and appear no different than the rest of us, most of the time.

Only the minority of psychopaths are actually violent.

55

There are people who are vice presidents of corporations,

56

who step over the competition, whose backstabbing

is only figurative.

One of the social dangers that psychopathic individuals

59

perpetuate is that oftentimes, especially

if they're brighter than average or perhaps very intelligent,

that they can fool individuals into believing

that they are quite sincere and are being quite honest.

Even psychopaths who murder such a serial killer, John Wayne

John Wayne Gacy is an interesting case in Chicago.

A respectable, responsible figure

68

was a clown at children's parties,

active in the political party of his time,

70

photographed with the president and the president's wife.

71

But all the while this was going on,

72

00:04:09,800 --> 00:04:12,640

he was systematically luring into his house

73

00:04:12,640 --> 00:04:16,120

and then hideously torturing and killing young men

74

and then burying them under his home.

Ted Bundy also appeared to be a pillar of society.

At various times before his arrest and execution,

a campaign aide to Washington Governor Dan Evans.

And in 1972, Ted Bundy was named Mr. Up and Coming

Republican.

Two very well-known journalists describe Ted Bundy,

82

for example, as a kind of alien life form,

83

mimicking the behavior of real human beings.

A lot of psychopaths don't just kill individuals.

85

They're not content with that.

86

A lot of psychopaths run countries.

87

I see no fundamental difference between someone

88

like Ted Bundy and someone like Adolf Hitler, who simply

89

use very different techniques for very similar ends.

That all that mattered to them was control and domination

91

in one case of a single isolated individual

And the ruthless annihilation of millions meant nothing.

The most destructive psychopaths,

6 million Jews and decimate most of Europe?

is that there's a lack of bonding between the parent

and the child in the very early years.

The sociopath grows up feeling unlove, out of control.

And when he grows up, he has intense need for control

Hitler's father was 52 years old when Hitler was born.

113

Many believe his physical and emotional abuse

114

virtually destroyed his son's self-esteem.

As an adult, Adolf Hitler felt compelled to subject

millions to avenge his own deep feelings of inferiority.

Psychopaths kill because that is the ultimate act

118

00:06:37,360 --> 00:06:41,240

of humiliation and dominance that shows their total power

and control over another human being.

It's the ultimate achievement of their psychopathic dreams.

There's no empathy for who he victimizes.

It is something that he intentionally does,

131

as to who he will manipulate.

More recently, Iraqi President Saddam Hussein

133

ordered the invasion of Kuwait, the latest episode

Saddam has an extremely dangerous personality,

but he is not crazy in the sense of being

commitable to a mental institution.

This is the kind of person, in a court of law,

139

who is not a criminal, but a criminal.

140

Saddam Hussein was a man who was trying to find a person

141

00:07:53,240 --> 00:07:56,840

in a court of law who would not be considered not guilty

142

by reason of insanity, but the recommendation

143

of the examining psychiatrist would undoubtedly

144

be to throw away the key.

145

Saddam Hussein grew up in an impoverished almost

146

00:08:09,120 --> 00:08:13,920

medieval village that lacked electricity and running water.

147

He was frequently beaten by his stepfather,

148

00:08:16,360 --> 00:08:20,080

stealing chickens and sheep.

149

00:08:20,080 --> 00:08:23,720

Like Hitler, Hussein exploited a turbulent political climate

150

00:08:23,720 --> 00:08:29,640

to legitimize his personal need to dominate and control others.

151

00:08:29,640 --> 00:08:34,160

Along the way, what he learned and what was reinforced

152

00:08:34,160 --> 00:08:39,080

regularly was that violence is the key to power.

153

00:08:42,360 --> 00:08:46,200

During the 1960s and 70s, Hussein methodically eliminated

154

00:08:46,200 --> 00:08:50,040

political rivals, torturing and murdering thousands.

155

00:08:50,040 --> 00:08:54,080

By July of 1979, Hussein inspired so much fear

156

00:08:54,080 --> 00:08:57,680

that he was able to gain the presidency simply by asking for it.

