Today, Eric Dunowsky is a happy, healthy seven-year-old,

Kathleen's doctors feared the worst, cancer.

She was directed to come back on Monday

I just went into an absolute panic.

Kathleen has been healthy for more than three years.

121

But was she actually helped by the power of prayer?

124

Some are skeptical.

125

There's no question that the mind exerts an influence

126

over what happens in the body.

127

The issue at hand is whether prayer or any other kind

128

of mental exercise can predictably influence

129

what happens to a person.

130

00:07:28,240 --> 00:07:31,360

And with respect to prayer, there simply

131

is no evidence that it does.

132

Dr. Larry Dossi, former chief of staff at Medical City

Hospital in Dallas, Texas, takes issue with Dr. Barrett.

One of the best kept secrets in modern medicine

135

00:07:47,000 --> 00:07:51,880

is the scientific data surrounding prayer.

136

00:07:51,880 --> 00:07:53,800

Currently, there are over 130 studies

137

00:07:53,800 --> 00:07:56,000

showing that if you bring prayer into the laboratory,

138

00:07:56,000 --> 00:07:57,760

the hospital or the clinic.

139

00:07:57,760 --> 00:08:03,560

And you do what we call a controlled double blind study.

140

00:08:03,560 --> 00:08:07,120

The prayer works.

141

00:08:07,120 --> 00:08:09,400

The most significant study in the century,

142

00:08:09,400 --> 00:08:12,160

I think, was done by Dr. Randolph Bird at the University

143

00:08:12,160 --> 00:08:14,720

of California Medical School in San Francisco.

144

00:08:14,720 --> 00:08:17,080

It took place in the coronary care unit.

145

00:08:17,080 --> 00:08:19,240

Almost 400 people were involved.

146

00:08:19,240 --> 00:08:21,880

They either had a heart attack or severe chest pain.

147

00:08:21,880 --> 00:08:24,520

Everybody gets treated with state-of-the-art coronary care

148

00:08:24,520 --> 00:08:25,640

techniques.

149

00:08:25,640 --> 00:08:28,520

The difference was that half the people get prayed for.

150

00:08:28,520 --> 00:08:30,120

This was a double blind study.

151

00:08:30,120 --> 00:08:33,880

Nobody knew who was and wasn't being prayed for.

152

00:08:33,880 --> 00:08:35,800

The results showed that the prayed for patients

153

00:08:35,800 --> 00:08:37,600

did significantly better.

154

00:08:37,600 --> 00:08:39,120

They needed fewer drugs.

155

00:08:39,120 --> 00:08:41,160

There were fewer deaths in the prayed for group.

156

00:08:41,160 --> 00:08:42,920

And nobody in the prayed for group

157

00:08:42,920 --> 00:08:45,160

wound up on the mechanical ventilator.

158

00:08:45,160 --> 00:08:48,080

12 of the people not being prayed for had to have this done.

159

00:08:51,680 --> 00:08:53,560

Many in the medical community find

160

00:08:53,560 --> 00:08:56,080

Dr. Bird's study unconvincing.

161

00:08:56,080 --> 00:08:59,240

And even his proponents admit that when it comes to prayer,

162

00:08:59,240 --> 00:09:02,240

you cannot adequately monitor a human control group.

163

But sometimes, as in our next story,

164

the life of a child can make scientific studies

165

00:09:11,440 --> 00:09:14,640

seem completely irrelevant.

166

On March 2, 1988, at Children's Hospital in Pittsburgh,

167

00:09:18,240 --> 00:09:21,920

Pennsylvania, will renowned organ transplant specialist

168

00:09:21,920 --> 00:09:26,000

Dr. Thomas Starzel worried over one of his patients,

169

00:09:26,000 --> 00:09:29,120

an 11-month-old baby boy, Eric Danowski,

170

00:09:29,120 --> 00:09:33,440

who had just undergone a liver transplant.

171

00:09:33,440 --> 00:09:38,160

By the time he had his first transplant in February of 1988,

172

00:09:38,160 --> 00:09:41,600

he was already quite ill.

173

00:09:41,600 --> 00:09:45,920

His outlook became progressively worse

174

00:09:45,920 --> 00:09:50,360

because the first liver was rejected,

175

00:09:50,360 --> 00:09:53,040

necessitating a second one, which was done about eight

176

00:09:53,040 --> 00:09:54,960

or nine days later.

