My name's Tom Warner.

The house I'm in now, we've been in for six generations.

My son's been in the sixth generation.

29

We've had the same very house since 1835.

I was the youngest of seven children.

31

A lot of things were happening back in 1969.

America is really changing rapidly.

33

Ten years old, you're changing too.

So we had been raised in more of a city environment.

47

As kids, we would spend a lot of time on the main street.

48

We were pretty wild.

49

00:04:47,440 --> 00:04:51,720

My sister and I had a friend that would steal cigarettes from her mom.

50

00:04:51,720 --> 00:04:55,560

So we wanted to go share a cigarette together that weekend.

51

00:04:55,560 --> 00:05:01,400

We did not want to get in a car with our parents and get ice cream.

52

00:05:01,400 --> 00:05:06,640

It was the last thing we wanted to do.

53

00:05:06,640 --> 00:05:10,840

I still to this day think about it, September 1st, 1969.

54

My whole life changed right here.

55

This was a moment that forever changed my life.

Something weird took place here.

57

We were a part of it.

Fifty years ago, man.

Fifty years ago.

It was like it was just yesterday.

61

It was just beyond dusk.

62

It was getting really dark.

When I was coming back from Stockbridge to Great Barrington,

There must be a lot of police cars up there.

70

Look at all the lights.

71

As I got closer, I couldn't even drive anymore because the lights were so bright.

I'd always go next door to the Shaw's and Debbie, who was Jane's sister, would always

I said stay in the lines.

And that's what she would do with him.

I've seen Tommy since the day he was brought home from the hospital.

And he starts chasing it.

158

My sister and I, we were like shaking.

159

00:12:12,760 --> 00:12:17,200

She said she doesn't remember anything after that.

160

00:12:17,200 --> 00:12:20,240

But I remember levitating.

161

00:12:20,240 --> 00:12:23,400

And then I remember being on a ship.

162

00:12:27,640 --> 00:12:34,600

I remember being laid out on it.

163

00:12:34,600 --> 00:12:36,720

That's when I saw Melanie.

164

00:12:36,720 --> 00:12:39,000

It was the only face I remember.

165

00:12:39,000 --> 00:12:42,040

She just was crouched to my right.

166

00:12:42,040 --> 00:12:44,920

I don't remember seeing him.

167

00:12:44,920 --> 00:12:48,480

But he said he remembers seeing my eyes.

168

00:12:48,480 --> 00:12:50,360

And then I was really scared.

169

00:12:50,360 --> 00:12:54,280

The look of, oh my god, fear.

170

00:12:54,280 --> 00:12:57,480

I was in a room with just young people.

171

00:12:57,480 --> 00:12:59,880

There were like children.

172

00:12:59,880 --> 00:13:03,240

And then they would just disappear one by one by one

173

00:13:03,240 --> 00:13:05,160

by one.

174

00:13:05,160 --> 00:13:11,480

And then I woke up and I was at the lake by myself.

175

00:13:11,480 --> 00:13:12,920

And then I had to walk home.

176

00:13:19,640 --> 00:13:23,120

The next thing I know, I'm being laid down at the other end

177

00:13:23,120 --> 00:13:24,960

of the property over here.

178

00:13:24,960 --> 00:13:28,520

And you can describe it as if you laid down a baby

179

00:13:28,520 --> 00:13:31,600

onto the ground.

180

00:13:31,600 --> 00:13:33,280

Just like that.

181

00:13:33,280 --> 00:13:36,880

And when I looked up, there was a beam on me.

182

00:13:36,880 --> 00:13:40,240

And with a beam on me, my brother was in back of me.

183

00:13:40,280 --> 00:13:42,840

And he said, run.

184

00:13:42,840 --> 00:13:44,640

And I couldn't run.

185

00:13:44,640 --> 00:13:46,160

I said, I can't.

186

00:13:46,160 --> 00:13:47,600

The beam's holding me on the ground.

187

And then mental lepathy said, I'll be done in a minute.

188

189

199

00:14:30,640 --> 00:14:33,080

When I met Tom for the first time,

200

00:14:33,080 --> 00:14:36,760

I felt an immediate connection to him.