157

00:09:01,520 --> 00:09:04,360

Within days, Hussein summoned his leading supporters

158

00:09:04,360 --> 00:09:07,480

to a meeting where he charged a number of potential rivals

159

00:09:07,480 --> 00:09:08,160

with treason.

160

00:09:10,960 --> 00:09:14,000

This crude video footage was smuggled out of Iraq

161

00:09:14,000 --> 00:09:17,360

and shows several of the accused being led from the meeting.

162

00:09:17,360 --> 00:09:19,120

After the meeting, Hussein forced

163

00:09:19,120 --> 00:09:21,440

those not identified as conspirators

164

00:09:21,440 --> 00:09:25,880

to execute their former colleagues.

165

00:09:25,880 --> 00:09:30,080

A striking example of the dangers of criticizing Saddam

166

00:09:30,080 --> 00:09:33,240

occurred in 1982.

167

00:09:33,240 --> 00:09:37,000

The war with Iran that Saddam had initiated

168

00:09:37,000 --> 00:09:38,960

was going very badly.

169

00:09:38,960 --> 00:09:41,640

And Saddam decided they had to stop it.

170

But by now Khomeini was obsessed with Saddam

171

00:09:45,240 --> 00:09:49,000

and said there would be no peace until Saddam was deposed

172

00:09:49,000 --> 00:09:50,360

or stepped down.

173

Saddam called a cabinet meeting, asked his cabinet,

174

00:09:53,560 --> 00:09:55,760

what shall we do?

175

00:09:55,760 --> 00:09:57,800

Khomeini insists I step down.

176

00:09:57,800 --> 00:09:59,640

To a man, of course, the cabinet said,

177

00:09:59,640 --> 00:10:00,400

you must stay on.

178

00:10:00,400 --> 00:10:01,760

We need your leadership.

179

00:10:01,760 --> 00:10:03,440

Saddam then said, no, no, no.

180

00:10:03,440 --> 00:10:07,200

I want your frank, candid, and creative suggestions.

181

00:10:07,200 --> 00:10:10,480

His Oxford-educated Minister of Health, Dr. Ibrahim,

182

00:10:10,480 --> 00:10:14,400

took him seriously and made a rather shrewd suggestion.

183

00:10:14,400 --> 00:10:18,120

Why, he suggested, don't we have you step down temporarily,

184

00:10:18,120 --> 00:10:21,560

Saddam, until our goal of peace is established?

185

And then you can resume the presidency.

186

As the story is told, Saddam thanked him for his candor

187

and then had him arrested.

188

The minister's wife pled with Saddam

189

to return her husband to her.

190

00:10:34,880 --> 00:10:36,520

He promised her that he would, as best

191

00:10:36,520 --> 00:10:38,880

as I can tell, the only promise he ever kept.

192

00:10:38,880 --> 00:10:41,040

The next day, he returned her husband to her,

193

00:10:41,040 --> 00:10:43,400

and a black canvas bag chopped into pieces.

194

With his critics effectively silenced,

195

Hussein launched his ill-fated invasion of Kuwait.

196

When he ultimately surrendered, Hussein

197

promised to terminate production of all chemical

198

00:11:00,080 --> 00:11:02,800

and nuclear weapons.

199

Subsequent United Nations inspections

200

confirm that Hussein was lying.

201

If one were to strip world leaders and politicians

202

of narcissistic characters, the ranks

203

would be perilously thinned.

We must always be alert to that fusion

205

between that personal drive for power,

206

unconstrained by conscience, when it meets a wounded

207

population that has repetitively over history

208

led to some of the most violent episodes that

209

00:11:40,080 --> 00:11:41,040

have scarred our planet.

210

History has shown the political psychopaths

211

will not meld with a wise and magnanimous leaders.

Most like Adolf Hitler, perishing the flames a helping

knight, some like Idi Amin, are deposed

A few such as Joseph Stalin and the Soviet Union

looking for a diabolical gender, it is the male.

There are, however, a few diabolical women.

225

Typically, the sociopaths conceal their true nature

behind a veil of tenderness and warmth.

