10:28,000 --> 00:10:30,000

There's no telling how much hay was there.

262

00:10:30,000 --> 00:10:32,000

A couple hundred towns, I'm guessing.

263

00:10:32,000 --> 00:10:34,000

You say how it happened?

264

00:10:34,000 --> 00:10:36,000

I don't know.

265

00:10:36,000 --> 00:10:38,000

And I wouldn't believe for a main dollar

266

it was quits.

267

00:10:40,000 --> 00:10:42,000

We need to find out how that same harvested field

268

00:10:42,000 --> 00:10:44,000

once it was bailed

269

00:10:44,000 --> 00:10:46,000

that fire burned to the ground.

270

00:10:46,000 --> 00:10:48,000

There's gotta be a connection.

271

00:10:48,000 --> 00:10:50,000

The minute I saw that triangle on that pig's head

272

00:10:50,000 --> 00:10:54,000

nothing's a coincidence that we've done so far.

273

The next day, the team meets with the fire marshal.

274

00:10:59,000 --> 00:11:01,000

Must be Brad.

275

To learn more information on the mysterious fire

276

00:11:04,000 --> 00:11:07,000

that destroyed the harvest from the wheat field.

277

00:11:07,000 --> 00:11:09,000

You guys want to come on in?

278

00:11:09,000 --> 00:11:12,000

I've been in the fire service for 24 years.

279

00:11:12,000 --> 00:11:14,000

Been investigating fires for over 6 years.

280

00:11:14,000 --> 00:11:17,000

I'd have to say this is the strangest

281

00:11:17,000 --> 00:11:20,000

unexplainable fire that I've ever investigated.

282

00:11:20,000 --> 00:11:22,000

Let me show you guys some pictures.

283

00:11:26,000 --> 00:11:30,000

This is what 150 tons of hay looks like.

284

00:11:30,000 --> 00:11:32,000

Holy crap.

285

00:11:32,000 --> 00:11:34,000

When you look at these photos it just gives you a feel

286

00:11:34,000 --> 00:11:36,000

of how big this fire was.

287

00:11:36,000 --> 00:11:38,000

Ever seen that before? Oh my gosh.

288

00:11:38,000 --> 00:11:41,000

150 tons of wheat hay.

289

00:11:41,000 --> 00:11:43,000

It's just unbelievable.

290

00:11:43,000 --> 00:11:45,000

So this is one of the earliest videos

291

00:11:45,000 --> 00:11:48,000

that one of my firefighters was able to obtain from the fire.

292

00:11:48,000 --> 00:11:50,000

Well it's rolling here.

293

00:11:50,000 --> 00:11:52,000

It is rolling.

294

00:11:52,000 --> 00:11:54,000

It is a hot damn fire.

295

00:11:54,000 --> 00:11:56,000

The whole stack's on fire.

296

00:11:56,000 --> 00:11:58,000

The whole stack on fire.

297

00:11:58,000 --> 00:12:00,000

You think somebody set that fire?

298

00:12:00,000 --> 00:12:02,000

You know I don't think somebody sets fire.

299

00:12:02,000 --> 00:12:04,000

That's one of the things I do in my investigation

300

00:12:04,000 --> 00:12:08,000

is I'll look for evidence of arson.

301

00:12:08,000 --> 00:12:10,000

Didn't pick up anything.

302

00:12:10,000 --> 00:12:12,000

So we can roll that out.

303

00:12:12,000 --> 00:12:14,000

Yeah, we can roll that out.

304

00:12:14,000 --> 00:12:16,000

Awful coincidental to have the same wheat field

305

00:12:16,000 --> 00:12:18,000

that we just got done walking through.

306

We nearly lose Hadley in.

307

00:12:23,000 --> 00:12:25,000

Hadley, son of a bitch!

308

00:12:25,000 --> 00:12:27,000

Ends up being the same field that burns to the ground

309

00:12:27,000 --> 00:12:29,000

once it gets bailed.

310

00:12:31,000 --> 00:12:33,000

Fire Marshal Brad then reveals

311

00:12:33,000 --> 00:12:36,000

a strange finding of his investigation.

312

00:12:36,000 --> 00:12:38,000

When I went out there and did my investigation

313

00:12:38,000 --> 00:12:41,000

I found two separate locations

314

00:12:41,000 --> 00:12:43,000

of where lightning had hit.

315

00:12:43,000 --> 00:12:45,000

Is that common?

316

00:12:45,000 --> 00:12:47,000

Very uncommon. Never heard of it.

317

00:12:47,000 --> 00:12:50,000

Yeah, so it burned from both ends together.

318

00:12:50,000 --> 00:12:54,000

Right here at this site is where I found the first strike was.

319

When I went out there and did my investigation

328

I found two separate locations

329

of where lightning had hit.

330

00:13:30,000 --> 00:13:32,000

So whenever lightning comes down

331

00:13:32,000 --> 00:13:35,000

does it just strike one place or can it split like that?