177

00:09:54,960 --> 00:09:57,360

The second one, I was like, how much more

178

00:09:57,360 --> 00:09:58,920

can his little body take?

179

00:09:58,920 --> 00:10:00,400

He was so frail.

180

00:10:00,400 --> 00:10:02,040

He had bone sticking out of his back.

181

00:10:02,040 --> 00:10:05,320

He was so skinny and had been bedridden for so long

182

00:10:05,320 --> 00:10:08,000

that we were, you know, you had your doubts.

183

00:10:08,000 --> 00:10:10,760

I mean, it kept my faith, kept positive attitude.

184

00:10:10,760 --> 00:10:12,680

But in the back of your mind, there's always that doubt,

185

00:10:12,680 --> 00:10:14,680

is he really going to be able to pull through all this,

186

00:10:14,680 --> 00:10:16,840

you know?

187

00:10:16,840 --> 00:10:19,240

Three weeks after Eric's second transplant,

188

00:10:19,240 --> 00:10:21,800

his parents were put on alert again.

189

00:10:21,800 --> 00:10:24,880

Dr. Starzel was not optimistic.

190

00:10:24,880 --> 00:10:28,800

Dr. Starzel, how's Eric?

191

00:10:28,800 --> 00:10:30,240

I'm afraid not good.

192

00:10:30,240 --> 00:10:33,920

Eric has developed viral pneumonia.

193

00:10:33,920 --> 00:10:38,440

And I have given him about a 50-50 chance.

194

00:10:38,440 --> 00:10:41,040

50-50?

195

00:10:41,040 --> 00:10:43,240

Well, what can you do for him?

196

00:10:43,240 --> 00:10:46,080

There's really nothing more we can do.

197

00:10:46,080 --> 00:10:48,400

I think you should prepare yourself

198

00:10:48,520 --> 00:10:51,240

for the worst during the next 48 hours.

199

00:10:54,920 --> 00:10:57,240

48?

200

00:10:57,240 --> 00:10:58,280

I'm sorry.

201

00:10:58,280 --> 00:11:03,480

And down inside, I guess I wouldn't accept that, you know?

202

But hearing it from such a powerful doctor who has been

203

through so much and has seen so much,

204

00:11:09,360 --> 00:11:13,440

that it was a very scary thought coming, you know,

205

a statement coming from him.

206

I didn't want to hear that my son wasn't going to live.

207

00:11:24,240 --> 00:11:27,240

There's nothing more the doctors could do,

208

00:11:27,240 --> 00:11:29,400

and there was nothing we could do.

209

00:11:29,400 --> 00:11:31,840

And the only thing that we had left

210

00:11:31,840 --> 00:11:34,320

was to hope that the Lord would answer our prayers.

211

He said that the next 48 hours are very crucial.

212

00:11:41,760 --> 00:11:44,560

That same night, Debbie spoke with Jack Grazier,

213

00:11:44,560 --> 00:11:47,240

a newspaper reporter who had written several articles

214

about Eric's medical odyssey.

215

00:11:49,400 --> 00:11:52,000

Jack told Debbie he would write another piece,

216

00:11:52,000 --> 00:11:56,720

asking his readers to pray for the boy.

217

00:11:56,720 --> 00:11:58,840

The article appeared in the Erie, Pennsylvania

218

00:11:58,840 --> 00:12:01,440

Daily Times a few days later.

219

00:12:01,440 --> 00:12:04,720

Immediately, churches all over central Pennsylvania

220

00:12:04,720 --> 00:12:07,000

were inundated with worshipers praying

221

00:12:07,000 --> 00:12:10,200

for little Eric Denowski.

222

00:12:10,200 --> 00:12:14,160

I felt that heaven was bombarded that night with prayers.

223

00:12:14,160 --> 00:12:20,200

And I really, really felt strongly in the power of prayer.

224

00:12:20,200 --> 00:12:21,720

You know, we both went down to the chapel,

225

00:12:21,720 --> 00:12:25,560

and we were like, God, whatever you have in store for us,

226

00:12:25,560 --> 00:12:28,520

just give us the strength to deal with it,

227

00:12:28,520 --> 00:12:30,880

whether you want Eric or whether you're

228

00:12:30,880 --> 00:12:32,400

going to keep him with us.