Frank and Marie Hilley were high school sweethearts.

228

They were married in 1950, and the life they built together

229

was the envy of friends and neighbors in Aniston, Alabama.

Here we go.

231

By 1971, Frank had worked his way up from a shipping clerk

232

to supervisor at the local foundry.

233

The Hilley's had two children, Carol 11 and Mike 18.

234

Aside from her tendency to overspend,

235

Marie was a cheerful and supportive partner

236

00:13:20,040 --> 00:13:22,480

by all appearances, the perfect wife and mother.

237

Wow.

238

That's it.

239

00:13:24,960 --> 00:13:29,520

But appearances deceive.

240

I first started getting sick when I was 18.

A lot of stomach problems.

And I started having those problems

250

Curiously, once Mike left home for college,

252

the symptoms disappeared.

253

And curiously, with Mike away from home,

254

his father developed a mysterious stomach ailment.

255

Once again, doctors are unable to find a cause or provide

256

a cure.

257

At the same time, Frank and Marie's marriage

258

was falling apart.

259

00:14:28,240 --> 00:14:30,200

My father called me one day and had something he wanted

260

to talk to me about.

261

00:14:32,840 --> 00:14:35,120

He had come home from work early one day

262

00:14:35,120 --> 00:14:39,560

and had found my mother in bed with one of her employers.

263

I think my father was going to divorce her.

264

I think that was one circumstance that she just

265

Marie rarely left his side, tenderly

feeding and caring for him.

You've got to eat, Frank.

is the catalyst that will put them back together.

After she was picked up, they had no idea

547

But psychopaths do not make this distinction.

548

Dr. Hare believes this may help explain why psychopaths

549

don't have a conscience.

Most people talk about conscience in terms

551

of something like an inner voice talking to one cell.

552

Well, I shouldn't do that.

You know, my mommy said I shouldn't do it.

Are certain people born as psychopaths,

568

or do they become psychopaths?

569

If I were to cast my vote in one direction or the other,

570

00:30:27,040 --> 00:30:29,640

I'd probably say that it's more likely that they're born not

571

00:30:29,640 --> 00:30:30,240

made.

572

I think that there are fairly strong genetic contributions

573

to all personality traits, including the personality

574

00:30:34,840 --> 00:30:37,040

traits that make up psychopathy.

575

I think it's pretty clear that while people

576

may have inherited susceptibility

577

00:30:41,920 --> 00:30:43,920

to certain kinds of violent crimes,

578

that individuals who go on to produce these kinds

579

of abominable crimes are created.

580

They're shaped by their families.

581

00:30:53,920 --> 00:30:56,000

They're shaped by their societies.

582

00:30:56,000 --> 00:30:59,760

They model the culture heroes in their civilization,

583

At the time of the interview, G. Daniel Walker

was probably the only prisoner in California

594

with his own courthouse workspace, including a computer,

595

privileges resulting from a lawsuit

596

00:31:39,440 --> 00:31:41,760

against a state prison system.

597

00:31:41,760 --> 00:31:44,800

Over a three-year period, Walker was driven several times

598

00:31:44,800 --> 00:31:47,360

a week to the Alameda County Courthouse,

599

00:31:47,360 --> 00:31:49,200

where he prepared still more lawsuits

600

00:31:49,240 --> 00:31:51,800

against judges, district attorneys, journalists,

601

00:31:51,800 --> 00:31:53,720

and corrections officials.

602

00:31:53,720 --> 00:31:58,680

He is almost as much trouble inside prison as out.

603

00:31:58,680 --> 00:31:59,600

Good morning, all.

604

00:31:59,600 --> 00:32:01,560

A funny thing happens to me on the way to this interview.

605

I got arrested, put in chains, and I'm not

606

the defendant in this case.

607

Walker projects a buoyant, confident manner.

608

00:32:09,320 --> 00:32:12,800

This amiable posture belies the fraud, armed robberies,

609

00:32:12,800 --> 00:32:15,280

and murder which have kept him institutionalized

610

00:32:15,280 --> 00:32:17,480

for most of the past 35 years.