332

00:13:35,000 --> 00:13:39,000

It does not ever split and hit two spots like that.

333

00:13:39,000 --> 00:13:42,000

Brad told us there was two strikes.

334

00:13:42,000 --> 00:13:44,000

He's got no answers and I can't believe

335

00:13:44,000 --> 00:13:47,000

two bolts would strike at the end of a stack like that.

336

00:13:49,000 --> 00:13:50,000

Amazing.

337

00:13:50,000 --> 00:13:54,000

So the other odd thing was is I pulled up a lightning map

338

00:13:54,000 --> 00:13:55,000

every time I have a fire.

339

00:13:55,000 --> 00:13:57,000

It tells us where lightning strikes

340

00:13:57,000 --> 00:13:59,000

for that day, for that time of the fire.

341

00:13:59,000 --> 00:14:02,000

There was not a single strike within 10 miles of that.

342

00:14:02,000 --> 00:14:04,000

Ain't this supposed to be pretty accurate?

343

00:14:04,000 --> 00:14:06,000

They're very accurate.

344

00:14:06,000 --> 00:14:08,000

Well that's just one more thing to go

345

00:14:08,000 --> 00:14:10,000

with everything else that doesn't make sense.

346

00:14:10,000 --> 00:14:13,000

Because that means we've now found a crop circle.

347

00:14:15,000 --> 00:14:17,000

There was dead deer at the edges of it

348

00:14:17,000 --> 00:14:18,000

with their ears slicked off.

349

00:14:18,000 --> 00:14:19,000

I'm not f***ing kidding.

350

00:14:19,000 --> 00:14:20,000

Oh.

351

00:14:20,000 --> 00:14:21,000

What?

352

00:14:21,000 --> 00:14:22,000

Bang.

353

00:14:23,000 --> 00:14:25,000

And then lightning turns around

354

00:14:25,000 --> 00:14:27,000

and hits his pile after he bells it.

355

00:14:28,000 --> 00:14:29,000

Same one, same one.

356

00:14:29,000 --> 00:14:32,000

And it ain't recorded on the freaking lightning strike map.

357

00:14:32,000 --> 00:14:34,000

Can you explain that?

358

I can't explain that now.

359

Doesn't matter.

360

00:14:36,000 --> 00:14:37,000

Doesn't matter.

And there's more than that.

362

We had some sounds, I wouldn't there,

363

but they can't even describe the sounds.

364

It was not really...

365

It really peaked our interest.

366

So my guys that were staying out there that night

want to play something for you guys

that they recorded out there.

See what you guys think.

That is...

Oh man.

That's what you heard in that field.

Where's that coming from?

386

the team then heads out with the fire.

387

The team then heads out with the fire marshal

388

to examine the site of the blaze.

389

Here's the location of the first strike.

390

00:15:39,000 --> 00:15:40,000

Oh man.

391

00:15:40,000 --> 00:15:41,000

That's called a fulgurite.

392

00:15:41,000 --> 00:15:42,000

Fulgurite.

393

00:15:42,000 --> 00:15:45,000

Yeah, that's where the lightning hits the earth.

394

00:15:45,000 --> 00:15:48,000

It melts all the dirt, rock, whatever is down in there

395

00:15:48,000 --> 00:15:49,000

all together.

396

00:15:49,000 --> 00:15:52,000

It makes like a glass crystal.

397

00:15:54,000 --> 00:15:56,000

That's the biggest one I've ever seen.

398

00:15:56,000 --> 00:15:58,000

I've collected a dozen of those over the years.

399

00:15:58,000 --> 00:16:01,000

We're going to go look at where the second lightning bolt struck.

400

00:16:01,000 --> 00:16:03,000

The biggest thing is.

401

Everybody's heard the lightning don't strike twice in the same place,

402

but this stack yard, it contradicts that.

403

This is where the second hit is.

404

Nothing natural about this.

405

So the flags what they do is they help me visualize the direction

406

of which way the fire went.

407

00:16:18,000 --> 00:16:20,000

So I hit there where the white flag is

408

00:16:20,000 --> 00:16:24,000

and traveled faster that way than it did towards this way.

409

00:16:24,000 --> 00:16:25,000

Now wait a minute.

410

00:16:25,000 --> 00:16:27,000

When we were down there, you said that wind was coming out of the

411

00:16:27,000 --> 00:16:29,000

southwest pushing the fire this way.

412

00:16:29,000 --> 00:16:32,000

And this one, the fire went down.

413

00:16:32,000 --> 00:16:34,000

Pushed in the opposite direction.

414

00:16:34,000 --> 00:16:36,000

What's up with that?

415

00:16:36,000 --> 00:16:38,000

Unexplainable.

416

00:16:38,000 --> 00:16:40,000

It burned against the wind?

417

00:16:40,000 --> 00:16:41,000

Yeah.

418

00:16:41,000 --> 00:16:43,000

Instead of going on that direction is what you're saying.

419

00:16:43,000 --> 00:16:45,000

This field should be burned.

