Whatever caused Judy to vanish occurred during the next eight

which animals had strewn over a 100-yard area.

Our victim was a wife female, probably

107

in her late 40s to mid 50s.

And the pathologist's report indicates

109

that there's puncture marks and cuts on the bra, which

could be consistent with stab wounds.

Jeff's flyers had been circulated throughout the area,

so a request was made for Judy's dental records.

after she had mysteriously vanished from Philadelphia.

Hi there.

129

Hi.

130

00:07:41,600 --> 00:07:44,920

One of them was retail clerk Joanne Stucker.

131

She seemed very alert to me.

132

00:07:46,560 --> 00:07:48,360

She was very pleasant.

133

00:07:48,360 --> 00:07:52,560

I didn't see anything about her that would indicate

134

that she wasn't right in any way.

135

Where are you from?

136

I'm from Boston.

I have a friend in there.

Judy Casey.

Casey, that's it.

141

Really?

142

My name's Judy, too.

143

She told me her husband was an attorney,

144

and that they were from Boston, and that they had been

145

in Pennsylvania.

And he was at a convention, and she decided to come down here.

147

If Judy left Philadelphia of her own free will,

151

I don't believe that she would have shown up at the airport

155

without her driver's license if she hadn't decided

156

that that was a way for her to kind of gracefully let

157

Jeff head towards Philadelphia and give her some time.

158

And I think then she maybe did show up at the hotel,

159

00:08:54,840 --> 00:08:56,760

brought him flowers to placate him,

160

00:08:56,760 --> 00:09:00,040

and then made her move.

161

I'm not going to try to suggest that she and I never

162

Was it a stranger or someone she may

have schemed to meet in Asheville?

172

If you're looking for the mystery man, there was a one.

173

Is it this way?

174

Judy was the type of person that could have easily

175

bumped into another person and spent some time with him.

176

Everybody was a good person to Judy.

177

And I think that was what made her vulnerable

178

to whatever happened to her.

Investigators trying to understand what happened

183

found two clues to who may have murdered her.

184

We found a blue and black backpack at the crime scene.

185

I believe that the backpack that was left

186

00:10:27,000 --> 00:10:28,600

doesn't belong to Judith Smith.

187

00:10:28,600 --> 00:10:31,800

I believe that it potentially belongs to our suspect.

188

00:10:31,800 --> 00:10:34,480

There was a pair of sunglasses there.

189

00:10:34,480 --> 00:10:37,640

These particular glasses were manufactured by Bollet.

190

00:10:37,640 --> 00:10:40,760

They retail for somewhere around \$110.

191

00:10:40,760 --> 00:10:42,600

And speaking with Judith's friends,

192

00:10:42,600 --> 00:10:45,760

Judith wouldn't have spent \$110 for a pair of glasses.

193

We believe that these glasses did not belong to Judith

194

00:10:49,280 --> 00:10:52,640

and that they potentially belong to our suspect.

195

North Carolina investigators still

196

00:10:54,680 --> 00:10:59,800

have no clue why Judith Smith was killed.

197

00:10:59,800 --> 00:11:01,960

Lieutenant Sam Casas does say, however,

198

00:11:01,960 --> 00:11:05,080

that they have ruled out robbery as a motive.

199

00:11:05,080 --> 00:11:08,160

Found at the crime scene was Judy's diamond wedding ring

200

00:11:08,160 --> 00:11:10,360

and \$167 in cash.

201

00:11:19,360 --> 00:11:20,360

You have a first?

202

00:11:20,360 --> 00:11:22,120

Yeah, you've got your first.

203

00:11:23,120 --> 00:11:25,880

On the night of July 9th, Colleen Nick

204

00:11:25,880 --> 00:11:27,720

took her six-year-old daughter Morgan

205

00:11:27,720 --> 00:11:31,680

to a Little League baseball game in Alma, Arkansas.

206

00:11:31,680 --> 00:11:35,240

It was an evening of shared joy between mother and child,

207

00:11:35,240 --> 00:11:39,640

with no hint of the nightmare about to unfold.

208

00:11:39,640 --> 00:11:41,680

We'd made the choice to go just Morgan and I

209

00:11:41,680 --> 00:11:43,600

just to have girls night out.

210

00:11:43,600 --> 00:11:49,680

And it was such a warm, close, fun night.

211

00:11:49,720 --> 00:11:51,720

You want to come with us to catch some fireflies?

212

00:11:51,720 --> 00:11:52,880

Well, I don't know if my mom's left.

213

00:11:52,880 --> 00:11:55,120

Throughout the evening, two local girls

214

00:11:55,120 --> 00:11:58,000

asked Morgan to come play with them.

215

00:11:58,000 --> 00:12:01,280

Mom, can me and my friends go catch fireflies?

216

00:12:01,280 --> 00:12:02,840

Oh, I don't think so, honey.

217

00:12:02,840 --> 00:12:03,840

Honey.

218

00:12:03,840 --> 00:12:05,400

Colleen, that should be fine.

219

00:12:05,400 --> 00:12:06,360

Are you sure it's safe?

220

00:12:06,360 --> 00:12:07,320

Sure.

221

00:12:07,320 --> 00:12:09,480

Finally, against my better judgment,

222

I told her that she could go and play.

223

And she threw arms around my neck and gave me a big hug.

228

229

the two girls returned to the field without Morgan.

230

Girls, girls, where's Morgan?