611

00:32:20,200 --> 00:32:23,640

G. Daniel Walker served time in the late 1960s

612

00:32:23,640 --> 00:32:25,680

for armed robbery in the attempted murder

613

00:32:25,680 --> 00:32:27,520

of an Illinois policeman.

614

00:32:27,520 --> 00:32:30,560

In 1972, he escaped.

615

00:32:30,560 --> 00:32:33,080

Three months later, he was arrested in California

616

00:32:33,080 --> 00:32:37,240

for the murder of advertising executive William Ashlock.

617

00:32:37,240 --> 00:32:39,440

After the killing, Walker allegedly

618

00:32:39,440 --> 00:32:42,600

raped Ashlock's fiance, all the while proclaiming

619

00:32:42,600 --> 00:32:44,240

his love for her.

620

00:32:44,240 --> 00:32:47,240

He then terrorized her into helping him cover up the crime.

621

Walker defended himself in court,

622

00:32:51,320 --> 00:32:54,840

claiming Ashlock was a victim of a mafia hit squad.

623

Walker insisted that he had only helped

624

to cover up the murder to protect Ashlock's fiance.

625

He lost his case and received a sentence of 17 years

626

00:33:05,040 --> 00:33:07,560

to life in prison.

627

00:33:07,560 --> 00:33:10,680

While Walker insists he is innocent of the murder charge,

628

he openly boasts of having committed more than 300

629

00:33:13,600 --> 00:33:16,920

other crimes for which he has neither been charged nor tried.

630

Do you feel that you are pretty much

631

by the system where you belong from the standpoint of?

632

Yes.

I'm convicted of murder.

And given the same set of facts, I would do it again.

How long is your rap sheet?

642

I would think the current one would probably

643

be about 29 to 30 pages.

644

29 to 30 pages.

645

00:33:48,480 --> 00:33:50,840

Charles Manson's is only five.

646

00:33:50,840 --> 00:33:52,880

Well, he was just a killer.

647

00:33:52,880 --> 00:33:56,840

But at the same time, I've heard you say that your criminal

648

record, your rap sheet, your FBI record, whatever,

649

00:33:59,960 --> 00:34:03,360

does not certainly hold all that you have done.

650

Definitely not.

651

No, the body of work of the criminal enterprise

652

has been much greater.

653

And let's hope that I've been successful in something.

You see, you're meeting a failed criminal right now,

655

and you're very happy to be meeting me as a failed criminal

656

because you were meeting me as a successful criminal.

That means that I'd have the gun pointed at you.

And you would suddenly have this speech.

A person like him can be extremely dangerous.

And again, that's a mark of a psychopath or a sociopath.

Is that they make their own rules in life.

You have had so many opportunities to stay out of jail.

And yet, you keep coming back in.

Well, then again, you see prison as not being successful.

667

And just because you're in prison doesn't

668

mean you can't be successful.

669

I think Salson Eason said the greatest freedom

670

00:34:50,960 --> 00:34:52,680

that a man enjoys is being in prison

671

00:34:52,680 --> 00:34:54,520

because they feed you breakfast in the morning.

672

00:34:54,520 --> 00:34:56,120

You can go out and kill one of your soulmates,

673

00:34:56,120 --> 00:34:57,400

and they'll still feed you lunch and give you

674

00:34:57,400 --> 00:34:59,720

sheets for your bed in the evening.

675

00:34:59,720 --> 00:35:01,720

The psychopathic individual will use

676

00:35:01,720 --> 00:35:03,240

several different defenses.

677

00:35:03,240 --> 00:35:05,480

One of those is rationalization.

678

00:35:05,480 --> 00:35:08,720

He will come up with very elaborate explanations

679

00:35:08,720 --> 00:35:11,880

that when thought about very carefully make no sense.

680

00:35:11,880 --> 00:35:14,920

Institutions are not that unsatisfying.

681

00:35:14,920 --> 00:35:16,360

You've got to remember, I don't have

682

00:35:16,360 --> 00:35:17,600

to go out and kill any cows.