201

00:14:36,760 --> 00:14:37,680

It was weird.

202

00:14:37,720 --> 00:14:40,760

It was very weird.

203

00:14:40,760 --> 00:14:42,960

Because I'd lived here my whole life,

204

00:14:42,960 --> 00:14:43,680

and I'd never really met him.

205

00:14:46,800 --> 00:14:48,800

And now I feel like he's a brother to me.

206

00:15:02,800 --> 00:15:06,800

On September 1, 1916, I was in the hospital.

207

00:15:06,800 --> 00:15:13,120

On September 1, 1969, I was riding in a horse show.

208

00:15:13,120 --> 00:15:14,880

It was a blistering hot day.

209

00:15:14,880 --> 00:15:15,480

I remember that.

210

00:15:15,480 --> 00:15:20,960

It was very hot, even, for that time of year.

211

00:15:20,960 --> 00:15:23,280

The saddle came loose, and I was holding on for dear life.

212

00:15:23,280 --> 00:15:26,680

And a few people came in to slow down the horse and stop it.

213

00:15:26,680 --> 00:15:29,800

And I had to run out and grab him.

214

00:15:29,800 --> 00:15:31,600

And at that point, she felt so thankful

215

00:15:31,600 --> 00:15:33,080

that I didn't get trampled or something.

216

00:15:33,080 --> 00:15:35,240

She could, you know what, let's go to dinner.

217

00:15:35,240 --> 00:15:37,240

And so we got to the diner.

218

And it was running late.

219

00:15:38,520 --> 00:15:41,600

It was almost 9 o'clock, and it was almost bedtime.

220

And so they decided to take the bridge, the shortcut home,

221

Now, as we started through the covered bridge,

223

00:16:00,600 --> 00:16:02,760

Thomas was in the back seat with Matthew,

224

00:16:02,760 --> 00:16:04,120

his younger brother.

225

00:16:04,120 --> 00:16:07,360

He loved those little, what we call, fireballs,

226

00:16:07,360 --> 00:16:08,440

hot brown things.

227

00:16:08,440 --> 00:16:10,400

And he was going to give one to Matthew.

228

00:16:10,400 --> 00:16:13,560

And my mother heard that, and she turned around, and she said,

229

00:16:13,560 --> 00:16:14,720

He could choke.

230

00:16:14,720 --> 00:16:15,600

Don't give that to him.

231

00:16:15,600 --> 00:16:16,960

He's too young.

232

00:16:16,960 --> 00:16:21,440

And when she turned around and facing the back of the station

233

00:16:21,440 --> 00:16:25,040

wagon, she noticed what looked like a light rising

234

00:16:25,040 --> 00:16:27,200

from the banks of the Housatonic River.

235

00:16:27,200 --> 00:16:39,200

And as we exited the bridge, I can remember this like yesterday.

236

00:16:39,200 --> 00:16:48,200

There was a light ball hovering, maybe about two stories high.

237

00:16:48,200 --> 00:16:49,560

We were amazed.

238

00:16:49,560 --> 00:16:51,520

I mean, we'd never seen anything like it.

239

00:16:51,520 --> 00:16:52,920

It was glowing.

240

00:16:53,920 --> 00:17:01,120

And then as it rose, it fired these rods of light.

241

00:17:01,120 --> 00:17:03,040

Everyone was focused on this thing.

242

00:17:03,040 --> 00:17:08,280

But for some reason, my brother's tend to look to the right.

243

00:17:08,280 --> 00:17:11,040

My brother saw this orange orb, and it

244

00:17:11,040 --> 00:17:13,960

seemed to have this roll to it, almost like something,

245

00:17:13,960 --> 00:17:16,160

like an ocean wave is the way he describes it,

246

00:17:16,160 --> 00:17:20,120

kind of like the inside of this thing was moving and turning.

247

00:17:20,120 --> 00:17:23,520

As we're rolling along, the atmosphere got really close.

248

00:17:23,520 --> 00:17:25,000

Everything was dead quiet.

249

00:17:25,000 --> 00:17:26,680

We felt like we were under water.

250

00:17:26,680 --> 00:17:29,480

We could feel like a pressure change.

251

00:17:29,480 --> 00:17:32,080

So my mother, she pulled off to the side of the road.

