MODEL BUILDING:

A RUMOR IS PROVEN TRUE

Over the last almost 50 years there have been claims that the Air Force built models of flying saucers for wind tunnel testing. Roughly ten years ago I interviewed a Lt. Col. formerly at Wright-Patterson AFB who told a story of seeing such models when he was touring WPAFB as a high school student in the 1950's. However, there was no documentary confirmation, only a strong suspicion that it was true since it would be a logical thing for the Air Force to do it the AF scientists really believed that flying saucers were real.

Now we have confirmation. Recently the Army Security Agency declassified (in July, 1994) and then released (in August, 1996) several hundred pages of formerly secret documents generated by the Army Counter Intelligence Corps (CIC) in 1947. The great bulk of these documents are related to the search for information on the Horton brothers research on "flying wing" type aircraft. This research was carried out by German aeronautical engineers during WWII and involved the testing of an aircraft with a curved wing (parabola shape) and no fuselage. The Air Materiel Command at Wright Field immediately suspected that the flying saucers might be Russian technological developments based on the German war research and so the AMC prepared a list of Essential Elements of Information (EEI) to indicate to the CIC the types of information needed for proper intelligence evaluation of saucer sighting reports. (These EEI are referred to in the Sept. 24, 1947 letter from Lt. General Nathan Twining, Chief of AMC, to Brig. Gen. George Schulgen... see

Appendix R of the Condon Report. The EEI form the core of an Intelligence Collection document generated by Air Force General George Schulgen's office late in October, 1947, which was released to researchers roughly ten years ago.)

The AMC sent the EEI document to the CIC during the latter part of October. The CIC documents just released show that the CIC acted on the EEI immediately by sending a directive to the agents in Europe. The directive asked the agents to locate and "discreetly" interview German scientists who had any knowledge of the Horton brothers' work. The interesting part of the Secret directive is contained in the following paragraph:

File: D-198239

28 October 1947

To: (Distribution)

Inclosed EEI written at WRIGHT FIELD, Ohio, concerning flying saucers, is forwarded for compliance therewith. The Air Materiel Command is of the opinion that some sort of object, such as the flying saucer, did exist. At the present time, construction models are being built for wind tunnel tests.

An earlier related document, dated October 20, indicates that the models were based on "descriptions from various persons who claimed to have sighted these objects."

These documents show how seriously some sections of Air Force intelligence took the "GWR" (German War Research) hypothesis to explain flying saucers. Of course, if the Roswell material were a CFS (crashed flying saucer), SOMEONE at AMC and/or the Pentagon (top generals) would have known that the GWR hypothesis was wrong. Hence, anyone who accepts the reality of the CFS must assume that the "top brass" (top generals) did not tell any of their employees at AMC or at Air Intelligence in the Pentagon (lower generals, colonels, etc.) but, instead, let the employees proceed the best way they could to understand the flying saucer mystery. The employees, lacking physical proof, would allow for all reasonable possibilities to explain saucers, including the possibility that the Russians had leapfrogged our own aeronautical research by building on the GWR. Hence they would request the CIC to provide information on the nature and success of the GWR.

This suggestion that the top brass didn't tell the lower brass about "the hard evidence" seems unlikely, but it is not impossible and hence the above mentioned documents do not refute the CFS hypothesis.

On the other hand, they do show that the AF took this much more seriously than they let on to the press.

Hi,

Well, back in my ole Army days, keeping the frequencies secret was absolutley no concern, because the only radio traffic we used was encrypted.

You may hear this on short-wave as a droning, power-saw sort of sound.

To think that Area 51's radio traffic would not be secured through cyprtophraphy is naive.

Assuming there even is a secret anything at area 51.

Even so, some radio chatter would come from there 'in the clear', but other than flight control operations or other trivial tasks, all commo in and out is going to be well scrambled.

Or, even better, frequency-skipped.

That is to say that the transmitter broadcasts on one frequencny for about 1/50 of a second, then skips to another, and then another frequency continuously.

The reciever is also skipping, keeping in time with the transmitter.

If the frequencies used are all over the VHF/UHF bands, it may not even be possible to detect the transmitter!

Monitoring any one frequency range will only give the occasional pop or squeel, not enough to get a directional fix on.

More likely, commo in and out is via cable, fibre-optic, or line of sight microwave.

And all of it encrypted.

So, someone may have the radio freqs. for some walkie-talkies, or a jeep or two, but not anything important.

IMHO, of course.

The Dreamland Control frequency (apparently the Dreamland MOA) used to be on 261.1

I often heard the name "Dreamland" used on this freq, but this was about three years ago, before significant Area 51 publicity. I haven't had time to listen to the scanner much since then. They almost certainly aren't using the name "Dreamland" anymore, but the freq could still be in use.

In my experience, all aviation control traffic is in the clear. I've never encountered encrypted aviation traffic -- but the pilots can speak cryptically and change call signs between freqs. (Just a few grunts is all it take for clearance to Groom Lake since there is little other traffic.)