683

00:35:17,600 --> 00:35:18,680

They're going to do all that for me.

684

00:35:18,680 --> 00:35:20,040

I don't have to go out and cook any meals.

685

00:35:20,040 --> 00:35:21,240

I don't have to wash any dishes.

686

00:35:21,240 --> 00:35:22,800

They're going to do all those things for me.

687

00:35:22,800 --> 00:35:27,160

So the institution becomes a wife by nature.

688

00:35:27,160 --> 00:35:28,920

They're going to wash my dirty socks for me.

689

00:35:28,920 --> 00:35:30,560

They're going to do all of the things

690

00:35:30,560 --> 00:35:32,600

that I don't necessarily like to do.

691

So if that's becoming institutionalized,

692

I'm happily married.

If you had the option, would you leave?

Juries have tried me and never found me guilty of escape.

697

I've always represented myself in those cases.

There is a certain excitement when you have escaped

from a major penitentiary and you know

700

that the red lights are right behind you.

701

You know the sirens are going.

702

00:35:57,800 --> 00:35:59,720

There is a certain excitement that you just,

703

it's better than six.

704

So yes, there is that possibility

705

that there may be a 14th escape.

747

00:37:30,080 --> 00:37:32,760

And responsibility for our behavior

748

00:37:32,760 --> 00:37:35,520

is really other people's responsibility.

749

00:37:35,520 --> 00:37:38,760

Do you feel that you are a truly dangerous person

750

00:37:38,760 --> 00:37:41,000

from the standpoint of committing violent acts?

751

00:37:41,000 --> 00:37:43,360

Only if you've done something wrong to me.

752

00:37:43,360 --> 00:37:45,120

I think what you're referring to is the fact that-

753

00:37:45,120 --> 00:37:47,320

From prison, Walker somehow managed

754

00:37:47,320 --> 00:37:49,440

to have a highly toxic poison imported

755

00:37:49,440 --> 00:37:51,360

into the United States.

756

00:37:51,360 --> 00:37:54,640

A deputy district attorney would once prosecuted Walker,

757

00:37:54,640 --> 00:37:57,760

became terrified that he might be Walker's target.

758

00:37:57,760 --> 00:37:59,320

The system where it can't be traced.

759

00:37:59,320 --> 00:38:01,000

So when suddenly the system discovered

760

00:38:01,000 --> 00:38:05,160

that I had 2.2 pounds of poison in the United States,

761

00:38:05,160 --> 00:38:06,000

they went crazy.

762

00:38:06,000 --> 00:38:09,280

Like, what does G. Daniel Walker want with this poison?

763

00:38:09,280 --> 00:38:11,560

Well, the little lady that lives in Dubuque, Iowa

764

00:38:11,560 --> 00:38:12,800

that has an antique collection

765

00:38:12,800 --> 00:38:14,520

that has never heard of the name G. Daniel Walker,

766

00:38:14,520 --> 00:38:16,600

knew that I didn't have that poison for her.

767

00:38:16,600 --> 00:38:18,080

So she had no concern.

768

00:38:18,080 --> 00:38:19,960

There were a lot of deputy attorney generals,

769

00:38:19,960 --> 00:38:21,920

a lot of United States assistant,

770

00:38:21,920 --> 00:38:25,040

United States attorneys that suddenly became very uncomfortable.

771

00:38:25,040 --> 00:38:27,360

And there were a lot of judges that became uncomfortable.

772

00:38:27,360 --> 00:38:29,640

And they started a major investigation.

773

00:38:29,640 --> 00:38:30,480

They indicted me.

774

00:38:30,480 --> 00:38:33,840

A two-count indictment for importing this poison.

775

00:38:33,840 --> 00:38:36,160

They spent about a million, \$300,000

776

00:38:36,160 --> 00:38:37,440

working up a prosecution.

777

00:38:37,440 --> 00:38:38,640

And then they folded their tent

778

00:38:38,640 --> 00:38:41,480

because they found out that I hadn't broken the law.