231

00:12:37,560 --> 00:12:39,560

Biocar getting the sand out of her shoe.

232

00:12:39,560 --> 00:12:40,560

Which car?

233

00:12:40,560 --> 00:12:42,560

I don't know. Yours, I guess.

234

00:12:42,560 --> 00:12:44,080

I'll be right back, OK?

235

00:12:44,080 --> 00:12:46,560

She was supposed to be dumping sand out of her shoes

236

00:12:46,560 --> 00:12:49,040

by my car, but I could see my car from where I was standing,

237

00:12:49,040 --> 00:12:50,040

and she wasn't there.

238

00:12:50,040 --> 00:12:51,040

Morgan!

239

00:12:51,040 --> 00:12:53,040

Morgan!

240

00:12:53,040 --> 00:12:56,560

I went over to the car, looked around the outside of the car,

241

00:12:56,560 --> 00:12:58,040

opened the doors, looked inside the car,

242

00:12:58,040 --> 00:13:00,840

thinking she had gotten in, even at one point,

243

00:13:00,840 --> 00:13:04,840

looked under the car, just thinking she has to be here somewhere.

244

00:13:09,840 --> 00:13:12,240

And within a couple of minutes, all the people,

245

00:13:12,240 --> 00:13:14,440

most of the cars were gone, and it was very clear

246

00:13:14,440 --> 00:13:16,440

that Morgan wasn't there.

247

As the parking lot emptied, panic began to overwhelm Colleen.

248

One of the baseball coaches arrived and questioned the two girls.

249

00:13:25,320 --> 00:13:26,320

These little girls.

250

00:13:26,320 --> 00:13:27,320

Girls, look at me.

251

00:13:27,320 --> 00:13:29,320

When you were in the field, were you there alone?

252

00:13:29,320 --> 00:13:32,320

They remembered seeing a man whom they described as creepy

253

00:13:32,320 --> 00:13:34,320

talking to Morgan in the field.

254

00:13:34,320 --> 00:13:36,320

I'm going to go find my mother, OK?

255

00:13:36,320 --> 00:13:37,320

Thank you. Thank you.

256

00:13:37,320 --> 00:13:38,320

Morgan!

257

00:13:38,320 --> 00:13:41,320

One of the coaches had a cell phone and made the initial 911

258

00:13:41,320 --> 00:13:43,320

call to law enforcement.

259

00:13:43,320 --> 00:13:46,320

They arrived within six minutes and began to call.

260

00:13:47,200 --> 00:13:49,200

They were looking for a cell phone, any media and massive search

261

00:13:49,200 --> 00:13:51,200

for Morgan that night.

262

00:13:51,200 --> 00:13:54,200

But the initial search failed to find Morgan Nick.

263

00:13:54,200 --> 00:13:57,200

The media was alerted and flyers were posted.

264

00:13:57,200 --> 00:14:01,200

Weeks stretched into months and finally years,

265

00:14:01,200 --> 00:14:04,200

with no sign of the blonde-haired little girl.

266

00:14:04,200 --> 00:14:07,200

It's the worst terror that any parent can ever feel.

267

00:14:07,200 --> 00:14:11,200

There's such a sense of it not being real somehow.

268

00:14:11,200 --> 00:14:14,200

It does not seem possible that your child could be missing,

269

00:14:15,080 --> 00:14:17,080

that someone could have taken your child.

270

00:14:17,080 --> 00:14:19,580

For five long years, Colleen Nick has

271

00:14:19,580 --> 00:14:22,080

searched for her daughter Morgan.

272

00:14:22,080 --> 00:14:23,960

Faced with the same circumstances,

273

00:14:23,960 --> 00:14:27,960

many of us would have given up hope, not Colleen.

274

00:14:27,960 --> 00:14:29,960

In fact, Colleen's personal tragedies

275

00:14:29,960 --> 00:14:32,920

led to a remarkable transformation.

276

00:14:32,920 --> 00:14:35,360

The once shy mother has become a leading activist

277

00:14:35,360 --> 00:14:39,160

for missing children all across the country.

278

00:14:39,160 --> 00:14:41,640

In the months following Morgan's disappearance,

279

00:14:41,640 --> 00:14:43,680

Colleen successfully lobbied the media

280

00:14:43,680 --> 00:14:47,560

to turn Morgan's disappearance into a national news story.

281

00:14:47,560 --> 00:14:49,560

It was then that Colleen discovered

282

00:14:49,560 --> 00:14:53,120

she was not alone in her grief.

283

00:14:53,120 --> 00:14:55,520

We began to get calls from other parents who

284

00:14:55,520 --> 00:14:58,760

had heard about Morgan, whose child was now missing, wanting

285

00:14:58,760 --> 00:15:00,760

to know what they could do.

286

00:15:00,760 --> 00:15:01,560

Where did they turn?

287

00:15:01,560 --> 00:15:03,480

What resources were available?

288

00:15:03,480 --> 00:15:05,560

And from that, we began to get involved

289

00:15:05,560 --> 00:15:09,960

in the bigger picture of children being missing.

290

00:15:09,960 --> 00:15:11,000

Yes, yes, come down.

291

00:15:11,640 --> 00:15:12,800

We really need your help.

292

00:15:12,800 --> 00:15:15,000

One year after her daughter's abduction,

293

There was some type of elacirated trauma

to all three victims' necks, which could not

which indicated to us that it had probably been dumped there

Investigators descended on the remote area.
