She had given a Belgian street address in this tiny village.

So the police informed the Belgian police,

And then they suddenly realized that

The hotel had pretty tight security

126

in the police documents about the police searching these cameras.

It wasn't a funeral.

156

It was just a burial.

157

00:12:16,680 --> 00:12:18,680

No priests,

158

00:12:19,680 --> 00:12:21,680

a coffin,

159

00:12:21,680 --> 00:12:23,680

and the pole bearers.

160

00:12:27,680 --> 00:12:35,680

How can a funeral or a burial be more alone than this one?

161

00:12:35,680 --> 00:12:39,680

That's the point when I got involved in this story.

162

I was doing a series of stories on missing persons in Norway

163

00:12:43,680 --> 00:12:46,680

and unidentified bodies.

164

I thought, this is a story I have to do.

165

This is the grave of Jennifer Fairgate.

166

00:13:10,680 --> 00:13:12,680

This is where she was buried.

167

00:13:14,680 --> 00:13:18,680

No headstone because no one knew who she was.

168

00:13:25,680 --> 00:13:28,680

Why is it important to find out

169

00:13:28,680 --> 00:13:32,680

why a person died nearly 25 years ago?

170

00:13:33,680 --> 00:13:35,680

People die all the time.

171

00:13:35,680 --> 00:13:39,680

There are so many unidentified dead people all around the world.

172

00:13:40,680 --> 00:13:43,680

So why is it important?

173

00:13:43,680 --> 00:13:46,680

Well, I think every life matters.

174

00:13:48,680 --> 00:13:53,680

I think that Jennifer Fairgate, whatever her name really is,

175

00:13:53,680 --> 00:13:56,680

I think she deserves a headstone with her name on.

176

00:13:56,680 --> 00:14:00,680

And I think her family deserves to know what happened to her.

177

00:14:03,680 --> 00:14:06,680

So I did the story.

178

00:14:06,680 --> 00:14:08,680

That was 1996.

179

00:14:10,680 --> 00:14:14,680

And I kept my notes in my desk drawer.

180

And for the next 20 years, from time to time,

181

00:14:20,680 --> 00:14:27,680

I took the story out because I was sure this wasn't an intriguing story,

182

00:14:27,680 --> 00:14:31,680

a real life mystery that people would get.

183

And I was interested in.

184

00:14:36,680 --> 00:14:41,680

And maybe if I could spread this story wide enough,

185

that could give us valuable information about her life

186

and that could tell us what happened in Room 2805.

187

She claimed to be from Berlin in Bilsen,

188

a tiny village that actually exists.

189

And that's why we have to go here

190

to see if we can find any trace of Jennifer.

191

00:15:16,680 --> 00:15:20,680

Because there must have been one reason or another

192

00:15:20,680 --> 00:15:23,680

for choosing this little town.

193

00:15:25,680 --> 00:15:28,680

Right here in the middle of the city,

194

00:15:28,680 --> 00:15:30,680

a little town.

195

00:15:35,680 --> 00:15:38,680

Lars asked me if I could help him out,

196

00:15:38,680 --> 00:15:40,680

if he could do some research,

197

00:15:40,680 --> 00:15:42,680

talk with some people here in Belgium,

198

00:15:42,680 --> 00:15:44,680

if they had heard about the case,

199

00:15:44,680 --> 00:15:46,680

if they knew what was going on.

200

At first I thought, well, this is going to be easy.

201

I just go to Berlin, show the picture about,

202

and if she's really for there, people are going to say,

203

oh yeah, I know who she was, they're going to know her story.

In the years, you know a lot of people from this village.

205

I was born in 1956, I'm from Berlin.

206

I'm always in my neighborhood,

207

because I built a house next to my parents' house,

208

00:16:09,680 --> 00:16:11,680

but I'm always in my neighborhood.

209

So I've known her since I was a kid,

210

00:16:13,680 --> 00:16:15,680

and that's how she came to Bourkemenst.

211

We know people, and finally, we love the population,

212

and we love to serve people,

213

But this kind of woman, nobody had ever seen this woman.

219

She was a complete stranger to these people.

220

Jennifer claimed to live in Rue de la Station,

221

00:16:52,680 --> 00:16:54,680

and no. 148.

222

00:16:54,680 --> 00:16:58,680

Here's 96, 98.

223

00:16:58,680 --> 00:17:01,680

And it literally stops at 100.

224

00:17:01,680 --> 00:17:04,680

So that means the White House is the last house.

225

00:17:04,680 --> 00:17:06,680

The White House is the very last one.

226

00:17:06,680 --> 00:17:08,680

No. 98 is the last one.

227

00:17:08,680 --> 00:17:11,680

This is another street.

228

00:17:11,680 --> 00:17:15,680

So I think we conclude that she was not from Berlin.

