And he said, no, I haven't heard from her. And this was about 12 minutes later.

We started asking for her on the radio at which time she did not answer.

Larry drove to Lucy's last reported destination and then passed her house.

Less than a block away, he spotted Lucy's cab, but Lucy was not driving.

And I'd asked Bruce right away. I said, are you in front of me, Bruce?

133

And he said, no. And right away he replied, well, the guy stole in the cab.

And it's a shock to the people that live here that a crime like this could occur

We were missing her wallet and her yellow jacket, which she'd been wearing.

149

The wallet was subsequently recovered.

150

Our best information is that Robbery was the motive for this murder.

151

She had probably about \$100 in taxi fares in the cab when the killing occurred,

152

00:17:15,320 --> 00:17:17,320

and that money is missing.

153

00:17:19,320 --> 00:17:24,320

When police examined Lucy's cab, they found blood spattered on the dashboard,

154

00:17:24,320 --> 00:17:26,320

front seat and steering wheel.

155

00:17:26,320 --> 00:17:31,320

Oddly, lab tests would determine that none of the blood was Lucy's.

156

00:17:32,320 --> 00:17:36,320

We're surmising that the attack on her took place outside the taxi

157

00:17:36,320 --> 00:17:42,320

and that the attacker somehow cut himself during the attack and bled inside the taxi while

158

00:17:42,320 --> 00:17:46,320

he occupied it for the 20 or 25 minutes after the offense occurred.

159

00:17:46,320 --> 00:17:51,320

What we don't know is whether the person who killed her was her last fare,

160

00:17:51,320 --> 00:17:54,320

may have been in the taxi with her and forced her to get out,

161

00:17:54,320 --> 00:17:58,320

or it also could have been somebody who flagged her down and dragged her out of the taxi

162

00:17:58,320 --> 00:18:00,320

and then stabbed her.

163

00:18:05,320 --> 00:18:10,320

18 hours after Lucy Tremel was killed, the murder weapon was found in the driveway

164

00:18:10,320 --> 00:18:12,320

of a local resident.

165

00:18:13,320 --> 00:18:16,320

Police learned that it had been stolen from a hotel employee,

166

00:18:16,320 --> 00:18:20,320

leading them to believe that the killer may have been from out of town.

167

00:18:22,320 --> 00:18:24,320

We've interviewed a lot of people.

168

00:18:24,320 --> 00:18:26,320

We did neighborhood inquiries.

169

00:18:26,320 --> 00:18:31,320

We were unable to find anybody who had seen or heard anything at the time of Lucy's death.

170

00:18:33,320 --> 00:18:36,320

That is kind of unusual because at that time of morning,

171

00:18:36,320 --> 00:18:40,320

there's usually people out on the street, but it's unfortunate,

172

00:18:40,320 --> 00:18:42,320

but that's what we're stuck with.

173

When we learned that Lucy died, it took us a while to realize that it was true.

She was just interesting.

Georgia told Daryl that her father was a Cherokee Indian,

187

It is a Watson-Jones or modified Watson-Jones technique.

The family or the physician may remember this.

Sheriff Adams next contacted Linda Gallinear, a forensic artist renowned for her ability to create accurate composite drawings based on human remains.

One of the first things we do are get photos of the skulls, and it's important for those to be to scale the same size of the skull.

We use the crime lab to do that, and they bring forth profiles and facial front of the skulls themselves.

Maybe my people that I was trying to locate hadn't seen Miss Panasafki for several years.
