and soon Miami had yet another problem, corrupt officers

at the heart of its police department.

ties he had been able to hide when he joined the police force.

Garcia was not content with nickel and dime shakedowns.

He grew bold enough to confiscate literally

70

00:04:14,720 --> 00:04:17,800

boatloads of drugs and bogus police operations

71

00:04:17,800 --> 00:04:21,200

that were totally off the record, raids which eventually

72

00:04:21,200 --> 00:04:24,480

escalated into violence.

73

In July of 1985, Garcia learned that some 400 kilos

74

of pure cocaine would soon arrive in Miami.

He had allegedly intercepted a similar shipment two weeks

before, and it seemed as easy as taking candy from a baby.

Police!

But this time, Garcia's plans went sour.

Six of the doper's jumped in the water

84

Three of them drowned.

The officers left for 400 kilos of cocaine.

Metro Day Police Department began the investigation

89

immediately after the three bodies were found,

90

and they thought it was a routine homicide.

I need you to tell me exactly what it was you saw.

There were three of them.

The city of Miami Police Department.

Detectives were stunned.

Further investigation blew the lid off Armando Garcia's

Ultimately, he and 34 other Miami police officers

105

were arrested on corruption charges.

While in prison, Garcia and several other officers

111

allegedly hashed a secret plot to kill

112

a number of the witnesses scheduled to testify against them.

113

75,000.

114

In January of 1986, after four months in jail,

115

Garcia and several associates made bail.

116

According to investigators, they lost no time putting

117

their murder plans into action against one of the prosecution's

118

00:06:27,840 --> 00:06:29,760

top witnesses.

119

They supplied \$50,000 to one hit man for that hit,

120

00:06:33,960 --> 00:06:35,600

but it did not take place.

121

00:06:35,600 --> 00:06:38,640

He took their money and did not commit the hit.

122

And they attempted even themselves.

123

They hid in the bushes waiting for one of the government

124

witnesses, but never could find him.

125

In the end, none of the witnesses were harmed.

126

But in spite of their testimony, the corruption case

127

against Garcia and his co-defendants ended in a mistrial.

By then, however, evidence of the assassination

plots had come to light.

The former officers were indicted

131

on a second set of charges, including conspiracy

132

to commit murder.

Several of the officers after the indictment

134

decided that they would cooperate.

135

The other officers realized then that the case had reached

136

a point where it was almost a sure conviction

137

if they went to court.

138

At that point, they made a decision to take flight.

139

Armando Garcia disappeared in May of 1987.

140

He is 5 feet 8 inches tall, weighs 185 pounds,

141

00:07:33,840 --> 00:07:36,440

and has brown hair and brown eyes.

142

00:07:36,440 --> 00:07:39,920

Garcia was born in Cuba, and police now fear he may have

143

00:07:39,920 --> 00:07:42,040

slipped away to South America.

144

00:07:42,040 --> 00:07:45,240

He is married and is known to have two young daughters, ages

145

00:07:45,240 --> 00:07:47,880

3 and 4.

146

00:07:47,880 --> 00:07:50,680

Authorities are also seeking Garcia's father,

147

00:07:50,680 --> 00:07:53,200

Toribio Dagoberto Garcia.

148

00:07:53,200 --> 00:07:57,280

He is 55 years old, balding, and has brown eyes.

149

00:07:57,280 --> 00:08:03,160

He stands 5 feet 6 inches tall and weighs 170 pounds.

150

00:08:03,160 --> 00:08:05,000

A third suspect wanted in this case

151

00:08:05,000 --> 00:08:08,440

is Victor Zapata, another former officer.

152

00:08:08,440 --> 00:08:13,320

Zapata is 5 feet 9 inches tall, weighs 175 pounds,

153

00:08:13,320 --> 00:08:15,440

and has brown hair and brown eyes.

154

Next, two friends turn out to be brother and sister.

155

Perhaps you can help find the rest of the family.

It was just three days before Christmas in 1964.

157

A young woman from Flint, Michigan named Faith Marie Brown

158

stole out for a late night joy ride with two friends.

