but in a way that someone else would remove your pants from you

in a pulling motion, whereas pants were turned inside out.

523

His socks were turned inside out, his shoes were off,

524

00:27:47,000 --> 00:27:50,000

and his shirt was ripped open.

525

\$4,000 in American, Canadian and German currency

526

00:27:53,000 --> 00:27:55,000

was strewn around Blair's body.

527

00:27:55,000 --> 00:27:58,000

Another \$2,000 worth of jewelry, gold and platinum

528

00:27:58,000 --> 00:28:01,000

was found inside a small pack.

529

And there was one other perplexing clue.

530

The key to Blair's Toyota had suddenly reappeared

531

about 10 feet from his body.

We started looking at the angle of maybe a drug deal going bad.

That didn't pan out.

534

We started thinking about Robert Robert.

It was immediately first thought of,

536

Anything to explain how he was found, the way he was found,

Although Blair had been adamant that his life was in danger,

authorities now believe the threat was imaginary
