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## Footnotes for Relationships & Topics

The Ufomind website provides a mechanism for linking researchers to topics and to one another.

For examples, see any page in our people section, like...

<http://www.ufomind.com/people/b/bigelow/>  
<http://www.ufomind.com/people/r/randi/>

Using "Edit Any Information Above," you can specify the topics a person is studying and the people and organizations they are affiliated with. You can also record conflicts between researchers and more subtle relationships.

The only trouble so far is that although you could specify a topic or relationship, you had no opportunity to substantiate it. If you said "Smith" was affiliated with "Jones," there was no way to note the nature of that relationship.

Now, we have implemented a new system of "sourcing" for relationships and topics. You can now add various footnotes to each selection.

In the editing screen for each person, you define a relationship with someone else by adding that other person's filecode to the appropriate relationship field. For example, in Smith's record, you could indicate that he is affiliated with Jones, by adding "jones" to the appropriate field.

Affiliation: jones

Now, you can also add a footnote in parentheses...

Affiliation: jones(Jones worked for Smith at the Western Institute. [gc])

In this case, everything within the parentheses will be automatically displayed as a numbered footnote, and the same footnote will automatically be copied to Jones' page.

There are several footnote options...

- 1) Standard text footnote, like the one above. Footnotes should be as brief as possible and should be just long enough to specify or substantiate the relationship.

Remember that the same footnote will appear in both people's pages, so be sure it makes sense in both pages. (That is why we said "Smith" and "Jones" explicitly.) Please add your initials in to the end of the footnote so we know who wrote it. (Someday, this will be done automatically.)

Since parentheses ( ) mark the beginning and end of the footnote, you can't use them inside the footnote itself.

## 2) Link reference...

```
Affiliation: jones(/people/s/smith/#3)
```

This creates a hot-link to the URL stored at entry #3 on Smith's page, where some part of the document describes the relationship between Smith and Jones. The part of the footnote before the '#' is the URL of the page minus the 'http://' and server name. It must begin and end with '/'.

As a shortcut, you can also provide just the link number if the entry is on the current page...

```
Affiliation: jones(#3)
```

The '#3' will automatically be translated into '/people/s/smith/#3'

The source page for the link can be any index page on our server. Decimal numbers are allowed to indicate subentries...

```
Affiliation: jones(/ufo/topic/abduction/#9.2)
```

(We do not allow foreign URLs to be entered directly, because they could change. By specifying the link entry instead, the system can automatically correct the URL if it is changed in the link entry.)

To be recognized by our system, this kind of footnote must always begin with '/' or '#'.

## 3) Reference to a book in our catalog...

```
Affiliation: jones($remote:299)
```

This creates a link to a book in our catalog with the product code 'remote' (which is "Remote Viewers: The Secret History of America's Psychic Spies"). The number after the ':' is the page number in the book where the relationship between Smith and Jones is described.

A single page number is the only thing allowed after the colon. If you need to give a longer description of what is in the book, use the "Print References" system.

A page number is recommended, but if you don't have one or if the entire book indicates the relationship, then you can leave the page number off...

```
Affiliation: jones($remote)
```

To be recognized by our system, this kind of footnote must begin with '\$'.

## 4) Brief footnotes of 1-3 words are allowed without providing your initials...

```
UFO Topic: abduction(skeptic)
```

In this case, we are indicating that Smith has studies Alien Abduction claims but has declared that they are false. (Here we use 'skeptic' in the popular sense of one who actively disbelieves.)

Footnotes of 3 words or less are displayed with the entry and are not placed in a separate section like longer footnotes.

Note that the same sourcing mechanism applies both to relationships and topics. For example, to indicate that Smith is an active skeptic of the Roswell Incident, use...

```
UFO Geographical Case: us/nm/roswell(skeptic)
```

Some short footnotes you might want to consider: skeptic, witness, practioner, member, funding, now estranged, married, family,

abductee, etc.

As a matter of style, these short footnotes should be all lowercase. Also, remember that any word or phrase you use must make sense on both sides of the relationship.

- 5) Multiple footnotes are allow within parentheses, using any of the above methods. Simply separate each footnote with a bar...

Affiliation: jones(#3|\$remote:299|Jones worked for Smith at WI. [gc])

Although there is no technical limit to the number of footnotes, in practice you should try to limit them to two or three per entry -- just enough to specify the relationship and show that it exists.

For now, the use of footnotes is optional, but over time we will tighten the requirement for them, especially where the relationship might be controversial. Please use footnotes whenever you can.

This system is new, so keep on the lookout for bugs.