229

00:12:32,400 --> 00:12:36,480

You know, we want him with us, but just give us some strength,

230

00:12:36,480 --> 00:12:38,240

and we'll deal with what we have to deal with.

231

Within a few days, it seemed that a miracle was taking place.

232

Eric experienced a sudden and unexpected turnaround.

233

Less than a week later, it was Eric's first birthday.

His family and medical team gathered to celebrate.

235

Hi, Dr. Stargle.

Well, I've got some pretty good news for you

237

folks on this birthday.

238

00:13:03,920 --> 00:13:04,720

What?

239

00:13:04,720 --> 00:13:07,040

Looks like a lot of people are going to be

240

00:13:07,560 --> 00:13:11,360

Look like Eric has beaten the virus.

241

00:13:11,360 --> 00:13:12,160

Really?

242

00:13:12,160 --> 00:13:14,480

Are you serious, doctor?

243

00:13:14,480 --> 00:13:15,920

That's great.

244

00:13:15,920 --> 00:13:20,840

I feel in my heart that Eric's recovery was definitely

245

00:13:20,840 --> 00:13:21,920

a miracle.

246

00:13:21,920 --> 00:13:24,800

He was just such a very sick little boy.

247

00:13:24,800 --> 00:13:29,040

I've had some of the best doctors in the world state

248

00:13:29,040 --> 00:13:30,640

that medically there was nothing more

249

00:13:30,640 --> 00:13:34,000

that they could do for him.

250

00:13:34,000 --> 00:13:35,880

It was the first day that I think

251

00:13:35,880 --> 00:13:39,000

I felt like a really sense of relief

252

00:13:39,000 --> 00:13:41,160

that he was going to make it.

253

00:13:41,160 --> 00:13:44,960

Did prayer give Eric a booster?

254

00:13:44,960 --> 00:13:45,480

I don't know.

255

00:13:45,480 --> 00:13:50,320

When I was young, I would probably have scoffed at the idea.

256

00:13:50,320 --> 00:13:53,700

But I've seen things and uncovered things

257

00:13:53,700 --> 00:13:58,320

over the last nearly 40 years that

258

00:13:58,320 --> 00:14:03,280

make me unwilling to be nihilistic about any possibility.

259

00:14:03,280 --> 00:14:08,200

And I think that includes prayer.

260

00:14:08,200 --> 00:14:11,280

Eventually, Eric underwent a third liver transplant.

261

00:14:11,280 --> 00:14:13,880

This one a resounding success.

262

00:14:13,880 --> 00:14:17,000

Today, Eric is eight years old and going strong,

263

00:14:17,000 --> 00:14:21,520

more than able to keep up with his big brother.

264

00:14:21,520 --> 00:14:25,720

Thankfully, Eric was far too young to remember his ordeal.

265

00:14:25,720 --> 00:14:27,880

His parents have told him about it, though,

266

00:14:27,880 --> 00:14:29,200

and he thinks he understands.

267

00:14:33,760 --> 00:14:39,240

When I found out how sick I was, I realized

268

00:14:39,240 --> 00:14:47,560

that I was very sick and a lot of people were praying for me.

269

00:14:47,560 --> 00:14:49,880

I want to make one thing perfectly clear.

270

00:14:49,880 --> 00:14:53,640

If you've got appendicitis, you ought to have an appendectomy.

271

00:14:53,640 --> 00:14:56,200

We're not advising people to give up drugs and surgical

272

00:14:56,200 --> 00:14:59,800

procedures and just wing it with prayer.

273

00:14:59,800 --> 00:15:02,640

On the other hand, you should feel free while you're doing

274

00:15:02,640 --> 00:15:04,880

that while you're having surgery for your appendicitis

275

00:15:04,880 --> 00:15:06,520

to get prayed for too, because there

276

00:15:06,520 --> 00:15:08,840

are studies which show, literally,

277

00:15:08,840 --> 00:15:12,680

that prayer increases the healing rate of surgical wounds.

278

00:15:12,680 --> 00:15:14,040

So we ought to do what works.