Fast to the night.

160

00:09:06,320 --> 00:09:07,320

Fast to the night.

161

00:09:07,320 --> 00:09:08,320

Come on.

162

00:09:08,320 --> 00:09:09,320

Oh, watch out.

163

00:09:09,320 --> 00:09:10,320

Watch out.

164

00:09:23,200 --> 00:09:28,480

Miraculously, the driver survived the crash,

165

00:09:28,480 --> 00:09:32,680

but both passengers were killed instantly.

166

Faith Brown was dead at the age of 26.

167

00:09:36,280 --> 00:09:38,760

In addition to her parents and four brothers,

168

Faith left behind seven children under the age of 10.

169

The untimely death of Faith Marie Brown

170

added one final tragic twist to the already complicated lives

171

of her four sons and three daughters.

172

Two divorces and now the fatal car crash

173

00:09:55,600 --> 00:09:58,760

has scattered the children to five different families.

174

It seemed they would be separated forever

175

00:10:01,000 --> 00:10:03,680

until a young woman named April Courgeous, who'd been adopted

176

00:10:03,680 --> 00:10:07,200

as a child, set out to find her biological parents.

177

In 1992, April was diagnosed with rheumatoid arthritis

178

00:10:14,720 --> 00:10:16,880

and hereditary disease.

179

00:10:16,880 --> 00:10:19,080

Concerned about her own children's health,

180

00:10:19,080 --> 00:10:23,760

April began her search, one with more than a share of surprises.

181

It all started in the records office of Shiawasi County,

182

00:10:26,840 --> 00:10:29,640

Michigan.

183

00:10:29,640 --> 00:10:32,720

I told them that I knew my name was Michelle Brown at birth,

184

00:10:32,720 --> 00:10:36,680

and that my birthday was September 18, 1961.

185

And I was adopted, and I'd like any information

186

00:10:39,160 --> 00:10:42,320

available on my adoption.

187

00:10:42,320 --> 00:10:45,120

Whom there's another child named Brown.

188

00:10:45,120 --> 00:10:47,520

I kind of glanced over, and I seen the name Michael Brown

189

00:10:47,520 --> 00:10:48,600

right underneath mine.

190

00:10:48,600 --> 00:10:50,480

And so I knew I had a brother.

191

May I take a look at that?

192

00:10:51,840 --> 00:10:54,920

April was not permitted to examine the records.

193

00:10:54,920 --> 00:10:58,440

Strict regulations govern the release of adoption files,

194

00:10:58,440 --> 00:11:00,320

and April petitioned a county judge

195

00:11:00,320 --> 00:11:02,600

for access to the information.

196

00:11:02,600 --> 00:11:06,240

Three days later, she received this letter.

197

00:11:06,240 --> 00:11:08,440

It contained the astonishing revelation

198

that April had four brothers and two sisters.

199

However, the key details that would allow her to find them

200

had been omitted.

201

April Courges was trapped in a bureaucratic catch 22.

202

I was a little bit upset that there wasn't

203

more information released on the other brothers and sisters.

204

We were all over the legal age, and we're all mature adults

205

00:11:34,440 --> 00:11:36,080

now, and we should be able to handle it.

206

And I was a little bit upset that they wouldn't give us

207

00:11:39,120 --> 00:11:41,500

any more than they did, but yet thankful that they at least

208

00:11:41,500 --> 00:11:43,520

give me that much.

209

I never even knew you were adopted.

210

Mike Galloway, the husband of April's best friend,

211

Deb, had also been adopted.

212

He was especially curious about April's investigation.

213

I mean, I knew that my birth name was Brown,

214

but they weren't willing to divulge any other names.

Your birth name is Brown?

223

had a brother born in Owasso in 1960.

225

He kind of looked over the top of the letter

226

and said, I was born in Owasso in 1960,

227

00:12:21,240 --> 00:12:24,080

and my last name was Brown.

228

We thought it would be funny if we were brother and sister,

229

00:12:26,400 --> 00:12:28,760

but we really didn't think that was a possibility.