779

00:38:41,480 --> 00:38:43,320

Did you use the poison?

780

00:38:43,320 --> 00:38:45,960

They've never found any sufficient evidence

781

00:38:45,960 --> 00:38:47,120

to charge me with having used it.

782

00:38:47,120 --> 00:38:49,320

But it certainly caused one deputy attorney general

783

00:38:49,320 --> 00:38:52,800

in the state of California to go through his cabinets

784

00:38:52,800 --> 00:38:58,320

and take all ingestible items out, toothpaste and liquor.

785

00:38:58,320 --> 00:38:59,800

And finally his wife said, well, gee,

786

00:38:59,800 --> 00:39:00,680

it could be in the carpet.

787

00:39:00,680 --> 00:39:01,880

So they recarbonized their home.

788

00:39:01,880 --> 00:39:04,800

And finally they sold the home, moved.

789

00:39:04,800 --> 00:39:07,440

So in other words, creating paranoia

790

00:39:07,440 --> 00:39:10,920

in a person can be oftentimes even more insidious

791

00:39:10,920 --> 00:39:12,520

and just making verbal threats.

792

00:39:12,520 --> 00:39:14,880

It's a better gamesmanship than doing physical violence.

793

00:39:14,880 --> 00:39:17,240

Because fear lives with you 24 hours a day.

794

00:39:17,240 --> 00:39:18,440

Fear never goes away.

795

00:39:18,440 --> 00:39:20,360

If you kill somebody, that's over.

796

00:39:20,360 --> 00:39:21,560

Or attempt to kill somebody.

797

00:39:21,560 --> 00:39:22,160

Yes.

798

00:39:22,160 --> 00:39:25,800

If you've hurt them, you know, and as long as a pain is there,

799

00:39:25,800 --> 00:39:30,480

but fear is a pain that lives with you forever.

800

00:39:30,480 --> 00:39:35,800

Since 1977, G. Daniel Walker has been denied parole seven times.

801

00:39:35,800 --> 00:39:38,480

If the state does grant him parole on the murder charge,

802

00:39:38,480 --> 00:39:41,480

Walker still faces a 50-year term on federal charges,

803

00:39:41,480 --> 00:39:44,880

stemming from credit card frauds he committed from inside prison.

804

00:39:49,520 --> 00:39:52,560

When we return, FBI and Florida investigators

805

00:39:52,560 --> 00:39:54,840

track an elusive diabolical killer.

806

00:40:06,440 --> 00:40:10,960

On May 26, 1989, Joanne Rogers and her daughters Michelle,

807

00:40:10,960 --> 00:40:17,400

17, and Christie, 14, left their farm in Wilshire, Ohio

808

00:40:17,400 --> 00:40:22,120

for a long anticipated vacation in Florida.

809

00:40:22,120 --> 00:40:24,400

They visited the zoo in Jacksonville,

810

00:40:24,400 --> 00:40:27,400

then drove to Kennedy Space Center, Disney World,

811

00:40:27,400 --> 00:40:30,360

and the Epcot Center before arriving in Tampa on June

812

00:40:30,360 --> 00:40:32,440

1st to Thursday.

813

00:40:32,480 --> 00:40:36,400

Boy, I'm on a trip.

814

00:40:36,400 --> 00:40:38,400

There, the Rogers carefree vacation

815

00:40:38,400 --> 00:40:40,520

came to a sudden and horrifying end.

816

00:40:43,200 --> 00:40:45,360

I knew they were supposed to be back maybe on Saturday,

817

00:40:45,360 --> 00:40:48,000

Sunday, maybe on Monday.

818

00:40:48,000 --> 00:40:51,240

But Tuesday morning, I got a little concerned about it.

819

I called her mom, and she hadn't even called her.

820

And I knew something had happened there,

828

Each had been bound with tape, weighted with a cinder block,

829

00:41:19,000 --> 00:41:22,320

and dumped into the bay, still alive.

830

00:41:22,320 --> 00:41:24,760

All three had apparently been sexually assaulted.