279

00:15:14,040 --> 00:15:19,120

I think this just falls into the category of common sense.

280

00:15:19,120 --> 00:15:23,280

Did prayer help Kathleen Berghardt and Eric Donalski?

281

Each of us must decide for ourselves.

282

While prayer can never take the place of medicine,

283

00:15:28,760 --> 00:15:31,080

it seems to offer a powerful assist.

284

Next, authorities need your help to capture a fugitive drug

285

lord who escaped from custody dressed as a woman.

286

August 4, 1994, 21-year-old Lionel Louvian

287

00:15:55,560 --> 00:15:58,360

was arrested in Houston, Texas, the culmination

288

00:15:58,360 --> 00:16:01,160

of a six-month sting operation.

289

00:16:01,160 --> 00:16:04,040

Despite his youth, Louviano was a key figure

290

00:16:04,040 --> 00:16:06,880

in an international drug ring that reportedly moved

291

00:16:06,880 --> 00:16:10,160

nearly a quarter of a million dollars in heroin every month.

292

Louviano faced the very real possibility

of spending the best years of his life behind bars.

Louviano shared room 3B3 with a total stranger named Vasquez

They indicated they were going to visit the individual

321

across the bed from Lionel Louviano.

She would later slip away during the commotion

364

following the discovery of Louviano's escape.

365

Eventually, Louviano's accomplices would be captured.

The other passenger was Ruby's cousin, 17-year-old Tracy

Is anybody down there?

By the time help arrived, Tracy was the only person still

cannot understand, Arnold and Ruby

403

Arnold and Ruby were both yanked and sue.

They grew up together on the reservation,

430

began dating in high school, and soon fell in love.

Arnold was a very nice young man.

432

He's never been in any serious trouble of any kind.

Arnold and Ruby were still kids themselves

447

On Saturday, December 11, 1992, Ruby, Arnold, and Tracy

embarked on an all-night party spree.

house where they had left the baby.

Tracy's father was waiting for them.

453

Hey, Charlie.

was in the car, you know.

485

Arnold wasn't in the car, and I don't know where he was.

486

Ruby was crying.

487

She was saying, oh my god, oh my god.

488

She just kept hitting the car.

489

The next thing I know, the door, you know,

490

it was open a little ways, and she had enough room

491

feared that Arnold and Ruby had wandered off

506

and fallen through the ice at some other location.

507

We walked around the ice part.

508

We had one officer walk on the opposite side

509

of the railroad tracks, thinking maybe they wandered off

toward the lake area, which was also frozen.

511

I've been to a number of accidents

512

where there hasn't been somebody around.

513

The driver hasn't been there.

514

No passengers there.

515

00:27:17,960 --> 00:27:20,080

And a lot of times it's because they've

516

00:27:20,080 --> 00:27:22,120

been partying, out drinking.

517

00:27:22,120 --> 00:27:24,560

I mean, we do have a DWI law.

518

00:27:24,560 --> 00:27:26,760

That was initially my first thought.

519

00:27:26,760 --> 00:27:30,400

Maybe Arnold was out drinking and didn't want to get arrested.

520

00:27:30,400 --> 00:27:31,880

So we feared he'd show up in a few days.

521

I know he wouldn't hide.

522

You know, he would have come home to us, or called us,

532

turned the search into a personal crusade.

535

00:28:10,680 --> 00:28:14,240

He worked tirelessly investigating every possible lead

536

00:28:14,240 --> 00:28:15,200

day after day.

537

00:28:15,200 --> 00:28:18,240

He came up empty until the spring thaw.

538

00:28:18,520 --> 00:28:22,480

In early March, a passing motorist saw a body in the ditch,

539

00:28:22,480 --> 00:28:25,560

just 75 feet from the accident site.

540

00:28:25,560 --> 00:28:26,560

It was Ruby Breweer.

541

00:28:30,000 --> 00:28:34,000

I was very shocked the morning that I received the radio

542

00:28:34,000 --> 00:28:36,960

transmission that they'd found a body.

543

00:28:36,960 --> 00:28:40,480

Of course, it wasn't broadcasted any names across,

544

00:28:40,480 --> 00:28:43,480

but I knew immediately that it was a body.

545

00:28:43,480 --> 00:28:44,480

I was shocked.