In my opinion, there is a lot of data in the air around Area 51 that no one has ever collected. It takes time, though, and you need to camp out in a location nearly in line of sight with the base, like Tikaboo Peak or the hills near Hancock Summit. I think if a competent radio monitor camped out on Tikaboo for a few days, he'd find out a lot about base operations.

Several new images have been added to my Area 51 Web site, including some spectacular shots of the secret Groom Lake base taken this past July by the intrepid reporter known only as Stargazer... These images can be found directly at <http://www.tiac.net/users/mayor/a51/stargazer.html>

From his own description:

Four photos taken of Area 51 from South to North end as seen from atop Tikaboo Peak, NV (elevation:~7,900') on the AM of 20 Jul 96. Distance from peak to Area 51 was ~25 miles and area was West of Tikaboo Peak. Photos taken using a 80mm f/10 (800mm focal length), Bausch & Lomb mirrored lens with an Olympus OM-88 camera using AMERICAN Brand ASA 100 Color Print Film.

The east sun angle provided "best" view of area structures. Pretty good details visible considering 25 mile distance! Note the details on the "Big Hangar" on A-51 Shot#2 (Middle -North)

Night time photos of Area 51 taken on the PM of 19 Jul 96 from atop Tikaboo Peak. Same equipment was used. Both photos are centered on the "Big Hangar" area noted on Area 51 20 Jul 96 Shot #2. Not much night time activity was present that night and stayed that way well into the early AM of next day. Right photo: Daytime photo shows STARGAZER taking shots of Area 51 from atop Tikaboo Peak on 19 Jul 96. Shows telephoto lens used to take all shots. A beautiful, beyond words view of the desert floor below is seen in the background.

And, somewhere up in the high end of the civil aircraft band I found IRIG

time code in AM mode running continuously, on a weekend. This is used as a time reference for data recorders and range timing. Its quite possibly driven by the master clock for the entire range. I wonder if they only turn it on when the range is in use. If so, it could be used as a beacon to indicate when to watch. There were rumbles in the distance from what I believed to be supersonic aircraft. My wife and I sighted 3 triangular shapes in tight formation but they were out of sight before the camcorder got up to speed.

I will try to find my notes on these freqs if anyone is interested.

-- Please remember that the moderator cannot edit messages, only return them for you to edit. This can result in a delay of many hours.

-- Enforcing these restrictions against empty subject lines and too much quoting will help keep the list readable.

3) The mailer automatically adds "AREA 51:" to the subject line for every message. When you reply to a message, please remove "AREA 51:" from the subject line, so the mailer can add it on again correctly.

-- This is a minor problem, and we won't reject messages because of it, but the title looks better when "AREA 51:" is in the right position.

4) Unsubscribe messages must go to area51-request@lists.best.com

5) Private conversations should be conducted by regular email. Some responses are better sent directly to the author rather than to the list. Use this list only for reasonably substantial statements you want everyone else to know about.

Some of the above may be not insignificant. Some time ago I heard from Dr. Steven Greer, CSETI founder, who does have excellent connections, that it was his opinion that most of the really sensitive alien stuff had now been moved to a base in Arizona, or a new base in Utah that was accessible only by air. The name of the Arizona base was Camp Something, the Something being an Indian name that I cannot remember, but which I will find out again in due course.

I received interesting verification of this while in England this summer, as the BBC (in what must have been the equivalent of their sweeps week) were touting an expose during one of their upcoming TV news shows about the Arizona base where the alien detritus was stored. Finally the clip aired, and it was just warmed over Area 51 Nevada stuff that looked as though it had been put together in a hurry from central files and contained nothing that we didn't know already. Now the BBC do not make those kind of geographical factual mistakes (confusing Arizona with Nevada).

But I do know that when they are slapped with what is known in the UK as a D-notice by the Security Services, the plug gets pulled immediately.

I witnessed this first hand last year when watching a special over there about the Mina, Arkansas drugs for contra arms scandal. The BBC had built the show up and were advertising a new eyewitness to the events (a State Trooper I believe) who was going to provide testimony that would link Clinton with the whole deal, and who, they said, could not give this testimony on camera in the States. It was a one hour show, and they brought him on about 15 minutes before the end of the show for the big finale. The screen immediately faded to the equivalent of "Do not adjust your set, we have technical problems", and stayed that way till the end of the show.

This was on prime time evening TV, and I checked the newspapers the next day for comments about this incredible last minute censoring, and there was not one word about it in any newspaper. It was amazing.

My guts tell me that this is also what happened with the BBC's Area 51 broadcast, that they had some revelations they were going to make about the Arizona Base, and when the boys in the band heard the Arizona teaser they made the BBC just run the generic Area 51 product.

BTW I ran a Web and Usenet search, but couldn't find the Arizona Camp name.