420

00:16:45,000 --> 00:16:48,000

You got that film still at your firefighter shop?

421

00:16:48,000 --> 00:16:49,000

Oh, the sounds?

422

00:16:49,000 --> 00:16:50,000

Yeah.

423

00:16:50,000 --> 00:16:51,000

Sure, we can show you that.

424

00:16:51,000 --> 00:16:54,000

So if you watch it, they were actually right here on this road.

425

00:16:55,000 --> 00:17:05,000

So your noises are popping off according to this right over there.

426

00:17:05,000 --> 00:17:07,000

That's where we need to go have a hunt.

427

Yeah, let's go down there.

428

Can't.

429

00:17:11,000 --> 00:17:12,000

We can't?

430

00:17:12,000 --> 00:17:14,000

It's tribal property.

431

Yeah, it's tribal property.

432

00:17:16,000 --> 00:17:17,000

That's native ground.

433

00:17:17,000 --> 00:17:19,000

We're not going tromping through that.

434

00:17:19,000 --> 00:17:21,000

So that's got us dead in our tracks then.

435

Everything seems to be pointing to tribal land at this point.

436

But the problem is we don't have any permission to be over there.

437

Well, I know that's where we want to be.

And somehow we're going to have to figure out a way to get access over there.

That night.

We get a few things to look at here, guys.

441

Jeff gathers the team to fill them in on a revelation he's made.

442

We all know we need access to this tribal land, right?

443

Right, yes, sir.

444

Well, it's a little more critical than we imagined.

445

I'm going to show you something here.

446

First of all, this map shows tribal lands.

This is where that mountain lit up in that red glow at night.

453

Jesus.

454

00:18:10,000 --> 00:18:12,000

What the hell is that?

455

Right there.

456

00:18:13,000 --> 00:18:17,000

The south side of that mountain, tribal ground.

457

00:18:17,000 --> 00:18:19,000

Come over here.

458

00:18:19,000 --> 00:18:22,000

That's where we all heard that boom and roll and thunder sound.

459

00:18:22,000 --> 00:18:24,000

Oh, f***.

460

00:18:24,000 --> 00:18:26,000

My God.

That roll and thunder come across these flats right there.

462

Tribal ground again.

463

Come over here another quarter mile.

464

There's the stackyard to burn to the ground.

465

00:18:39,000 --> 00:18:42,000

Here's the crop circle field right there.

466

00:18:42,000 --> 00:18:45,000

There's the stone barn.

467

00:18:45,000 --> 00:18:47,000

The crater sits right there.

468

00:18:47,000 --> 00:18:51,000

Every damn bit of this tribal all the way around there.

469

00:18:51,000 --> 00:18:53,000

Ever since we've been out here in the thick of all this,

470

00:18:53,000 --> 00:18:55,000

I never really realized where we was at.

471

00:18:55,000 --> 00:18:56,000

We got to get on that.

472

Yeah.

473

It wasn't until Jeff laid a map out and dropped the hammer on us,

474

everything is happening right here on the tribal ground.

Until we can get over on that side,

476

we're never going to find the real answers.

We're working on access.

We don't have it yet, but there's a hell of a lot more to it

480

than the tribal land.

481

There's a crater.

482

00:19:17,000 --> 00:19:19,000

Steve's hearing the sounds at night out there

483

00:19:19,000 --> 00:19:21,000

coming from that crater.

484

00:19:23,000 --> 00:19:24,000

Wow.

485

00:19:24,000 --> 00:19:26,000

And it only happens at night.

486

00:19:26,000 --> 00:19:27,000

So what's that mean?

487

You guys got to go in there in the dark.

488

00:19:29,000 --> 00:19:30,000

Yeah.

489

00:19:30,000 --> 00:19:32,000

Here's some more bad news from Steve.

490

Well, I've got this and a couple of days later,

491

I had five cows go missing.

492

He's been counting cows at dusk and daylight.

493

He's missing four more head.

494

They're vanishing.

495

No blood trail, no gates down, no wire cut.

496

That's up to nine or 10.

497

I did volunteer again to go look for these cows.

498

Perfect.

Woo-hoo.

508

It's singing my song.

509

That night, the team splits up.

510

How the hell do you think these cattle are getting out?

511

Jeff Parker and Caleb search for signs of Rancher Steve's missing cattle.

512

If they come through here, they'd have been working down that fence line.

513

00:20:28,000 --> 00:20:32,000

Orah and Hadley head over to the crater to take soil samples.

514

00:20:34,000 --> 00:20:37,000

I'll be excited to know what we get with this guy or counter.

515

00:20:37,000 --> 00:20:39,000

And survivalist Josh.

516

00:20:39,000 --> 00:20:40,000

All right.

517

00:20:40,000 --> 00:20:41,000

By myself.

518

00:20:41,000 --> 00:20:46,000

Heads over to the abandoned barn to get a closer look at the mummified hog.

519

He wants to examine the mysterious trying Jeff found painted on the hog's head.

520

No, no, no, no.