230

Brown's a common name, and when I was brought up,

231

it's just like Smith or Jones or any other common name

232

So I'm the type of person that likes to see things in writing

234

The next morning, April met Mike and Deb at their house.

We jumped up and we hugged each other and Deb and said,

This is too wild.

I'm kind of glad that April and I didn't meet first

251

252

because then that would have been kind of shocking to have

253

kids with your own sister, I suppose.

254

Mike and April matched information

255

00:13:43,200 --> 00:13:45,960

from the county files with recollections primarily

256

from Mike's adoptive parents.

257

Soon a picture began to emerge of their birth mother, Faith

258

00:13:52,040 --> 00:13:52,920

Marie Brown.

259

Come on, we really need to talk about this now.

260

00:13:58,760 --> 00:14:00,040

Not in here.

261

00:14:00,040 --> 00:14:02,160

When she was just 16 years old, Faith

262

00:14:02,160 --> 00:14:04,880

had dropped out of high school to be married.

263

00:14:04,880 --> 00:14:06,840

By the time she was 20, she already

264

00:14:06,840 --> 00:14:10,800

had four children, including twin boys.

265

00:14:10,800 --> 00:14:13,640

Faith would lose them all when her young marriage ended

266

00:14:13,640 --> 00:14:15,120

in divorce.

267

00:14:15,120 --> 00:14:17,200

What are you talking about?

268

00:14:17,200 --> 00:14:19,200

They're coming with me, and if you try to fight me, Faith,

269

00:14:19,200 --> 00:14:21,000

I will take you to court.

270

00:14:21,000 --> 00:14:23,480

At the heart of the conflict was her husband's belief

271

00:14:23,480 --> 00:14:25,640

that another man had fathered the twins.

272

00:14:25,640 --> 00:14:27,840

You're not raising them either.

273

00:14:27,840 --> 00:14:29,840

Why are you doing this?

274

00:14:29,840 --> 00:14:33,040

Because I want to do what's best for the kids.

275

00:14:33,040 --> 00:14:35,760

Mike and April would later learn that their father

276

00:14:35,760 --> 00:14:39,400

was yet another man 25 years older than their mother.

277

00:14:39,400 --> 00:14:41,040

For a while, OK.

278

00:14:41,040 --> 00:14:42,040

OK.

279

00:14:42,040 --> 00:14:45,600

From what we know, our mother had a very hard time

280

00:14:45,600 --> 00:14:47,600

at anything she ever done.

281

00:14:47,600 --> 00:14:50,560

She had kids one right after the other,

282

00:14:50,560 --> 00:14:53,480

and like she wasn't responsible for them.

283

She wouldn't give them up for adoption,

284

00:14:54,960 --> 00:14:57,600

or they would eventually be taken away.

285

I don't think she could really handle

286

00:14:59,040 --> 00:15:03,520

the responsibilities of having the kids.

287

00:15:03,560 --> 00:15:07,720

In 1962, Michigan Social Services took custody

288

00:15:07,720 --> 00:15:09,440

of April and Michael.

289

00:15:09,440 --> 00:15:11,680

Three months later, their father and Faith

290

00:15:11,680 --> 00:15:14,080

had another daughter, Shannon.

291

00:15:14,080 --> 00:15:17,480

After Faith died, Shannon was put up for adoption,

292

00:15:17,480 --> 00:15:19,440

and the records sealed in county files.

293

00:15:19,440 --> 00:15:20,640

OK.

294

00:15:20,640 --> 00:15:22,680

We can see my family again.

295

00:15:22,680 --> 00:15:26,160

We believe that a gentleman by the name of Mr. Dennis

296

00:15:26,160 --> 00:15:27,720

is our father.

297

00:15:27,720 --> 00:15:31,120

Each family claimed their son did not commit suicide.

Tonight, we will be looking at two of the most baffling cases,

the cases of Sergeant Billy Ray Hargrove and Sergeant Mike

389

00:20:11,000 --> 00:20:12,520

Carmichael.

