The disclosure of classified material is a crime.

In order to be guilty of a crime you have to have committed the act (actus reas) and have the necessary mental intent (mens rea). In most cases, a lack of knowledge that something was classified would be enough to not be found guilty of passing classified material.

Now, Art brings up the point of knew or should have known, which is the same standard that is used for receiving stolen property.
