The night I spoke with Tiffany, obviously at the party,

she showed no signs of any kind of stress.

She had things prepared.

214

Tiffany was ready to make that next move.

There was no way in hell she committed suicide.

New Jersey Transit made the determination that my daughter stood on those tracks

217

and committed suicide in less than 24 hours from the time she was hit.

People that knew Tiffany just couldn't believe it.

219

00:14:21,000 --> 00:14:24,000

We were on a mission because we knew our daughter didn't do this.

220

00:14:29,000 --> 00:14:31,000

My name is Paul DeMato.

221

I've been a trial lawyer for 46 years.

222

00:14:38,000 --> 00:14:43,000

Most of my cases have involved representing victims.

223

And there have been those cases, like Tiffany's case,

224

that you simply cannot say no to.

225

When I first met Stephen Diane, they were sitting right here.

226

And they were so broken and so upset.

227

They told me that their daughter did not take her own life.

228

I didn't know if I could help them.

229

And I said to myself, let me get the records from the New Jersey Transit Police Department.

I'll present the reports to them.

231

And sadly, I'll have to tell them your daughter took her own life.

232

But that never happened once we got the records.

233

Tiffany Valente was 18 years old and lived with her family

234

00:15:42,000 --> 00:15:46,000

in a very rural area of New Jersey, west of Atlantic City.

235

00:15:48,000 --> 00:15:53,000

Now, here's what we know about the night that she was killed.

236

00:15:55,000 --> 00:16:03,000

On Sunday, July 12th, New Jersey Transit train number 4693 left Philadelphia at 9.50 p.m.

237

00:16:03,000 --> 00:16:06,000

Heading east to Atlantic City.

238

00:16:08,000 --> 00:16:12,000

There were about 60 passengers and crew on board.

239

00:16:13,000 --> 00:16:18,000

The train had just passed under the bridge at Tilton Road in Galloway Township

240

00:16:18,000 --> 00:16:21,000

and was headed toward the crossing at Genoa Avenue.

241

00:16:21,000 --> 00:16:27,000

It was 11.12 p.m. at mile marker 45 on a very dark stretch of track

242

00:16:27,000 --> 00:16:30,000

where Tiffany was hit by the train.

243

00:16:34,000 --> 00:16:39,000

When the train was examined later, it showed that the impact was specifically

244

00:16:39,000 --> 00:16:43,000

on the lower left side of the train close to the track.

245

00:16:46,000 --> 00:16:52,000

There were two engineers on board the train, a senior engineer and a student engineer.

246

00:16:52,000 --> 00:16:58,000

That night, they both signed a report saying that Tiffany dove in front of the train.

247

00:16:59,000 --> 00:17:02,000

But here's the problem.

248

00:17:02,000 --> 00:17:12,000

Six days later, when he's put under oath, the senior engineer comes up with a completely different version

249

00:17:12,000 --> 00:17:16,000

of what he told the detective the night of the incident.

250

00:17:16,000 --> 00:17:18,000

Here's his story.

251

00:17:18,000 --> 00:17:21,000

I was talking to the conductor.

252

00:17:21,000 --> 00:17:23,000

I never saw her.

253

00:17:23,000 --> 00:17:26,000

My back was turned.

254

00:17:27,000 --> 00:17:35,000

So you throw his statements out and then you look at what the student engineer said.

255

00:17:35,000 --> 00:17:42,000

Initially, he was asked, when did you first see the trespasser?

256

00:17:42,000 --> 00:17:44,000

What was his answer?

257

00:17:44,000 --> 00:17:49,000

I didn't see her until I was on top of her.

258

00:17:50,000 --> 00:17:57,000

Ten days later, he's put under oath and now here's his story.

259

00:17:57,000 --> 00:18:01,000

I see something when I'm half a mile away.

260

00:18:01,000 --> 00:18:05,000

Then I see something when I'm a quarter mile away.

261

00:18:05,000 --> 00:18:14,000

And then I see this person jump out of the woods onto the tracks.

262

00:18:20,000 --> 00:18:32,000

In the end, the student engineer was the only witness, a student engineer who gave variations of what he saw that night.

263

00:18:34,000 --> 00:18:48,000

To this day, the New Jersey Transit Police Department stands by the inconsistent contradictory statements of the student engineer.