00:20:12,520 --> 00:20:15,560

The Army has refused to participate in our broadcast

391

00:20:15,560 --> 00:20:18,160

and stands by the judgment that the two soldiers killed

392

00:20:18,160 --> 00:20:19,720

themselves.

393

00:20:19,720 --> 00:20:24,520

Both families say the Army is dead wrong.

394

00:20:24,520 --> 00:20:27,840

Mike didn't have nothing to die for.

395

00:20:27,840 --> 00:20:29,920

No more than Billy had to die for.

396

00:20:29,920 --> 00:20:32,720

Neither one of them committed suicide.

397

00:20:32,720 --> 00:20:33,400

They didn't do it.

398

00:20:34,200 --> 00:20:37,360

Billy Ray Hargrove and Mike Carmichael

399

00:20:37,360 --> 00:20:41,200

led similar lives and suffered similar deaths.

400

00:20:41,200 --> 00:20:44,440

Both had planned careers in the military since childhood.

401

00:20:44,440 --> 00:20:46,400

Both had joined the Army in their teens

402

00:20:46,400 --> 00:20:49,520

and become the best of friends as they climbed the ranks.

403

Both had married Korean women while stationed in the Far East.

404

Tragically, Billy Ray Hargrove and Mike Carmichael

405

00:20:58,120 --> 00:21:00,400

died within six weeks of each other.

And according to the Army, they committed suicide

407

in a similar manner.

408

During Operation Desert Storm, Billy Ray Hargrove and his outfit

409

were sent from their base in Germany to Saudi Arabia.

410

However, the conflict ended before the platoon

411

00:21:17,920 --> 00:21:20,200

saw active duty.

412

When Billy finished Desert Storm and went back to Germany,

413

he was disappointed because his man did not

414

get a merit award, a medal, that he felt like they deserved.

And he set about trying to get the medal far

416

and every direction he went in, he couldn't accomplish it.

417

We're wondering when you'd recommend us for the Desert

418

Storm decoration.

419

Billy Ray, I appreciate everything you and the men

420

did during the campaign.

421

But since the unit did not go into combat,

422

I'm refusing the application.

423

Sir, I understand your point, but the men were just as-

I've decided to refuse the application.

Billy Ray could not accept the Army's decision

426

and made a questionable decision of his own.

He forged a superior signature on the appropriate documents.

A short time later, his men received their medals.

429

In June of 1991, Billy Ray arrived in Korea

Billy Ray called me January the 28th

I had visited their house, and they were fighting a lot.

She was constantly accusing him of having a girlfriend

And I just don't know how to fix it.

I looked at the writing, and I did not believe it was his writing.

It did not look to me like his writing.

The army acknowledges a possibility

508

that the suicide note might not have been in Billy Ray's

handwriting.

510

Even so, they ruled that he had killed himself,

511

00:25:37,640 --> 00:25:40,160

speculating that he had been driven to suicide

512

00:25:40,160 --> 00:25:44,040

by his upcoming court martial and divorce.

513

00:25:44,040 --> 00:25:47,560

He was not the type person to commit suicide,

514

00:25:47,560 --> 00:25:50,680

no matter what.

515

00:25:50,680 --> 00:25:53,360

Especially putting a rope around his neck.

516

00:25:53,360 --> 00:25:55,160

I just could not believe it.

517

00:25:55,160 --> 00:25:57,280

And I still don't believe it.

518

Something happened to him, but he did not commit suicide.

519

00:26:03,280 --> 00:26:05,600

The autopsy report yielded another piece

520

of mysterious evidence that seemed to bolster

521

00:26:08,160 --> 00:26:10,120

Sue Nunnely's claim.

522

Billy Ray had unexplained abrasions and lacerations

523

00:26:13,640 --> 00:26:16,240

on his face and hands.

524

00:26:16,240 --> 00:26:18,880

That would indicate to me that someone

525

00:26:18,880 --> 00:26:21,680

had been in a scrape or a fight.