546

00:28:44,480 --> 00:28:45,480

I was shocked.

547

00:28:45,600 --> 00:28:49,040

I didn't know any names across, but I knew immediately

548

00:28:49,040 --> 00:28:50,760

who they had found.

549

00:28:50,760 --> 00:28:53,560

It was either going to be Ruby Breweer or Arnold or Shambo.

550

00:28:56,560 --> 00:28:57,800

Her glasses were missing.

551

00:28:57,800 --> 00:28:59,920

Both shoes were missing.

552

00:28:59,920 --> 00:29:01,120

Her clothes were intact.

553

00:29:01,120 --> 00:29:02,560

It appeared to be the same clothes

554

00:29:02,560 --> 00:29:04,640

that she had on the night of the accident.

555

00:29:04,640 --> 00:29:06,960

But the body was very decomposed.

556

00:29:06,960 --> 00:29:09,080

It was hard to recognize.

557

00:29:09,080 --> 00:29:12,240

And in fact, we had to get down to look at a tattoo

558

00:29:12,240 --> 00:29:14,120

to get a positive identification of the body.

559

00:29:16,320 --> 00:29:18,840

At that time, our department decided

560

00:29:18,840 --> 00:29:21,040

that we would start pumping the ditch out.

561

00:29:21,040 --> 00:29:23,880

And about noon the next day, we found the body of Arnold

562

00:29:23,880 --> 00:29:28,240

submerged in the water about 15 feet away from where we found Ruby.

563

00:29:30,240 --> 00:29:32,640

Arnold's body was very well kept.

564

00:29:32,640 --> 00:29:35,040

His skin color was fine.

565

00:29:35,040 --> 00:29:36,840

He was not frozen to the ground.

566

00:29:36,840 --> 00:29:38,840

The clothes were not frozen to the ground.

567

00:29:38,840 --> 00:29:41,440

There is a question mark, as far as in our investigation,

568

00:29:41,440 --> 00:29:44,440

if he was swearing the same clothes that he was.

569

00:29:44,920 --> 00:29:46,320

But he was the night of the accident.

570

00:29:49,600 --> 00:29:52,440

Deputy Youngstrom was completely baffled.

571

00:29:52,440 --> 00:29:55,040

How could two bodies found in the same location

572

00:29:55,040 --> 00:29:58,080

be in such different states of decomposition?

573

00:29:58,080 --> 00:29:59,920

And how could they end up in an area

574

00:29:59,920 --> 00:30:03,840

that had already been so thoroughly searched?

575

00:30:03,840 --> 00:30:06,240

The bodies were immediately autopsied.

576

00:30:06,240 --> 00:30:10,320

But the results only served to deepen the mystery.

577

00:30:10,320 --> 00:30:12,840

There was no way of determining the time of death.

578

00:30:12,880 --> 00:30:15,960

And there seemed to be no evidence of foul play.

579

00:30:15,960 --> 00:30:18,160

The coroner concluded that Arnold and Ruby

580

00:30:18,160 --> 00:30:19,560

had both died of exposure.

581

00:30:22,200 --> 00:30:25,880

Death by exposure is kind of a, to me,

582

00:30:25,880 --> 00:30:29,480

it's just like they froze to death.

583

00:30:29,480 --> 00:30:33,120

And I cannot actually buy that.

584

00:30:33,120 --> 00:30:35,680

They may have froze to death, but they didn't freeze

585

00:30:35,680 --> 00:30:39,000

to death at that ditch.

586

00:30:39,000 --> 00:30:40,440

That's impossible that they could have been there

587

00:30:40,440 --> 00:30:42,360

the entire three months.

588

00:30:42,360 --> 00:30:46,240

I, myself, personally walked that ditch several times

589

Since Jean vanished, her children's

simmering disapproval of Al Henderson

has turned to outright suspicion,

702

pitting them against the man their mother planned to marry.

What follows is Al Henderson's account of Jean's last day.

704

Thank you.

Got the ticket.

713

Went inside the casino where Jean was waiting for me.

714

Here's the claim check for the car.

715

Our plan was that we would meet back at our hotel room

716

00:37:01,000 --> 00:37:04,720

at a quarter of 12.