264

00:18:50,000 --> 00:19:00,000

My name is Louise Housman and I'm retired from the Atlantic County Medical Examiner's Office, where I was a senior investigator.

265

00:19:00,000 --> 00:19:02,000

I worked there for 20 years.

266

00:19:05,000 --> 00:19:10,000

I've probably been to several thousand scenes over the course of 20 years.

267

00:19:11,000 --> 00:19:20,000

I was really concerned with the sworn statements by the engineer and the student engineer.

268

00:19:20,000 --> 00:19:31,000

Because a great deal of weight was apparently given to the information they provided at the scene, which turned out to not be correct.

269

00:19:32,000 --> 00:19:37,000

The major incident event recorder is considered the black box.

270

00:19:37,000 --> 00:19:42,000

It records everything that happens with the engine as it's going along.

271

00:19:42,000 --> 00:19:51,000

The speed of the train, when the handbrakes are used, when the horn is rung, if the headlights are on.

272

00:19:51,000 --> 00:19:53,000

And it gives the distance.

273

00:19:53,000 --> 00:19:55,000

The train is traveled when all this happens.

274

00:19:55,000 --> 00:19:58,000

So it's very easy to read.

275

00:19:58,000 --> 00:20:02,000

There's nothing mysterious about it. It's very straightforward.

276

00:20:04,000 --> 00:20:16,000

According to the event recorder, from the time the apprentice engineer sounded the horn, struck Tiffany, and applied the emergency brake, it took a total of 4.1 seconds.

277

00:20:16,000 --> 00:20:19,000

That train is traveling 80 miles an hour.

278

00:20:19,000 --> 00:20:24,000

So did he see what he thought he saw that she jumped in front of him?

279

00:20:24,000 --> 00:20:26,000

I don't know.

280

00:20:29,000 --> 00:20:35,000

I believe that the student engineer was in a type of trauma, in shock.

281

00:20:35,000 --> 00:20:36,000

Anyone would be.

282

00:20:36,000 --> 00:20:41,000

If you hit someone in a car, are you going to be able to describe exactly what happened?

283

I don't know what sense it would make to walk from Tiffany's house to where the shoes were found.

Then take your shoes off and put them in the woods and then walk to where the train strike happened.

If you look at the photographs of Tiffany's feet, especially her right foot, there are no markings whatsoever that you would expect to see if someone had walked in their bare feet,

444

especially over the rocks and the glass on the tracks.

If she walked on the train tracks itself, she would have had splinters on her feet to walk for miles and have her feet completely clean proves to you that she did not walk.

446

I walked that tracks after the fact and I had a hard time walking on them with worksheets and that's what makes me feel that she never ever walked there.

447

00:36:49,000 --> 00:37:04,000

If someone, especially a female 6'3 is walking on the roadway, someone is going to see them and going to notice them because it's very unusual to see anyone walking on the roadway in this area.

448

If you look at the photos from Steve's deer cameras outside of his home, you will see headlights of motor vehicles at the same time Tiffany's walking down the driveway.

449

I believe she entered a motor vehicle. I suspect voluntarily.

450

00:37:34,000 --> 00:37:39,000

I believe she got in the car with somebody she thought she knew was very comfortable with them.

451

Once she entered that vehicle, somebody grabbed the phone and I think that phone was thrown out of the car as they were pulling away.

452

When they took her phone, that's when I think reality hit. She was in trouble.

453

Everybody has their own scenarios of what happened to my daughter. I thought maybe they tried to rape her and she ran from them and maybe she was trying to get away from them and she just couldn't run anymore.

I truly believe that she was hanging on to this for dear life trying to save herself, you know what I mean, and trying to keep them from taking her.

which suggests that the body could have been laid there and was bleeding before the train hit the body.

The medical examiner in this report says when referring to Tiffany's arms and legs that they were cut from the torso, that word cut is right in the report. Not ripped away, but cut.

And that says to me that there is a viable theory that she was harmed before the body was placed on the tracks. The arms were placed out and the legs were hanging over the other track.

463

Her feet were intact and her hands were intact. What's that tell you? She wasn't standing on that track and hit by the train. She was laying there. They were cut off.

I believe somebody laid her on the tracks and she bled out there.

Before my daughter went to college, I promised her I'd build her a volleyball court.
