but they did.

In 1954, Hurricane Hazel had left the Southern Atlantic coast in ruins.

For the next 35 years, the killer winds steered clear of Paulie's Island,

Thousands were forced to flee their homes.

115

In South Carolina alone, there was close to \$5 billion worth of damage.

Over 9,000 homes were destroyed.

Paulie's Island was particularly hard hit.

Well, it looked like a giant dump pile.

Chairs, couches, iceboxes, all that stuff was piled up in the middle of the road.

It was terrible.

It practically destroyed Paulie's Island.

It destroyed 14 houses in our section.

According to the story, the gray man ended his tenure on Earth

173

Yet some say he unknowingly walks the sands of Paulie's Island,

175

still searching for a woman who has been in her grave for over a century.

It is somehow inspiring to count and play the love so strong as to defy death.

177

But if these witnesses are to be believed,

David expressed a desire to change his life

with a newfound spirituality may have sent him on a journey

Well, I think he could best be described as overachiever

223

in just about every way.

You've never met a kinder, gentler, young man than him,

very close to family.

you put him in a football uniform and he was like a proverbial commando.

For years, David struggled with his dual nature.

On October 28th, 1988, during a party at his apartment,

232

David temporarily lost control.

233

David, what's going on?

David started hitting him.

235

00:14:58,320 --> 00:15:01,320

He said he might have hit him 20, 25 times

236

and he didn't really hurt him, but felt he had to do that.

237

Roughly around nine o'clock in the morning,

238

he came down and told me what he had done.

239

Where are you going?

240

I'm not sure. Grand Canyon, Sonora Desert, Sedona.

David told John that he needed to get away to reflect on his explosive behavior.

He said he would return home in a few days.

Later.

Five days later, David's car was discovered on a desolate stretch of New Mexico Highway 80.

When we hadn't heard from him, we called the New Mexico State Police

and his car had been found abandoned and they had towed it in.

David's car was found near the Pyramid Mountain Range.

Pyramids are an integral part of New Age philosophy.

According to New Age philosophy, a vision quest is an introspective journey taken in order to discover one's inner self.