717

Al claims he left Jean in the casino at around 9.30 AM.

718

Once outside, he planned to flag down a taxi

719

and return to their hotel.

There was no cab there.

721

Can you take these bags to security for checking out?

Still believing that nothing was wrong,

736

Al returned to the hotel and checked out.

737

He then took a cab back to the casino to find Jean.

738

When I saw that the car was right where it had been left

and spoke to the valet, nobody had brought a ticket for the car,

then I began to become alarmed.

Al says he thoroughly searched the lobby, the shops,

742

and the gaming area.

743

Jean Moore was nowhere to be found.

744

Over the next few days, Al questioned dozens of people

745

00:38:50,800 --> 00:38:54,880

and distributed thousands of these flyers in the Laughlin area.

746

Despite the offer of a \$25,000 reward,

747

00:38:58,080 --> 00:39:00,680

not one helpful call was received.

748

After a certain amount of time, I had to figure that something

749

terrible has happened.

750

Jean's children reached the same conclusion,

751

but they are convinced that Al Henderson knows more about Jean's

fate than he has admitted.

753

The more we find out about what supposedly happened as compared

to what can be verified, the less I'm inclined to believe

In my opinion, Al has not said everything that had happened.

The reason I say that is because, number one,

In his original statement to police, Al Henderson insisted

But Al told us that he left Jean at his side entrance

and gave her the ticket inside the casino.

Other details made Jean's children uneasy.

765

For starters, Jean had left most of her jewelry in the hotel room.

766

It seemed very odd to me that she had left her engagement ring

767

00:40:16,400 --> 00:40:18,160

that she was so proud of.

768

00:40:19,160 --> 00:40:20,960

I thought it was very strange.

769

She was not one to go out without her purse or without her jewelry.

770

Within a couple of days, or within the day,

771

00:40:28,560 --> 00:40:32,160

I had to go to the hotel room and I had to go to the hotel room.

772

Within a couple of days, or within the day,

773

I knew that he was involved.

774

In my heart, I know he was involved.

775

When I got off the plane, when I flew into Bullhead,

monitoring virtually every square inch of the casino

786

24 hours a day.

787

00:41:18,160 --> 00:41:21,160

Al Henderson says he pulled into the valet area

788

00:41:21,160 --> 00:41:23,160

at around 9.15 a.m.

789

00:41:23,160 --> 00:41:26,160

Surveillance tapes confirmed the arrival

790

00:41:26,160 --> 00:41:28,160

of Al's Cadillac that morning.

791

00:41:31,160 --> 00:41:35,160

Cameras in the lobby also recorded Al's entry into the casino.

792

00:41:35,160 --> 00:41:38,160

Beyond this point, Al and the surveillance footage

793

00:41:38,160 --> 00:41:41,160

seemed to disagree.

794

00:41:41,160 --> 00:41:43,160

This tape shows two views of the area

795

00:41:43,160 --> 00:41:46,160

where Al said he gave the valet ticket to Jean.

796

00:41:46,160 --> 00:41:50,160

Additional cameras should have picked up glimpses of Jean

797

00:41:50,160 --> 00:41:53,160

as she moved about the casino.

798

00:41:53,160 --> 00:41:56,160

I have reviewed four of those tapes of the areas

799

00:41:56,160 --> 00:42:00,160

that Mr. Henderson said that they were in.

800

00:42:00,160 --> 00:42:02,160

And the tapes that I have reviewed,

801

00:42:02,160 --> 00:42:04,160

the surveillance tapes that I have reviewed,

802

00:42:04,160 --> 00:42:08,160

we do not see Jeannie in any of those tapes.

803

00:42:08,160 --> 00:42:10,160

I can't really comment on that.

804

00:42:10,160 --> 00:42:13,160

I can only tell you what happened.

805

00:42:13,160 --> 00:42:17,160

I accept no responsibility for what their tapes show

806

00:42:17,160 --> 00:42:21,160

or don't show because I am not an expert in that field.

807

I can just tell you what happened.

808

00:42:24,160 --> 00:42:28,160

Al's assertion that he played Jean's lucky slot machine

809

00:42:28,160 --> 00:42:32,160

should also have been backed up by the cameras.