526

00:26:21,680 --> 00:26:28,080

But the military in their report didn't question anyone

527

00:26:28,080 --> 00:26:32,200

or ask where the scratches come from.

528

00:26:32,200 --> 00:26:36,480

They just ignored them.

529

00:26:36,480 --> 00:26:41,120

Billy Ray Hargrove was laid to rest on March 4, 1992.

530

00:26:41,120 --> 00:26:42,960

One of the mourners at his funeral

531

00:26:42,960 --> 00:26:45,160

was his old friend, Mike Carmichael.

532

00:26:47,160 --> 00:26:48,720

When I found it didn't make Mike,

533

00:26:48,720 --> 00:26:54,080

it was at Billy's funeral when he brought Billy's body back home.

534

00:26:54,080 --> 00:26:57,760

And he told me, he said, our said, we'll give him hell.

535

We're going to make him pay the SOBs'

pay for what they've done.

After the service, Mike returned to the Hargrove's house

538

and he told me that if it was the last thing he ever did,

Just don't do anything until you hear from me.

OK.

and told us that Mike believed there

549

And there had been three other army personnel

551

00:27:39,400 --> 00:27:45,960

there in Correa that had supposedly committed suicide.

552

00:27:45,960 --> 00:27:49,240

And my nephew told his birth mother,

553

says, don't be surprised if I'm not next.

554

On March 22, 1992, Mike Carmichael returned to Korea

555

00:27:58,560 --> 00:28:01,840

and immediately began his own investigation.

556

He and his wife, Son Hee, visited Billy Ray's widow, Kim,

557

00:28:05,240 --> 00:28:08,440

and collected Billy Ray's personal papers.

Included was a letter Billy Ray had written to his father

559

00:28:11,280 --> 00:28:13,280

a few days before the hanging.

560

00:28:13,280 --> 00:28:18,200

And Harvey Hargrove says he never received the correspondence.

561

00:28:18,200 --> 00:28:23,480

He was supposed to have written me a letter sometimes

562

00:28:23,480 --> 00:28:24,520

in February.

563

00:28:24,520 --> 00:28:27,160

I don't know when, but he was supposed to have written me

564

00:28:27,160 --> 00:28:28,040

a letter.

565

00:28:28,040 --> 00:28:29,720

And I'm sure if I could find that letter,

566

it would explain everything.

567

Mike continued collecting Billy Ray's papers

By the next morning, Mike had still not returned home.

The army investigation was completed within a few days.

587

because he was despondent over financial matters

589

and Billy Ray's death.

590

Mike's wife has accepted the ruling.

591

00:29:55,760 --> 00:30:00,480

and his stepfather.

The birthday festivities promised to be a high point

in what had always been a close relationship.

Most had been disposed of, but the few that remained

771

Local divers immediately volunteered

797

to look for the body of Charles Horvath.

798

For five days, a search yielded nothing.

799

But the mysterious informant was apparently

watching the divers every move.

Denise received a second note, saying

And he said it wasn't Charles.

The dead man was later identified as a 64-year-old

821

Kelowna resident, a probable suicide.

Police now believe that the anonymous notes were hoaxes

and the discovery of a body just a coincidence.

Once again, it seemed that Charles must be alive.

Then a man named Gino Borden came forward,

Gino and his son had pitched their tent near Charles

little camp, and have coffee in the morning,

834

and play frisbee and catch with my son,

835

and just sit and chat with us.

What should I do with him?

The next morning, Gino had awakened to find Charles gone

852

and his things left behind.

When I first established that Charles had abandoned his

belongings at the campsite, it was assumed that something

It was so unlike him to have left his photographs behind,

Is it Joanne?

Charles supposedly called a Joanne Zebroff's apartment

867

in May of 1989.

But police later discovered that Joanne was mistaken.

869

Charles had actually come by in July, two full months

This revelation has led some to conclude

It is totally out of character for him to have gone out intentionally

883

to break away from his family

884

because he wasn't that kind of boy.

He may have tried to imply to people who he wanted to impress

886
