One could venture that the reason for this that most people are to "involved" in their normal everyday lives during the day to notice anything unusual going on around them, thus at night they have less to distract them so they are more likely to notice other more extraneous things.

This hypothesis could be borne out in part by:

- 1) some night-time sightings were barely visible "lights".
- 2) some of the daylight sightings were the more "unusual" ufo's.

But of course we would need more data on this and a more intensive study on it.