831

00:41:25,480 --> 00:41:27,840

2, 3, go.

832

00:41:27,840 --> 00:41:32,240

The victims were Joanne, Michelle, and Christy Rogers.

833

00:41:32,240 --> 00:41:34,280

Once again, authorities were confronted

834

00:41:34,280 --> 00:41:38,840

with a grim harvest of an unknown psychopathic killer.

835

00:41:38,840 --> 00:41:43,920

Male serial killers are so difficult to apprehend.

836

00:41:43,920 --> 00:41:49,320

They kill strangers, unknown motive, no crime scene,

837

00:41:49,320 --> 00:41:52,640

no fingerprints, no other physical evidence,

838

00:41:52,640 --> 00:41:55,560

usually only a dump site.

839

00:41:55,560 --> 00:42:00,520

And that is the modus operandi of the male serial killer.

840

00:42:03,800 --> 00:42:05,840

The murders of Joanne, Michelle, and Christy

841

00:42:05,840 --> 00:42:08,280

were classic psychopathic killings,

842

00:42:08,280 --> 00:42:11,760

cunningly concede and executed without remorse.

843

00:42:11,760 --> 00:42:13,480

The maddening scarcity of evidence

844

00:42:13,480 --> 00:42:16,920

has limited authorities to assumptions and speculation.

845

00:42:16,920 --> 00:42:18,960

Without a name, face, or fingerprint,

846

00:42:18,960 --> 00:42:22,440

police have attempted to construct the profile of a killer.

847

00:42:22,440 --> 00:42:25,120

It is at best a slow, frustrating process.

848

00:42:28,760 --> 00:42:31,520

Tampa Bay was the final stop on the Rogers itinerary

849

00:42:31,520 --> 00:42:32,880

before they returned to Ohio.

850

00:42:35,760 --> 00:42:37,840

Christy, isn't that last place we went to?

851

00:42:37,840 --> 00:42:38,740

Oh, yeah.

852

00:42:38,740 --> 00:42:39,640

Did you love it?

853

00:42:39,640 --> 00:42:42,240

Joanne, Michelle, and Christy checked into their motet

854

00:42:42,240 --> 00:42:44,480

around noon on June 1.

855

00:42:44,480 --> 00:42:46,760

Within hours, fate and happenstance

856

00:42:46,760 --> 00:42:50,400

brought them into the range of a lurking killer.

857

00:42:50,440 --> 00:42:53,320

We believe that they were victims of opportunity.

858

00:42:53,320 --> 00:42:57,680

What that means, basically, is he surveilled them.

859

00:42:57,680 --> 00:43:00,400

He knew that they were the ones that he wanted to approach,

860

00:43:00,400 --> 00:43:01,320

and he had planned this.

861

00:43:01,320 --> 00:43:02,960

But it wasn't that much in advance,

862

00:43:02,960 --> 00:43:05,800

because the circumstances of their travels

863

00:43:05,800 --> 00:43:08,800

wouldn't lend to that.

864

00:43:08,800 --> 00:43:11,080

Authorities believe that in order to bring Joanne

865

00:43:11,080 --> 00:43:13,200

and her daughters under his control,

866

00:43:13,200 --> 00:43:18,080

the killer first had to overcome their natural suspicions.

867

00:43:18,080 --> 00:43:20,120

We feel that the offender presented himself

868

00:43:20,160 --> 00:43:22,600

in a very non-threatening manner.

869

00:43:22,600 --> 00:43:25,160

Something where he made it enticing or inviting to them

870

00:43:25,160 --> 00:43:28,040

struck up a conversation, and that in his physical appearance,

871

00:43:28,040 --> 00:43:30,280

he was probably pleasing to look at someone

872

00:43:30,280 --> 00:43:32,040

that they felt comfortable with.

873

00:43:32,040 --> 00:43:33,360

Time appears to be the car.

874

00:43:33,360 --> 00:43:36,840

It's a two-door, old, blue and collar.

875

00:43:36,840 --> 00:43:39,960

On June the 8th, the Rogers car was found at a boat ramp