229

Otherwise, we should have known,

230

00:17:17,680 --> 00:17:20,680

just met someone who actually knew her.

231

00:17:20,680 --> 00:17:22,680

It's a very small village,

232

00:17:22,680 --> 00:17:25,680

and it was even smaller in the 90s.

233

There was some connection,

234

00:17:29,680 --> 00:17:32,680

but I still do not know what that connection is.

235

I don't know what connection it is.

I'm quite sure that Jennifer wasn't from this place,

238

but she must have known something about this place and this area.

The street exists,

the phone numbers she gave up are pretty consistent with this area.

241

So she must have known something about this place

242

without being from here.

243

She was very successful at hiding her identity.

244

And we are still left with the same problem.

245

As always in this story, there are no traces.

246

There are no paths to follow.

247

It's like following a ghost.

248

It's so strange that no one

249

have been able to recognize this woman.

250

We have made sketches of her.

251

00:18:48,680 --> 00:18:53,680

It has been widely published in several languages, several countries.

252

00:18:57,680 --> 00:19:02,680

She must have had friends, school friends, colleagues, lovers, boyfriends.

253

00:19:03,680 --> 00:19:06,680

Someone knows this woman.

254

00:19:18,680 --> 00:19:21,680

The police theory was that

255

00:19:21,680 --> 00:19:27,680

she might have been a depressed woman wanting to take her own life.

256

00:19:27,680 --> 00:19:31,680

But she obviously had a shower when she was found dead.

257

00:19:31,680 --> 00:19:34,680

She was neatly dressed, all in black,

258

00:19:34,680 --> 00:19:37,680

with her high-heeled shoes on her feet.

259

00:19:37,680 --> 00:19:42,680

So it actually looks like a woman about to go out for a night.

260

00:19:44,680 --> 00:19:50,680

And besides, the weapon was a 9mm semi-automatic browning pistol.

261

00:19:50,680 --> 00:19:53,680

It's a pretty powerful weapon.

262

00:19:54,680 --> 00:20:01,680

But more strange than that is that she had a briefcase with 25 rounds.

263

00:20:01,680 --> 00:20:08,680

And that is another strange thing with this very, very strange and peculiar case.

It's strange to have a suit case with only cartridges in.

265

You only need one.

She wasn't very tall.

268

00:20:28,680 --> 00:20:30,680

She was a tiny woman.

269

00:20:30,680 --> 00:20:36,680

She had small hands and she still had a gun in her hand when she was found.

270

00:20:36,680 --> 00:20:41,680

She had a very special hand grip on the gun.

271

00:20:43,680 --> 00:20:45,680

She didn't have the usual grip.

272

00:20:45,680 --> 00:20:50,680

She had an opposite grip with a thumb on the trigger

273

00:20:50,680 --> 00:20:54,680

and her fingers on the other side of the hand grip.

274

00:20:54,680 --> 00:21:01,680

How could she still hold on to such a powerful weapon with this strange grip?

275

00:21:01,680 --> 00:21:16,680

The 9mm gun is a tough gun with a hard recoil.

276

00:21:17,680 --> 00:21:22,680

Here we have a similar gun that was used in the case.

277

00:21:22,680 --> 00:21:25,680

This is heavy. It's powerful.

278

00:21:25,680 --> 00:21:29,680

It's more a assault weapon than a weapon that you protect yourself with.

279

00:21:31,680 --> 00:21:36,680

She was firing with her thumb here

280

00:21:36,680 --> 00:21:40,680

and then you'd have a very bad grip on the weapon.

281

00:21:40,680 --> 00:21:44,680

And I would say that normally the weapon will be thrown away.

282

You could see the recoil from the weapon.

283

00:22:01,680 --> 00:22:07,680

So when you fire and the recoil pushes the gun back,

284

00:22:11,680 --> 00:22:16,680

I think it's very odd that the gun is not falling out of her hand.

285

I think maybe there must have been a second person.

286

It could have been a suicide, except for the fact that there were no blood spots on her hand.

287

00:22:39,680 --> 00:22:43,680

In most cases, I think when people perform suicide, they are shaky

288

00:22:43,680 --> 00:22:49,680

and they will also put a left hand around the barrel and do it like this.

289

00:22:50,680 --> 00:22:56,680

And then there will be typical blood spots or suit deposits here,

290

00:22:56,680 --> 00:22:59,680

as you can see in this picture here.

291

So I think I've never seen a case without any blood spots on the hand

292

00:23:05,680 --> 00:23:11,680

when they have performed suicide like this or like this or against the head.

293

I think from the scene investigation there were blood spots all over,

294

00:23:15,680 --> 00:23:18,680

the roof and the walls, but not here.

295

And that's difficult to explain.

It's a total picture that is very suspicious.

297

Well, I think homicide cannot be excluded.

Was it a homicide? But why? And how?