252

00:17:32,080 --> 00:17:32,960

Windows were open.

253

00:17:32,960 --> 00:17:34,680

It was about 90 degrees that night.

254

00:17:34,680 --> 00:17:37,480

We all started looking out the side of the car.

255

00:17:37,480 --> 00:17:38,280

Grandma was looking out.

256

00:17:38,280 --> 00:17:41,040

Everyone was looking at, where is this white sphere

257

00:17:41,040 --> 00:17:42,680

that we saw moments ago?

258

00:17:42,680 --> 00:17:45,880

And then soon, then bang, my mother notices this thing

259

00:17:45,880 --> 00:17:46,840

first in the sky.

260

00:17:46,840 --> 00:17:48,520

And she's like, my god, what is that?

261

00:17:50,920 --> 00:17:56,160

There was a disc-shaped object hovering there.

262

00:17:56,160 --> 00:17:59,200

It looked something like, if you ever took a turtle shell

263

00:17:59,200 --> 00:18:02,360

and turned it sideways and looked at it, it was like that.

264

00:18:02,360 --> 00:18:04,440

And then it was a little shorter under here,

265

00:18:04,440 --> 00:18:09,480

but in the middle, there was a different ridge to it.

266

00:18:09,480 --> 00:18:12,480

The craft itself, I would say that it

267

00:18:12,480 --> 00:18:19,360

had to be at least 100 yards long.

268

00:18:19,400 --> 00:18:22,480

And we're staring at this thing out the window.

269

00:18:22,480 --> 00:18:26,360

And all of a sudden, the car is lit up.

270

00:18:26,360 --> 00:18:29,000

Inside, like the floodlights inside our car,

271

00:18:29,000 --> 00:18:30,600

I could see the dashboard.

272

00:18:30,600 --> 00:18:33,480

I could see the back of my grandmother's hair.

273

00:18:33,480 --> 00:18:34,560

I could see the radio.

274

00:18:34,560 --> 00:18:36,160

I remember this like it was yesterday.

275

00:18:36,160 --> 00:18:37,800

I could see my mother.

276

00:18:37,800 --> 00:18:41,720

Everything in the car was just like it was daylight.

277

00:18:41,720 --> 00:18:45,040

I mean, usually you hear some summer noises.

278

00:18:45,040 --> 00:18:47,800

And everything was deadly still and silent.

279

00:18:50,360 --> 00:18:54,760

Then all of a sudden, the chirping started loudly.

280

00:18:54,760 --> 00:18:57,280

The erupted crickets, everything.

281

00:18:57,280 --> 00:18:58,640

And that's the last I remember.

282

00:18:58,640 --> 00:18:59,320

That was it.

283

00:18:59,320 --> 00:19:01,880

Disruption of crickets and cadets and frogs

284

00:19:01,880 --> 00:19:06,600

and whatever it was seemed to affect the entire area,

285

00:19:06,600 --> 00:19:07,960

the wildlife.

286

00:19:07,960 --> 00:19:09,440

And then that's, bang, that's the last thing

287

00:19:09,440 --> 00:19:12,960

I remember being in the car.

288

00:19:12,960 --> 00:19:18,920

My fragmented memory of it, I can account for maybe 15 minutes.

289

00:19:19,000 --> 00:19:20,720

But it was over a three hour period.

290

00:19:23,200 --> 00:19:25,920

I have no memory of the lost time.

291

00:19:25,920 --> 00:19:26,760

I have none.

292

00:19:26,760 --> 00:19:28,720

And I wish I did in a way.

293

00:19:28,720 --> 00:19:31,440

Maybe it's just as well I don't.

294

351

94.1 FM, WSBS, streaming online worldwide at WSBS.com.

And check us out on that.

353

00:22:15,640 --> 00:22:18,760

In 1969, I wasn't even thought of yet.

354

00:22:18,760 --> 00:22:20,800

I was born in 1983.

355

00:22:20,800 --> 00:22:22,960

A legend has it that strange occurrence that

356

00:22:22,960 --> 00:22:28,400

took place in September of 1969 was a UFO sighting.

357

I think it's unlikely that if you have all these people