810

In examining the tapes for the time frame,

811

00:42:36,160 --> 00:42:40,160

Al gave us 945 to approximately 1015.

812

00:42:40,160 --> 00:42:44,160

The machines that he told security was her favorite machine.

813

00:42:44,160 --> 00:42:48,160

We do not see Al playing those machines.

814

00:42:48,160 --> 00:42:51,160

Well, the only response to that is that he was evidently

815

00:42:51,160 --> 00:42:54,160

looking at the tape of the wrong machine.

816

00:42:54,160 --> 00:42:59,160

I have checked with the surveillance personnel for the hotel

817

00:42:59,160 --> 00:43:02,160

and they have advised me that this is the group of machines

818

00:43:02,160 --> 00:43:05,160

that Al Henderson told the security personnel.

819

00:43:05,160 --> 00:43:07,160

It was Jeannie's favorite machine

820

00:43:07,160 --> 00:43:12,160

and asked if they would make a copy of them for him.

821

00:43:12,160 --> 00:43:14,160

He was instructed they could not do that

822

00:43:14,160 --> 00:43:16,160

that they would turn him over to the police.

823

00:43:16,160 --> 00:43:20,160

So these are the surveillance tapes for the machines AI told security

824

00:43:20,160 --> 00:43:22,160

with her favorite machine.

825

00:43:25,160 --> 00:43:30,160

Investigators began to wonder if Jean had been in Laughlin at all.

826

Eventually they found a waitress

827

who had served Al and Jean on Monday, April 6th, the day they arrived.

828

Other than the coffee shop,

we have nobody seeing Jeannie in the Laughlin area.

How would you like your steak cooked?

The question remained,

832

where was Jean more between the Monday sighting

833

and the Thursday report that she was missing?

834

A few weeks later, a witness came forward with a possible answer.

835

A friend of Jean's has made the stunning claim

836

00:44:02,160 --> 00:44:06,160

that she saw the couple 150 miles away from Laughlin

837

00:44:06,160 --> 00:44:09,160

at a gas station in their hometown of Apple Valley

838

00:44:09,160 --> 00:44:12,160

when, April 8th, 4.30 p.m.,

839

00:44:12,160 --> 00:44:17,160

the day before Jean was reported missing.

840

00:44:17,160 --> 00:44:19,160

The witness remembered the time

841

00:44:19,160 --> 00:44:22,160

as they were en route to a school function

842

00:44:22,160 --> 00:44:25,160

that would have been only at that time

843

00:44:25,160 --> 00:44:29,160

and pinpointed the time and date.

844

00:44:29,160 --> 00:44:36,160

I've provided several people with copies of my telephone log

845

00:44:36,160 --> 00:44:42,160

from Call USA showing that I made a call from Laughlin

846

00:44:42,160 --> 00:44:48,160

to the Victorville area at a little bit after 3 on that day.

847

00:44:48,160 --> 00:44:50,160

I had another call.

848

00:44:50,160 --> 00:44:54,160

I think it was at 6.59 on that day,

849

00:44:54,160 --> 00:44:57,160

so you've got less than four hours,

850

00:44:57,160 --> 00:44:59,160

and it's physically impossible.

851

00:44:59,160 --> 00:45:02,160

Even if all you did was drive from Laughlin

852

00:45:02,160 --> 00:45:04,160

and turn around and go back,

853

00:45:04,160 --> 00:45:07,160

you can't do it in less than six hours.

854

00:45:07,160 --> 00:45:11,160

Phone records verify the calls were made from Laughlin on Wednesday,

855

as Henderson says.

856

00:45:13,160 --> 00:45:17,160

Furthermore, Al's bookkeeper told us that he called her from Laughlin

857

00:45:17,160 --> 00:45:19,160

that same Wednesday evening.

858

And so we discussed various things,

859

and then he says, well, just a minute,

860

Jeannie wants to say hi too.

861

So Jeannie got on the phone,

862

and she was just happier than happy could be

863

Does Al Henderson know more about Jean's faith

Or is he something of a victim himself,

875

burdened with false accusations

876

00:46:06,160 --> 00:46:09,160

during a time of crushing personal loss?

877

Unequivocally, I had nothing to do

878

00:46:12,160 --> 00:46:15,160

with the disappearance of Jean Moore.

879
